UK URGED TO TAKE MORE VIETNAMESE REFUGEES
* * * * *

THE UNITED NATIONS HIGH COMMISSIONER FOR REFUGEES, MR POUL HARTLING, SAID TODAY (MONDAY) HE HOPED THE UNITED KINGDOM WOULD TAKE THE INITIATIVE TO ACCEPT MORE VIETNAMESE REFUGEES FROM HONG KONG BECAUSE THAT MIGHT ENCOURAGE OTHER RESETTLEMENT COUNTRIES TO ACCEPT MORE ALSO.

MR HARTLING WAS TALKING TO REPORTERS AFTER TOURING THE BOWRING CLOSED CENTRE FOR REFUGEES IN TUEN MUN.

HE SAID HE WOULD BE HOLDING DISCUSSIONS WITH HONG KONG GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON THE CONCEPT OF CLOSED CAMPS AS WELL AS WAYS TO SPEED UP THE RESETTLEMENT PROGRAMME.

+WE WILL DO WHAT WE CAN WITH THAT BECAUSE THAT IS IN THE HANDS OF THE RESETTLEMENT COUNTRIES,+ HE SAID.

ON HIS VISIT TO THE BOWRING CLOSED CENTRE THIS MORNING, MR HARTLING POINTED OUT THAT HE DID NOT LIKE THE IDEA OF CLOSED CAMPS.

I THINK THE HONG KONG AUTHORITIES ALSO DID NOT LIKE THE IDEA OF CLOSED CAMPS, HE SAID.

+BUT INSIDE, I FOUND THE CIRCUMSTANCES, THE CONDITIONS VERY ENCOURAGING.

+I ALWAYS LOOK AT THE CHILDREN,+ HE SAID. +I CAN TELL YOU THAT WE HAVE 10 MILLION REFUGEES IN THE WORLD, HALF OF THEM ARE CHILDREN.+

MR HARTLING TOLD REPORTERS THAT IF THEY WENT AND SAW THE REFUGEE CHILDREN IN OTHER COUNTRIES, THEY WOULD FIND SOME OF THEM STARVING, SICK, DESTITUTE, AND WITH TEARS IN THEIR EYES.

+NOW LOOK AT THE CHILDREN HERE. YOU HAVE SEEN THEM YOURSELVES,+ HE SAID.

+I WAS ENCOURAGED TO SEE THAT, AND I THINK BOTH THE AUTHORITIES HERE AND THE VOLUNTARY AGENCIES ARE DOING A VERY GOOD JOB AND FOR THAT I AM VERY GRATEFUL.+

IN REPLY TO A QUESTION ON WHETHER THE SPEEDIER RESETTLEMENT OF REFUGEES WOULD ENCOURAGE MORE TO COME HERE, MR HARTLING SAID HE DID NOT THINK A +PULL FACTOR+ WOULD BE CREATED BY FASTER RESETTLEMENT.

+IN THE YEARS 1979-80, HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS WERE TAKEN AWAY FROM THESE COUNTRIES HERE AND ALSO FROM HONG KONG, AND THEN AT THE SAME TIME, ARRIVALS WENT DOWN,+ HE SAID.

EARLIER, MR HARTLING SPENT MORE THAN AN HOUR LOOKING AT VARIOUS FACILITIES INSIDE THE BOWRING CLOSED CENTRE AND TALKING TO REFUGEES HOUSED THERE.

THE CENTRE, CONVERTED FROM AN ARMY BARRACKS AT A COST OF SOME \$10 MILLION, WAS OPENED ON MARCH 1 THIS YEAR. IT HAS A POPULATION OF JUST OVER 1 000.

THE SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND PROVIDES EDUCATIONAL, SOCIAL AND RECREATIONAL SERVICES IN THE CENTRE. THE UNITED NATIONS HIGH COMMISSION FOR REFUGEES HELPS TO FINANCE EDUCATIONAL PROJECTS IN THE CENTRE IN ADDITION TO THE GOVERNMENT'S FUNDING IN THE FIELDS OF SOCIAL AND RECREATIONAL SERVICES.

MR HARTLING WAS ACCOMPANIED ON HIS VISIT BY MR KEN WOODHOUSE, PRINCIPAL ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR SECURITY, MRS DOLORES LASAN, CHARGE DE MISSION, UNITED NATIONS HIGH COMMISSION FOR REFUGEES, AND OTHER GOVERNMENT AND UNHCR OFFICIALS.

HK TEAM TO VISIT FUJIAN

THE TEAM COMPRISES THE POLITICAL ADVISER, MR JOHN BOYD; THE DIRECTOR OF IMMIGRATION, MR ALAN CARTER; ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF IMMIGRATION, MR JOHN H.C. YEUNG; AND INTERPRETER MISS VIVIEN FONG.

THE PURPOSE OF THEIR VISIT IS TO ESTABLISH CONTACT WITH THE FUJIAN AUTHORITIES AND TO SEE PLACES OF INTEREST IN THE PROVINCE.

THEY WILL HOLD DISCUSSIONS ON STRENGTHENING COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO SIDES.

MORE WORK STARTS ON EXTENDING QUEEN MARY HOSPITAL
* * * * *

A \$389-MILLION CONTRACT WAS AWARDED TODAY FOR WORK ON THE SECOND OF A THREE-STAGE PROGRAMME TO EXTEND AND IMPROVE FACILITIES AT QUEEN MARY HOSPITAL IN POK FU LAM.

PART OF AN \$864-MILLION OVERALL SCHEME, THE CONTRACT WAS SIGNED TODAY (MONDAY) BY THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDING DEVELOPMENT, MR CHAU CHAM-SON, AND THE DIRECTOR OF OVERSEAS DIVISION OF SHIMIZU CONSTRUCTION COMPANY LIMITED, MR MAMORU ASAHATA.

WORK ON THE SECOND STAGE INVOLVES THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO BUILDINGS, ONE 29 STOREYS HIGH AND FRONTING POK FU LAM ROAD AND THE OTHER OF 12 STOREYS TO BE BUILT AT THE REAR OF THE HOSPITAL.

WORK WILL ALSO BE CARRIED OUT TO IMPROVE SOME OF THE EXISTING FACILITIES, SUCH AS EXTENDING THE KITCHEN, BUILDING A NEW MAIN ENTRANCE AND ALTERING THE CASUALTY BLOCK.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT 76 000 SQUARE METRES MORE HOSPITAL SPACE WOULD BE AVAILABLE IN THE NEW BUILDINGS, WHICH WOULD BE CONNECTED TO THE EXISTING HOSPITAL BY BRIDGES AND TUNNELS.

THE TALLER BUILDING WOULD BE MAINLY FOR PAEDIATRIC PATIENTS, AND WOULD INCLUDE INTENSIVE CARE UNITS AND A NEW PAEDIATRIC OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

+THE BUILDING WILL ALSO BE PROVIDING WARDS FOR DIALYSIS, UROLOGY, ORTHOPAEDIC, RECONSTRUCTIVE, OBSTETRIC AND PRIVATE PATIENTS AND A NEW BURNS UNIT.

+THERE WILL ALSO BE ADDITIONAL OPERATION THEATRES, X-RAY ROOMS, LABORATORIES, STERILISING FACILITIES AND STAFF ACCOMMODATION,+ HE ADDED.

THE LOWER BLOCK WOULD HOUSE THE PSYCHIATRIC UNIT WITH WARDS AND FACILITIES FOR BOTH IN-PATIENTS AND OUT-PATIENTS. THERE WOULD ALSO BE A NEW CUSTODIAL WARD AND A MAJOR EXTENSION TO THE EXISTING CASUALTY DEPARTMENT.

ON COMPLETION OF THE WORK IN THE LATTER PART OF 1988, PATIENTS WILL BE MOVED INTO THE 844 BEDS AVAILABLE IN THE NEW BUILDINGS TO ALLOW UPGRADING WORK TO START ON WARDS IN THE EXISTING BLOCK.

+WE HAVE ENGAGED THE CONSULTANT FIRM OF LLEWELYN-DAVIES WEEKS TO UNDERTAKE THE PLANNING AND OVERALL DESIGN OF THE TWO BUILDINGS IN CONSULTATION WITH THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND THE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG. THIS IS BECAUSE QUEEN MARY SERVES AS THE REGIONAL HOSPITAL FOR HONG KONG ISLAND AS WELL AS BEING THE TEACHING HOSPITAL FOR THE UNIVERSITY'S MEDICAL FACULTY,+ HE SAID.

/BUILDING WORK

BUILDING WORK IS EXPECTED TO START AT THE END OF THIS MONTH ON A SITE ALREADY FORMED UNDER AN EARLIER CONTRACT. IN OCTOBER THIS YEAR, WORK WILL START ON EXTENDING THE MEAL KITCHEN IN THE EXISTING BUILDING AND PROVIDING A TEMPORARY STAFF CANTEEN TO REPLACE ONE NOW OCCUPYING PART OF THE CONSTRUCTION SITE.

+THE PROJECT REPRESENTS A CONSIDERABLE CHALLENGE IN THE INTEGRATION OF MAJOR NEW BUILDINGS WITHIN THE SITE OF AN EXISTING REGIONAL HOSPITAL,+ HE SAID.

+RESTRICTIONS HAVE BEEN MADE TO LIMIT DISTURBANCE CAUSED BY BUILDING WORKS, AND THIS WILL BE CLOSELY MONITORED BY US,+ HE ADDED.

DURING THE FINAL STAGES OF REDEVELOPMENT, WHICH IS EXPECTED TO START NEXT YEAR, WORK WILL INVOLVE FURTHER UPGRADING, RENEWAL OF BUILDING SERVICES, INTRODUCTION OF CENTRAL AIR-CONDITIONING TO EXISTING WARDS, EXTENSIONS TO THE SISTERS' AND NURSES' QUARTERS, EXPANSION OF THE MORTUARY AND IMPROVEMENT TO THE CLINICAL PATHOLOGY BUILDING AND AN EXTENSION TO THE RADIOTHERAPY UNIT.

FOLLOWING THE SIGNING OF THE MAIN CONTRACT, MR ASAHATA OF SHIMIZU CONSTRUCTION ALSO SIGNED AGREEMENTS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE THREE MAIN SUB-CONTRACTORS.

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY TODAY (MONDAY) DECLARED TWO TWO-STOREY WAREHOUSES INSIDE THE KOWLOON DOCKS, HUNG HOM, TO BE IN A DANGEROUS CONDITION FOLLOWING A FOURTH ALARM FIRE YESTERDAY.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE SAID THAT INSPECTIONS HAD SHOWN MOVEMENTS IN THE BRICK AND STEEL WORKS.

+AS THERE WAS A RISK OF COLLAPSE, IT WAS THEREFORE NECESSARY TO CLOSE THE STRUCTURES,+ HE SAID.

NOTICES OF INTENTION TO APPLY FOR CLOSURE ORDERS IN KOWLOON DISTRICT COURT AT 9.30 AM TOMORROW WERE POSTED TODAY.

YOUNG SWIMMING, DIVING TALENT SOUGHT
* * * * *

MANY HUNDREDS OF HONG KONG'S YOUNG PEOPLE WILL BE GIVEN THE CHANCE TO PROVE THEMSELVES IN SWIMMING, DIVING AND SYNCHRONISED SWIMMING, UNDER A COMPREHENSIVE, TERRITORY-WIDE TRAINING SCHEME TO BE STARTED SHORTLY.

THE IDEA OF THE PROGRAMME IS TO SEARCH OUT AND DEVELOP YOUNG PEOPLE'S TALENTS IN THESE AQUATIC SPORTS SO AS TO PREPARE THEM FOR EVENTUAL PARTICIPATION IN INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS.

+IT IS THE FIRST TIME WE ARE ORGANISING SPORTS PROGRAMMES ON SUCH A COMPREHENSIVE SCALE,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE MUNICIPAL SERVICES BRANCH SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

THE SPORTS DEVELOPMENT AND SERVICES SECTION OF THE MUNICIPAL SERVICES BRANCH IS ORGANISING THE SCHEME, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE HONG KONG AMATEUR SWIMMING ASSOCIATION, THE HONG KONG SWIMMING TEACHERS' ASSOCIATION, THE URBAN COUNCIL AND THE PROVISIONAL REGIONAL COUNCIL.

IN THE SWIMMING SECTION OF THE SCHEME, A 10-MONTH LONG DEVELOPMENT COURSES WILL BE OFFERED TO SOME 2 000 YOUTHS BETWEEN THE AGES OF EIGHT AND 15, DIVIDED INTO THREE STAGES.

PARTICIPANTS WILL START FROM STAGE ONE AND, AFTER PASSING QUALIFYING TESTS, WILL PROGRESS ON TO STAGE TWO FOR +BRONZE SQUAD+ TRAINING, AND THEN STAGE THREE -- +SILVER SQUAD+ TRAINING.

OUTSTANDING SWIMMERS COMPLETING THE THIRD STAGE WILL BE RECOMMENDED FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE AGE-GROUP SWIMMING COMPETITION.

ANOTHER COURSE IS IN THE RELATIVELY NEW SPORT OF SYNCHRONISED SWIMMING, WHICH WILL BE OPEN TO MORE THAN 500 PERSONS ABOVE THE AGE OF 12.

BASIC TECHNIQUES WILL BE TAUGHT IN THE ELEMENTARY TRAINING AND INTERMEDIATE TRAINING CLASSES TO BE HELD FROM THIS MONTH TILL OCTOBER.

THE COURSE WILL END IN A COMPETITION, FROM WHICH THE MOST TALENTED SWIMMERS WILL BE CHOSEN FOR FURTHER TRAINING.

AND A COURSE IN DIVING WILL BE INTRODUCED FOR 700 YOUTHS BETWEEN THE AGES OF 14 AND 35, ALSO FROM THIS MONTH UNTIL OCTOBER.

AFTER ELEMENTARY AND INTERMEDIATE TRAINING, THEY WILL TAKE PART IN A DIVING COMPETITION TO GAIN EXPERIENCE.

THERE WILL ALSO BE A TALK ON LAW OF RELEVANCE TO THE PRESS BY THE ASSISTANT TO THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, MR WILLIAM MARSHALL.

TENDERS INVITED FOR NEW HOUSING PROJECTS
* * * *

PUBLIC HOUSING DEVELOPMENT IS MOVING FAST FORWARD IN THE BUDDING NEW TOWNS OF JUNK BAY AND MA ON SHAN AS BUILDING TENDERS ARE INVITED FOR TWO NEW ESTATE PROJECTS THERE.

THE TENDERS WILL COVER THE SECOND PHASE OF TSUI LAM ESTATE IN JUNK BAY AND THE FIRST PHASE OF YIU ON ESTATE IN MA ON SHAN, BOTH THE SECOND ESTATE FOR THE TWO NEW TOWNS.

AT TSUI LAM ESTATE, FOUR MORE BLOCKS WILL BE BUILT TO HOUSE 11 000 PEOPLE BY 1988.

OTHER WORKS WILL INCLUDE THE CONSTRUCTION OF TWO PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND A SEVEN-STOREY COMMERCIAL CENTRE, PLUS ASSOCIATED ROADS.

DEVELOPED IN THREE PHASES, TSUI LAM ESTATE WILL BE FULLY BUILT BY 1989 PROVIDING HOMES FOR 26 000 PEOPLE IN EIGHT RENTAL AND THREE HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME BLOCKS.
