MORE THAN 63,200 FORM 1 PLACES ALLOCATED
* * * * *

A TOTAL OF 63,266 CANDIDATES WHO TOOK THE SECONDARY SCHOOL ENTRANCE EXAMINATION IN MAY HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED FORM 1 PLACES BASED ON THE RESULTS OF THE EXAMINATION, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY.

THIS MEANS THAT 14,712 MORE PUPILS GAINED FORM 1 PLACES COMPARED WITH THE TOTAL NUMBER OF 48,554 PLACES ALLOCATED IN 1975.

ALTOGETHER 97,930 CANDIDATES SAT FOR THE EXAMINATION THIS YEAR COMPARED WITH 96,119 IN 1975.

OF THE 63,266 PLACES ALLOCATED THIS YEAR, 23,082 ARE GOVERNMENT AND AIDED FIVE-YEAR PLACES, 290 PRIVATE FIVE-YEAR PLACES, 9,655 GOVERNMENT AND AIDED THREE-YEAR PLACES AND 30,239 PRIVATE THREE-YEAR PLACES.

THESE FIGURES COVER ALL CANDIDATES IN BLOCK X1 TO X5, Y1 AND Y2 AND ALSO SEVEN BLOCK Z1 CANDIDATES WHO WERE OFFERED UNFILLED THREE-YEAR PLACES IN SCHOOLS NEAR THEIR HOMES. THE ALLOCATIONS TO THE SEVEN BLOCK Z1 CANDIDATES DO NOT APPEAR IN THE FULL RESULTS LISTS ISSUED TO PRIMARY SCHOOLS- THEIR PARENTS WILL BE INFORMED INDIVIDUALLY IN WRITING, AN EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE ADDED : +CANDIDATES MAY INQUIRE ABOUT THEIR RESULTS AT THEIR PRIMARY SCHOOLS TOMORROW. THEY SHOULD REPORT TO THEIR PRIMARY SCHOOLS AGAIN ON JULY 21 (WEDNESDAY) TAKING WITH THEM THEIR ADMISSION FORMS, IN ORDER THAT THEIR INDIVIDUAL RESULTS SLIPS MAY BE ATTACHED TO THE FORMS.+

SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES WHO HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED FIVE-YEAR OR THREE-YEAR PLACES IN GOVERNMENT OR AIDED SECONDARY SCHOOLS OR ASSISTED PLACES (FIVE-YEAR ASSISTANCE) IN PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS SHOULD REPORT TO THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO WHICH THEY HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DATES AND TIMES SPECIFIED. THIS INFORMATION HAS BEEN SUPPLIED TO ALL PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS.

/CANDIDATES WHO

CANDIDATES WHO HAVE BEEN AWARDED ASSISTED PLACES (THREE-YEAR ASSISTANCE) IN PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS SHOULD REPORT TO THE SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO WHICH THEY HAVE BEEN ALLOCATED DURING THE FIRST THREE-DAY REGISTRATION PERIOD, I.E. AUGUST 3, 4 AND 5, 1976, IF THEY WISH TO TAKE UP THE PLACES OFFERED. THERE WILL BE A SECOND THREE-DAY PERIOD OF REGISTRATION, I.E. AUGUST 6, 9 AND 10, 1976 DURING WHICH ANY OF THESE CANDIDATES WHO HAVE CHOSEN NOT TO TAKE UP THE PLACES OFFERED WILL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO FIND PLACES FOR THEMSELVES IN OTHER PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS OFFERING THREE-YEAR ASSISTED PLACES WHICH MAY HAVE VACANCIES.

PARENTS OF CANDIDATES WHO HAVE BEEN AWARDED THREE-YEAR ASSISTED PLACES IN PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS SHOULD MAKE CERTAIN THAT THEY READ THE GUIDE TO PARENTS PRINTED ON THE BACK OF THE ALLOCATION SLIPS TO BE ISSUED TOGETHER WITH THE INDIVIDUAL RESULTS SLIPS. THIS GUIDE EXPLAINS THE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES IN DETAIL.

PARENTS ARE REMINDED THAT CANDIDATES WHO HAVE BEEN AWARDED THREE-YEAR PLACES IN GOVERNMENT OR AIDED SECONDARY SCHOOLS AND EVENTUALLY FIND PLACES FOR THEMSELVES IN ANY PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOLS ARE NOT ENTITLED TO GOVERNMENT FEE ASSISTANCE.

FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS INTO IMPORTED CHOLERA CASE

* * * * *

THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAS CARRIED OUT FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS INTO LAST WEEK'S IMPORTED CASE OF CHOLERA INVOLVING AN AMERICAN TOURIST WHO IS NOW RECOVERING AT PRINCESS MARGARET HOSPITAL.

HEALTH OFFICERS HAVE TRACED THE DIRECT CONTACTS OF THE CHOLERA INFECTED WOMAN AND TAKEN RECTAL SWABS FROM ALL OF THEM FOR BACTERIOLOGICAL TESTS.

RESULTS OF THE TESTS SHOWED THAT ALL STOOL SPECIMENS EXCEPT ONE WERE NEGATIVE. THE ONE SPECIMEN THAT SHOWED POSITIVE RESULT WAS FROM A 20-YEAR-OLD GIRL WHO HAD BEEN IN DIRECT CONTACT WITH THE AMERICAN WOMAN.

THE GIRL WAS TAKEN TO PRINCESS MARGARET HOSPITAL TO BE ISOLATED AND PUT UNDER MEDICAL SURVEILLANCE. ALTHOUGH HER STOOL SPECIMEN WAS POSITIVE, SHE SHOWED NO SIGNS OF THE DISEASE AND WAS THEREFORE REGARDED AND TREATED AS A CARRIER.

FURTHER RECTAL SWABS WERE THEN TAKEN FROM HER CONTACTS AND RESULTS ON THESE PROVED TO BE NEGATIVE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT STRESSED THAT THE GIRL IS NOT SUFFERING FROM CHOLERA AND SHE WOULD BE DISCHARGED FROM HOSPITAL WHEN HER STOOL IS CLEARED OF THE CHOLERA ORGANISM.

THE CONDITION OF THE AMERICAN WOMAN HAS ALSO MARKEDLY IMPROVED, AND SHE IS EXPECTED TO BE DISCHARGED IN THE NEXT FEW DAYS.

HE SAID THAT NO OTHER CASES HAVE BEEN DETECTED APART FROM THIS ONE IMPORTED CASE, AND HONG KONG REMAINS AN UNINFECTED AREA.

THE SPOKESMAN EMPHASISED THAT MEASURES TO PREVENT ANY OUTBREAK OF CHOLERA IN HONG KONG AND TO LOCATE CARRIERS OF THE DISEASE ARE TAKEN THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, AND THESE INCLUDE THE EXAMINATION OF NIGHTSOIL SAMPLES AND ALL CASES OF DIARRHOEA FOR CHOLERA ORGANISMS.

BUT HE URGED THE PUBLIC TO CONTINUE THEIR VIGILANCE IN PROTECTING THEMSELVES AGAINST CHOLERA AND OTHER DIARRHOEA DISEASES BY OBSERVING THE SIMPLE RULES OF PERSONAL HYGIENE AND ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANLINESS.

ANTI-CHOLERA VACCINES ARE AVAILABLE AT ALL GOVERNMENT CLINICS FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO BE VACCINATED.

HOWEVER, THE SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED THAT CHOLERA VACCINATION DOES NOT PROVIDE FULL PROTECTION.

+THE MOST RELIABLE MEASURES ARE TO ENSURE CLEANLINESS IN THE PREPARATION AND CONSUMPTION OF FOOD, AND GOOD PERSONAL HYGIENE,+ HE ADDED.

BUS ROUTE CHANGES

A NUMBER OF BUS ROUTE CHANGES WILL TAKE PLACE DURING THE NEXT FEW DAYS, A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY.

IMPROVED BUS SERVICES WILL BE INTRODUCED IN THE TUEN MUN AREA TOMORROW (FRIDAY). THIS INCLUDES THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW KMB ROUTE 61 BETWEEN TUEN MUN AND YUEN LONG VIA HA TSUEN.

IN KOWLOON, K.M.B. ROUTE 2C WILL BE AMENDED SO AS TO TERMINATE AT TAI HANG TUNG INSTEAD OF YAU YAT CHUEN.

STARTING FROM SUNDAY (JULY 18), CMB ROUTES 3, 6, 6A AND 15 WILL BE RE-ROUTED ON JOURNEYS TO CENTRAL VIA QUEEN'S ROAD CENTRAL AND QUEEN VICTORIA STREET INSTEAD OF PEDDER STREET.

AGREEMENT HAS BEEN REACHED BETWEEN CMB AND THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT FOR A NEW ROUTE TO BE INTRODUCED SHORTLY BETWEEN THE HING WAH ESTATE AT CHAI WAN AND LAI TAK TSUEN VIA NORTH POINT AND CAUSEWAY BAY. IT IS HOPED TO START THIS SERVICE AT THE EARLIEST IN AUGUST.

A PARTY OF 60 YOUNG ENVIRONMENTALISTS WILL START A THREE-DAY +WORKING BEE+ ON SUNDAY (JULY 18) TO CLEAN UP THE KEI LING HA PICNIC AREA AT SAI KUNG NORTH.

MEMBERS OF THE YOUTH ENVIRONMENT ACTION GROUP, COMPRISING SECONDARY SCHOOL AND UNIVERSITY STUDENTS, WILL PITCH CAMP AT NOON TO PREPARE FOR THE CLEAN-UP OPERATION, PARTICULARLY OF THE FORESHORE AREA WHICH IS POPULAR WITH CANOEING AND BOATING ENTHUSIASTS.

C.A.S. MOUNTAIN RESCUERS COMPLETE TRAINING IN U.K.

* * * * *

THE CIVIL AID SERVICES PLANS TO RUN MOUNTAIN CRAFT COURSES FOR YOUTH LEADERS LATER THIS YEAR.

DISCLOSING THIS TODAY, A CAS SPOKESMAN SAID FIVE OFFICERS FROM THE MOUNTAIN RESCUE UNIT HAD JUST COMPLETED THEIR ADVANCED TRAINING IN THE UNITED KINGDOM.

THEY ARE THE FIRST MOUNTAIN RESCUERS SENT ABROAD TO RECEIVE FURTHER TRAINING IN MOUNTAIN SEARCH AND RESCUE AND MOUNTAIN CRAFT.

THE GROUP, WHICH LEFT HONG KONG IN MAY, FIRST ATTENDED A MOUNTAIN LEADERSHIP COURSE IN GRANTOWN, SCOTLAND, BEFORE RECEIVING ANOTHER WEEK OF MOUNTAIN RESCUE TRAINING IN THE SCOTTISH TOWN OF KINLOSS.

FROM SCOTLAND, THEY WENT TO NORTH WALES WHERE THEY RECEIVED FURTHER TRAINING IN MOUNTAIN RESCUE AND MOUNTAIN CRAFT.

THE TRAINING WAS CARRIED OUT WITH THE CO-OPERATION OF THE RAF LAND RESCUE SERVICE AND THE UK CENTRAL COUNCIL FOR PHYSICAL RECREATION.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID: +THE OFFICERS WHO HAVE COMPLETED THEIR TRAINING WILL PASS ON THEIR KNOWLEDGE TO OTHER MEMBERS OF CAS ON THEIR RETURN.+

HE POINTED OUT THAT AS THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO GO HIKING WAS ON THE INCREASE, THE NUMBER OF ACCIDENTS WOULD INEVITABLY GO UP.

+IT IS IMPORTANT, THEREFORE, CAS MOUNTAIN RESCUERS SHOULD BE TRAINED IN THE MOST MODERN TECHNIQUES IN ORDER TO COPE WITH THE SITUATION.+

AT PRESENT, THE CAS MOUNTAIN RESCUE UNIT CONSISTS OF 56 MEMBERS. THEY ARE TRAINED TO RESCUE PEOPLE WHO ARE INJURED, TRAPPED OR BECOME LOST ON MOUNTAINS. IN ADDITION, THEY ARE TAUGHT HOW TO RESCUE SURVIVORS FROM AIR CRASHES IN REMOTE AREAS.

ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS, VOLUNTEERS FROM THE MOUNTAIN RESCUE UNIT ARE ON STANDBY DUTY AT THE CAS KOWLOON TRAINING CENTRE AT 204 ARGYLE STREET, KOWLOON FROM 10 A.M. TO 9.30 P.M. THEY CAN BE CONTACTED ON TELEPHONE NOS. 3-015011 OR 3-016030.

THE GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT IT INTENDS TO APPEAL AGAINST THE DECISION OF THE HIGH COURT IN THE PROCEEDINGS BROUGHT BY A NUMBER OF DEMARCATORS.

THE DEMARCATORS CONCERNED WILL, IN THE MEANTIME, BE PAID THEIR FULL SALARIES WITH EFFECT FROM APRIL 1 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DECLARATIONS MADE BY THE HIGH COURT.

APRIL ISSUE OF MONTHLY DIGEST OF STATISTICS

* * * * *

THE APRIL ISSUE OF THE HONG KONG MONTHLY DIGEST OF STATISTICS, WHICH CONTAINS A SPECIAL REVIEW ARTICLE, IS NOW ON SALE.

THE ARTICLE INTRODUCES AN EFFECTIVE (TRADE-WEIGHTED) EXCHANGE RATE OF THE HONG KONG DOLLAR, ITS METHOD OF CALCULATION AND ITS MOVEMENTS SINCE DECEMBER 18, 1971 WHEN THE SMITHSONIAN AGREEMENT WAS REACHED.

CONVENTIONALLY, THE EXTERNAL VALUE OF THE HONG KONG DOLLAR HAS BEEN EXPRESSED IN TERMS OF AN INTERNATIONAL CURRENCY SUCH AS THE U.S. DOLLAR. BECAUSE OF THE FLOATING EXCHANGE RATE SYSTEM AND THE RELATIVE STRENGTH OF THE H.K. DOLLAR AGAINST OTHER MAJOR CURRENCIES, THIS IS NO LONGER A RELIABLE YARDSTICK FOR MEASURING EXCHANGE VALUES OF THE H.K. DOLLAR.

WHILST THE HONG KONG DOLLAR MAY DEPRECIATE OR APPRECIATE AGAINST THE CURRENCIES OF HONG KONG'S MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS, SOME INDICATION ON THE NET, OVERALL POSITION REQUIRES THAT AN EFFECTIVE (TRADE-WEIGHTED) EXCHANGE RATE BE CONSTRUCTED. THE EFFECTIVE (TRADE-WEIGHTED) EXCHANGE RATE ATTEMPTS TO INDICATE THE MOVEMENTS OF THE EXTERNAL VALUE OF THE HONG KONG DOLLAR IN TERMS OF 15 CURRENCIES OF HONG KONG'S TRADING PARTNERS.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE FOR HOTEL GUESTS

* * * * *

ANY PERSON OVER THE AGE OF 15 WHO INTENDS TO STAY IN A HOTEL OR A LODGING PLACE SHOULD ON ARRIVAL INFORM THE KEEPER OF THE PREMISES HIS FULL NAME AND NATIONALITY.

IN A NOTICE, THE DIRECTOR OF IMMIGRATION ALSO DREW THE ATTENTION OF SUCH PERSON, WHO IS AN ALIEN, THAT HE SHOULD ALSO INFORM THE KEEPER OF THE DATE OF HIS ARRIVAL IN HONG KONG, THE NAME OF THE SHIP OR AIRLINE BY WHICH HE ARRIVED AND HIS OCCUPATION.

IN ADDITION, HE SHOULD INFORM THE KEEPER BEFORE HIS DEPARTURE THE PLACE TO WHICH HE IS GOING AND ALSO THE NAME OF THE SHIP AND AIRLINE BY WHICH HE WILL DEPART.

UNDER THE IMMIGRATION ORDINANCE 1971, THE KEEPER OF THE PREMISES IS REQUIRED, AMONG OTHER THINGS, TO KEEP FOR AT LEAST 12 MONTHS A RECORD IN WRITING OF THE INFORMATION GIVEN TO HIM BY A LODGER AND AN IMMIGRATION OFFICER OR POLICE OFFICER MAY INSPECT AT ANY TIME THE RECORD KEPT BY THE KEEPER OF ANY PREMISES.
