BD BLITZ AGAINST DEMOLITION SITES

\* \* \* \* \*

THE BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT SPECIAL TASK FORCE HAVE VISITED ALL 140 DEMOLITION SITES, OF WHICH 138 WERE IN ACTIVE OPERATION.

THE DEPARTMENT WAS TO INSPECT THEIR OPERATIONS FOR SAFETY AND FOR COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIRED STANDARDS AND REGULATIONS. SPECIFICALLY, THIS INCLUDES CHECKS ON:

- \* METHOD AND SEQUENCE OF DEMOLITION;
- \* AMOUNT OF DEBRIS ACCUMULATION ON SITE;
- \* ADEQUACY OF PROTECTIVE SCREENS AND ANY OTHER SAFETY MEASURES NECESSARY;
- \* CONDITIONS OF COVERED WALKWAYS AND HOARDING; AND
- \* ANY IRREGULARITIES OR BREACH OF THE LAW FOR BUILDING SAFETY.

OF THE 138 SITES IN ACTIVE OPERATION, THE SPECIAL TASK FORCE HAVE FOUND 12 TO BE UNSATISFACTORY IN THE FOLLOWING ASPECTS:

- \* EXCESSIVE ACCUMULATION OF DEBRIS ON SITE;
- \* OBSTRUCTION TO COVERED WALKWAYS FOR PEDESTRIANS;
- \* NEED FOR IMPROVEMENT TO PROTECTIVE SCREENS;
- \* NEED FOR ADDITIONAL SUPPORT TO THE BUILDINGS UNDER DEMOLITION; AND
- \* UNAUTHORISED USE OF HEAVY MECHANICAL EQUIPMENT.

THE SPECIAL TASK FORCE HAVE REQUIRED THE AUTHORISED PERSONS (THAT IS THE PROFESSIONALS RESPONSIBLE FOR THOSE SITES) TO TAKE IMMEDIATE REMEDIAL ACTION TO RESTORE SAFE OPERATION OF THESE 12 SITES.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS CARRIED OUT FOLLOW-UP INSPECTIONS AT THESE 12 SITES TODAY AND WILL DO SO AS APPROPRIATE AGAIN LATER TO ENSURE ALL NECESSARY SAFETY REQUIREMENTS ARE IN PLACE.

THE TASK FORCE HAVE FOUND THE OTHER SITES GENERALLY SATISFACTORY AND REMINDED THOSE RESPONSIBLE OF THEIR DUTY TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE REGULATIONS AND NECESSARY SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS PLEDGED TO DO MORE. IT WILL BE FOLLOWING UP FURTHER AND IT WILL REQUIRE AUTHORISED PERSONS RESPONSIBLE FOR DEMOLITION SITES TO SUBMIT REPORTS AND RECORDS OF:

- \* THEIR SITE SUPERVISION ARRANGEMENTS;
- \* THEIR INSTRUCTIONS TO CONTRACTORS; AND
- \* THE GUIDANCE TO DEMOLITION WORKERS.

IN THIS BLITZ ACTION, THE SPECIAL TASK FORCE HAVE DEPLOYED CLOSE TO 80 PROFESSIONAL STAFF IN THE BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT.

THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDINGS WILL CONTINUE TO MAKE AVAILABLE ADDITIONAL STAFF, BY INTERNAL REDEPLOYMENT, TO CARRY OUT SPOT CHECKS AND SITE INSPECTIONS TO ENSURE SAFETY AND COMPLIANCE WITH BUILDING REGULATIONS.

THE BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT WILL CONTINUE TO MONITOR DEMOLITION SITES.

IT WILL TAKE LEGAL ACTION WHERE APPROPRIATE.

NOTE TO EDITORS:

THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE 12 DEMOLITION SITES FOUND UNSATISFACTORY IN SOME ASPECTS IS AS FOLLOWS:

SIX ON HONG KONG ISLAND (THREE IN WAN CHAI, AND ONE EACH IN CENTRAL, POK FU LAM AND SHAU KEI WAN).

FIVE IN KOWLOON (TWO IN SAN PO KONG, AND ONE EACH IN SHAM SHUI PO, KWUN TONG AND TSIM SHA TSUI).

ONE IN SHEUNG SHUI, THE NEW TERRITORIES.

MEANWHILE, THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDINGS, MRS HELEN YU, WILL BE MEETING REPRESENTATIVES OF THE HONG KONG INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS, HONG KONG INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, HONG KONG INSTITUTE OF SURVEYORS, HONG KONG CONSTRUCTION ASSOCIATION AND THE REAL ESTATE DEVELOPERS ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG, IN THE BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT AT 3 PM TOMORROW (MONDAY).

SHENZHEN RIVER ENVIRONMENT REPORT AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION

THE ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT (EIA) OF THE STAGE ONE OF THE SHENZHEN RIVER REGULATION PROJECT HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND ITS REPORT WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION FROM TOMORROW (MONDAY).

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO ARE INTERESTED IN THE FULL REPORT MAY GO TO THE PUBLIC REFERENCE LIBRARIES OF THE URBAN AND REGIONAL COUNCILS; THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPARTMENT HEADQUARTERS; THE YUEN LONG AND NORTH DISTRICT OFFICES, AND THE LIBRARY OF THE OFFICE OF MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SECRETARIAT.

COPIES OF THE EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE REPORT MAY ALSO BE OBTAINED FREE OF CHARGE FROM THESE OFFICES.

THE EIA STUDY, WHICH BEGAN IN DECEMBER LAST YEAR, IS TO ASSESS THE ENVIRONMENTAL ACCEPTABILITY OF STAGES I AND II OF THE PROJECT AND TO RECOMMEND NECESSARY MITIGATION MEASURES.

THE EIA FOR THE OTHER STAGE OF THE PROJECT WILL CONTINUE AND IS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED BY MARCH NEXT YEAR.

56 NEW BUILDING PLANS APPROVED

\* \* \* \* \*

THE BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT APPROVED 56 NEW BUILDING PLANS IN JUNE THIS YEAR.

OF THE PLANS, 16 ARE FOR HONG KONG ISLAND, 18 FOR KOWLOON AND 22 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE APPROVED PLANS INCLUDE 22 FOR APARTMENT AND APARTMENT/COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS, 11 FOR COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENTS AND NINE FOR FACTORY AND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENTS.

IN THE SAME MONTH, CONSENT WAS GIVEN FOR WORK TO START ON 56 NEW BUILDING PROJECTS, WHICH INVOLVE 59,886.9 SQUARE METRES OF USABLE DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA AND 174,206.2 SQUARE METRES OF USABLE NON-DOMESTIC FLOOR AREA.

THE DECLARED COST OF NEW BUILDINGS COMPLETED IN THE MONTH TOTALLED ABOUT \$1,455 MILLION.

OF THE BUILDINGS CERTIFIED FOR OCCUPATION IN THE MONTH, USABLE FLOOR AREAS FOR DOMESTIC AND NON-DOMESTIC USES ARE 65,783.2 SQUARE METRES AND 101,961.3 SQUARE METRES RESPECTIVELY.

IN THE SAME MONTH, THE DEPARTMENT ISSUED 28 OCCUPATION PERMITS - 11 FOR HONG KONG ISLAND, FIVE FOR KOWLOON AND 12 FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES.

IN ADDITION, 41 DEMOLITION CONSENTS INVOLVING 108 BUILDINGS WERE ISSUED.

THE BUILDINGS DEPARTMENT'S CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT DIVISION RECEIVED 577 COMPLAINTS OF UNAUTHORISED BUILDING WORKS, CARRIED OUT 1,658 INSPECTIONS AND ISSUED 239 REMOVAL ORDERS ON UNAUTHORISED WORKS.

THE DEPARTMENT'S DANGEROUS BUILDINGS SECTION ALSO INSPECTED 885 BUILDINGS AND OBTAINED NO EMERGENCY CLOSURE ORDER FROM THE COURT.

APPLICATION FORMS FOR P1 PLACES AVAILABLE TOMORROW

PARENTS WHO WISH TO APPLY FOR A PRIMARY ONE PLACE IN PUBLIC-SECTOR SCHOOLS FOR THEIR CHILDREN IN SEPTEMBER NEXT YEAR UNDER THE PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION SYSTEM CAN OBTAIN APPLICATION FORMS FROM TOMORROW (MONDAY) TO END OF THE MONTH (SEPTEMBER 30).

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID APPLICATION FOR ADMISSION TO PRIMARY ONE WAS OPEN TO ALL HONG KONG BELONGING CHILDREN WHO WERE BORN ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1989 AND WHO ARE NOT STUDYING IN A PRIMARY SCHOOL.

HE SAID PARENTS OF CHILDREN WHO WERE ATTENDING KINDERGARTENS COULD OBTAIN THE APPLICATION FORMS, RELATED INFORMATION LEAFLETS AND EXPLANATORY NOTES ON HOW TO COMPLETE THE APPLICATION FORM FROM THEIR KINDERGARTENS.

FOR PARENTS OF CHILDREN NOT ATTENDING KINDERGARTENS, THE FORMS ARE AVAILABLE FROM DISTRICT OFFICES AND OFFICES OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT COMPLETED APPLICATION FORMS TOGETHER WITH ALL RELEVANT DOCUMENTS SHOULD BE RETURNED WITHIN OFFICE HOURS BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 26 AND 30 DIRECT TO A GOVERNMENT OR AIDED PRIMARY SCHOOL IN WHICH THE PARENT WISHES TO APPLY FOR A DISCRETIONARY PLACE.

THIS SCHOOL MAY EITHER BE WITHIN OR OUTSIDE THE DISTRICT IN WHICH THE CHILD LIVES.

BUT THE SPOKESMAN SAID PARENTS WERE STRONGLY ADVISED TO SELECT A NEIGHBOURHOOD SCHOOL IN ORDER TO REDUCE UNNECESSARY TRANSPORT PROBLEMS AND TO TAKE THE "POINTS SYSTEM" INTO CONSIDERATION IN SELECTING THE SCHOOL.

THE SPOKESMAN EMPHASISED THAT ONLY ONE APPLICATION FORM SHOULD BE RETURNED IN RESPECT OF ANY ONE CHILD.

"IF PARENTS ARE FOUND TO HAVE APPLIED TO MORE THAN ONE GOVERNMENT OR AIDED SCHOOL, THEIR APPLICATIONS WILL BE RENDERED VOID AND ALLOCATION OF A DISCRETIONARY PLACE MADE ON THE BASIS OF SUCH APPLICATIONS WILL BE WITHDRAWN," HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO REQUESTED PARENTS OF THOSE CHILDREN WHO CANNOT USE CHINESE AS A LEARNING MEDIUM TO SEEK ADVICE FROM THE DEPARTMENT'S PRIMARY ONE ADMISSION UNIT AT SECOND FLOOR, 269 QUEEN'S ROAD EAST, WAN CHAI, HONG KONG (TEL 572 4383), BEFORE SUBMITTING AN APPLICATION FORM.

HE SAID SCHOOLS RECEIVING TOO FEW APPLICATIONS FOR DISCRETIONARY PLACES MIGHT NOT BE ALLOWED TO OPERATE PRIMARY ONE CLASSES, AND IN SUCH CASES, CHILDREN ALREADY ACCEPTED BY THESE SCHOOLS FOR DISCRETIONARY PLACES WOULD HAVE TO BE SUBSEQUENTLY RE-ALLOCATED TO SOME OTHER SCHOOLS WHICH HAD VANCANCIES.

IF PARENTS ONLY WISH TO APPLY FOR CENTRAL ALLOCATION, THEY SHOULD SEND IN THE COMPLETED APPLICATION FORM WITH RELEVANT DOCUMENTS TO ONE OF THE FOLLOWING COLLECTION CENTRES WITHIN OFFICE HOURS DURING THE SAME PERIOD:

BOOKLET TO PREVENT YOUTH SUICIDE

\* \* \* \* \*

THE CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY UNIT OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT HAS PRODUCED A PUBLICITY BOOKLET TO PREVENT YOUNG PEOPLE FROM COMMITTING SUICIDE.

ENTITLED "I WILL LIVE ON", THIS FULL-COLOUR PUBLICATION IS AIMED AT INCULCATING IN YOUNG PEOPLE THAT UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES THEY SHOULD RESORT TO TERMINATING THEIR LIVES.

"THE BOOKLET IS INTENDED TO HELP ADOLESCENTS TO TAKE A MORE POSITIVE LOOK AT LIFE AND DEATH BY ADDRESSING TO THEIR FEELINGS AND COGNITIONS WHEN THEY CONTEMPLATE SUICIDE," SAID THE SENIOR CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGIST OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT, MR YAU DICK-WAH, TODAY (SUNDAY).

"IT IS MEANT TO BE A SELF-HELP RESOURCE BOOKLET WHICH WILL ENABLE ADOLESCENTS TO HAVE SECOND THOUGHT ABOUT THEIR PROBLEMS AND HOW THEY APPROACH TO SOLVE THEM.

"HOPEFULLY, THEY WOULD CHOOSE TO LIVE ON INSTEAD OF TAKING THEIR LIVES AFTER REEVALUATING THEIR OPTIONS," MR YAU ADDED.

THE BACK COVER OF THE BOOKLET CONTAINS A COMPREHENSIVE LIST OF GOVERNMENT AND NON-GOVERNMENT ORGANISATIONS WHERE YOUNG PEOPLE CAN SEEK COUNSELLING SERVICE IF THEY COME ACROSS ANY PERSONAL OR EMOTIONAL PROBLEMS.

COPIES OF THE BOOKLET, PRINTED IN CHINESE, ARE NOW OBTAINABLE AT ALL YOUTH OFFICES OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

FOREIGN DOMESTIC HELPERS MUST BE INSURED

EMPLOYERS OF FOREIGN DOMESTIC HELPERS SHOULD COMPLY WITH THEIR STATUTORY OBLIGATION TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES FOR THEIR DOMESTIC HELPERS UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION ORDINANCE (ECO), THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

AN EMPLOYER OF A FOREIGN DOMESTIC HELPER WAS RECENTLY FINED \$3,000 BY A SHA TIN MAGISTRATE FOR FAILING TO TAKE OUT AN INSURANCE POLICY TO COVER HIS FULL LIABILITIES UNDER THE ECO AND COMMON LAW.

"THE CASE CAME TO LIGHT WHEN A FOREIGN DOMESTIC HELPER REPORTED WORK INJURY TO THE EMPLOYEES' COMPENSATION DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT IN FEBRUARY THIS YEAR," LABOUR OFFICER (PROSECUTIONS) MRS GRACE SHEK SAID.

"FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT THE EMPLOYER OF THE FOREIGN DOMESTIC HELPER DID NOT TAKE OUT INSURANCE FOR THE DOMESTIC HELPER," SHE SAID.

MRS SHEK POINTED OUT THAT UNDER THE ECO, ALL EMPLOYERS ARE REQUIRED TO TAKE OUT INSURANCE POLICIES TO COVER THEIR FULL LIABILITIES UNDER THE ORDINANCE AND UNDER COMMON LAW.

"THIS STATUTORY REQUIREMENT APPLIES TO EMPLOYERS OF BOTH FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME EMPLOYEES," SHE SAID.

"EMPLOYERS OF DOMESTIC SERVANTS ARE OF NO EXCEPTIONS," SHE ADDED.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS LEGAL REQUIREMENT WILL RENDER THE OFFENDER LIABLE TO A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$20,000 AND ONE YEAR'S IMPRISONMENT.
