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BETTER ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE TO ENSURE FUTURE PROSPERITY

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THE DIRECTOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION, DR STUART REED, TODAY (SUNDAY) STRESSED THAT CHANGES MUST BE MADE TOWARDS BETTER ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE IN HONG KONG TO ENSURE FUTURE PROSPERITY.

"THERE IS A CLEAR LINK BETWEEN SUCCESSFUL ECONOMIES AND STRONG ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROLS -- JAPAN AND GERMANY ARE GOOD EXAMPLE," DR REED SAID.

"IT IS IN CONTRAST WITH THE WEAK ECONOMIES OF COUNTRIES IN EASTERN EUROPE, FOR EXAMPLE, WHERE THERE ARE POOR ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROLS," HE SAID.

HE MADE THESE REMARKS WHEN OFFICIATING AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FESTIVAL 1992 ORGANISED BY THE ENVIRONMENTAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE.

QUOTING A RECENT SPEECH OF BILL CLINTON, THE PRESIDENT-ELECT OF THE UNITED STATES, DR REED SAID GERMAN WORKERS USE HALF THE ENERGY THAT THEIR AMERICAN COUNTERPARTS USE TO PRODUCE THE SAME AMOUNT OF GOODS, AND JAPANESE COMPANIES GAIN A FIVE PER CENT COMPETITIVE PRICE ADVANTAGE BECAUSE OF HIGHER ENERGY EFFICIENCY.

"AND, OF COURSE, THE LESS ENERGY WE USE THE LESS THE POLLUTION WE GENERATE," DR REED SAID.

IN EASTERN EUROPEAN COUNTRIES WHERE THE NEED TO PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT SEEMS TO HAVE BEEN COMPLETELY IGNORED, DISASTROUS RESULTS BOTH IN TERMS OF THE HEALTH AND THE WEALTH OF THE COMMUNITIES IN THOSE COUNTRIES ARE SEEN, HE SAID.

TO ACHIEVE WHAT HAS BEEN DONE IN JAPAN AND GERMANY, AND SOME OTHER COUNTRIES, LEADERSHIP BASED UPON AN APPRECIATION OF THE ISSUES INVOLVED IS REQUIRED, HE STRESSED.

DR REED REPEATED HIS CALL FOR BUSINESS TO INCORPORATE ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE GOALS AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL AUDITING INTO THE BUSINESS PLAN FOR THE COMPANY CONCERNED.

IT IS IMPORTANT FOR BUSINESS TO IDENTIFY AN INDIVIDUAL AT THE MOST SENIOR LEVEL IN THEIR COMPANY AND TO GIVE HIM OR HER THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THAT COMPANY'S ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE, HE SAID.

"IT IS THIS SORT OF PROGRESSIVE ACTION THAT WILL ENSURE SUSTAINABLE PROSPERITY AND A HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT FOR ALL OF US IN HONG KONG," HE SAID.

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THREE MORE CHAPTERS OF TOWN PLANNING MANUAL ON SALE

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THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT HAS RECENTLY PUBLISHED THREE MORE CHAPTERS OF THE HONG KONG PLANNING STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES (HKPSG), A COMPREHENSIVE TOWN PLANNING MANUAL AVAILABLE FOR SALE TO THE PUBLIC FOR THE FIRST TIME.

THE PUBLICATIONS, IN A SERIES OF 11 CHAPTERS EACH ON A PARTICULAR ASPECT OF LAND USES OR FACILITIES, ARE SOLD ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS.

CHAPTER 5, ENTITLED "INDUSTRY", PROVIDES STANDARDS AND LOCATION GUIDELINES FOR INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENTS INCLUDING DEVELOPMENT PARAMETERS AND PLANNING CRITERIA SUCH AS PLOT RATIO, WORKER DENSITY, TRAFFIC ENGINEERING REQUIREMENTS AND ANCILLARY FACILITIES.

CHAPTER 6 - "RETAIL FACILITIES" OFFERS GUIDELINES FOR THE PLANNING AND ASSESSMENT OF RETAIL FACILITIES SO THAT THE GOVERNMENT CAN PROVIDE OR ENCOURAGE A REASONABLE STANDARD OF PROVISION IN PUBLIC INTEREST.

CHAPTER 10, "LANDSCAPE AND CONSERVATION", CONSISTS OF TWO PARTS - "RURAL ENVIRONMENT" AND "URBAN LANDSCAPE".

THE FORMER OUTLINES THE RURAL LAND USES/RESOURCES WHICH SHOULD BE IDENTIFIED AND CONSIDERED IN PLANNING FOR RURAL AREAS.

IT ALSO PROVIDES GUIDELINES AIMED AT REDUCING THE ADVERSE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS RESULTING FROM RURAL AREA DEVELOPMENT.

THE SECOND PART OF THE CHAPTER, ON THE OTHER HAND, SUGGESTS PLANNING PRINCIPLES AND URBAN LANDSCAPE DESIGN.

TOGETHER WITH THE SIX CHAPTERS - "INTRODUCTION", "RESIDENTIAL DENSITIES", "COMMUNITY FACILITIES", "RECREATION AND OPEN SPACE", "INTERNAL TRANSPORT FACILITIES" AND "MISCELLANEOUS PLANNING STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES" PUBLISHED EARLIER, NINE CHAPTERS ARE NOW READY FOR PURCHASE.

CHAPTER 6 IS AT \$20 A COPY WHILE THE OTHER TWO NEW CHAPTERS ARE EACH AT \$18. THEY ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS SALES CENTRE, GROUND FLOOR, GENERAL POST OFFICE BUILDING, CONNAUGHT PLACE, CENTRAL.

CHAPTER 1 - "INTRODUCTION" WHICH HELPS TO UNDERSTAND THE PURPOSE AND APPLICATION OF THE HKPSG, IS PROVIDED FREE-OF-CHARGE TO BUYERS OF OTHER CHAPTERS.

THE REMAINING TWO CHAPTERS WHICH COVER TOPICS ON UTILITY SERVICES AND ENVIRONMENT WILL GO ON SALE SOON.

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COMIC BOOK ON HUMAN RIGHTS

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A FULL-COLOUR COMIC BOOK TO PROMOTE PUBLIC AWARENESS ON HUMAN RIGHTS WILL BE AVAILABLE FREE OF CHARGE AT ALL DISTRICT OFFICES FROM TOMORROW (MONDAY).

THE COMIC BOOK, ENTITLED "THE BILL OF RIGHTS AS TOLD BY A WISE OLD WOMAN", IS ONE OF THE PUBLICITY ITEMS PRODUCED BY THE HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION SUB-COMMITTEE UNDER THE COMMITTEE ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION.

THE CONVENOR OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION SUB-COMMITTEE, MR WILLIAM TSUI HING-CHUEN, SAID THE BOOK, WHICH EXPLAINS THE HONG KONG BILL OF RIGHTS ORDINANCE IN LIVELY CARTOONS AND SIMPLE LANGUAGE, WOULD ENABLE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO EASILY GRASP THE ESSENCE OF THE BILL.

THE STORY DEPICTS WHAT A WISE OLD WOMAN SEES AND HEARS IN HER DAILY LIFE, HIGHLIGHTING IN DIFFERENT SITUATIONS THE KEY CONCEPTS OF HUMAN RIGHTS.

"SOME OF THE RIGHTS AND FREEDOMS, WHICH ARE ENJOYED BY ALL INDIVIDUALS AND EMBODIED IN THE BILL OF RIGHTS, ARE ILLUSTRATED IN THE COMIC BOOK," MR TSUI SAID.

THESE INCLUDE LIBERTY AND SECURITY OF PERSON; EQUALITY BEFORE COURTS AND RIGHT TO A FAIR AND PUBLIC HEARING; FREEDOM OF OPINION AND EXPRESSION; RIGHT OF PEACEFUL ASSEMBLY; FREEDOM OF ASSOCIATION; PROTECTION OF PRIVACY; EQUALITY BEFORE AND EQUAL PROTECTION OF THE LAW.

FOR THOSE WHO WANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT THE SUBJECT, THEY CAN TURN TO THE ENDING PART OF THE BOOK WHICH CARRIES THE FULL TEXT OF THE 23 ARTICLES OF THE BILL OF RIGHTS, HE SAID.

THE COMIC BOOK, IN CHINESE, ALSO CONTAINS A LIST OF ORGANISATIONS WHERE THE PUBLIC CAN SEEK FREE LEGAL ADVICE ON HUMAN RIGHTS ISSUES OR DIG FOR INFORMATION ON HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION.

THE HUMAN RIGHTS EDUCATION SUB-COMMITTEE WAS FORMED IN MAY THIS YEAR.

ONE OF ITS RESPONSIBILITIES IS TO FORMULATE A STRATEGY TO CONDUCT EDUCATION AND PUBLICITY PROGRAMMES SO AS TO FOSTER PUBLIC UNDERSTANDING AND RESPECT FOR HUMAN RIGHTS.

THE SUB-COMMITTEE COMPRISES MEMBERS FROM DIFFERENT SECTORS OF THE COMMUNITY INCLUDING LAWYERS, LECTURERS IN LAW AND APPLIED SOCIAL STUDIES, EDUCATION AND YOUTH WORKERS, AND REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE CONSTITUTIONAL AFFAIRS BRANCH, CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION, GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SERVICES AND THE POLICE.

FREE COPIES OF A BOOKLET - "AN INTRODUCTION TO HONG KONG BILL OF RIGHTS ORDINANCE" - ARE ALSO AVAILABLE AT DISTRICT OFFICES.

DIAMOND JUBILEE OF FAMILY HEALTH SERVICE

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THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH'S FAMILY HEALTH SERVICE (FHS) EXEMPLIFIES THE SUCCESS OF CLOSE PARTNERSHIP BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE SECTOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS AND OF ACTIVE COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION IN SELF CARE, THE SECRETARY FOR HEALTH AND WELFARE, MRS ELIZABETH WONG, SAID.

SPEAKING AT A CEREMONY TO MARK THE 60TH ANNIVERSARY OF FHS THIS (SUNDAY) AFTERNOON, MRS WONG SAID THE FHS SINCE ITS ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FIRST INFANT WELFARE CLINIC IN 1932 WAS AT PRESENT A MAJOR HEALTH CARE PROGRAMME.

"OVER THE YEARS, WE HAVE SEEN SIGNIFICANT DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES FOR MOTHERS AND CHILDREN," MRS WONG SAID.

THE SECRETARY SAID THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH OPERATED 46 MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH CENTRES PROVIDING SCREENING, IMMUNISATION AND HEALTH COUNSELLING SERVICES TO SOME 370,000 MOTHERS AND CHILDREN EACH YEAR TOGETHER WITH A SERVICE COVERAGE OF OVER 90 PER CENT OF NEWBORN BABIES.

MRS WONG SAID: "OUR INFANT AND MATERNAL MORTALITY RATES, AT 6.5 PER 1,000 LIVE BIRTHS AND 0.06 PER 1,000 BIRTHS RESPECTIVELY, ARE AMONG THE LOWEST IN THE WORLD."

"MOST CHILDHOOD COMMUNICABLE DISEASES ARE WELL UNDER CONTROL," SHE SAID, ADDING THAT SERVICE COULD NOT HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED WITHOUT THE DEDICATION TO SERVICE OF THE STAFF AND ACTIVE SUPPORT OF HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

MRS WONG WAS ALSO PLEASED TO LEARN THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH WAS EXPLORING FURTHER WAYS OF FOSTERING SUCH JOINT EFFORTS, NOT ONLY IN FAMILY HEALTH SERVICE BUT ALSO IN THE PRIMARY HEALTH SERVICES AS WELL.

SHE LOOKED FORWARD TO SEEING PLANS FOR EARLY IMPLEMENTATION.

THE DIRECTOR OF HEALTH, DR S H LEE, ALSO REVIEWED THE DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION IN THE MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES OVER THE PAST SIX DECADES.

DR LEE SAID THE SERVICE STARTED WITH A FIVE-MEMBER SMALL INFANT WELFARE CENTRE IN THE 1930'S AND HAD SINCE DEVELOPED INTO THE PRESENT SIZE WITH MORE THAN 600 STAFF.

HE SAID THE CHANGE OF ITS NAME FROM MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICE TO FHS IN 1973 SIGNIFIED THE EXPANSION AND INCREASING COMPLEXITY OF THE SERVICE.

"IN ADDITION TO MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES, FAMILY PLANNING, COMPREHENSIVE OBSERVATION, VARIOUS SCREENING SERVICES AND SPECIFIC HEALTH EDUCATION ACTIVITIES HAVE BEEN INTRODUCED," HE ADDED.

DR LEE POINTED OUT THAT THE PREDOMINANT PUBLIC HEALTH PROBLEMS BEFORE AND AFTER THE SECOND WORLD WAR WERE POOR SANITATION, OVERCROWDING AND PREVALENCE OF DANGEROUS COMMUNICABLE DISEASES SUCH AS CHOLERA, SMALLPOX, TUBERCULOSIS AND MANY OTHER CHILDHOOD COMMUNICABLE DISEASES.

TO TACKLE THESE PROBLEMS, DR LEE SAID, PRIORITY WAS GIVEN TO DEVELOPING MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH SERVICES AND MOUNTING ANTI-EPIDEMIC MEASURES AND IMMUNISATION CAMPAIGNS.

HOWEVER, DR LEE SAID THERE WERE MANY ACCOMPLISHMENTS DURING THE PAST 60 YEARS WHICH WERE RESULTS OF HARD WORK AND DEDICATION OF THE STAFF.

HE SAID THE INFANT MORTALITY PER 1,000 LIVE BIRTHS IN 1932 WAS 525 BUT IT FURTHER DECLINED TO 99.6 IN 1950 AND 6.5 IN 1991.

"THE MATERNAL MORTALITY ALSO DROPPED FROM 170 IN 1950 TO SIX PER 100,000 TOTAL BIRTHS IN 1991.

"APART FROM A SIGNIFICANT REDUCTION IN PERINATAL MORTALITY, THE MAJOR KILLER DISEASES OF CHILDHOOD SUCH AS POLIOMYELITIS, DIPHTHERIA AND MEASLES HAVE EITHER BEEN ERADICATED OR WELL CONTAINED," HE SAID.

DR LEE SAID ANOTHER ACHIEVEMENT MADE WAS THE VACCINATIONS AGAINST POLIOMYELITIS AND BCG WERE GIVEN TO ABOUT 99 PER CENT OF SCHOOL CHILDREN AND OVER 98 PER CENT OF NEWBORN BABIES RESPECTIVELY.

THE MORTALITY FOR TUBERCULOSIS REDUCED FROM 1,680 PER 100,000 IN 1952 TO 71 IN 1991, DR LEE SAID.

DR LEE SAID THE SERVICE WOULD CONTINUE TO DEVELOP IN QUANTITY AND QUALITY, INCLUDING THE OPENING OF NEW CLINICS AND EXPANSION OF EXISTING CLINICS, INTRODUCTION OF A PILOT "WELL-WOMAN CLINIC" PROJECT NEXT YEAR AND A NEW STUDENT HEALTH SERVICE IN 1994.

ANOTHER IMPROVEMENT WILL BE THE PRODUCTION OF CHILD HEALTH BOOKLET EARLY NEXT YEAR.

THIS BOOKLET WILL RECORD ALL THE HEALTH INFORMATION OF THE CHILD FROM BIRTH TO 18 YEARS OF AGE AND WILL BE KEPT BY THE PARENTS.

"THE UTILISATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF THE EXISTING SERVICES WILL ALSO BE REVIEWED TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE BEING MANAGED IN A COST-EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT MANNER," DR LEE SAID.

DR LEE SAID: "IN THE YEARS AHEAD, I CAN SEE GOOD OPPORTUNITY TO ESTABLISH A CLOSE LINK BETWEEN THE FHS AND THE STUDENT HEALTH SERVICE WHICH WILL ENSURE CONTINUITY OF CARE FOR INFANTS AND CHILDREN FROM BIRTH TO 18 YEARS."

DR LEE WAS CONFIDENT THAT WITH THE SUPPORT AND CO-OPERATION FROM THE STAFF AND THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE, THE GOVERNMENT COULD GO ONE STEP FURTHER BY PROVIDING AN EVEN BETTER SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY.

CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT FESTIVAL  
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DISTRICT FESTIVALS ARE AIMED AT ENCOURAGING RESIDENTS TO TAKE PART IN COMMUNITY AFFAIRS, TO ENHANCE THEIR KNOWLEDGE OF THEIR PLACE OF LIVING AND TO STRENGTHEN THEIR SENSE OF BELONGING, THE SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, MR MICHAEL SUEN SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

HE MADE THE REMARKS AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE FOURTH CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT FESTIVAL.

TO ACHIEVE THOSE AIMS, HE SAID THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT FESTIVAL WOULD PROVIDE RESIDENTS WITH A HOST OF ACTIVITIES IN THE NEXT THREE WEEKS.

THESE ACTIVITIES RANGE FROM RECREATIONAL PROGRAMMES AND CULTURAL ACTIVITIES TO SPORTS EVENTS AND CIVIC EDUCATION FUNCTIONS.

SPEAKING ON THE SAME OCCASION, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT FESTIVAL ORGANISING COMMITTEE, MR PETER LEE SHUNG-TAK, SAID HE HOPED THAT RESIDENTS WOULD BE PROUD OF THEIR OWN COMMUNITY AND JOIN TOGETHER TO FURTHER DEVELOP THE DISTRICT.

THE DISTRICT FESTIVAL'S OPENING AND THE STAR-STUDED EXTRAVAGANZA THAT FOLLOWED ATTRACTED A LARGE AUDIENCE IN THE CHATER ROAD PEDESTRIAN PRECINCT.

MORE THAN 200 SENIOR CITIZENS AND STUDENTS, TOGETHER WITH REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE DISTRICT'S AREA COMMITTEES AND VARIOUS RESIDENTS ORGANISATIONS, ALSO JOINED IN THE CELEBRATION WITH A SPECIAL TEA RECEPTION.

THESE WILL INCLUDE: AN ON-SITE VISIT BY GROUP MEMBERS TO IDENTIFY VICE SPOTS, PUBLICATION OF A LEAFLET TO ADVISE RESIDENTS THE WAYS TO HANDLE THE PROBLEM, A PUBLIC SEMINAR, AND HELPING FLAT OWNERS TO FORM OWNERS' CORPORATIONS AND MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES.

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RESIDENTS IN TSEUNG KWAN O AND SAI KUNG WILL BE ABLE TO KNOW MORE ABOUT THE DEVELOPMENT OF THEIR NEW TOWN IN AN EXHIBITION TO BE HELD FROM TUESDAY (NOVEMBER 24) TO SUNDAY (NOVEMBER 29) BETWEEN 2 PM AND 7 PM DAILY.

THE EXHIBITION, WHICH WILL BE HELD AT THE KING LAM NEIGHBOURHOOD COMMUNITY CENTRE IN TSEUNG KWAN O, IS ORGANISED BY THE SOUTH EAST NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT OFFICE OF THE TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT.

IT WILL FEATURE THE DEVELOPMENT IN TSEUNG KWAN O, THE PLANNING POLICY OF THE NEW TOWN, THE STAGES IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DEVELOPMENT FROM RECLAMATION, PROVISION OF INFRASTRUCTURE TO COMMUNITY BUILDING.

VISITORS TO THE EXHIBITION WILL HAVE AN INSIGHT OF THE VARIOUS ASPECTS IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE NEW TOWN AND NEIGHBOURING AREAS SUCH AS SAI KUNG THROUGH THE DISPLAY OF MODELS, PHOTOGRAPHS, DRAWINGS AND PLANS.

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TRAINING COURSE FOR HEALTH WORKERS

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THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT IS INVITING HEALTH WORKERS IN PRIVATE HOMES FOR THE ELDERLY TO APPLY FOR ENROLMENT ON AN 11-WEEK TRAINING COURSE.

SCHEDULED TO START IN MID-FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR, THE COURSE AIMS FOR THOSE WHO HAVE NOT RECEIVED THEIR NURSING OR MEDICAL TRAINING IN HONG KONG TO IMPROVE THEIR QUALITY OF SERVICE IN THESE PRIVATE HOMES.

"LEGISLATION TO CONTROL RESIDENTIAL CARE HOMES FOR THE ELDERLY, INCLUDING THOSE IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR, IS TO BE INTRODUCED SOON," A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

UNDER THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION, NO ONE SHALL BE QUALIFIED TO BE REGISTERED AS A HEALTH WORKER FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYMENT AT A RESIDENTIAL CARE HOME WITHOUT HAVING COMPLETED A TRAINING COURSE APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE.

"THE COURSE IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE COLLEGE OF NURSING, HONG KONG, AND THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT," THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.
