WORKS OF PROVISIONAL COUNCIL ON SMOKING AND HEALTH PRAISED

\* \* \* \* \*

THE HONG KONG COUNCIL ON SMOKING AND HEALTH IS DUE TO BE FULLY ESTABLISHED UNDER ITS OWN ORDINANCE LATER THIS YEAR ONCE THE NECESSARY LEGISLATION HAS BEEN PASSED, THE SECRETARY FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE, MR JOHN CHAMBERS, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

MR CHAMBERS WAS SPEAKING AT A CONFERENCE ENTITLED +INTERNATIONAL UPDATE ON TOBACCO-RELATED PROBLEMS+, JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE HEALTH AND WELFARE BRANCH OF THE GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT AND THE PROVISIONAL COUNCIL ON SMOKING AND HEALTH.

+IT SEEMS TO ME TO BE VERY APPROPRIATE THAT THE COUNCIL IN ITS PRESENT PROVISIONAL FORM SHOULD HAVE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO PUBLICISE BOTH ITS OWN WORK AND THE LATEST SCIENTIFIC AND MEDICAL EVIDENCE WHICH DEMONSTRATES THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS WORK,+ HE SAID.

AND HE HOPED THAT THE CONFERENCE WOULD PROVIDE AN EVEN FIRMER AND MORE UP-TO-DATE BASE FOR THE COUNCIL ON SMOKING AND HEALTH TO CONTINUE THE WORK SO EXCELLENTLY BEGUN BY THE PROVISIONAL COUNCIL.

MR CHAMBERS THANKED ORGANISERS AND SPEAKERS OF THE CONFERENCE FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS, AND SAID HE WAS PLEASED TO SEE IN THE AUDIENCE A WIDE RANGE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF CONCERNED ORGANISATIONS AS WELL AS THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PROVISIONAL COUNCIL ON SMOKING AND HEALTH, DR RONALD LEUNG, SAID AT THE SAME CONFERENCE THAT OVER THE LAST FIVE YEARS, THE GOVERNMENT HAD ACHIEVED A SUCCESS IN THE FIELD OF SMOKING AND HEALTH WHICH HAD BEEN NOTED WORLDWIDE.

NUMBERS OF SMOKERS HAD DROPPED CONSIDERABLY THROUGH A COMBINATION OF EXEMPLARY LEGISLATION, INTENSIVE PUBLICITY, AND THE STRONG DISINCENTIVE OF A VERY SHARP TAX HIKE, HE SAID.

DR LEUNG SAID THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD GIVEN THE COUNCIL A GREAT 'SEND-OFF' WITH THE ANNOUNCEMENTS OF TWO MAJOR ADVANCES IN LEGISLATION AGAINST TOBACCO USE, NAMELY THE PROSPECTIVE BAN ON TOBACCO ADVERTISING ON TV AND RADIO AND A COMPLETE BAN ON SMOKELESS TOBACCO.

+IT IS, THEREFORE, LOGICAL TO PRESUME THAT OUR COUNCIL ON SMOKING AND HEALTH SHOULD FOLLOW UP ON THESE TWO ISSUES.

+WE SHOULD CONCENTRATE ON AN EVENTUAL COMPLETE BAN ON TOBACCO ADVERTISING IN ALL ITS FORMS, AND TO ARRIVE AT A TIMETABLE FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE BAN ON TV AND RADIO TO ALL OTHER ADVERTISING MEDIA.

+FURTHERMORE, AS WITH SMOKELESS TOBACCO, IT SHOULD BE UNDERSTOOD THAT ANY OTHER NEW FORMS OF TOBACCO USE WILL NOT BE TOLERATED NOR WILL IT BE APPROVED IN THE LIGHT OF THE EXTENT OF RISKS OF TOBACCO USE IN ANY OF ITS FORMS,+ HE SAID.

ALSO SPEAKING AT THE CONFERENCE WERE OTHER INTERNATIONAL HEALTH EXPERTS, WITH TOPICS COVERING SMOKING AND NON-CANCEROUS RESPIRATORY DISEASES, TOBACCO AND CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE, TOBACCO AND CHILDREN'S HEALTH, PASSIVE SMOKING, THE WORLD TOBACCO PANDEMIC AND PUBLIC EDUCATION ON TOBACCO.

CHIEF JUSTICE HELPS CLEAN LITTER BLACKSPOT

THE CHIEF JUSTICE, SIR DENYS ROBERTS, OFFERED FULL SUPPORT TO THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN CAMPAIGN BY PHYSICALLY CLEANING UP A LITTER BLACKSPOT AT YAU MA TEI THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

WEARING THE CAMPAIGN T-SHIRT WITH THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN LOGO AND SLOGAN, SIR DENYS TOOK PART IN SWEEPING A SECTION OF SHANGHAI STREET BETWEEN MARKET STREET AND KANSU STREET.

SIR DENYS DECIDED TO JOIN TODAY'S CLEAN-UP OPERATION AS HE REALISED THAT THIS YEAR'S KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN CAMPAIGN, THE LARGEST EVER SINCE IT WAS LAUNCHED IN 1972, NEEDED THE SUPPORT OF PEOPLE FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE.

HE HOPED THAT HIS PARTICIPATION WILL AROUSE THE PUBLIC'S AWARENESS TOWARDS THE CAMPAIGN AND THEREBY ENCOURAGING THEM TO JOIN THE KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN FORCES.

JOINING HANDS WITH SIR DENYS IN THE OPERATION WERE CHAIRMAN OF THE URBAN COUNCIL AND REGIONAL COUNCIL, MR GERRY FORSGATE AND MR CHEUNG YANG-LUNG, CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT UC/RC KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN STEERING COMMITTEE, MR CARLOS CHEUNG, AND VICE-CHAIRMAN, MR WALTER SULKE.

THEY AGREED THAT SUPPORT FROM THE LEGAL PROFESSION WOULD GIVE ANOTHER IMPETUS TO THE CAMPAIGN.

COMPUTER LITERACY FOR JUNIOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT IS TO ASSIST SOME 70 PUBLIC SECTOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO OFFER COMPUTER LITERACY COURSES TO JUNIOR SECONDARY STUDENTS IN THE NEW ACADEMIC YEAR IN SEPTEMBER.

SECONDARY SCHOOLS ARE INVITED TO TAKE PART IN THE PHASED INTRODUCTION OF COMPUTER LITERACY COURSE IN FORM I AND III STARTING SEPTEMBER. APPLICATIONS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED TO THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT BEFORE JUNE 8.

TO ENABLE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMPUTER LITERACY COURSES IN JUNIOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS, THE FINANCE COMMITTEE HAS APPROVED A COMMITMENT OF \$7.5 MILLION FOR THE PROJECT WHICH INCLUDED \$6.3 MILLION FOR RECURRENT EXPENDITURE AND \$1.2 MILLION FOR NON-RECURRENT EXPENDITURE.

THE OBJECTIVE OF INTRODUCING COMPUTER LITERACY COURSES WAS TO ENABLE ALL STUDENTS TO RECEIVE SOME FORM OF COMPUTER EDUCATION DURING THEIR NINE-YEAR FREE AND COMPULSORY EDUCATION, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID.

THE EMPHASIS OF THE COURSES IS TO ENHANCE STUDENTS' UNDERSTANDING OF COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY IN GENERAL RATHER THAN ON PROGRAMME WRITING.

COMPUTER EDUCATION WAS FIRST INTRODUCED TO PUBLIC SECTOR SCHOOLS IN 1982 THROUGH THE SUBJECT OF COMPUTER STUDIES AT FORMS IV AND V. IT HAS BECOME A WELL ESTABLISHED SUBJECT AND CURRENTLY BEING OFFERED IN MORE THAN 80 PER CENT OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS.

EXISTING COMPUTER EQUIPMENT PROVIDED FOR SCHOOLS UNDER THE COMPUTER STUDIES SCHEME IS CONSIDERED ADEQUATE TO SUPPORT THIS NEW SUBJECT WHILE SOFTWARE PACKAGES WILL BE PROVIDED BY STAGES FOR USE IN THE PRACTICAL SESSIONS OF THE COURSE.

FOR THOSE SCHOOLS WHICH HAD NOT ALREADY BEEN INCLUDED IN THE COMPUTER STUDIES SCHEME MIGHT ALSO OFFER COMPUTER LITERACY COURSES, THE SPOKESMAN SAID, ADDING THAT THEY WOULD BE EXPECTED TO MAKE USE OF THEIR OWN COMPUTER EQUIPMENT.

REVISED TAI PO DISTRICT HANDBOOK PUBLISHED

THE REVISED EDITION OF THE TAI PO DISTRICT HANDBOOK WITH UPDATED INFORMATION ON THE DISTRICT HAS BEEN PUBLISHED.

THE 72-PAGE HANDBOOK IN CHINESE WAS PRODUCED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD'S PROMOTION AND PUBLICITY COMMITTEE AND THE DISTRICT OFFICE AS A PUBLICATION INTRODUCING VARIOUS ASPECTS OF TAI PO TO RESIDENTS.

THE FIRST EDITION OF THE HANDBOOK PUBLISHED IN NOVEMBER 1983 REFLECTED CHANGES IN THE COMMUNITY WITH INFORMATION ON VARIOUS FEATURES, ORGANISATIONS AND FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE DISTRICT, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DISTRICT OFFICE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT THE HANDBOOK HAD ATTRACTED A HIGH READERSHIP AND WAS A VALUABLE REFERENCE TO HELP BOTH INDIGENOUS AND NEW RESIDENTS UNDERSTAND AND INTEGRATE INTO THE CHANGING COMMUNITY.

IN VIEW OF THE DISTRICT'S POPULATION GROWTH AND CHANGES IN THE DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION, EMPHASIS WAS PUT ON EXISTING AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS IN THE NEW EDITION, HE POINTED OUT.

THE REVISED HANDBOOK, WHICH IS ILLUSTRATED WITH PHOTOGRAPHS, MAPS AND CHARTS, HAS THREE NEW CHAPTERS ON THE TAI PO DISTRICT BOARD, FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS OF TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, AND THE SAI KUNG NORTH SUB-DISTRICT.

THE CHAPTER ON THE TAI PO DISTRICT BOARD PROVIDES READERS WITH COMPREHENSIVE INFORMATION ON THE STRUCTURE AND WORK OF THE BOARD.

THE CHAPTER ON FUTURE TRANSPORTATION LINKS OF TAI PO HIGHLIGHTS THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS OF TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SAI KUNG NORTH SUB-DISTRICT IS SUMMARISED IN ANOTHER CHAPTER.

A TOTAL OF 20 000 COPIES OF THE HANDBOOK HAVE BEEN PRINTED AND WILL BE DISTRIBUTED TO SCHOOLS, RURAL COMMITTEES, MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS IN THE DISTRICT.

COPIES ARE ALSO AVAILABLE FREE AT THE SECRETARIAT OF THE DISTRICT BOARD, THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND ITS SUB-OFFICES FROM MONDAY (MAY 18).

BIGGER BUDGET FOR SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD HAS BEEN ALLOCATED \$1.56 MILLION FOR 1987-88, AN INCREASE OF ABOUT NINE PER CENT FROM \$1.43 MILLION LAST YEAR, A SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

THE BOARD PLANS TO SPEND \$903 000 ON COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT PROJECTS UNDER THE COMMUNITY BUILDING AND THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEES, AND \$657 000 ON ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS UNDER THE ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE, HE SAID.

OF THE \$830 000 ALLOCATED TO THE COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE, \$285 000 WILL SERVE AS GRANTS TO LOCAL BODIES AND RESIDENTS ORGANISATIONS FOR ORGANISING ACTIVITIES, WHILE \$222 000 WILL BE SET ASIDE FOR SOME 40 PROGRAMMES RUN BY THE DISTRICT'S RECREATION AND SPORTS COUNCIL AND ARTS AND CULTURE ASSOCIATION.

ANOTHER \$130 000 ARE BUDGETED FOR PUBLICITY ON THE DISTRICT BOARD VOTER REGISTRATION AND ELECTIONS.

THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE, ON THE OTHER HAND, HAS SET ASIDE \$35 000 FROM ITS \$73 000 ALLOCATION FOR GRANTS TO LOCAL ORGANISATIONS AND FOR ITS OWN AD HOC PROJECTS.

THE REST WILL BE SPENT ON ORGANISING THE DISTRICT'S SOCIAL SERVICES AWARD SCHEME, THE COMMUNITY MEDICAL SCHEME FOR THE ELDERLY, SEA TRIPS FOR HANDICAPPED AND UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN, AND PUBLISHING A DIRECTORY OF SOCIAL SERVICES ORGANISATIONS IN THE DISTRICT.

THE ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE WILL SPEND MORE THAN ONE-THIRD OF ITS FUNDS ON AMENITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS SUCH AS BUILDING SITTING-OUT AREAS AND RAIN SHELTERS.

ANOTHER ONE-THIRD WILL BE SPENT ON ACCESS IMPROVEMENT AND SQUATTER IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS, AND A SMALL AMOUNT HAS BEEN BUDGETED FOR THE PROVISION AND REPLENISHMENT OF FIRE FIGHTING EQUIPMENT FOR FIRE WATCH TEAMS IN SQUATTER AREAS.

THE AFFECTED SECTION RUNS FROM A POINT ABOUT 55 METRES NORTH OF ITS JUNCTION WITH BUTE STREET TO A POINT ABOUT 25 METRES SOUTH OF THE SAME JUNCTION.

NO VEHICLE WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS WITHIN THE RESTRICTED AREA.
