THE DEPUTY REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR KEVIN MAK, PRAISED LOCAL ORGANISATIONS TODAY (FRIDAY) FOR THEIR CONTRIBUTION IN ORGANISING DISTRICT CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES.

HE SAID THE EFFORTS MADE BY LOCAL BODIES IN ORGANISING DISTRICT CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES AS WELL AS MAJOR FUNCTIONS ON FESTIVAL DAYS HAD GIVEN RESIDENTS OPPORTUNITIES TO ENJOY A HEALTHY SPIRITUAL LIFE AND TO DEVELOP A SENSE OF BELONGING.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE SHAM SHUI PO MID-AUTUMN LANTERN CARNIVAL, MR MAK SAID THE CO-ORGANISERS OF THE EVENT, THE SHAM SHUI PO ARTS ASSOCIATION AND THE SHAM SHUI PO KAI FONG ASSOCIATION, WERE AMONG THE VARIOUS ORGANISATIONS WHICH HAD GIVEN WORTHY SUPPORT IN ARRANGING RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR RESIDENTS.

MONG KOK CAMPAIGN TO BOOST CIVIC AWARENESS

A PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN WILL BE LAUNCHED IN MONG KOK NEXT MONTH TO BOOST CIVIC AWARENESS AMONG RESIDENTS.

THE CAMPAIGN WILL AIM AT ENHANCING RESIDENTS' UNDERSTANDING OF CIVIC RIGHTS AND DUTIES, INCREASING THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF THE OPERATION AND JURISDICTION OF GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, AND ENCOURAGING PARTICIPATION IN DISTRICT AFFAIRS.

AN ORGANISING COMMITTEE HAS BEEN FORMED UNDER THE MONG KOK DISTRICT BOARD TO HELP CO-ORDINATE THE CIVIC EDUCATION WORK OF LOCAL BODIES AND GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE, MR HO FEI-CHI, NOTED THAT A SIMILAR PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN WAS ORGANISED LAST YEAR TO STIMULATE RESIDENTS' CIVIC-MINDEDNESS.

HE SAID THE CAMPAIGN THIS YEAR WOULD STRESS THE PRACTICAL ASPECTS OF CIVIC EDUCATION BY URGING RESIDENTS TO SHOW RESPONSIBLE CITIZENSHIP IN DAILY LIFE, THUS CONTRIBUTING TO THE WELL-BEING OF THE COMMUNITY.

A TOTAL OF 12 ACTIVITIES WOULD BE ORGANISED DURING THE CAMPAIGN PERIOD FROM MID-OCTOBER TO FEBRUARY, HE SAID.

MR HO SAID A SURVEY WAS BEING PLANNED TO COLLECT RESIDENTS' VIEWS ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION.

+THE FINDINGS WILL SERVE AS INDICATORS OF THEIR LEVEL OF CIVIC AWARENESS AND WILL BE USED FOR FORMULATING STRATEGIES TO MOUNT FUTURE PUBLICITY DRIVES ON CIVIC EDUCATION.+

A CATALOGUE WAS ALSO BEING COMPILED AND WOULD LIST BOOKS AND READING MATERIALS ON CIVIC EDUCATION THAT WERE KEPT IN THE DISTRICT OFFICE FOR PUBLIC USE, HE SAID.

+LOCAL ORGANISATIONS AND SCHOOLS WILL RECEIVE COPIES OF THE CATALOGUE FOR REFERENCE.+

MR HO ADDED THAT THE COMMITTEE HAD ENLISTED THE SUPPORT OF DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS, BY ALLOCATING TO THEM FUNDS FOR ORGANISING A WIDE RANGE OF ACTIVITIES.

THESE INCLUDED DEBATES, SEMINARS, LECTURES, CARNIVALS, VISITS AND GAMES.

HE SAID THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN WOULD PUT EMPHASIS ON RESIDENTS AGED 15 AND OVER AS CHILDREN WERE NORMALLY ATTENDING SCHOOLS WHERE CIVIC EDUCATION WAS TAUGHT SYSTEMATICALLY.

A BUDGET OF MORE THAN \$70 000 HAD BEEN EARMARKED FOR THE PROJECT, WITH \$45 800 BEING ALLOCATED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD AND THE BALANCE COMING FROM THE DISTRICT OFFICE, HE ADDED.

THE FILM SHOW WAS THE FIRST IN A SERIES OF PROGRAMMES ORGANISED BY THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE.

OTHER PROGRAMMES INCLUDE A SEMINAR ON THE PREVENTION OF SHOPLIFTING, A CHINESE SOLGAN COMPETITION FOR STUDENTS, AN EXHIBITION ON SECURITY DEVICES AND VISITS TO POLICE STATIONS.

AT TODAY'S OPENING CEREMONY, WAN CHAI DISTRICT OFFICER, MR ROGER GARCIA, SAID THE CAMPAIGN WOULD PRESENT A SERIES OF PROGRAMMES FROM THIS MONTH TO JANUARY NEXT YEAR, AND HE HOPED THAT RESIDENTS WOULD PARTICIPATE IN THEM AND HELP PROMOTE THE FIGHT CRIME MESSAGE.

HE POINTED OUT THAT THE COMMITTEE HAD BEEN ORGANISING COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ACTIVITIES EVERY YEAR IN THE FORM OF A CAMPAIGN WITH A VIEW TO AROUSING PUBLIC AWARENESS OF CRIME PREVENTION AND GOOD CITIZENSHIP.

+THIS YEAR WE ARE FOLLOWING THE CENTRAL FIGHT CRIME CAMPAIGN AND CONCENTRATING ON THE PREVENTION OF RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES AND CARRYING OUT A PHASED EXPANSION OF THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME.

+OUR DISTRICT CAMPAIGN ALSO AIMS AT THE PREVENTION OF SHOPLIFTING AND COMMERCIAL BURGLARIES,+ HE SAID.

MR GARCIA NOTED THAT THE COMMITTEE HAD RECENTLY STARTED THE SECOND PHASE OF THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME IN WAN CHAI DISTRICT WITH PARTICIPATION FROM 296 HOUSEHOLDS IN FOUR SELECTED BUILDINGS.

+THE NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS IS VERY SATISFACTORY= AND IT IS HOPED THE SCHEME CAN HELP RESIDENTS WORK TOGETHER TO COMBAT RESIDENTIAL BURGLARIES,+ HE ADDED.

A SEMINAR ON THE NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH SCHEME AND CRIME PREVENTION WILL BE HELD FOR CENTRAL AND WESTERN RESIDENTS TOMORROW (SATURDAY).

MORE THAN 300 RESIDENTS FROM SIX BLOCKS INVOLVED IN THE SCHEME HAVE BEEN INVITED TO ATTEND THE SEMINAR, TO START AT THE PALM SPRING RESTAURANT AT 5 PM.

THE SEMINAR IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT FIGHT CRIME COMMITTEE, THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND THE POLICE. THE AIM IS TO GENERATE STRONGER TIES BETWEEN NEIGHBOURS IN PREVENTING CRIME IN RESIDENTIAL PREMISES.

THE IMPORTANCE THE URBAN COUNCIL PLACES ON ITS ONGOING CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAMME IS EMPHASISED IN +VIBRANT HONG KONG+, ITS NEWLY-PUBLISHED ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1985-86.

+AT THE END OF THE YEAR, THE CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAMME COMPRISED 128 PROJECTS WITH AN ESTIMATED TOTAL COST OF \$2.203 MILLION,+ SAID THE REPORT.

IN THE FOREWORD, COUNCIL CHAIRMAN MR. H.M.G. FORSGATE ALSO DRAWS ATTENTION TO THE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME.

+THE COUNCIL'S FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAMME FORGED AHEAD, WITH CONSTRUCTION WORK WELL UNDERWAY FOR MANY AND BETTER FACILITIES FOR OUR FOUR AND A HALF MILLION URBAN RESIDENTS,+ HE CITED.

THE ANNUAL REPORT NOTES THE STEADY PROGRESS OF THE COUNCIL'S CONSTRUCTION PROGRAMME TO REDEVELOP SEVERAL OLD MARKETS INTO MULTI-FUNCTIONAL COMPLEXES CONSISTING OF A MARKET, A COOKED-FOOD CENTRE, A REFUSE COLLECTION POINT, AN INDOOR GAMES HALL, A LIBRARY AND A COMMUNITY ARTS CENTRE.

FOOTBRIDGE TO LINK TSING YI ESTATE BLOCKS

A COVERED PEDESTRIAN FOOTBRIDGE WILL BE BUILT ACROSS A NEW ROAD ON TSING YI ISLAND TO PROVIDE A LINK BETWEEN PHASE ONE AND PHASE TWO OF TSING YI ESTATE.

THE 36-METRE-LONG, 13.5-METRE-WIDE BRIDGE WILL BE CONNECTED TO BUILDINGS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE ROAD AT PODIUM LEVEL.

IT WILL BE SUPPORTED BY TWO ROWS OF LANDSCAPED COLUMNS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE ROAD AND WILL GIVE 5.3 METRES OF HEADROOM TO TRAFFIC.

DURING CONSTRUCTION NORMAL PEDESTRIAN AND VEHICULAR TRAFFIC WILL BE MAINTAINED.

PLANS CAN BE SEEN AT CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT OFFICE, THE DISTRICT LANDS OFFICE IN TSUEN WAN, AND TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICE.

THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT'S +HOTLINE+, WHICH OPERATES 24 HOURS A DAY TO RECEIVE COMPLAINTS AND ENQUIRIES ABOUT VARIOUS ASPECTS OF ITS ACTIVITIES, WILL BE CHANGED FROM +5-95555+ TO +5-8105599+ FROM OCTOBER 1.

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY, A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE CHANGE WAS DUE TO THE CANCELLATION OF THE DISTRICT TELEPHONE EXCHANGE.

THE SPOKESMAN REMINDED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT THE ROUND-THE-CLOCK +HOTLINE+ SERVICE WAS NOT CONFINED TO COMPLAINTS AGAINST LITTERING, ALTHOUGH THIS WAS A SUBJECT OF FREQUENT COMPLAINTS.

+THE HOTLINE HANDLES COMPLAINTS AND ENQUIRIES CONCERNING THE WHOLE SPECTRUM OF THE DEPARTMENT'S WORK, SUCH AS ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE, PEST CONTROL, HAWKERS AND MARKETS,+ HE SAID.

+EACH COMPLAINT IS FOLLOWED UP AND DEALT WITH AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE.

+IF THE COMPLAINT IS OF A SIMPLE NATURE, IT CAN BE DEALT WITH IN A MATTER OF HOURS. IF IT IS MORE COMPLICATED, SUCH AS ON A DEFECTIVE WATER PIPE OR A DRIPPING AIR CONDITIONER, MORE TIME WOULD BE REQUIRED AS THE DEPARTMENT HAS TO LOCATE THE OWNERS FIRST AND ASK THEM TO RECTIFY THE SITUATION WITHIN A SPECIFIED PERIOD.+

IN THE FIRST EIGHT MONTHS OF THIS YEAR, A TOTAL OF 1 577 COMPLAINTS WERE HANDLED. OF THESE, 91 PER CENT CONCERNED ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE PROBLEMS AND 60 PER CENT WERE ON LITTERING.

TONKIN STREET TO BE REALIGNED

THE SECTION OF TONKIN STREET BETWEEN CHEUNG SHA WAN ROAD AND TUNG CHAU STREET IN SHAM SHUI PO WILL BE REALIGNED AND EXTENDED.

THE EXTENSION WILL PROVIDE A LINK TO THE SLIP ROAD LEADING TO THE SOUTHBOUND CARRIAGEWAY OF THE WEST KOWLOON CORRIDOR NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

A FOOTBRIDGE FOR PEDESTRIANS WILL ALSO BE BUILT AT THE JUNCTION OF TONKIN STREET AND LAI CHI KOK ROAD. THIS WILL IMPROVE TRAFFIC FLOW AT THIS JUNCTION.

IN ADDITION, THE EXISTING BOX CULVERT ALONG TONKIN STREET WILL BE DUPLICATED TO IMPROVE THE STORMWATER DRAINAGE SYSTEM IN THIS PART OF SHAM SHUI PO.
