THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS, MR FRANCIS PYM, AND THE MINISTER OF STATE, LORD BELSTEAD, HAVE SENT CONGRATULATORY MESSAGES TO SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE ON HIS RETIREMENT AS GOVERNOR OF HONG KONG.

IN HIS MESSAGE, MR PYM SAID:

+ON YOUR RETIREMENT PLEASE ACCEPT MY WARMEST CONGRATULATIONS ON YOUR OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS AS GOVERNOR OF HONG KONG. THE TERRITORY HAS PROSPERED GREATLY IN THE LAST 10 YEARS. I KNOW HOW MUCH OF THIS IS DUE TO YOUR EFFORTS AND AM VERY GRATEFUL.

SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE HAS ASSUMED THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT AS ACTING GOVERNOR.

AT A CEREMONY IN THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL CHAMBER THIS (SATURDAY) EVENING, SIR PHILIP, HOLDING THE BIBLE, READ THE OATH OF ALLEGIANCE, THE OFFICIAL OATH AND THE JUDICIAL OATH AS PRESCRIBED BY ARTICLE III OF THE LETTERS PATENT.

THE OATHS WERE ADMINISTERED BY THE CHIEF JUSTICE, SIR DENYS ROBERTS, IN THE PRESENCE OF MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

SIR PHILIP THEN SIGNED THE THREE OATHS IN THE OATHS BOOK AND THE CHIEF JUSTICE COUNTER-SIGNED.

APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS
AND CROWN SOLICITOR

THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AND COMMONWEALTH AFFAIRS HAS APPROVED THE PROMOTION OF MR M. LUCAS, Q.C. AND MR J.F. MATHEWS TO LAW OFFICERS.

MR LUCAS WILL FILL THE POST OF DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS IN PLACE OF MR D.R. BOY, Q.C. WHO PROCEEDED ON PRE-RETIREMENT LEAVE RECENTLY.

MR LUCAS, WHO IS 46 YEARS OF AGE, JOINED THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT IN AUGUST 1964 AS A CROWN COUNSEL AFTER FIVE YEARS PRIVATE PRACTICE IN AUSTRALIA. THROUGHOUT HIS CAREER IN THE LEGAL DEPARTMENT MR LUCAS HAS SERVED IN THE PROSECUTIONS DIVISION OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S CHAMBERS. HE HAS ACTED AS DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC PROSECUTIONS ON A NUMBER OF OCCASIONS.

MR MATHEWS WILL FILL THE POST OF CROWN SOLICITOR IN PLACE OF MR F.T.M. JONES WHO LEFT THE SERVICE LAST MONTH ON COMPLETION OF AGREEMENT.

MR MATHEWS IS 40 YEARS OF AGE. FOLLOWING A PERIOD OF FIVE YEARS PRIVATE PRACTICE IN LONDON HE JOINED THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT IN FEBRUARY 1968 AS A CROWN COUNSEL. AFTER SPECIALISING IN LAW DRAFTING FOR MOST OF HIS CAREER IN THE LEGAL DEPARTMENT AND BEING PROMOTED TO DEPUTY PRINCIPAL CROWN COUNSEL IN APRIL 1977 HE TOOK UP THE DUTIES AS DEPUTY CROWN SOLICITOR IN FEBRUARY 1981. HE HAS ACTED AS CROWN SOLICITOR.

NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS IN TSUEN WAN AND KWAI CHUNG

* * * * *

NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS WILL BE INTRODUCED IN TSUEN WAN AND KWAI CHUNG FROM 10 AM ON MONDAY (MAY 10) IN CONNECTION WITH THE OPENING OF MTR TSUEN WAN EXTENSION.

THE NORTHERN KERBSIDE LANE OF SAI LAU KOK ROAD NEAR ITS JUNCTION WITH MEI WAN STREET WILL BE OPEN TO BUSES ONLY.

TO THE EAST OF THIS SECTION, THE LANE WILL BE A 24-HOUR URBAN CLEARWAY WHERE NO VEHICLES, EXCEPT FRANCHISED BUSES, WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS.

THIS APPLIES TO THE ENTIRE SOUTHERN KERBSIDE LANE AS WELL.

CLEARWAY RESTRICTION WILL ALSO BE IMPOSED ON THE NORTHERN KERBSIDE LANE OF SAI LAU KOK ROAD NEAR CHUNG ON STREET BETWEEN 7 AM AND 7 PM DAILY.

IN ADDITION, PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER MEI WAN STREET AND THE APPROACH ROADS FROM KWAI FOOK ROAD, KWAI FUK ROAD AND HING FONG ROAD TO MTR STATIONS IN KWAI FONG AND KWAI HING.

BAND SEMINARS IN MAY

THE ANNUAL CONCERT OF THE HONG KONG YOUTH SYMPHONIC BAND TO BE HELD TOMORROW (SUNDAY) AT THE HONG KONG ART CENTRE WILL SPARK OFF A SERIES OF SEMINARS AND MASTER CLASSES ESPECIALLY AIMED AT YOUNG BAND PLAYERS.

THE MASTER CLASSES, ORGANISED BY THE MUSIC OFFICE, WILL FEATURE TWO HONG KONG PHILHARMONIC PRINCIPAL PLAYERS. DAVID GAUGER, PRINCIPAL TRUMPET, WILL GIVE A MASTER CLASS ON BRASS CHAMBER MUSIC ON TUESDAY (MAY 11), AND DAN SILVER, PRINCIPAL CLARINET, WILL CONDUCT A MASTER CLASS ON WOODWIND CHAMBER MUSIC ON MAY 17. QUINTETS FROM THE HONG KONG YOUTH SYMPHONIC BAND WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE MASTER CLASSES WHICH WILL INCLUDE COACHING OF QUINTETS, DIFFERENT ASPECTS OF INSTRUMENTAL AND SECTION PLAYING.

TWO FURTHER SEMINARS WILL BE GIVEN BY SAMSON CHEUNG, MANAGER OF THE YOUTH SYMPHONIC BAND AND YAU YUEN-HING, CONDUCTOR OF THE WEST KOWLOON YOUTH BAND OF THE MUSIC OFFICE. THEIR SEMINARS ON +BAND MANAGEMENT AND REPERTOIRE+ AND +BAND MUSIC APPRECIATION+ WILL BE GIVEN ON MAY 10 AND MAY 13 RESPECTIVELY.

NEW TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SCHEME IN ABERDEEN

* * * * *

NEW MEASURES TO IMPROVE THE TRAFFIC FLOW IN THE ABERDEEN AREA WILL BE INTRODUCED FROM 10 AM ON MAY 11 (TUESDAY).

THIS IS THE SECOND STAGE OF THE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT SCHEME DESIGNED TO COPE WITH THE TRAFFIC SITUATION AFTER THE OPENING OF THE ABERDEEN TUNNEL.

+AS A RESULT OF THESE MEASURES, IT IS HOPED THAT TRAFFIC CONDITIONS IN THE ABERDEEN TOWN CENTRE CAN BE FURTHER IMPROVED,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (MAY 8).

VEHICLES TRAVELLING ON TUNG SING ROAD WILL ONLY BE ALLOWED TO TURN LEFT INTO ABERDEEN MAIN ROAD, WHILE THOSE FROM ABERDEEN RESERVOIR ROAD SHOULD GO STRAIGHT INTO LOK YEUNG STREET.

IN ADDITION, TRAFFIC ALONG THE UNNAMED ROAD OPPOSITE WU NAM ROAD WILL BE DIRECTED WESTBOUND INTO ABERDEEN MAIN ROAD ONLY.

/CHENGTU ROAD

CHENGTU ROAD NEAR ITS JUNCTION WITH ABERDEEN MAIN ROAD, WU NAM STREET BETWEEN CHENGTU ROAD AND TUNG SING ROAD, LOK YEUNG STREET WILL BE DESIGNATED AS URBAN CLEARWAYS FROM 7 AM TO 10 AM AND FROM 4 PM TO 7 PM DAILY, WHEN ALL VEHICLES EXCEPT FRANCHISED BUSES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS OR GOODS.

ALL PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER CHENGTU ROAD AND LOK YEUNG STREET BETWEEN TUNG SING ROAD AND CHENGTU ROAD, BUT THE EXISTING PLB PROHIBITED ZONES IN LOK YEUNG STREET, TUNG SING ROAD AND SAI ON STREET WILL BE RESCINDED.

SECTIONS OF TUNG SING ROAD AND LOK YEUNG STREET NEAR ABERDEEN MAIN ROAD WILL BE DESIGNATED AS PLB CLEARWAYS FROM 7 AM TO 12 MIDNIGHT DAILY, WHEN ALL PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO STOP FOR PASSENGERS.

HOWEVER, THE EXISTING PLB CLEARWAYS IN WU NAM STREET AND CHENGTU ROAD WILL BE RESCINDED.

THE TERMINUS FOR MAXICAB ROUTE 27 WILL BE RELOCATED FROM SAI ON STREET TO OLD MAIN STREET ABERDEEN.

MEANWHILE, NEW BUS TERMINI WILL ALSO BE INTRODUCED IN THE FOLLOWING LOCATIONS:

- * ROUTE 70 - SAI ON STREET BETWEEN CHENGTU ROAD AND TUNG SING ROAD.
- * ROUTE 72 - TUNG SING ROAD BETWEEN LOK YEUNG STREET AND SAI ON STREET.
- * ROUTE 77 - SAI ON STREET BETWEEN ABERDEEN MAIN ROAD AND TUNG SING ROAD.

AT THE SAME TIME, SEVERAL ROADS WILL BE RE-ROUTED AS FOLLOWS:

- * CHENGTU ROAD ONE WAY SOUTHBOUND;
- * WU NAM STREET ONE WAY EASTBOUND;
- * TUNG SING ROAD BETWEEN ABERDEEN MAIN ROAD AND SAI ON STREET ONE WAY NORTHBOUND;
- * WU PAK STREET BETWEEN CHENGTU ROAD AND TUNG SING ROAD ONE WAY EASTBOUND;
- * TUNG SING ROAD BETWEEN WU PAK STREET AND WU NAM STREET ONE WAY SOUTHBOUND.

+SUPPORT FRONT-LINE PEOPLE IN YOUTH WORK+ CALL
* * * * *

THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR SELWYN ALLEYNE, TODAY (SATURDAY) CALLED FOR ENCOURAGEMENT AND SUPPORT FOR +FRONT-LINE WORKERS+ IN THE FIELD OF WORK WITH CHILDREN AND YOUTH.

HE WAS SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE HONG KONG PLAYGROUND ASSOCIATION'S KAI TAK OUTREACHING TEAM BASE AND FU SHAN CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH CENTRE AT FU SHAN ESTATE IN WONG TAI SIN.

+WE CAN DO THIS BY SHOWING THAT WE ARE SENSITIVE TO THE PROBLEMS THEY FACE, PARTICULARLY THE DIFFICULTIES CAUSED BY SHORTAGES OF TRAINED STAFF AND THAT WE ARE COMMITTED TO IMPROVEMENTS TO THE QUALITY OF SERVICE AND TO THE WAY IN WHICH SERVICES ARE DELIVERED,+ HE SAID.

THE DIRECTOR SAW CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH CENTRES AS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT BECAUSE THEY PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR YOUNG PEOPLE TO MEET, DEVELOP MUTUAL INTERESTS AND WORK IN GROUPS IN AN ATMOSPHERE FREE FROM THE PRESSURE AND COMPETITIVENESS OF THE SCHOOL SETTING.

+THE COMMITMENT OF STAFF IN THESE CENTRES,+ HE SAID, +IS CRITICAL IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF ATTRACTIVE PROGRAMMES AND IN MAKING USE OF THESE OF PROGRAMMES TO DEVELOP IN YOUNG PEOPLE A SENSE OF INVOLVEMENT AND IDENTITY WITH THE COMMUNITY IN WHICH THEY LIVE.+

REFERRING TO OUTREACHING SOCIAL WORK, MR ALLEYNE SAID THE AIM OF THIS APPROACH WAS TO TRY AND REACH THOSE YOUNG PEOPLE WHO WERE NOT ATTRACTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE MORE FORMAL AND ORGANISED TYPES OF ACTIVITY IN CHILDREN'S AND YOUTH CENTRES.

+OUTREACHING SOCIAL WORKERS ARE EXPECTED TO GO INTO THE PARKS, PLAYGROUNDS, GAMES HALLS AND FAST-FOOD SHOPS WHICH ARE THE MODERN DAY HAUNTS OF THESE YOUNG PEOPLE,+ HE SAID.

MANY OF THEM ARE AT RISK IN THE SENSE THAT THEY ARE BORED, AIMLESS, PERHAPS DISILLUSIONED WITH THEIR PRESENT LIFE STYLE AND FAMILY CIRCUMSTANCES AND ARE THEREFORE IN DANGER OF FALLING INTO BAD COMPANY AND POSSIBLY DELINQUENT BEHAVIOUR.

MR ALLEYNE SAID OUTREACHING SOCIAL WORKERS MUST HAVE SPECIAL QUALITIES TO WORK AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE WHO, IN MANY CASES, WERE SUSPICIOUS, UNCO-OPERATIVE AND NEGATIVE IN THEIR ATTITUDES TO THE WORKERS.

+FOR THIS REASON, THIS AREA OF SOCIAL WORK FACES PARTICULAR PROBLEMS IN THE RECRUITMENT OF TRAINED SOCIAL WORKERS,+ HE SAID.

HE WENT ON: +I BELIEVE THE WILLINGNESS OF SOCIAL WORKERS TO GO OUT TO SEEK AND WHERE POSSIBLE PREVENT SOCIAL PROBLEMS, WHICH AFFECT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE, IS CRITICAL IN UNDERLINING THE RELEVANCE OF SOCIAL WORK METHODS IN SERVICES TO CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE.

+THE FAILURE OF AGENCIES TO RETAIN TRAINED WORKERS IN THE OUTREACH FIELD, HOWEVER, MAKES IT EXTREMELY DIFFICULT, ON THE ONE HAND, TO EVALUATE ITS IMPACT AND ON THE OTHER TO PLAN A LONG-TERM ROLE FOR THIS TYPE OF SERVICE IN HONG KONG.+

LECTURES AND DEMONSTRATIONS ON TREE PLANTING

* * * *

THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAS STARTED A SERIES OF LECTURES AND DEMONSTRATIONS ON TREE PLANTING, CARE AND MAINTENANCE OF SHRUBS, CLIMBERS AND CREEPERS FOR SCHOOLS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

SINCE EARLY LAST MONTH, DISTRICT AMENITIES OFFICERS OF THE DEPARTMENT HAD VISITED A NUMBER OF SCHOOLS AND ARRANGED AMENITY PLOTS FOR THE CHILDREN TO PRACTISE TREE PLANTING.

A SPOKESMAN SAID THE LECTURES AND DEMONSTRATIONS WERE AIMED AT ENLISTING MORE YOUNGSTERS TO TAKE PART IN THE 'MAI FA' PHASE - BEAUTIFICATION SCHEME - OF THE CLEAN HONG KONG CAMPAIGN.

EARLY LAST WEEK, 300 SHA TIN STUDENTS FROM SEVERAL SCHOOLS ATTENDED A LECTURE ON TREE PLANTING HELD AT PUI YING MIDDLE SCHOOL.

TODAY (SATURDAY) SOME 20 YOUNGSTERS, WHO WERE MEMBERS OF THE SHENG KUNG HUI SHA TIN SOCIAL SERVICES CENTRE, GATHERED AT AN OPEN SPACE AT TUNG LO WAN TSUEN FOR A PRACTICE COURSE ON TREE PLANTING AND DEMONSTRATED THEIR SKILL.

THE YOUNGSTERS PLANTED SEVERAL PELTOPHORUM PTEROCARPUM THERE. THE TREE, GENERALLY FOUND AT SHA TIN ROADSIDE, IS A MEDIUM-SIZED DECIDUOUS TREE THAT CAN REACH 7.5 METRES IN HEIGHT WITH A SPREADING CROWN AND GRACEFUL FEATHERY LEAVES.

THE DISTRICT AMENITIES OFFICER OF SHA TIN, MR CHAN HUNG-YING, WAS PRESENT AT THE TREE PLANTING ACTIVITY TO GIVE GUIDANCE TO THE YOUNGSTERS.

PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE YOUNGSTERS, MR CHAN EXPRESSED HIS HOPE THAT THEY WOULD BRING HOME THE MESSAGE OF PLANTING AND CARING OF TREES TO THEIR FRIENDS TO HELP IMPLEMENT THE BEAUTIFICATION SCHEME.

SWIMMING TOPS WATER SPORTS ACCIDENT RATE

* * * * *

SWIMMING WAS STILL BY FAR THE TOP-MOST ACCIDENT-PRONE WATER SPORT IN 1981, ACCORDING TO THE LATEST REPORT ON +ACCIDENTS ARISING FROM OUTDOOR PURSUITS+ COMPILED BY THE COMMITTEE ON SAFETY IN OUTDOOR PURSUITS.

STATISTICS BASED ON DATA PROVIDED BY THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE AND THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT REVEALED THAT OF THE 1 365 REPORTED AQUATIC SPORTS ACCIDENTS CLAIMING 13 LIVES, 1 312 OR OVER 96 PER CENT WERE RELATED TO SWIMMING, RESULTING IN 11 PEOPLE DROWNED.

+SWIMMING IS THE MOST POPULAR FORM OF WATER SPORT IN HONG KONG IN THE SUMMER BECAUSE UNLIKE OTHER AQUATIC ACTIVITIES, IT DOES NOT REQUIRE ANY EQUIPMENT OR TEAM MATES,+ SAID MR CHAM SIU-LEUN, CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE SAFETY IN OUTDOOR PURSUITS.

+BUT AS WE ALL KNOW, FAMILIARITY BREEDS CONTEMPT, AND MANY SWIMMERS NEGLECT THE IMPORTANCE OF OBSERVING THE BASIC SAFETY PRECAUTIONS.

+IN MANY CASES, IF THE PARTICIPANTS HAD BEEN MORE CAREFUL, ACCIDENTS COULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED,+ MR CHAM ADDED.

COMPARED WITH THE PREVIOUS YEAR, THERE WAS AN OVERALL DROP OF 11 PER CENT IN WATER SPORTS ACCIDENT RATE IN 1981.

THE MOST DRASTIC DECREASE WAS FOUND IN ROWING ACCIDENTS. IT DROPPED FROM 93 IN 1980 TO ONLY FIVE IN 1981.

ACCIDENTS INVOLVING CANOEING ALSO DECREASED FROM 26 TO TWO AND THOSE INVOLVING SCUBA DIVING FROM TWO TO NIL.

ON THE OTHER HAND, THE ACCIDENT FIGURES FOR PLEASURE BOATING NEARLY DOUBLED, RISING FROM 24 IN 1980 TO 46 IN 1981.

MR CHAM STRESSED THAT DESPITE THE OVERALL REDUCTION IN ACCIDENT RATE, PROMOTIONAL EFFORTS TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC ON SAFETY RULES SHOULD NOT BE SLACKENED.

+THE GOVERNMENT, VOLUNTARY AGENCIES, SPORTS ASSOCIATIONS AND OTHER COMMUNITY BODIES WILL CONTINUE TO ORGANISE SAFETY DEMONSTRATIONS AND PLAY-IN SESSIONS THIS YEAR,+ HE SAID.

+WHILE THE LACK OF PLAY SAFE AWARENESS IS THE MAIN CAUSE FOR ACCIDENTS, LEARNING AND PRACTISING THE SAFETY HINTS SUGGESTED BY EXPERTS ARE THE BEST WAY TO PREVENT THEM,+ HE ADDED.

FIRING PRACTICE WILL TAKE PLACE IN THE HA TSUEN/CASTLE PEAK RANGE FROM WEDNESDAY (MAY 12) TO FRIDAY (MAY 14).

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ARE WARNED NOT TO ENTER THE AREA WHEN RED FLAGS ARE FLYING.
