STEADY SUPPLY OF LAND INTO 21ST CENTURY ASSURED  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE GOVERNMENT IS VERY CONSCIOUS OF THE IMPORTANCE OF MAINTAINING A STEADY RATHER THAN AN OVER SUPPLY OF LAND SO THAT HONG KONG MAY CONTINUE TO GROW INTO THE NEXT CENTURY, THE PRINCIPAL GOVERNMENT LAND AGENT OF THE BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT, MR BOB POPE, SAID TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

ADDRESSING THE ROTARY CLUB OF KOWLOON GOLDEN MILE ON PLANS FOR FUTURE LAND DEVELOPMENT, MR POPE SAID THE MAJOR SOURCE OF NEW LAND WOULD BE THE VARIOUS RECLAMATION PROJECTS CURRENTLY UNDER STUDY.

THE PROJECTS INCLUDE THE RECLAMATIONS IN CENTRAL AND WAN CHAI, KOWLOON WEST AND HUNG HOM AND THE TSEUNG KWAN O NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT.

ABOUT 24 HECTARES OF LAND WOULD BE PROVIDED BY THE CENTRAL AND WAN CHAI RECLAMATION FOR COMMERCIAL USE FOR WHICH A TOTAL GROSS FLOOR AREA OF 2.1 MILLION SQUARE METRES WAS ENVISAGED.

A CONSULTANCY STUDY HAS SUGGESTED THAT THE PROJECT SHOULD COMMENCE IN 1991-92, WITH LAND READY FOR SALE IN 1993-94.

"THE GOVERNMENT IS CURRENTLY CONSIDERING THE POSSIBILITY OF PRIVATISING CERTAIN PACKAGES AND THE LIKELY EFFECT THE SUPPLY OF THIS LAND IN THE MID-1990'S WILL HAVE ON PROPERTY VALUES AT THAT TIME," MR POPE SAID.

TURNING TO THE WEST KOWLOON RECLAMATION, MR POPE SAID IT WAS SCHEDULED TO BE LARGELY COMPLETED WITHIN FOUR YEARS TO PROVIDE FOR THE ROAD/RAIL CONNECTION VIA ROUTE 3 TO THE NEW AIRPORT.

UNDER THE PROJECT, 22 HECTARES OF LAND IS EARMARKED FOR RESIDENTIAL USE, 28 HECTARES FOR COMMERCIAL USE AND 20 HECTARES FOR INDUSTRIAL USE.

HE EXPECTED THAT LAND FOR HIGH DENSITY PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT IN TSEUNG KWAN O, TOTALLING 13.36 HECTARES, WOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR SALE OVER THE NEXT TWO TO THREE YEARS.

ANOTHER 20 HECTARES OF INDUSTRIAL LAND IN THE AREA WILL BE AVAILABLE IN 1992-94.

MR POPE ADDED THAT 3.4 AND 5.77 HECTARES OF LAND FROM THE HUNG HOM RECLAMATION WOULD BE SET ASIDE FOR COMMERCIAL AND RESIDENTIAL USES RESPECTIVELY.

MR POPE STRESSED THAT SUFFICIENT LAND WAS AVAILABLE TO MEET HONG KONG'S NEEDS INTO THE TURN OF THE CENTURY.

"WHEN THE LAND WILL ACTUALLY BE SOLD WILL DEPEND VERY MUCH ON WHEN MONEY IS MADE AVAILABLE BY GOVERNMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF INFRASTRUCTURE SERVICES AND THE MARKET AT THE TIME," HE SAID.

OUTLINE ZONING PLANS FOR THESE RECLAMATION PROJECTS, WHICH ARE IN THE PRELIMINARY PLANNING STAGES, WOULD BE PREPARED FOR PUBLIC DISPLAY, HE ADDED.

NO EVIDENCE OF INCREASED CAPITAL OUTFLOW  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE SECRETARY FOR MONETARY AFFAIRS, MR DAVID NENDICK, YESTERDAY (TUESDAY) QUASHED REPORTS OF A MASSIVE INCREASE IN CAPITAL OUTFLOW FROM HONG KONG BECAUSE OF SHAKEN BUSINESS CONFIDENCE DUE TO THE EVENTS IN CHINA LAST JUNE.

APPEARING ON FINANCIAL NEWS NETWORK (FNN) TELEVISION IN NEW YORK, MR NENDICK SAID THE ECONOMY IN HONG KONG HAD CONTINUED TO GROW AT A RATE OF TWO AND A HALF PER CENT LAST YEAR AND THREE PER CENT THIS YEAR.

ASKED ABOUT THE DROP IN THE HANG SENG INDEX AFTER JUNE 4 LAST YEAR, HE SAID THE EFFECT HAD BEEN MUCH LESS WITH THE INDEX FALLING BY ONLY 30 PER CENT AS AGAINST 50 PER CENT IN 1987.

"IN FACT, THE INDEX TODAY WAS NOW NEARLY AT WHAT IT WAS BEFORE JUNE 4 LAST YEAR," HE ADDED.

ON INCREASING JAPANESE INVESTMENT IN HONG KONG WHICH WAS NOW ABOUT US\$8 BILLION, MR NENDICK SAID JAPANESE INVESTORS WERE TAKING A LONGER TERM VIEW THAN OTHERS WHO WERE OVER-REACTING TO SHORT-TERM SHOCKS.

HE SAID HONG KONG'S ECONOMY HAD BEEN THROUGH MANY SHOCKS BEFORE BUT HAD ALWAYS RECOVERED.

MR NENDICK IS IN NEW YORK ON HIS WAY TO ATTEND A SEMINAR IN BOSTON ORGANISED BY THE WORLD BANK LATER THIS WEEK.

COMMUNITY CHEST A FORCE FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

THE WORK OF THE COMMUNITY CHEST IN THE NINETIES WILL CONTINUE TO BE OF GREAT IMPORTANCE, NOT ONLY TO THE 113 AGENCIES WHICH ARE MEMBERS OF THE CHEST, BUT AS A FORCE FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, LADY WILSON SAID TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE COMMUNITY CHEST OF HONG KONG, LADY WILSON SAID THROUGH THE CHEST'S WALKS FOR MILLIONS, MONTHLY PAYROLL DONATIONS, ROUNDING UP OF TELEPHONE IDD BILLS, DONATIONS THROUGH CREDIT CARDS, AND IN MANY OTHER WAYS, MORE AND MORE PEOPLE WERE CONTRIBUTING TO THE WELFARE OF THOSE IN NEED.

"THIS IS THE BEST POSSIBLE SIGN OF A COMMUNITY DEVELOPING IN A HUMANE WAY," SHE SAID.

LADY WILSON POINTED OUT THAT ALTHOUGH THE YEAR STARTED IN AN ANXIOUS ATMOSPHERE, THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, AND ITS CHAIRMAN, MR JAMES KUNG, HAD SUCCEEDED MAGNIFICENTLY.

SHE SAID SHE FOUND IT QUITE AMAZING THAT, SINCE HER INVOLVEMENT IN 1987, THE CHEST HAD MANAGED TO MORE THAN DOUBLE ITS INCOME, THROUGH HARD WORK ON THE PART OF THE MEMBERS, AND THROUGH THE ENORMOUS GENEROSITY OF THE DONORS.

"EVEN AS LATE AS MARCH THIS YEAR, IT SEEMED THAT IT WOULD BE DIFFICULT TO REACH THE TARGET OF \$80 MILLION. IN THE EVENT, THE TARGET WAS EXCEEDED BY 10 PER CENT, SO THAT TOTAL DONATIONS AMOUNTED TO \$88 MILLION," SHE SAID.

"THIS MARKED THE FIFTH YEAR OF GROWTH IN DONATIONS, AT A COMPOUND RATE OF 24 PER CENT PER ANNUM," SHE ADDED.

SHE POINTED OUT THAT AS THE SUMS GOT BIGGER, IT WAS NOT GOING TO BE EASY TO CONTINUE TO SEEK INCREASES OF THIS ORDER, EVEN THOUGH THE NEEDS OF THE AGENCIES WERE GROWING AT ABOUT THAT RATE.

LADY WILSON PRAISED THE WORK OF THE CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE, CHAIRED BY MRS ANITA CHAN, AND ITS SUPPORTING COMMITTEES, FOR DISPLAYING REMARKABLE INGENUITY IN CREATING NEW WAYS IN WHICH PEOPLE COULD SHOW THEIR SUPPORT.

"THEIR WORK HAS BEEN EXTREMELY WELL SUPPLEMENTED BY THE PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE, WHICH HAS BROUGHT THE NEEDS FOR SOCIAL WORK TO THE ATTENTION OF MANY," SHE SAID.

"IT IS CLEAR THAT MOST PEOPLE IN HONG KONG WOULD WISH TO MAKE SOME CONTRIBUTION, HOWEVER LARGE OR SMALL. FOR THOSE WHO ARE UNCERTAIN WHERE MONEY IS MOST NEEDED, AND FOR THOSE WHO ARE NOT FAMILIAR WITH THE AGENCIES, A DONATION THROUGH THE CHEST IS A MOST EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE WAY OF GIVING," SHE ADDED.

LADY WILSON PAID TRIBUTE TO THOUSAND OF VOLUNTEERS WHO SUPPORTED THE WORK OF THE CHEST THROUGH GIVING THEIR TIME AND THEIR WORK.

"I AM SURE MEMBER AGENCIES ARE AS GRATEFUL TO THEM AS ALL OF US IN THE CHEST ARE," SHE SAID.

LADY WILSON SAID AS DONATIONS WERE NOW MORE GENEROUS THAN IN RECENT YEARS, THE ADMISSIONS, BUDGETS AND ALLOCATIONS COMMITTEE WAS THEREFORE ABLE TO MEET 85 PER CENT OF FUNDS REQUESTED FOR THE CURRENT YEAR BY ALL AGENCIES NOW MEMBERS OF THE CHEST.

"THE WORK OF THIS COMMITTEE IS VITAL," SHE SAID, ADDING THAT WITHOUT A CAREFUL ALLOCATION OF DONATIONS RECEIVED, THE CREDIBILITY OF THE CHEST WOULD BE UNDERMINED.

SHE THANKED MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE FOR THE MANY HOURS THAT THEY SPENT ON DETAILED EXAMINATION OF THE REQUESTS RECEIVED.

"I AM GLAD TO SAY THAT THE CHEST IS NOW ABLE TO ASSIST IN A GOOD DEAL OF THE WORK THAT IS BEYOND THE PRESENT REACH OF THE GOVERNMENT'S SUBVENTION SYSTEM," LADY WILSON SAID.

LADY WILSON SAID COMMUNITY SUPPORT HAD BUILT THE CHEST INTO AN INSTITUTION THAT NOW REQUIRED EVEN GREATER COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT IN MEETING THE NEEDS OF THOSE WHO SUFFERED UNFAIRLY FROM THE ACCIDENTS OF LIFE.

"WE SHALL HAVE TO GO FURTHER THAN LAST YEAR, BECAUSE NEEDS GROW AND COSTS RISE.

"WE WILL AGAIN NEED THE PERSONAL SUPPORT OF ALL OUR BOARD MEMBERS AND OUR PATRONS, WHO HAVE HELPED SO MUCH WITH THEIR PERSONAL APPEALS," SHE SAID.

EXCO APPROVES NEW FARES FOR NT AND LANTAU TAXIS

\* \* \* \* \*

THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL HAD APPROVED AN INCREASE IN FARES FOR NEW TERRITORIES AND LANTAU TAXIS TO MEET RISING OPERATING COSTS.

THE NEW FARES WILL TAKE EFFECT FROM SUNDAY, JUNE 24.

UPON REVISION, THE NT AND LANTAU TAXI FARES WILL BE \$7 FOR THE FIRST TWO KILOMETRES AND 80 CENTS FOR EVERY 0.25 KILOMETRE THEREAFTER.

THE APPROVED NEW FARE SCALES REPRESENT AN AVERAGE INCREASE OF ABOUT 22.3 PER CENT FOR NT TAXIS AND 17.2 PER CENT FOR LANTAU TAXIS.

WAITING TIME CHARGES FOR EVERY ONE MINUTE WILL ALSO BE RAISED FROM 70 CENTS TO 80 CENTS.

IN ADDITION, RADIO-CALL BOOKING SURCHARGE FOR TAXIS IN THE NT WILL BE REVISED FROM \$1 TO \$2, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT THE RELATIVELY LONG DISTANCE NT TAXIS HAVE TO COVER BEFORE REACHING THEIR CLIENTS.

THE FARES FOR NT TAXIS AND LANTAU TAXIS WERE LAST REVISED IN JANUARY AND JULY LAST YEAR RESPECTIVELY.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT THE FARE INCREASE APPLICATIONS FROM THE TAXI TRADE HAD BEEN CAREFULLY SCRUTINISED TO ENSURE THAT THE PUBLIC INTEREST WAS PROTECTED AS WELL.

IN APPROVING THE NEW FARE RATES, THE GOVERNMENT HAD TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION THE POLICY OF ESTABLISHING A SUBSTANTIAL FARE DIFFERENTIAL BETWEEN TAXIS AND OTHER PUBLIC TRANSPORT MODES, THE EFFECT OF INCREASED OPERATING AND MAINTENANCE AND FUEL COSTS, AND THE NEED TO MAINTAIN AN ACCEPTABLE LEVEL OF TAXI SERVICE IN THE NT AND LANTAU, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

PENDING THE CONVERSION OF TAXIMETERS, TAXIS MAY CHARGE THE REVISED FARES STARTING FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE BY DISPLAYING A CONVERSION TABLE SHOWING THE REVISED FARE SCALES.

STARTING FROM NEXT THURSDAY (JUNE 21), OPERATORS AND DRIVERS CAN OBTAIN THE FARE CONVERSION TABLES FROM THE FOLLOWING TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT OFFICES:

TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS IN SHEUNG WAN AND WESTERN  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES THAT FROM 10 AM ON FRIDAY (JUNE 15), THE NORTHERN KERBSIDE LANE OF STAUNTON STREET, IN SHEUNG WAN, FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH ABERDEEN STREET TO A POINT ABOUT 50 METRES WEST OF THE SAME JUNCTION WILL BE DESIGNATED AN URBAN CLEARWAY 24 HOURS DAILY FOR 12 WEEKS TO FACILITATE ROAD RECONSTRUCTION WORKS.

WITHIN THE RESTRICTED AREA, ALL VEHICLES, EXCEPT THOSE WITH PERMITS ISSUED BY THE COMMISSIONER FOR TRANSPORT, WILL BE PROHIBITED FROM STOPPING FOR PASSENGERS AND GOODS.

AT THE SAME TIME, IN CONNECTION WITH THE DUALLING OF CONNAUGHT ROAD WEST IN WESTERN DISTRICT, VEHICLES ON EASTBOUND CONNAUGHT ROAD WEST WILL BE ABLE TO TURN RIGHT INTO KA ON STREET.

THE EXISTING RIGHT TURNING FROM WESTBOUND DES VOEUX ROAD WEST INTO WATER STREET WILL BE BANNED, AND THE RIGHT-TURN LANE WILL BECOME A "TRAM ONLY" LANE.

VEHICLES ON WESTBOUND DES VOEUX ROAD WEST HEADING FOR WATER STREET WILL BE DIVERTED VIA EASTERN STREET AND QUEEN'S ROAD WEST, OR THEY CAN CONTINUE ALONG WESTBOUND DES VOEUX ROAD WEST, TURN RIGHT AT THE HILL ROAD JUNCTION INTO EASTBOUND CONNAUGHT ROAD WEST, AND THEN TRAVEL TO WATER STREET VIA KA ON STREET AND EASTBOUND DES VOEUX ROAD WEST.

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES THAT FROM 10 AM ON FRIDAY (JUNE 15), THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF ROADS IN SHAU KEI WAN WILL BE DESIGNATED URBAN CLEARWAYS 24 HOURS DAILY:

- \* THE NORTHERN KERBSIDE LANE OF FACTORY STREET FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH WANG WA STREET TO A POINT ABOUT FIVE METRES WEST OF THE SAME JUNCTION;
- \* THE SOUTHERN KERBSIDE LANE OF FACTORY STREET FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH WANG WA STREET TO A POINT ABOUT 15 METRES WEST OF THE SAME JUNCTION;
- \* THE WESTERN KERBSIDE LANE OF WANG WA STREET FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH FACTORY STREET TO A POINT ABOUT 20 METRES NORTH OF THE SAME JUNCTION; AND
- \* THE EASTERN KERBSIDE LANE OF WANG WA STREET FROM ITS JUNCTION WITH FACTORY STREET TO A POINT ABOUT 25 METRES NORTH OF THE SAME JUNCTION.

NO VEHICLES EXCEPT FRANCHISED BUSES WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS THERE.
