CONSTRUCTION OF HK'S FIRST PURPOSE-BUILT MUSEUM STARTS NEXT MONTH  
\* \* \* \* \*

WORK WILL START NEXT MONTH ON THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE FIRST PURPOSE-BUILT MUSEUM OF ART IN HONG KONG, THE DIRECTOR OF ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES, MR JOSE LEI, SAID TODAY (MONDAY).

MR LEI'S ANNOUNCEMENT CAME AFTER HE SIGNED THE MAIN CONTRACT FOR THE PROJECT WHICH WILL COST A TOTAL OF \$176 MILLION AND TAKE ABOUT 20 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

LOCATED NEXT TO THE SPACE MUSEUM AND THE CULTURAL CENTRE, THE MUSEUM OF ART IS THE THIRD AND FINAL PHASE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE TSIM SHA TSUI CULTURAL CENTRE. IT WILL REPLACE THE EXISTING MUSEUM LOCATED AT THE HIGH BLOCK OF THE CITY HALL WHEN IT IS COMPLETED IN JANUARY 1990.

MR LEI SAID "THE BASIC AIM OF THE DESIGN WAS TO ACHIEVE A DISTINGUISHED BUILDING THAT WOULD BE SIGNIFICANTLY DIFFERENT FROM THE TALL RECTANGULAR BUILDINGS SO TYPICAL OF HONG KONG."

THE MUSEUM CONSISTS OF FIVE STOREYS AND A ONE-LEVEL BASEMENT.

IT HAS A TOTAL FLOOR AREA OF 17,000 SQUARE METRES, DIVIDED INTO THREE ELEMENTS OF LARGELY WINDOWLESS GALLERIES ABOVE A PODIUM. THE THREE ELEMENTS ARE SEPARATED BY TWO ATRIUM SPACES THAT DIVIDE THE BUILDING FROM PODIUM TO ROOF.

THE CENTRAL ELEMENT OF THE BUILDING CONTAINS THE ORIENTATION AND HISTORICAL PICTURES GALLERIES. THE WEST BLOCK CONTAINS THE HONG KONG CONTEMPORARY ART GALLERY AND THE ADMINISTRATIVE/CURATORIAL OFFICES. THE EAST BLOCK CONTAINS THE TEMPORARY EXHIBITION, THE CHINESE ANTIQUITIES GALLERIES AND CHINESE FINE ART GALLERIES.

THERE IS A TOTAL OF SIX GALLERIES WITH A TOTAL FLOOR AREA OF 5,000 SQUARE METRES.

THE MAIN PUBLIC ENTRANCE IS PLACED AT PODIUM LEVEL WITH A GRAND STAIR AND AN ESCALATOR TAKING VISITORS UP FROM GROUND LEVEL.

ESCALATORS WILL FURTHER LINK UP THE ENTRANCE WITH THE VARIOUS UPPER GALLERIES. LOUNGES AROUND ESCALATORS ALLOW THE VISITORS TO ENJOY MAGNIFICENT VIEWS ACROSS THE HARBOUR.

SEPARATE ENTRANCES ARE ALLOWED AT GROUND LEVEL FOR STAFF AND HANDICAPPED VISITORS. THIS PODIUM ALSO HOUSES THE MUSEUM SHOP AND ORIENTATION ROOMS FOR LARGE GROUPS AND SCHOOLS.

THE SPACE MUSEUM WAS THE FIRST PHASE OF THE PROJECT WHILE THE AUDITORIA, RESTAURANTS AND ADMINISTRATION BUILDING FORMED PHASE II.

THE TOTAL ESTIMATED COST OF CONSTRUCTING PHASE I - III IS ABOUT \$680 MILLION. THE PROJECT IS FUNDED BY GOVERNMENT AND WILL BE MANAGED BY THE URBAN COUNCIL.

NEED TO ASSIST FINISHING, PRINTING, DYEING INDUSTRY HIGHLIGHTED

\* \* \* \* \*

A RECENT TECHNO-ECONOMIC STUDY HAS HIGHLIGHTED THE NEED FOR GOVERNMENT TO CONSIDER MEASURES TO ASSIST THE FINISHING, PRINTING AND DYEING INDUSTRY TO IMPROVE BOTH THE QUANTITY AND QUALITY OF ITS OUTPUT, SO THAT IT MAY BETTER SUPPORT THE TEXTILES AND CLOTHING INDUSTRIES IN THEIR RESPONSE TO EXTERNAL DEMAND.

THE DIRECTOR OF INDUSTRY, MR K.Y. YEUNG, SAID THIS TODAY (MONDAY) AT THE FOUNDATION STONE LAYING CEREMONY OF CONCORDIA PAPER LIMITED IN THE YUEN LONG INDUSTRIAL ESTATE.

AS THAT SUPPORTING INDUSTRY NEEDED AN AMPLE SUPPLY OF WATER, MR YEUNG SAID THE GOVERNMENT HAD THEREFORE DISCUSSED WITH THE HONG KONG INDUSTRIAL ESTATES CORPORATION WAYS OF INCREASING THE WATER SUPPLY TO YUEN LONG INDUSTRIAL ESTATE.

"THIS ENABLES SITES TO BE GRANTED TO FURTHER LARGE WATER USING INDUSTRIES WHICH COULD SIGNIFICANTLY CONTRIBUTE TO EITHER BROADENING HONG KONG'S INDUSTRIAL BASE OR LEAD TO IMPROVEMENTS IN EXISTING TECHNOLOGY LEVELS AND QUALITY STANDARDS.

"WE ALSO RECOGNISE THE NEED TO MAINTAIN ACCEPTABLE ENVIRONMENTAL STANDARDS AND ARE STUDYING HOW TO EXPAND THE EFFLUENT TREATMENT WORKS WHICH RECEIVE THE LIQUID WASTE FROM THE INDUSTRIAL ESTATE.

"IF ALL GOES AS PLANNED, IT SHOULD BE POSSIBLE FOR THE INDUSTRIAL ESTATES CORPORATION TO GRANT A NUMBER OF SITES TO FURTHER HEAVY WATER USERS LATER THIS YEAR."

MR YEUNG ALSO STRESSED THAT HONG KONG SHOULD NOT ONLY FACILITATE THE CONTINUED GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OF THE EXPORTING INDUSTRIES, BUT SHOULD ALSO ENSURE THAT THE MANY SUPPORTING INDUSTRIES WHICH PROVIDED ESSENTIAL COMPONENTS OR TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO SUCH EXPORTERS WERE NOT NEGLECTED.

SWAC ENDORSES VOLUNTARY REGISTRATION  
FOR PRIVATE ELDERLY HOMES

THE SOCIAL WELFARE ADVISORY COMMITTEE HAS ENDORSED THE VIEW THAT A VOLUNTARY REGISTRATION SYSTEM SHOULD BE INTRODUCED FOR PRIVATE ELDERLY HOMES WHICH ARE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE CODE OF PRACTICE FOR SUCH HOMES.

IT ALSO AGREED THAT FOR THIS PURPOSE, AN INSPECTION UNIT SHOULD BE SET UP IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AND THAT THE ASSOCIATION OF PRIVATE HOMES FOR THE ELDERLY SHOULD BE INVOLVED.

AT ITS MEETING TODAY (MONDAY), THE COMMITTEE DISCUSSED THE FINDINGS OF A REVIEW CONDUCTED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT INTO THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CODE OF PRACTICE FOR PRIVATE HOMES FOR THE ELDERLY WHICH WAS INTRODUCED IN OCTOBER 1986.

WHILE THE ROLE PLAYED BY PRIVATE HOMES IN THE PROVISIONS FOR THE ELDERLY WAS APPRECIATED, THE COMMITTEE FULLY RECOGNISED THAT THE WELL-BEING OF THE ELDERLY SHOULD BE TAKEN CARE OF.

IT SAW LEGISLATIVE CONTROL AS THE ULTIMATE AIM, WITH 1992 AS THE TARGET DATE.

TO GIVE THE OPERATORS INCENTIVES TO COMPLY WITH THE CODE, THE COMMITTEE RECOMMENDED THAT CONSIDERATION BE GIVEN TO OPTIONS SUCH AS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, BUYING PLACES, TRAINING FOR IN-SERVICE STAFF OF REGISTERED HOMES, REFERRAL OF CASES, AND AS A LONGER TERM MEASURE, GRANTING OF LAND AT REDUCED PREMIUM FOR BUILDING ELDERLY HOME.

ON SPACE REQUIREMENT, SOME MEMBERS WERE FOR RETAINING THE PRESENT SPECIFICATION OF 9.5 SQUARE METRES WHILE SOME WANTED SOME SORT OF REDUCTION.

AS FOR FIRE AND SAFETY PRECAUTIONS, THE COMMITTEE FELT THAT THE CURRENT STANDARDS SHOULD BE MAINTAINED.

ANOTHER TOPIC DISCUSSED AT THE MEETING WAS THE SETTING UP OF A HOSTEL FOR DISCHARGEES FROM REFORMATORY SCHOOLS IN CHEUNG HONG ESTATE ON TSING YI AND MEMBERS UNANIMOUSLY SUPPORTED THE SETTING UP OF SUCH A FACILITY THERE.

THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR TONY HAMMOND, TODAY (MONDAY) VISITED A GARMENT MANUFACTURING FACTORY AT QUARRY BAY TO FAMILIARISE HIMSELF WITH THE LATEST DEVELOPMENTS IN THE LOCAL INDUSTRIAL AND LABOUR SCENE.

MR HAMMOND TOURED VARIOUS PARTS OF THE DESMOND GARMENT MANUFACTURING, AND ALSO DISCUSSED A WIDE RANGE OF SUBJECTS, INCLUDING LABOUR SHORTAGE, STAFF WELFARE AND LABOUR LEGISLATION WITH THE MANAGEMENT.

HE WAS ACCOMPANIED ON THE TOUR BY THE COMPANY'S MANAGING DIRECTOR, MR P.D. MEHTA, AND THE FACTORY'S MANAGER, MR TONG WING-YIN.

DESMOND GARMENT MANUFACTURING PRODUCES MAINLY SHIRTS AND GOWNS FOR THE MARKETS IN NORTHERN EUROPE.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES FOR DECEMBER PUBLISHED  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT TODAY (MONDAY) PUBLISHED THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES FOR DECEMBER 1987. THE CPI(A) AND CPI(B) (OCTOBER 84/SEPTEMBER 85 = 100) FOR DECEMBER 1987 WERE BOTH 113.0, REPRESENTING INCREASES OF 7.5 PER CENT AND 7.0 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY OVER DECEMBER 1986. COMPARED WITH NOVEMBER 1987 AND BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS COMPARISON MAY BE AFFECTED BY SEASONAL FACTORS, THE CPI(A) INCREASED BY 1.3 PER CENT AND THE CPI(B), BY 1.1 PER CENT.

THE AVERAGE CPI(A) AND AVERAGE CPI(B) FOR THE WHOLE OF 1987, AT 109.4 AND 109.5 RESPECTIVELY, WERE 5.5 PER CENT AND 5.3 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY HIGHER THAN IN 1986.

DURING THE THREE-MONTH PERIOD ENDED DECEMBER 1987, THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED CPI(A) INCREASED AT AN AVERAGE RATE OF 1.0 PER CENT PER MONTH, AND THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED CPI(B), AT 0.9 PER CENT PER MONTH.

THE SHARP INCREASE IN THE PRICES OF FRESH VEGETABLES DURING DECEMBER CONTRIBUTED SIGNIFICANTLY TO THE UPSURGE IN BOTH CPI(A) AND CPI(B), MAINLY BECAUSE OF REDUCED SUPPLY AS A RESULT OF THE COLD WEATHER IN EARLY DECEMBER. THIS REDUCED SUPPLY WAS, HOWEVER, ONLY TEMPORARY. PRICES OF FRESH VEGETABLES TENDED TO EASE TOWARDS THE END OF THE MONTH.

THE CPI(A) AND THE CPI(B) ARE BASED ON THE EXPENDITURE PATTERNS OF 50 PER CENT AND 30 PER CENT, RESPECTIVELY, OF URBAN HOUSEHOLDS IN HONG KONG, WHICH WERE DERIVED FROM THE 1984/85 HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE SURVEY. THE CPI(A) REFERS TO HOUSEHOLDS SPENDING BETWEEN \$2,000 AND \$6,499 A MONTH AT THAT TIME AND THE CPI(B) BETWEEN \$6,500 AND \$9,999 A MONTH.

CHANGES IN THE INDEXES FOR DECEMBER 1987 IN RESPECT OF THE NINE COMMODITY/SERVICE SECTIONS IN THE TWO CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES, AS COMPARED WITH NOVEMBER 1987 AND DECEMBER 1986, ARE GIVEN BELOW.

COMPARED WITH NOVEMBER 1987, THE INDEX FOR FOODSTUFFS INCREASED BY 2.4 PER CENT IN CPI(A) AND BY 2.2 PER CENT IN CPI(B). THIS WAS MAINLY DUE TO INCREASES IN THE AVERAGE RETAIL PRICES OF FRESH VEGETABLES AND SALT-WATER FISH AND IN THE AVERAGE CHARGE FOR MEALS IN RESTAURANTS AND OTHER EATING PLACES. THE EFFECT OF MOVEMENTS IN THE RETAIL PRICES OF OTHER FOOD ITEMS ON THE INDEX FOR FOODSTUFFS WAS INSIGNIFICANT.

THE INDEX FOR CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR INCREASED BY 2.1 PER CENT IN BOTH CPI(A) AND CPI(B) AS A RESULT OF HIGHER PRICES OF OUTER CLOTHING.

THE INDEX FOR MISCELLANEOUS GOODS INCREASED BY 1.0 PER CENT IN CPI(A) AND BY 0.8 PER CENT IN CPI(B) DUE TO HIGHER PRICES OF JEWELLERY AND MEDICINES.

THE INDEX FOR SERVICES INCREASED BY 0.3 PER CENT IN CPI(A) AND BY 0.5 PER CENT IN CPI(B) AS A RESULT OF HIGHER CHARGES FOR PACKAGE TOURS AND ADMISSION TO NIGHT CLUBS AND DISCOTHEQUES AROUND THE CHRISTMAS AND NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS.

PRICE MOVEMENTS IN OTHER SECTIONS OF THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES WERE INSIGNIFICANT.

THE HANG SENG CPI WAS 116.6 IN DECEMBER 1987, UP BY 0.7 PER CENT OVER NOVEMBER 1987 AND UP BY 7.8 PER CENT OVER DECEMBER 1986. THE HANG SENG CPI IS BASED ON THE EXPENDITURE PATTERN OF THE 10 PER CENT OF URBAN HOUSEHOLDS IN HONG KONG THAT SPENT \$10,000-24,999 A MONTH DURING THE 1984/85 HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE SURVEY. FURTHER DETAILS REGARDING THIS INDEX ARE INCLUDED IN THE HANG SENG CPI REPORT ISSUED BY THE ECONOMIC RESEARCH DEPARTMENT OF HANG SENG BANK LIMITED.

THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPARTMENT (EPD) HAS COMMISSIONED A CONSULTANCY STUDY TO INVESTIGATE THE ENGINEERING FEASIBILITY AND ECONOMIC VIABILITY OF EXPORTING IN PART OR IN ITS ENTIRETY THE TREATED EFFLUENT FROM THE SHA TIN AND THE TAI PO SEWAGE TREATMENT WORKS TO THE KAI TAK NULLAH.

THE PROJECT IS ONE OF THE MEASURES AIMED AT IMPROVING THE WATER QUALITY OF TOLO HARBOUR.

AN AGREEMENT SIGNING CEREMONY TOOK PLACE TODAY (MONDAY) BETWEEN REPRESENTATIVES OF EPD AND BALFOUR INTERNATIONAL(ASIA)/CHARLES HASWELL PARTNERS (FAR EAST).

THE STUDY, AT A COST OF \$2.5 MILLION, IS EXPECTED TO TAKE SIX MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

COMMITTEE TO CONSIDER OLD BUILDINGS STUDY

THE MONG KOK DISTRICT BOARD'S ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE WILL CONSIDER A PROPOSAL TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE PROBLEMS OF OLD BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT AT ITS MEETING TOMORROW (TUESDAY).

A WORKING GROUP WAS SET UP UNDER THE COMMITTEE LAST YEAR TO LOOK INTO THE PROBLEMS OF OLD BUILDINGS AND HOW THEY AFFECT THE DISTRICT'S ENVIRONMENT, WITH A VIEW TO RECOMMENDING REDEVELOPMENT TO THE GOVERNMENT.

THE COMMITTEE WILL ALSO DISCUSS THE REVISED GUIDELINES ON THE USE OF DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS FOR CARRYING OUT MINOR ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS.

DISCUSSIONS WILL FOCUS ON THE GUIDELINES REGULATING THE ALLOCATION OF FUNDS FOR IMPROVING THE CONDITION OF EXTERNAL WALLS OF PRIVATE BUILDINGS, SUCH AS REMOVING EYESORES OR HAZARDOUS OBJECTS.
