EDUCATION HELPING TO END MENTAL HEALTH PREJUDICE  
\* \* \* \*

MUCH HAS BEN DONE IN RECENT YEARS TO BREAK DOWN THE BARRIERS AND PREJUDICE THAT HAVE BEEN BUILT UP AGAINST THOSE WHO SUFFER FROM MENTAL ILLNESS, LADY YOUDE SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE MENTAL HEALTH PROMOTION CAMPAIGN, ORGANISED BY THE JOINT COUNCIL FOR THE PHYSICALLY AND MENTALLY DISABLED (REHABILITATION DIVISION, HONG KONG COUNCIL OF SOCIAL SERVICE), LADY YOUDE SAID SUCH PREJUDICES AROSE LARGELY FROM A LACK OF UNDERSTANDING.

SHE NOTED THAT MANY OF THOSE SUFFERING FROM MENTAL OR EMOTIONAL DISORDER WOULD BE ABLE TO RETURN TO THE COMMUNITY AFTER MEDICAL TREATMENT AND SOCIAL REHABILITATION AND LEAD NORMAL LIVES.

+THE TASK THAT FACES US ALL IS TO EDUCATE THE PUBLIC TO A MORE CARING AND UNDERSTANDING ATTITUDE.+

LADY YOUDE COMMENDED GOVERNMENT BODIES, DISTRICT BOARDS AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES FOR ORGANISING CONFERENCES, SEMINARS AND EXHIBITIONS TO INCREASE SUCH UNDERSTANDING.

+BUT WE MUST CONTINUE TO LOOK FOR WAYS OF CREATING A MORE POSITIVE ATTITUDE TOWARDS MENTAL ILLNESS,+ SHE SAID.

THE CAMPAIGN, SHE ADDED, WAS AIME AT PROMOTING SUCH AN ATTITUDE AND TO INCREASE PUBLIC AWARENESS OF THE SERVICES THAT WERE AVAILABLE TO THE MENTALLY ILL, TO RECUPERATING PATIENTS AND TO THEIR FAMILIES.

LADY YOUDE SAID IT WOULD BRING HOME TO THOSE WHO SAW THE EXHIBITIONS - OR WHO HEARD ABOUT THEM THROUGH THE MEDIA - THE FACT THAT MENTAL ILLNESS WAS NOT JUST A PROBLEM FOR THE INDIVIDUAL SUFFERERS OR FOR THEIR FAMILIES. +IT SHOULD BE A COMMUNITY CONCERN, AND WE ALL HAVE A PART TO PLAY.+

PROVISIONAL TRADE FIGURES FOR APRIL  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE VALUE OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS IN APRIL 1986, AT \$11 348 MILLION, GREW BY 17.5 PER CENT OR \$1 688 MILLION COMPARED WITH APRIL 1985, WHILE THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS GREW BY 0.6 PER CENT OR \$61 MILLION TO \$9 560 MILLION, ACCORDING TO THE PROVISIONAL TRADE FIGURES PUBLISHED TODAY BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

TAKING DOMESTIC EXPORTS AND RE-EXPORTS TOGETHER, THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS, AT \$20 908 MILLION, WAS 9.1 PER CENT OR \$1 749 MILLION HIGHER THAN IN APRIL 1985.

THE VALUE OF IMPORTS GREW BY 13.5 PER CENT OR \$2 678 MILLION OVER APRIL 1985 TO REACH \$22 477 MILLION.

AS THE VALUE OF IMPORTS GREW AT A FASTER RATE THAN THAT OF TOTAL EXPORTS, THE VISIBLE TRADE GAP, THAT IS THE PROPORTION OF THE VALUE OF IMPORTS NOT COVERED BY THAT OF TOTAL EXPORTS, WIDENED TO 7.0 PER CENT IN APRIL 1986 FROM 3.2 PER CENT IN APRIL 1985.

PUTTING THE MONTH'S TRADE FIGURES INTO CONTEXT, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1986 WAS \$74 059 MILLION, MADE UP OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS OF \$40 494 MILLION AND RE-EXPORTS OF \$33 565 MILLION.

COMPARED WITH THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1985, THE VALUE OF TOTAL EXPORTS GREW BY \$451 MILLION OR 0.6 PER CENT, AND OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS BY \$1 859 MILLION OR 4.8 PER CENT, WHILE THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS FELL BY \$1 408 MILLION OR 4.0 PER CENT.

OVER THIS PERIOD, THE VALUE OF IMPORTS GREW BY \$4 351 MILLION OR 5.9 PER CENT, TO \$78 149 MILLION. AS THE VALUE OF IMPORTS GREW AT A FASTER RATE THAN THAT OF TOTAL EXPORTS, THE VISIBLE TRADE GAP FOR THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF 1986 WIDENED TO 5.2 PER CENT, FROM 0.3 PER CENT FOR THE CORRESPONDING PERIOD IN 1985.

COMMENTING ON THESE FIGURES, A GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT AFTER HAVING DECLINED FOR MOST OF 1985 IN TERMS OF YEAR-ON-YEAR COMPARISON, THE VALUE OF DOMESTIC EXPORTS RECOVERED IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1986 AND THIS TREND CONTINUED INTO APRIL.

IMPROVED ECONOMIC GROWTH IN THE UNITED STATES IN THE FIRST QUARTER AND THE DEPRECIATION OF THE HONG KONG DOLLAR AGAINST MOST MAJOR CURRENCIES OTHER THAN THE US DOLLAR CONTRIBUTED TO THIS RECOVERY.

ON THE OTHER HAND, THE VALUE OF RE-EXPORTS DECLINED BY 6 PER CENT IN THE FIRST QUARTER AND GREW marginally IN APRIL, PROBABLY REFLECTING THE EFFECT OF CHINA'S INCREASED CONTROLS OVER ITS FOREIGN EXCHANGE SPENDING.

THE PERMANENT SECRETARY OF HER MAJESTY'S TREASURY, SIR PETER WIDDLETON, WILL VISIT HONG KONG FROM MAY 26 TO 31.

DURING HIS STAY, SIR PETER WILL MEET THE GOVERNOR, THE CHIEF SECRETARY, THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY AND OTHER GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.

HE WILL ALSO MEET THE SENIOR BRITISH TRADE COMMISSIONER AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE BANKING, FINANCE, AND BUSINESS SECTORS.

SIR PETER WILL GO ON A HELICOPTER FAMILIARISATION TOUR AND VISIT THE CASTLE PEAK POWER PLANT AND THE UNIFIED STOCK EXCHANGE.

\$120 000 RAISED FOR +NEW+ ROAD SAFETY TOWN

THE ROAD SAFETY PUBLICITY COMMITTEE HAS SECURED SPONSORSHIP OF \$120 000 FROM SIX PRIVATE ORGANISATIONS FOR THE REFURBISHMENT OF THE 16-YEAR-OLD SAU MAU PING ROAD SAFETY TOWN.

A PEDAL CAR TELEMATCH TITLED +CELEBRITY DRIVE GAME+ WAS HELD AT THE TOWN TODAY (SATURDAY) TO OFFICIALLY THANK THE SPONSORS INVOLVED.

OFFICIATING AT THE START OF THE CELEBRITY DRIVE GAME, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR (TRAFFIC), ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE, MR JOHN CLEMENCE, SAID, +THE TOWN WAS FIRST CONSTRUCTED IN 1970 AND SINCE THAT TIME MANY THOUSANDS OF CHILDREN HAVE PASSED THROUGH ITS GATES AND BEEN INSTRUCTED IN THE BASICS OF ROAD SAFETY.+

THE TOWN HAD ALSO PROVIDED AN OUTING FOR SUCH CHILDREN AND ITS SERVICES WERE IN VERY HEAVY DEMAND, HE ADDED.

MORE THAN 900 ELDERLY PEOPLE HAVE JOINED THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD'S COMMUNITY MEDICAL SCHEME WHICH PROVIDES MEDICAL SERVICES AT A REDUCED RATE TO LOCAL SENIOR RESIDENTS, A SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

ABOUT ONE-THIRD OF THE PRIVATE DOCTORS AND DENTISTS PRACTICING IN THE DISTRICT HAVE AGREED TO OFFER REDUCED RATES TO PEOPLE WHO HAVE JOINED THE SCHEME.

THE SCHEME, INTRODUCED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD'S SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE IN JANUARY, AIMS AT PROVIDING PRIORITY MEDICAL AND DENTAL TREATMENT AT REDUCED COST FOR PEOPLE AGED 60 OR OVER.

+WE ARE PLEASED THAT MANY DOCTORS HAVE JOINED THE SCHEME AND WE HOPE MORE WILL SIGN UP TO RENDER THEIR SERVICES TO THE ELDERLY,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+ACCORDING TO THE 1981 CENSUS, THE DISTRICT HAS ABOUT 19 500 PEOPLE WHO ARE OVER 60 YEARS OLD,+ HE SAID.

ELIGIBLE RESIDENTS SHOULD APPLY IN PERSON TO THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE IN ABERDEEN CENTRE OR ITS WAH FU AND STANLEY SUB-OFFICES, BRINGING WITH THEM THEIR IDENTITY CARDS AND DOCUMENTS TO PROVE THEIR RESIDENCY IN THE DISTRICT.

THE CARD WILL ALSO INDICATE WHETHER THE HOLDER IS RECEIVING ANY FORM OF SOCIAL WELFARE ALLOWANCE SO THAT THE DOCTOR CAN FULLY ASSESS THE PERSON'S NEEDS.

+NEVERTHELESS, APPLICANTS NEED NOT BE RECIPIENTS OF SOCIAL WELFARE ALLOWANCES TO QUALIFY SO LONG AS THEY MEET THE AGE AND ABODE CRITERIA,+ THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.
