SIR YUET-KEUNG KAN TO CHAIR ICAC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CORRUPTION

SIR YUET-KEUNG KAN HAS TAKEN OVER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE ICAC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CORRUPTION FROM THE COMMISSIONER, MR. JACK CATER. AT THE SAME TIME, MR. CATER HAS SUCCEEDED SIR YUET-KEUNG KAN AS CHAIRMAN OF THE CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON COMMUNITY RELATIONS. SIR YUET-KEUNG KAN WILL HOWEVER RETAIN HIS MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMITTEE.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY THAT THESE APPOINTMENTS ARE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GOVERNMENT'S VIEW THAT THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON CORRUPTION SHOULD IN THE LONG TERM HAVE AN UNOFFICIAL CHAIRMAN.

MR. CATER'S ASSUMPTION OF THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON COMMUNITY RELATIONS IS ON AN EX-OFFICIO BASIS AND WILL BRING IT INTO LINE WITH THE COMMISSION'S OTHER DEPARTMENTAL ADVISORY BODIES, ALL OF WHICH ARE CHAIRED BY THE COMMISSIONER.

LEGCO MEETS TOMORROW
* * * * *

THE SECRETARY FOR ECONOMIC SERVICES, THE HON. DAVID JEAFFRESON WILL INTRODUCE A MOTION IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY) TO AMEND THE TELEPHONE ORDINANCE TO GIVE LEGISLATIVE EFFECT TO THE PROPOSED ADJUSTMENTS TO TELEPHONE TARIFFS FROM JULY 1, THIS YEAR.

SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER, THE HON. SIR SZE-YUEN CHUNG, WILL SPEAK ON THE MOTION.

DURING THE QUESTION TIME, THE UNOFFICIALS WILL ASK A TOTAL OF 13 QUESTIONS ON VARIOUS MATTERS OF PUBLIC INTEREST.

THE HON. PETER C. WONG WILL ASK THE GOVERNMENT TO STATE THE CAUSES OF THE RECENT FLOODINGS IN TAI PO, SHA TIN AND TUEN MUN AND WHAT EFFECTIVE MEASURES ARE CONTEMPLATED TO PREVENT FUTURE RECURRENCES.

THE HON. S.L. CHEN WILL ASK WHAT ACTION THE GOVERNMENT WILL TAKE AGAINST THE OWNERS OF PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES WHO CHARGE MORE THAN THE FARE INDICATED OR WHO INCREASE FARES FOR PARTICULAR JOURNEYS ON CERTAIN DAYS SIMPLY BY CHANGING THEIR FARE INDICATORS.

THE HON. WONG LAM WILL ASK THE GOVERNMENT TO STATE WHAT PROGRESS HAS BEEN MADE IN THE USE OF CHINESE IN COMMUNICATIONS WITH MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND WITHIN THE CIVIL SERVICES SINCE CHINESE WAS MADE AN OFFICIAL LANGUAGE.

THE REV. THE HON. JOYCE M. BENNETT WILL QUERY WHETHER THE GOVERNMENT WILL TAKE IMMEDIATE STEPS TO ENFORCE A REGULATION IN THE FOOD BUSINESS (NEW TERRITORIES) REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE TRANSPORTATION OF COOKED AND UNCOOKED FOOD, AND STATE HOW MANY PROSECUTIONS FOR OFFENCES UNDER THIS REGULATION HAVE BEEN TAKEN IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS.

THE HON. CHARLES YEUNG WILL ASK WHAT COMPENSATION AND/OR OTHER BENEFITS WILL BE OFFERED OR MADE AVAILABLE BY GOVERNMENT TO PERSONS AFFECTED BY THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY DEVELOPMENT IN URBAN AREAS, THE URBAN RENEWAL SCHEME AND DEVELOPMENTS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

OTHER QUESTIONS TO BE RAISED BY THE UNOFFICIALS CONCERN TONG FAI IN FORMS 1 TO 3 IN SUBSIDISED SECONDARY SCHOOLS, TREATMENT OF STRAY DOGS AND CATS, INSTITUTIONAL CARE FOR MENTALLY RETARDED CHILDREN, MEDICAL FACILITIES ON LAMMA ISLAND AND EXPENDITURE OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY ON PUBLIC HOUSING PROJECTS AND ESTATE MANAGEMENT.

A TOTAL OF NINE BILLS WILL BE INTRODUCED INTO THE COUNCIL FOR FIRST AND SECOND READINGS. THEY ARE THE FIRE SERVICES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978, THE COMPANIES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978, THE HONG KONG TRADE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978, THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978, THE MISCELLANEOUS LICENCES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978, THE JURY (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978, THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND URBAN SERVICES (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL 1978, THE WIDOWS' AND CHILDREN'S PENSIONS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978 AND THE WIDOWS AND ORPHANS PENSION (AMENDMENT) BILL 1978.

SHA TIN INDUSTRIAL SITE SOLD
* * * * *

AN INDUSTRIAL SITE IN SHA TIN FETCHED A RECORD PRICE OF \$20 MILLION FOR THE AREA AT A GOVERNMENT AUCTION TODAY (TUESDAY).

THE 3,782 SQUARE METRE SITE REALISED THE EQUIVALENT OF \$491 PER SQUARE FOOT -- ONLY marginally BELOW URBAN AREA PRICES FOR A COMPARABLE SITE.

THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER WAS NEW YEAR ENTERPRISES LIMITED.

THE AUCTION, HELD AT THE SHA TIN GOVERNMENT SECONDARY SCHOOL, WAS CONDUCTED BY THE SENIOR ESTATE SURVEYOR OF THE SHA TIN DISTRICT OFFICE, MR. ROGER THOMPSON WHO DESCRIBED THE RESULT AS +VERY SATISFACTORY+.

+THE BIDDING WAS VERY KEEN, AS WE EXPECTED, BECAUSE IT IS A VERY GOOD SITE SITUATED AT THE JUNCTION OF TAI PO AND LION ROCK TUNNEL ROADS AT TAI WAI,+ HE SAID.

+THERE WERE ABOUT 10 MAIN BIDDERS AND THE COMPETITION AMONG THEM WAS VERY KEEN.

+IT DIDN'T TAKE LONG TO DOUBLE THE OPENING BID OF \$10 MILLION.+

MR. THOMPSON SAID THE LAST INDUSTRIAL LAND AUCTION IN THE NEW TOWN IN MARCH 1976 HAD REALISED \$312 PER SQUARE FOOT FOR A SITE AT THE FO TAN INDUSTRIAL AREA.

BUT, HE POINTED OUT THAT THE PLOT RATIO ON THE FO TAN SITE ALLOWED FOR DEVELOPMENT OF UP TO 14 STOREYS WHILE THE SITE AUCTIONED TODAY IS RESTRICTED TO SIX OR SEVEN STOREY DEVELOPMENT.

HE ADDED THAT TODAY'S AUCTION REFLECTED THE CONTINUING INTEREST BY DEVELOPERS AND INDUSTRIALISTS IN SHA TIN NEW TOWN AND IN NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT GENERALLY.

SHING MUN BRIDGE TO BE READY NEXT YEAR
* * * * *

A NEW BRIDGE ON THE SHING MUN RIVER, WHICH FORMS PART OF THE NEW TRUNK ROAD IN SHA TIN, IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED BY EARLY 1979.

THE 36-METRE LONG, 16.5-METRE WIDE, REINFORCED CONCRETE BRIDGE HAS BEEN DESIGNED TO ACCOMMODATE FOUR TRAFFIC LANES. INITIALLY, IT WILL PROVIDE ONLY TWO TRAFFIC LANES. AT A LATER DATE, AS TRAFFIC INCREASES, TWO MORE LANES CAN BE ADDED.

COMMENTING ON THE PROGRESS OF THE WORK ON THE BRIDGE, MR. S.K. KWEI, PROJECT MANAGER, SHA TIN NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT OFFICE, SAID THAT THE FOUNDATION (RESTING ON CAST-IN-SITU PILES) AND PIERS HAVE BEEN BUILT FOR THE \$0.9 MILLION BRIDGE ON WHICH WORK STARTED LAST YEAR.

+WE EXPECT THE ENTIRE WORK TO BE COMPLETED EARLY NEXT YEAR.+

VOLUNTARY WELFARE AGENCIES PLAY IMPORTANT ROLE
* * * * *

VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS AND SERVICE CLUBS HAVE AN INCREASINGLY IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY AT A TIME WHEN THE GOVERNMENT IS BREAKING NEW GROUNDS IN WELFARE SERVICES, THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR. THOMAS LEE SAID THIS EVENING.

ADDRESSING THE MEETING OF THE LIONS CLUB OF HAPPY VALLEY, MR. LEE POINTED OUT THAT WITH THE GOVERNMENT ASSUMING FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR COSTLY SCHEMES AND STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS, THE EXISTENCE OF A VIGOROUS AND PROGRESSIVE VOLUNTARY SECTOR IS ESSENTIAL.

+THE SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN GOVERNMENT SUBVENTION TO THE VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS YEAR BY YEAR, AND THE CONTINUOUS AND INTENSIVE INVOLVEMENT OF THE VOLUNTARY SECTOR IN THE JOINT PREPARATION AND REVIEWS OF SOCIAL WELFARE PLANS ARE PRACTICAL INDICATIONS OF THE GOVERNMENT'S VIEWS,+ HE NOTED.

CITING FIGURES TO ILLUSTRATE HIS POINT, MR. LEE SAID THIS YEAR'S SUBVENTION TOWARDS RECURRENT EXPENSES OF VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS AND TRUSTS HAS GONE UP TO \$100 MILLION, AN INCREASE OF \$32 MILLION ON THE APPROVED ESTIMATE FOR LAST YEAR.

/MR. LEE

MR. LEE SAID THE PUBLICATION OF BOTH THE WHITE PAPER AND THE FIVE YEAR PLAN IN 1973, INVOLVING HEAVILY THE VOLUNTARY SERVICE ORGANISATIONS AND THE COMMUNITY IN THE CONSULTATIVE PROCESS, HAVE DEMONSTRATED THE ADVANTAGE OF CLOSE CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND THE VOLUNTARY SECTOR.

HE SAID, VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS HAVE BEEN INVOLVED IN THE DISCUSSION OF THE PROPOSALS AND HAVE MADE USEFUL COMMENTS ON THE GREEN PAPERS ON SERVICES FOR THE ELDERLY, SOCIAL SECURITY DEVELOPMENT AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF PERSONAL SOCIAL WORK AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE PUBLISHED LAST YEAR.

HE SAID THAT AGENCIES CONCERNED WITH RESPECTIVE AREAS OF SERVICES WOULD BE EXPECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN SOME OF THE PROJECTS WITH THE SUPPORT FROM GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS WHEN THE GREEN PAPERS BECOME GOVERNMENT POLICY, AS IN THE CASE OF THE ONE ON REHABILITATION SERVICES WHICH TURNED INTO A WHITE PAPER IN 1977.

+I COULD ENVISAGE THAT THERE WILL BE TREMENDOUS SCOPE IN WHICH VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS CAN MAKE USEFUL CONTRIBUTIONS TOWARDS THE PROVISION OF WELFARE SERVICES IN A WIDE RANGE OF AREAS,+ HE SAID.

BECAUSE OF THE RAPID DEVELOPMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES IN RECENT YEARS, MR. LEE SAID THAT THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, WHICH IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OVERALL COORDINATION OF WELFARE ACTIVITIES AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF GOVERNMENT POLICY IN THE WELFARE FIELD, IS UNDERGOING CONSIDERABLE EXPANSION.

+WITH A HISTORY OF 20 YEARS, THE DEPARTMENT HAS GROWN INTO A FAIR-SIZE ORGANISATION WITH A STAFF OF ABOUT 2,400 AND IS SPENDING AN INCREASING AMOUNT OF MONEY EACH YEAR ON SERVICES OF ALL KINDS PROVIDED THROUGH 160 CENTRES AND OFFICER,+ HE SAID.

MR. LEE POINTED OUT THAT THE DEPARTMENT'S PROVISION OF SOCIAL SECURITY PAYMENTS, FAMILY AND CHILD CARE SERVICE, COMMUNITY AND YOUTH WORK, REHABILITATION AS WELL AS PROBATION AND CORRECTIONS DEMANDED SUBSTANTIAL INCREASES IN EXPENDITURE, WHICH AMOUNTED TO \$415 MILLION FOR THE CURRENT FINANCIAL YEAR.

EQUIPMENT FOR SEWAGE PUMPING STATION

* * * *

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT HAS AWARDED A CONTRACT WORTH JUST OVER A MILLION DOLLARS, FOR THE SUPPLY AND INSTALLATION OF ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT FOR THE TAI PO SEWAGE PUMPING STATION.

SIGNING THE CONTRACT TODAY WERE MR. BOSCO KEOWN, CHIEF ENGINEER OF THE TAI PO AND FAN LING DEVELOPMENT OFFICE OF THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND MR. KENNETH COLE OF MESSRS. ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNOLOGY CO. LTD., THE CONTRACTORS AND AGENTS FOR AKWAPLAN ENGINEERING CO. LTD., U.K.

THE EQUIPMENT CONSISTING OF PUMPS, MOTORS, ONE OVERHEAD CRANE, ELECTRICAL SWITCHGEAR AND VALVES WILL BE SUPPLIED BY FIVE DIFFERENT BRITISH MANUFACTURERS.

EARLIER THIS MONTH AN \$8.1 MILLION CONTRACT WAS AWARDED TO ANOTHER FIRM FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PUMPING STATION AND A 1,560-METRE LONG RISING MAIN PIPELINE ALONG TING KOK ROAD.

THE EIGHT-METRE HIGH PUMPING STATION -- WITH TWO LEVELS BELOW GROUND -- WILL ACCOMMODATE FOUR PUMPS AND HAVE A TRANSFORMER ROOM, STAFF WASHROOMS AND A SPECIALLY DESIGNED VENTILATION SYSTEM.

IT IS EXPECTED THE STATION WILL BE COMPLETED TOWARDS THE END OF NEXT YEAR.

BUS RE-ROUTING FOR MTR WORK IN CHEUNG SHA WAN

A NUMBER OF KMB BUS ROUTES WILL BE DIVERTED AS FROM SUNDAY, (JUNE 25) IN CONJUNCTION WITH NEW TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENTS IN THE SHAM SHUI PO AREA TO FACILITATE THE CONSTRUCTION OF MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY STATIONS AND TUNNELS IN CHEUNG SHA WAN ROAD, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY.

THE FOLLOWING 10 BUS ROUTES WILL BE AFFECTED:

- * ROUTE NO. 2 (STAR FERRY - SO UK): ON JOURNEYS TO SO UK, BUSES WILL BE DIVERTED FROM LAI CHI KOK ROAD TO OPERATE VIA BOUNDARY STREET AND YEE KUK STREET INSTEAD OF LAI CHI KOK ROAD.
- * ROUTE NO. 2A (NGAU TAU KOK - SO UK): ON JOURNEYS TO SO UK, BUSES WILL BE DIVERTED FROM LAI CHI KOK ROAD TO OPERATE VIA BOUNDARY STREET, YEE KUK STREET AND YEE KUK STREET EXTENSION TO REJOIN LAI CHI KOK ROAD=

TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENT IN KWUN TONG

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT KWUN TONG ROAD BETWEEN HONG TAK ROAD AND ELEGANCE ROAD WILL BE CLOSED TO ALL VEHICULAR TRAFFIC BETWEEN 1.30 A.M. AND 5.30 A.M. DAILY ON THURSDAY AND FRIDAY (JUNE 22 AND 23) TO FACILITATE THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION WORKS.

DURING THE CLOSURE PERIOD SOUTHBOUND TRAFFIC ON KWUN TONG ROAD WILL BE DIVERTED VIA NGAU TAU KOK ROAD AND ELEGANCE ROAD TO REJOIN KWUN TONG ROAD.

NORTHBOUND TRAFFIC ON KWUN TONG ROAD WILL BE DIVERTED VIA LAI YIP STREET, WAI YIP STREET TO REJOIN KWUN TONG ROAD. ALTERNATIVELY, VEHICLES CAN PROCEED VIA THE ROUNDABOUT AT THE JUNCTION OF KWUN TONG ROAD AND ELEGANCE ROAD, TO NGAU TAU KOK ROAD AND SHING SHUN ROAD TO REJOIN KWUN TONG ROAD.

WATER CUT IN KOWLOON CITY

WATER SUPPLY TO A NUMBER OF PREMISES IN KOWLOON CITY WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR FIVE HOURS FROM 1 A.M. ON THURSDAY (JUNE 22) TO FACILITATE THE WATERWORKS STAFF TO CARRY OUT LEAKAGE TESTS.
