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POP CONCERT PROMOTES VOTER REGISTRATION
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MORE THAN 8,000 PEOPLE THIS (SUNDAY) AFTERNOON ATTENDED A THREE-HOUR POP CONCERT TO PROMOTE VOTER REGISTRATION IN KWUN TONG.

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE SOLAR PROJECT '90 CONCERT AT THE KWUN TONG RECREATION GROUND, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR DAVID LAN, APPEALED TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO EXERCISE THEIR CIVIC RIGHTS BY REGISTERING AS VOTERS.

"ELECTIONS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, THE TWO MUNICIPAL COUNCILS AND THE DISTRICT BOARDS WILL BE HELD NEXT YEAR.

"AND THE FIRST DIRECT ELECTIONS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL WILL SET A NEW MILESTONE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF HONG KONG'S POLITICAL SYSTEM," MR LAN SAID.

"MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO HAVE NOT YET REGISTERED AS VOTERS AND THOSE ELECTORS WHO HAVE CHANGED THEIR RESIDENTIAL ADDRESS SHOULD NOW SIGN UP OR NOTIFY THE AUTHORITIES OF THE CHANGE IN ADDRESS SO THAT THEY CAN CAST THEIR VOTE IN THE ELECTIONS," HE ADDED.

MR LAN SAID THE GOVERNMENT WOULD CONDUCT A SIX-WEEK VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVE FROM MID-AUGUST, AND THAT TODAY'S CONCERT WAS A PRELUDE.

JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD AND RADIO TELEVISION HONG KONG, THE CONCERT ALSO MARKED THE OPENING OF THE STATION'S SOLAR PROJECT '90 TO ENCOURAGE RESIDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN COMMUNITY BUILDING AND TO HELP PROMOTE VOTER REGISTRATION.

THE PROJECT WOULD BE SUPPORTED BY A NUMBER OF POPULAR LOCAL SINGERS AND MOVIE STARS.

OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE CONCERT TODAY WERE OMELCO MEMBER MRS RITA FAN, HEAD OF RTHK'S CHINESE PROGRAMME SERVICE MR RAYMOND NG, AND PRESIDENT OF THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT SOLAR PROJECT '90 ORGANISING COMMITTEE MISS YEUNG KAM-CHUN.

OTHER GUESTS INCLUDED KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICER, MR CHRIS WAN, AND DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR LAM HANG-FAI.

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PUBLIC WARNED ABOUT SUMMER DISEASES

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MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE TODAY (SUNDAY) URGED TO TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS AGAINST CHOLERA AND OTHER GASTROINTESTINAL DISEASES DURING SUMMER MONTHS.

IN MAKING THE APPEAL, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SAID LAST YEAR THERE WERE 29 CHOLERA CASES AND 188 FOOD POISONING CASES WHICH AFFECTED MORE THAN 760 PEOPLE.

DURING THE FIRST HALF OF THIS YEAR, 39 CASES OF FOOD POISONING AFFECTING 156 PEOPLE WERE REPORTED.

"ALTHOUGH ONLY ONE CHOLERA CASE HAS BEEN REPORTED SO FAR THIS YEAR, THE PUBLIC SHOULD NOT RELAX THEIR PRECAUTIONS AGAINST THE DISEASE," THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

"THE MOST RELIABLE AND EFFECTIVE METHOD TO PREVENT CHOLERA AND OTHER COMMUNICABLE DISEASES SUCH AS TYPHOID AND DYSENTERY IS TO OBSERVE PERSONAL, ENVIRONMENTAL AND FOOD HYGIENE," HE STRESSED.

DURING THE SUMMER SEASON, PEOPLE TEND TO BE LESS CAREFUL IN THE CHOICE OF FOOD AND DRINKS. SINCE MOST GASTROINTESTINAL DISEASES ARE TRANSMITTED THROUGH CONTAMINATED FOOD AND DRINK, PEOPLE SHOULD BE EXTRA CAREFUL IN THEIR EATING HABITS.

THE SPOKESMAN ADVISED THAT ALL FOOD SHOULD BE THOROUGHLY COOKED AND SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNCOVERED IF NOT TAKEN IMMEDIATELY.

"THE TYPE OF CHOLERA BEING ENCOUNTERED NOWADAYS IS CHOLERA ET TOR WHICH IS ENDEMIC IN THIS PART OF THE WORLD AND ISOLATED CASES ARE EXPECTED TO OCCUR EVERY NOW AND THEN," HE SAID.

"THE STRICT ADHERENCE TO THE SIMPLE RULES OF PERSONAL HYGIENE SUCH AS WASHING OF HANDS AFTER TOILET AND BEFORE FOOD PREPARATION, AND THE HYGIENIC HANDLING OF FOOD AND DRINKS ARE THE MOST EFFECTIVE WAYS OF PREVENTING CHOLERA AND OTHER DIARRHOEA DISEASES," HE ADDED.

PEOPLE TRAVELLING TO OVERSEAS COUNTRIES WHERE CHOLERA AND OTHER GASTROINTESTINAL DISEASES ARE ENDEMIC ARE ALSO ADVISED TO TAKE SPECIAL CARE IN THE SELECTION OF FOOD AND DRINK.

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NATURAL BEAUTY STILL BEING RETAINED IN HK

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THE SENIOR MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, MR ALLEN LEE, TODAY (SUNDAY) OFFICIATED AT THE YOUTH SERVICE DAY AT THE LIONS NATURE EDUCATION CENTRE AT TSIU HANG SPECIAL AREA IN SAI KUNG.

SPEAKING AT THE CEREMONY, MR LEE SAID IT WAS FORTUNATE THAT HONG KONG, AS A FAST DEVELOPING MODERN CITY, COULD STILL RETAIN SOME OF THE BEST NATURAL BEAUTY OF THE COUNTRYSIDE.

HE NOTED THAT 40 PER CENT OF HONG KONG'S LAND WERE COUNTRY PARKS.

HE COMMENDED THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT FOR PROMOTING SUCH HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT AND PUTTING UP RECREATIONAL FACILITIES IN THE COUNTRY PARKS FOR THE ENJOYMENT OF THE PEOPLE.

MR LEE ALSO COMMENDED THE LIONS CLUB OF HONG KONG AND MACAU, DISTRICT 303 FOR THEIR WORTHWHILE DONATION TO THE HONG KONG'S FIRST NATURE EDUCATION CENTRE DUE TO BE COMPLETED BY JUNE NEXT YEAR.

HE PRAISED THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT, THE LIONS CLUB AND HKTVB FOR ORGANISING SUCH A MEANINGFUL EVENT. IN PARTICULAR, HE PRAISED THE YOUTH, NUMBERED MORE THAN 400, WHO WERE AT TODAY'S FUNCTION FOR HELPING OUT IN MINOR MAINTAINENCE WORK. THIS, HE SAID, HAD SET UP A GOOD EXAMPLE FOR OTHERS IN THE CARING OF THE COUNTRYSIDE.

MR LEE AND OTHER OFFICIATING GUESTS INCLUDING THE SECRETARY FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE, MRS ELIZABETH WONG; DEPUTY SECRETARY FOR PLANNING, ENVIRONMENT AND LANDS, MR CLIVE OXLEY; THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR Y.T. LI; THE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, DR LAWRENCE LEE; AND THE HK TVB GENERAL MANAGER, MR KELLY CHENG VISITED THE LIONS NATURE EDUCATION CENTRE AND WAS BRIEFED ON THE PROGRESS OF CONSTRUCTION.

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ANTI-CRIME PUBLICITY PAYS OFF AT BEACHES

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PUBLICITY EFFORTS BY THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE (DFCC) AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS BY THE POLICE HAVE SUCCEEDED IN KEEPING THE CRIME RATE DOWN AT BEACHES.

SPEAKING AT AN ANTI BEACH CRIME ACTIVITY TODAY (SUNDAY), DFCC CHAIRMAN, MR CHAN YAU-YUE, SAID THERE HAD BEEN A MARKED DECREASE IN BEACH CRIMES IN SOUTHERN SINCE THE FIRST PUBLICITY DRIVE WAS HELD IN 1988.

/"THERE WERE

"THERE WERE 117 REPORTED CRIMES IN 1987, AND THE FIGURE DROPPED TO 50 IN 1988 AND TO 31 LAST YEAR," HE SAID.

HOWEVER, THERE WAS NO ROOM FOR COMPLACENCY AND THE DFCC WAS DETERMINED TO CONTINUE ITS EFFORTS IN THIS AREA, MR CHAN SAID.

THE ABERDEEN POLICE DIVISIONAL COMMANDER, MR TSE CHAN-FAI, ATTRIBUTED THE DROP TO STEPPED-UP PATROLS ON BEACHES BY BOTH UNIFORMED AND PLAIN CLOTHES POLICE OFFICERS AND THE PUBLICITY EFFORTS MADE BY THE DFCC.

HE EXPECTED THAT MORE PEOPLE WOULD VISIT THE BEACHES IN SOUTHERN THIS YEAR AS BETTER FACILITIES WERE NOW AVAILABLE FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF THE URBAN COUNCIL'S IMPROVEMENT WORKS.

THIS MEANT THAT UNRULY ELEMENTS WOULD NOW HAVE MORE TARGETS TO PREY UPON, MR CHAN SAID.

"ALTHOUGH THE POLICE WILL TRY ITS BEST TO CONTINUE FIGHTING BEACH CRIMES, BEACH-GOERS SHOULD ALSO DO THEIR PART BY TAKING CARE OF THEIR OWN PROPERTY AT ALL TIMES," HE SAID.

DURING TODAY'S PUBLICITY DRIVE, DFCC MEMBERS WENT TO REPULSE BAY TO DISTRIBUTE COPIES OF A COLOURFUL ANTI BEACH CRIME LEAFLET AND TO GIVE ADVICE TO SWIMMERS.

THE LEAFLET IS PRODUCED BY THE WESTERN JUNIOR POLICE CALL. USING CARTOONS, IT SPELLS OUT THE PRECAUTIONS THAT BEACH-GOERS SHOULD TAKE TO AVOID BECOMING CRIME VICTIMS.

THE PUBLICITY DRIVE AT BEACHES IS PART OF THE DFCC'S ANTI-CRIME CAMPAIGN THIS YEAR.

ANOTHER MAJOR ACTIVITY, AN ANTI-NARCOTICS BEACH CONCERT, WILL BE HELD AT REPULSE BAY IN THE AFTERNOON OF AUGUST 4. IT WILL BE PRODUCED AND BROADCAST LIVE BY COMMERCIAL RADIO.

OTHER ACTIVITIES WILL INCLUDE VISITS TO SCHOOLS, A FIGHT CRIME EXHIBITION, A "HOME AND SHOP SECURITY" SEMINAR AND A TELEGAMES DAY.

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IMPORTANCE ON KNOWING NEIGHBOURING COMMUNITIES STRESSED

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THE ACTING DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, MR JOHN WINFIELD, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY) IT IS IMPORTANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT THE SITUATIONS AND DEVELOPMENTS OUTSIDE HONG KONG'S IMMEDIATE COMMUNITIES AS THE TERRITORY MOVES INTO THE 1990's.

HE TOLD EIGHT PRIMARY SCHOOL STUDENTS - FOUR BOYS AND FOUR GIRLS - LEAVING FOR THE 1990 ASIAN PACIFIC CHILDREN'S CONVENTION TO BE HELD IN FUJUOKA, JAPAN, THAT IT WAS EQUALLY IMPORTANT TO HAVE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE WAY OF LIVING OF OTHER PEOPLE, PARTICULARLY HONG KONG'S NEIGHBOURS IN THE ASIAN-PACIFIC REGION.

THE STUDENTS WILL REPRESENT HONG KONG IN THE ONE-WEEK CONVENTION, THE SECOND OF ITS KIND, WITH MORE THAN 300 DELEGATES FROM COUNTRIES IN THE REGION.

MR WINFIELD SAID ACTIVITIES OF THIS TYPE, INVOLVING STUDENT PARTICIPATION FROM MORE THAN 30 COUNTRIES, WERE "AN EXCELLENT WAY OF PROMOTING PEACE AND LOVE AT AN INTERNATIONAL LEVEL".

"YOUR STAY IN JAPAN WILL GIVE YOU A WONDERFUL OPPORTUNITY TO MAKE LOTS OF NEW FRIENDS, TO LEARN FROM ONE ANOTHER, AND TO UNDERSTAND AND APPRECIATE CULTURES AND CUSTOMS WHICH YOU ARE NOT FAMILIAR WITH," HE TOLD THE YOUNG REPRESENTATIVES.

HE THANKED THE HONG KONG JUNIOR CHAMBER OF COMMERCE FOR THEIR INITIATIVE IN PROMOTING EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS OF THIS KIND.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF A SUMMER CAMP FOR CHILDREN OF SMALL GROUP HOMES ORGANISED BY THE AGENCY FOR VOLUNTEER SERVICE, MR FUNG SAID EMPLOYEES' PARTICIPATION IN VOLUNTEER SERVICE WOULD HELP FOSTER AMONG THEM A SENSE OF BELONGING.

"IN ADDITION, IT WILL AUGUR WELL IN MAINTAINING A HARMONIOUS LABOUR RELATION," HE SAID.

THE ACTIVITY GUIDELINE WAS FIRST PUBLISHED IN LATE 1988.

THE REVISED EDITION HAS INCORPORATED SUGGESTIONS FROM USERS WHO HAD PROVIDED VALUABLE COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS TO THE JOINT WORKING GROUP.

DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR M.D. CARTLAND SAID THE GUIDELINE SERVED AS A USEFUL REFERENCE MATERIAL IN HELPING CHILD CARE CENTRE STAFF TO PLAN THEIR CURRICULUM AND ASSESS THEIR PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES.

"THE ACTIVITY GUIDELINE LISTED OUT THE CHARACTERISTICS AND DEVELOPMENTAL NEEDS OF CHILDREN IN THEIR EARLY YEARS WITH SUGGESTED PROGRAMME ACTIVITIES TO DEVELOP THEIR APTITUDES IN VARIOUS ASPECTS.

"I HOPE THAT CHILD CARE CENTRE SUPERVISORS CAN SHARE WITH THEIR STAFF THE CONTENT AND SPIRIT OF THIS ACTIVITY GUIDELINE AND TRY OUT THE ACTIVITIES PROPOSED IN THEIR CENTRE," MR CARTLAND ADDED.

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CAUTION AGAINST OVERLOADING OF CRANES

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THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TODAY (SUNDAY) WARNED CONTRACTORS AGAINST OVERLOADING OF CRANES TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS.

THE APPEAL WAS MADE FOLLOWING A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH THE GUANG LEE PILING ENGINEERING CO. LTD. WAS CONVICTED OF HAVING FAILED TO ENSURE THAT A MOBILE CRANE IT USED WAS NOT OVERLOADED.

IT HAD ALSO FAILED TO PROVIDE THE CRANE WITH AN INDICATOR WHICH SHOWED THE RADIUS OF THE JIB AT ALL TIMES AND THE SAFE WORKING LOAD APPLICABLE TO THAT RADIUS.

THE CRANE OVERTURNED AS A RESULT OF OVERLOADING WHEN USED FOR PILING AT A CONSTRUCTION SITE IN WESTERN DISTRICT EARLY THIS YEAR.

THE COMPANY WAS EVENTUALLY FINED \$6,000.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE BASIC REQUIREMENTS FOR SAFE USE OF CRANES WERE SET OUT IN THE CONSTRUCTION SITES (SAFETY) REGULATIONS.

"FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE REQUIREMENTS BY CONTRACTORS WILL NOT ONLY RESULT IN ACCIDENTS, BUT WILL ALSO RENDER THEM PROSECUTION AND A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$50,000," HE WARNED.

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WATER CUTS IN KOWLOON EAST

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FLUSHING WATER SUPPLY TO CERTAIN PREMISES IN EAST KOWLOON WILL BE SUSPENDED FROM 9 AM ON TUESDAY (JULY 24) TO 10 AM ON THURSDAY (JULY 26) TO FACILITATE WATER WORKS.

THE SUSPENSION WILL AFFECT ALL PREMISES AT LAM TIN, SAU MAU PING, SHUN TIN ESTATE, SHUN LEE ESTATE, SHUN ON ESTATE, SHUN CHI COURT, CHOI WAN ESTATE, LOK WAH ESTATE AND KUNG LOK ROAD.

ALSO TO FACILITATE WATER WORKS, FLUSHING WATER SUPPLY TO CERTAIN PREMISES IN KWUN TONG AND NGAU TAU KOK WILL BE SUSPENDED FROM 9 AM ON TUESDAY (JULY 24) TO 10 AM THE NEXT DAY.
