SCHOOL NOISE ABATEMENT PRIORITIES EXPLAINED TO PARENTS

\* \* \* \* \*

PRIORITIES FOR THE NOISE ABATEMENT PROGRAMME ARE GIVEN TO SCHOOLS WORST AFFECTED BY AIRCRAFT AND TRAFFIC NOISE, THE PRINCIPAL ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR EDUCATION AND MANPOWER, MR CHRIS GODWIN, TOLD A GROUP OF TSUEN WAN SCHOOL PARENTS TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

THE EXPLANATION WAS GIVEN AT A MEETING HELD BETWEEN PARENT REPRESENTATIVES AND OFFICIALS FROM THE EDUCATION AND MANPOWER BRANCH, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPARTMENT TO DISCUSS THE NOISE PROBLEMS FACED BY THE SCHOOLS LOCATED NEAR ROUTE 5.

IN RESPONSE TO THE POINT THAT THE SCHOOLS WERE AFFECTED BY ROADWORKS CONSTRUCTION NOISE, MR GODWIN SAID HE WAS SYMPATHETIC GIVEN THE SITUATION BUT POINTED OUT THAT THE TSUEN WAN SECTION OF ROUTE 5 WOULD BE COMPLETED BY THE END OF THE YEAR.

"SINCE NOISE ABATEMENT WORK COULD ONLY BE CARRIED OUT DURING SCHOOL HOLIDAYS, IT IS UNLIKELY THAT TREATMENT OF THESE SCHOOLS CAN BE COMPLETED BY THE TIME THE CONSTRUCTION PROBLEMS HAVE DISAPPEARED," HE SAID.

"BESIDES, ACTION HAS ALSO BEEN TAKEN BY THE PROJECT MANAGER (TSUEN WAN) TO CONTROL THE LEVEL OF NOISE GENERATED BY THE ROAD WORKS."

MR GODWIN SAID SCHOOLS AFFECTED BY SEVERE AIRCRAFT NOISE WERE BEING TREATED UNDER THE NOISE ABATEMENT PROGRAMME AND PLANS WERE IN HAND FOR TREATING 92 SCHOOLS AFFECTED BY TRAFFIC NOISE OF 75 DECIBELS AND ABOVE, STARTING IN SUMMER THIS YEAR.

"AT PRESENT, THE SIX SCHOOLS LOCATED NEAR ROUTE 5 ARE EXPOSED TO TRAFFIC NOISE BETWEEN 62 AND 76 DECIBELS,"

RESPONDING TO THE POINT THAT THE SCHOOLS WOULD BE EXPOSED TO A PROJECTED TRAFFIC NOISE OF 76 DECIBELS IN 1996 AFTER ROUTE 5 WAS FULLY OPERATIVE AND SHOULD THEREFORE MERIT EARLY TREATMENT UNDER THE NOISE ABATEMENT PROGRAMME, MR GODWIN EXPLAINED THAT ABOUT 59 SCHOOLS WERE ALREADY EXPOSED TO TRAFFIC NOISE OF 77 DECIBELS AND ABOVE.

"ADVANCING THE TREATMENT OF THE ROUTE 5 CASES WOULD BE UNFAIR TO THE 59 SCHOOLS CONCERNED AS TRAFFIC NOISE ALONG ROUTE 5 IS STILL COMPARATIVELY TOLERABLE," HE SAID.

"HOWEVER, THE PRIORITY OF SCHOOLS IS REASSESSED WHENEVER NECESSARY SO THAT NEW DEVELOPMENTS SUCH AS AN INCREASE IN TRAFFIC NOISE ASSOCIATED WITH THE OPENING OF ROUTE 5 CAN BE TAKEN INTO ACCOUNT AT THE APPROPRIATE STAGE," MR GODWIN ADDED.

WIDE-RANGING FESTIVAL ENTERTAINMENT FOR SHAM SHUI PO RESIDENTS

RESIDENTS IN SHAM SHUI PO WILL BE TREATED TO A THREE-WEEK EXTRAVAGANZA OF CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL, SPORTS AND EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES IN THE 1988-89 SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT FESTIVAL.

THE FESTIVAL, COMPRISING 51 EVENTS, WILL BEGIN ON SUNDAY (JANUARY 8) AND CONTINUE UNTIL JANUARY 28.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE 1988-89 SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT FESTIVAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE, MR CHOI WAN-HOE, ANNOUNCED THE PROGRAMME AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY (WEDNESDAY).

"THE FESTIVAL, WHICH HAS BECOME AN ANNUAL EVENT OF SHAM SHUI PO, AIMS AT FOSTERING RESIDENTS' SENSE OF BELONGING TO THE DISTRICT, PROMOTING THEIR INTEREST AND PARTICIPATION IN CULTURAL, RECREATIONAL, SPORTS AND COMMUNITY BUILDING ACTIVITIES, AND ENHANCING THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THE DISTRICT," MR CHOI SAID.

"IT IS ALSO HOPED THAT THE FESTIVITIES WILL HELP IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF LIFE OF LOCAL RESIDENTS."

THE FESTIVAL IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE COORDINATING COMMITTEE AND THE SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT OFFICE.

THE VARIOUS ACTIVITIES WILL BE STAGED BY MORE THAN 30 LOCAL ORGANISATIONS SUCH AS AREA COMMITTEES AND RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATIONS.

THE FESTIVAL, ESTIMATED TO COST MORE THAN \$1 MILLION, IS SPONSORED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD, THE URBAN COUNCIL AND PRIVATE ORGANISATIONS.

MR CHOI SAID THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR DAVID LAN, WOULD OFFICIATE AT A SWITCHING-ON CEREMONY TO MARK THE OPENING OF THE FESTIVAL THIS SUNDAY AT THE ACADEMY COMMUNITY HALL IN KOWLOON TONG.

AFTER THE CEREMONY THERE WILL BE A VARIETY SHOW FEATURING SINGING BY POPULAR ARTISTES AND CHOIRS AS WELL AS A DRAMA PERFORMANCE.

"IN RESPONSE TO THE TERRITORY-WIDE CAMPAIGN TO PROMOTE CIVIC EDUCATION, THE EMPHASIS OF THIS YEAR'S DISTRICT FESTIVAL WILL BE PLACED ON THE PROMOTION OF THE PUBLIC'S AWARENESS OF THEIR CIVIC RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL, WITH 21 EVENTS FOCUSING ON THEMES RELATED TO CIVIC EDUCATION," MR CHOI NOTED.

ON SATURDAY, JANUARY 21, A MOCK DISTRICT BOARD MEETING WILL BE HELD IN A HOTEL, WITH 40 MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TAKING THE ROLE OF DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS AND DISCUSSING ISSUES OF DISTRICT INTEREST.

THIS EXERCISE WILL HELP THE PARTICIPANTS TO HAVE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF THE OPERATIONS OF THE BOARD.

IN ADDITION, A SPEECH COMPETITION, A DAY CAMP, TALKS AND EXHIBITIONS WILL BE HELD TO PROJECT THE CIVIC EDUCATION THEME.

OTHER ACTIVITIES IN THE FESTIVAL INCLUDE A TERRITORY-WIDE SOCIAL DANCE COMPETITION, A PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION ON FESTIVAL EVENTS, AN ANTI-SHOPTHEFT TELEMATCH, CARNIVALS, VARIETY SHOWS, CANTONESE OPERA SINGING AS WELL AS CHINESE AND WESTERN ORCHESTRAL PERFORMANCES.

#### EXCHANGE OF VIEWS ON CONTAINER PORT ISSUES

\* \* \* \* \*

REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE CONTAINER TRADE, KWAI TSING DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS FROM SOUTH KWAI CHUNG AND OFFICERS OF THE KWAI TSING DISTRICT OFFICE HAVE HELD AN INFORMAL DISCUSSION TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON PROBLEMS RELATED TO THE CONTAINER PORT AND ON POSSIBLE IMPROVEMENTS.

THE DISCUSSION WAS CONVENED BY THE KWAI TSING DISTRICT OFFICER, MR PAUL TANG, WITH THE AIM OF FOSTERING BETTER UNDERSTANDING AND CLOSER COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THOSE IN THE PORT TRADE AND RESIDENTS.

IT WAS NOTED DURING THE DISCUSSION THAT HONG KONG HAD A PROBLEM IN THE PROVISION OF BACK-UP LAND FOR THE CONTAINER PORT.

THE PORT WAS DEVELOPED IN THE 1970'S AND THE THROUGHPUT OF CONTAINERS NOW FAR EXCEEDED ORIGINAL ESTIMATES.

ON ONE HAND, RESIDENTS WERE CONCERNED ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF THE CONTAINER PORT AND RELATED USES.

ON THE OTHER HAND, THERE WAS PRESSURE TO PROVIDE BACK-UP LAND IN KWAI CHUNG AND TSUEN WAN AREAS TO FACILITATE SMOOTH OPERATION OF THE PORT.

HOWEVER, THE PARTICIPANTS AGREED THAT A CONCERTED EFFORT WOULD HELP TO REDUCE THE EFFECTS OF NOISE, GLARE AND TRAFFIC NUISANCES CAUSED TO RESIDENTS.

IT WAS ALSO AGREED THAT COMMUNICATION WITH ALL PARTIES IN THE TRADE SHOULD BE MAINTAINED.

AS REGARDS LAND USED FOR CONTAINER-RELATED PURPOSES, THE PARTICIPANTS NOTED THAT SOME DESIGNATED BACK-UP AREAS WOULD BE LOCATED NEXT TO TERMINALS SIX AND SEVEN, AND POINTED OUT THAT PROVISION FOR BACK-UP AREAS SHOULD CONTINUE TO BE INCLUDED IN FUTURE PLANNING OF CONTAINER TERMINALS.

IT WAS ALSO SUGGESTED THAT CONSIDERATION SHOULD BE GIVEN TO THE PROVISION OF PUBLIC FACILITIES FOR CONTAINER TRUCK DRIVERS, SUCH AS SETTING UP PUBLIC CONVENIENCE FACILITIES NEAR THE PORT.

THE KWAI TSING DISTRICT OFFICE WILL ARRANGE VISITS TO CONTAINER TERMINALS FOR KWAI TSING DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS IN DUE COURSE, TO FURTHER ENHANCE THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THE PORT OPERATIONS.

KWAI TSING DISTRICT BOARD TO MEET TOMORROW

THE KWAI TSING DISTRICT BOARD WILL BE BRIEFED ON THE PROPOSED RELOCATION OF MOBIL OIL DEPOTS AND PROVISION OF CHEMICAL WASTE TREATMENT FACILITIES AT TSING YI AT A MEETING TO BE HELD TOMORROW (THURSDAY).

MEMBERS WILL ALSO BE BRIEFED ON DETAILS CONCERNING THE REMOVAL, REHOUSING AND COMPENSATION FOR SINGLETON AND TWO-PERSON HOUSEHOLDS OF 11 HOUSING BLOCKS IN THE DISTRICT.

OTHER ITEMS ON THE AGENDA INCLUDE NOISE POLLUTION CAUSED BY BOATYARDS AT NORTH TSING YI AND THE PLAN TO RELOCATE THEM.

A MEMBER WILL MOVE A MOTION THAT THE HOUSING AUTHORITY SHOULD FREEZE THE RENTAL OF THOSE HOUSING ESTATES WHICH WILL BE REDEVELOPED WITHIN THE FIRST FIVE YEARS UNDER THE LONG TERM HOUSING STRATEGY.

QUESTIONS WILL BE RAISED ON THE NUMBER OF HOUSEHOLDS IN THE DISTRICT'S PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE THAT PAY DOUBLE RENT AND THE NUMBER OF SINGLE-PARENT FAMILIES IN THE DISTRICT, AND THE SERVICES PROVIDED FOR THEM.

IMPROVEMENT TO KIM SHIN LANE ON DB AGENDA

MEMBERS OF THE SHAM SHUI PO DISTRICT BOARD'S ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE WILL BE INFORMED AT THEIR MEETING TOMORROW (THURSDAY) OF THE LONG-TERM IMPROVEMENT PLAN TO KIM SHIN LANE UNDER THE TERRITORY-WIDE "IMPROVEMENT TO RESUMED PRIVATE STREETS" PROJECT.

THEY WILL ALSO BE ASKED TO SUPPORT IN PRINCIPLE A PROPOSAL BY THE DISTRICT OFFICE TO CARRY OUT INTERIM REPAIRS TO THE ROAD SURFACE AND DRAINAGE SYSTEM OF THE LANE, USING DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS.

SUBJECT TO THEIR APPROVAL, THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND THE CITY AND NEW TERRITORIES ADMINISTRATION'S WORKS SECTION WILL PROCEED TO ASSESS THE EXTENT OF NECESSARY REPAIRS AND PREPARE AN ESTIMATE OF COSTS FOR THE COMMITTEE'S CONSIDERATION.

ACCORDING TO THE GUIDELINES FOR THE USE OF DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS, PRIOR CONSENT OF LANDOWNERS ARE REQUIRED FOR PROJECTS ON PRIVATE LAND.

THEREFORE, THE DISTRICT OFFICE WILL ASSIST FLAT OWNERS IN KIM SHIN LANE TO FORM OWNERS' CORPORATIONS AND SEEK THEIR AGREEMENT TO THE PROPOSED WORKS.

ANOTHER ITEM FOR DISCUSSION AT THE MEETING IS A PROPOSED HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME PROJECT AT TAI WO PING.

THE PROJECT, COVERING AN AREA OF ABOUT 12 HECTARES, WILL PROVIDE A MAXIMUM OF 3,400 FLATS FOR 11,500 PEOPLE.

SITE FORMATION IS EXPECTED TO COMMENCE LATE THIS YEAR AND IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE FLATS WILL BE OCCUPIED BY LATE 1995.

THE MEETING WILL ALSO DISCUSS IMPROVEMENTS TO THE MANAGEMENT OF A REFUSE COLLECTION POINT AT THE JUNCTION OF TAI NAN STREET AND KWEILIN STREET, IMPROVEMENTS TO FACILITIES AT BEACON HILL, USE OF THE SHAM SHUI PO ARMY CAMP SITE, THE SUSPENSION OF SALT WATER SUPPLY IN PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES AND HAWKING PROBLEMS IN MEI FOO SUN CHUEN.

IN ADDITION, MEMBERS WILL BE PRESENTED WITH INFORMATION PAPERS ON THE INTRODUCTION OF AN EVENING SERVICE IN COLLECTING HOUSEHOLD WASTES IN THREE HOUSING ESTATES, THE PROGRESS OF PROJECTS FUNDED BY THE 1988-89 ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT VOTE AND THE NOISE NUISANCE TO THE FAT TSUENG STREET TEMPORARY HOUSING AREA.
