BLITZ AGAINST ILLEGAL DISPLAY OF POSTERS  
\* \* \* \* \*

OVER 40 SUMMONSES WERE ISSUED DURING A TWO-DAY BLITZ AGAINST ILLEGAL DISPLAY OF POSTERS ON WALLS OF PRIVATE BUILDINGS AND AT PUBLIC PLACES.

THE OPERATION, CARRIED OUT BY THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT AND REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT THIS WEEKEND (SATURDAY AND SUNDAY), WAS PART OF THE ACTION PLANNED TO TACKLE THE PROBLEM.

THE PRACTICE OF DISPLAYING POSTERS OR SIMILAR FORM OF PUBLICITY MATERIALS AT PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PLACES HAD CAUSED GREAT PROBLEMS TO ENVIRONMENTAL TIDINESS AND CLEANLINESS.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE JOINT URBAN COUNCIL/REGIONAL COUNCIL KEEP HONG KONG CLEAN STEERING COMMITTEE SAID THE DISPLAY OF PUBLICITY MATERIALS IN PRIVATE PLACES WITHOUT OWNERS' CONSENT OR AT PUBLIC PLACES WITHOUT THE GOVERNMENT'S AUTHORITY WAS AN OFFENCE UNDER THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND MUNICIPAL SERVICES ORDINANCE AND CARRIED A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$2 000.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED THAT THE TWO DEPARTMENTS, BESIDES PROSECUTING PEOPLE STICKING POSTERS AT PRIVATE OR PUBLIC PLACES WITHOUT APPROVAL, WERE ALSO CONSIDERING TAKING ACTION AGAINST ADVERTISED COMPANIES INVOLVED.

IN ADDITION, WARNING LETTERS WERE REGULARLY SENT TO THE KNOWN OFFENDERS IN EACH DISTRICT, HE SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN STRESSED THAT THE ENFORCEMENT OF LEGISLATION WAS JUST ONE WAY TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM. SELF-DISCIPLINE SHOULD BE EXERCISED AMONG MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AND THE COMPANIES CONCERNED IN ORDER TO FULLY CONTAIN THE PROBLEM.

FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION IS LONG-TERM WORK AND FOR IT TO BE EFFECTIVE, SUSTAINED PROMOTIONAL EFFORTS ARE REQUIRED, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR STEPHEN LAW, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE +FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION MOTHER'S DAY CARNIVAL+ ORGANISED BY THE HONG KONG CHILDREN AND YOUTH SERVICES AT THE NEW WORLD PLAZA, HE SAID THAT THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AND A NUMBER OF VOLUNTARY AGENCIES HAD BEEN PROMOTING FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION SINCE 1979.

+IT IS A COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROGRAMME TO HIGHLIGHT THE IMPORTANCE OF IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF FAMILY LIFE IN ORDER TO FOSTER A MORE HARMONIOUS RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN FAMILY MEMBERS AND TO PREVENT FAMILY BREAKUPS,+ HE SAID.

AS FOR THE ACTUAL PROMOTION OF FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION, THE DEPARTMENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR OVERALL CO-ORDINATION AND PLANNING AS WELL AS THE ANNUAL TERRITORY-WIDE PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN WHILE THE FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION WORKERS OF THE AGENCIES DEAL WITH THE ORGANISATION OF ACTIVITIES AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL UNDER THE AUSPICES OF DISTRICT FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION COMMITTEES.

IN ADDITION, THERE IS A RESOURCE CENTRE IN THE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE AUDIO-VISUAL, DISPLAY AND OTHER REFERENCE MATERIALS FOR USE BY THE FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION WORKERS.

MR LAW POINTED OUT THAT FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION WAS CONDUCTED THROUGH VARIOUS CHANNELS, INCLUDING RADIO AND TELEVISION PROGRAMMES, NEWSPAPER AND OTHER PUBLICATIONS, EXHIBITIONS, SEMINARS, TALKS AND GROUP DISCUSSIONS.

THERE ARE AT PRESENT OVER 50 FAMILY LIFE EDUCATION WORKERS IN THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT AND THE 14 VOLUNTARY AGENCIES ENGAGING IN THIS LONG-TERM WORK.

#### RAIN PLAYS HAVOC IN APRIL \* \* \* \* \*

APRIL WAS WETTER THAN USUAL WITH HEAVY RAINSTORM PLAYING HAVOC WITH FARMLAND IN THE NEW TERRITORIES AND LIGHTNING KILLING A FISHERMAN AND INJURING TWO OTHERS.

RAINFALL IN THE MONTH AMOUNTED TO 277.8 MM WHICH WAS ABOUT TWICE THE NORMAL, THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY REPORTED TODAY (SUNDAY). ACCUMULATED RAINFALL SINCE JANUARY 1 WAS 535.5 MM WHICH WAS ALSO TWICE THE MEAN VALUE FOR THE PERIOD.

TORRENTIAL RAIN ON APRIL 5 AND 6 RESULTED IN 133 CASES OF FLOODING AND NINE CASES OF LANDSLIP. ABOUT 106 HECTARES OF FARMLAND WERE INUNDATED IN YUEN LONG, TUEN MUN AND TAI PO AND OVER 5 000 HEADS OF LIVESTOCK WERE DROWNED.

ON APRIL 12, A FISHERMAN WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHERS WERE STRUCK BY LIGHTNING IN SAI KUNG WHEN A SIGNIFICANT SURGE OF WINTER MONSOON ARRIVED, BRINGING IN HEAVY SQUALLY SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORM.

RAINFALL WAS CONFINED TO THE FIRST HALF OF THE MONTH, WITH AN EPISODE OF HEAVY RAIN AND HAILSTORM ON APRIL 5 AND 6 AND A SIGNIFICANT SURGE OF THE WINTER MONSOON ON APRIL 12 AND 13. WEATHER IN THE LATTER HALF OF THE MONTH WAS PREDOMINANTLY FINE AND WARM.

UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF THE WINTER MONSOON, THE FIRST FOUR DAYS OF APRIL WERE RELATIVELY COOL AND MAINLY CLOUDY WITH SOME LIGHT RAIN.

ON APRIL 5, IT WAS DRIZZLY AND MISTY BEFORE THE WEATHER FURTHER DETERIORATED IN THE LATE AFTERNOON WHEN A TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE DEVELOPED NEAR THE SOUTH CHINA COAST. SQUALLY THUNDERSTORMS AFFECTED HONG KONG AND HAIL WAS REPORTED IN SHA TIN AND LAI CHI KOK AROUND 5 PM.

INTENSE RAINSTORM ALSO AFFECTED MACAU. ACCORDING TO PRESS REPORTS, A TOTAL OF 285.4 MM OF RAINFALL WAS RECORDED BETWEEN 4 AND 10 PM MAKING THIS MONTH THE WETTEST APRIL EVER FOR MACAU.

WITH THE TROUGH OF LOW PRESSURE LINGERING NEAR THE SOUTH CHINA COAST, HEAVY AND THUNDERY SHOWERS PERSISTED IN THE REGION. THERE WAS TORRENTIAL RAIN ON APRIL 5 AND 6 WITH THE RAINFALL RECORDED ON APRIL 6 TO OVER 100 MM.

SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS SUBSIDED BY THE AFTERNOON OF APRIL 7 AND IT BECAME SUNNY ON APRIL 8. A WARM AND HUMID SOUTHEASTERLY AIRSTREAM THEN SET IN, BRINGING MIST AND FOG ON APRIL 9 AND 10. WITH WINDS VEERING FURTHER TO THE SOUTHWEST, IT WAS SUNNY AND HOT ON APRIL 11.

ON THE MORNING OF APRIL 12, A SIGNIFICANT SURGE OF THE WINTER MONSOON ARRIVED AND WINDS STRENGTHENED FROM THE EAST. TEMPERATURES FELL SHARPLY BY ABOUT 5 DEGREES CELSIUS IN TWO HOURS AND SKIES TURNED OVERCAST WITH HEAVY SQUALLY SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS.

A FISHERMAN WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHERS WERE STRUCK BY LIGHTNING IN SAI KUNG THAT MORNING.

WINDS REMAINED STRONG UNTIL THE AFTERNOON OF APRIL 13 AND COOL AND WET CONDITIONS PREVAILED TO APRIL 14. MINIMUM TEMPERATURE OF 14.2 DEGREES CELSIUS WERE RECORDED DURING THE EARLY MORNINGS OF APRIL 13 AND 14, THE LOWEST FOR THE MONTH.

THE WEATHER IMPROVED ON APRIL 15 WITH SUNNY INTERVALS. WITH GENTLE BREEZES FROM THE EAST, IT BECAME MILD AND SUNNY OVER THE NEXT FOUR DAYS.

FROM APRIL 20 TO 24, MIST AND FOG OCCURRED OVERNIGHT BUT IT WAS SUNNY AND WARM IN THE AFTERNOON. THE FINE WEATHER PREVAILED OVER THE NEXT TWO DAYS WITH AFTERNOON TEMPERATURE RISING TO 29.8 DEGREES CELSIUS ON APRIL 26, THE HIGHEST RECORDED SO FAR THIS YEAR.

OVERNIGHT ON APRIL 26, WINDS FRESHENED FROM THE EAST, GIVING RISE TO SLIGHTLY COOLER AND CLOUDY CONDITIONS WITH SOME LIGHT RAIN. HOWEVER, ON APRIL 27, WINDS BECAME MODERATE AND SUNNY PERIODS RETURNED BETWEEN APRIL 28 AND 30.

IN APRIL, ONLY ONE TROPICAL CYCLONE OCCURRED OVER THE WESTERN NORTH PACIFIC. TROPICAL STORM PERCY DEVELOPED OVER THE PACIFIC ABOUT 510 KM EAST OF YAP ON THE MORNING OF APRIL 11. IT MOVED NORTHWESTWARDS AND DISSIPATED AT ABOUT 330 KM NORTHEAST OF YAP THE NEXT DAY.

DURING THE MONTH, SEVEN AIRCRAFT WERE DIVERTED FROM HONG KONG DUE TO ADVERSE WEATHER. THUNDERSTORM WARNINGS WERE ISSUED ON APRIL 5, 6, 7 AND 12. FLOOD WARNINGS WERE ISSUED ON APRIL 5, 6 AND 12 AND A LANDSLIP WARNING WAS ISSUED ON APRIL 6. THE YELLOW FIRE DANGER WARNING WAS IN EFFECT FROM APRIL 17 TO 19.

WORKERS URGED TO HEED SAFETY RULES  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TODAY (SUNDAY) REMINDED WORKERS TO OBSERVE SAFETY REGULATIONS IN WORKPLACES AND NOT TO DO ANYTHING LIKELY TO ENDANGER HIMSELF OR OTHERS.

THIS FOLLOWS A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH A GARAGE WORKER WAS FINED \$4 000 BY A CENTRAL COURT MAGISTRATE FOR INFLECTING SEVERE BURN INJURIES ON ANOTHER WORKER'S FEET.

THE CASE SHOWED THAT THE INJURED WORKER USED PETROL TO REMOVE SOME LUBRICANT STAINS ON HIS SHOES. THE PETROL SOAKED THROUGH HIS SOCKS WITH EXCESSIVE QUANTITY DRIPPING ON TO THE FLOOR.

THE DEFENDANT, ON SEEING THIS, SCARED HIM BY LIGHTING UP THE PETROL ON THE FLOOR WHICH IMMEDIATELY IGNITED THE SOCKS OF THE INJURED WORKER.

A LABOUR DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT UNDER THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS REGULATIONS, NO PERSON EMPLOYED IN FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS SHOULD WILFULLY AND WITHOUT ANY REASONABLE CAUSE DO ANYTHING LIKELY TO ENDANGER HIMSELF OR OTHERS.

ANYONE WHO CONTRAVENES ANY OF THE REGULATIONS IS LIABLE, ON CONVICTION, TO A FINE OF \$10 000.

THE SPOKESMAN CALLED ON FACTORY PROPRIETORS TO EXERCISE STRICTER SUPERVISION ON THEIR WORKERS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH ALL THE SAFETY REGULATIONS.

HE ALSO URGED WORKERS NOT TO USE PETROL OR OTHER INFLAMMABLE SOLVENT TO CLEAN PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

AN ENGINEER OF THE HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN PRESENTED WITH AN OUTSTANDING AWARD IN RECOGNITION OF THE EXCELLECT RESULTS HE ACHIEVED AT A UNIVERSITY IN THE UNITED STATES LAST YEAR.

MR WAI CHI-SHING, 32, WAS AWARDED A FELLOWSHIP IN 1985 BY THE INTERNATIONAL ROAD FEDERATION TO STUDY FOR A MASTER OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN HIGHWAY ENGINEERING AT PURDUE UNIVERSITY, INDIANA.

HE IS THE SECOND HONG KONG ENGINEERING PROFESSIONAL TO BE AWARDED THE FEDERATION'S FELLOWSHIP TO FURTHER HIS STUDIES, THE FIRST BEING FORMER SECRETARY FOR LANDS AND WORKS, MR NICKY CHAN, 27 YEARS AGO.

FACING STRONG COMPETITION FROM 20 FELLOW STUDENTS FROM 16 COUNTRIES, MR WAI WAS RECENTLY SELECTED FOR THE OUTSTANDING FELLOWSHIP STUDENT AWARD BY THE FEDERATION, WHICH CONSISTS OF MEMBERS FROM MORE THAN 500 GOVERNMENTS, COMPANIES AND ASSOCIATIONS AROUND THE WORLD.

+MR WAI HAS BROUGHT GREAT CREDIT ON HIMSELF, THE HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT AND THE INTERNATIONAL ROAD FEDERATION,+ THE DIRECTOR OF HIGHWAYS, MR HAROLD BEATON, SAID AFTER PRESENTING THE AWARD TO HIM ON BEHALF OF THE ORGANISATION.

SINCE JOINING THE GOVERNMENT IN 1977 MR WAI HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN A NUMBER OF MAJOR ROAD PROJECTS.

ANOTHER HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT ENGINEER, MR HEUNG YUK-SAI, WAS ALSO AWARDED A FELLOWSHIP BY THE FEDERATION LAST YEAR AND IS NOW STUDYING AT PURDUE UNIVERSITY.

FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITIES

RESIDENTS ORGANISATIONS AND LOCAL BODIES IN SOUTHERN DISTRICT CAN APPLY FOR DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS THROUGH THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMITTEE TO SPONSOR SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITIES.

OUT OF \$73 000 ALLOCATED FROM THE DISTRICT BOARD THIS YEAR, THE COMMITTEE HAS SET ASIDE \$35 000 FOR GRANTS TO LOCAL ORGANISATIONS AND FOR ITS OWN AD HOC PROJECTS.

THE REMAINING FUNDS WILL BE SPENT ON ORGANISING THE DISTRICT'S SOCIAL SERVICES AWARD SCHEME, THE COMMUNITY MEDICAL SCHEME FOR THE ELDERLY, SEA TRIPS FOR HANDICAPPED AND UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN, AND PUBLISHING A DIRECTORY OF SOCIAL SERVICES ORGANISATIONS IN THE DISTRICT.

A DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDS SHOULD REACH THE COMMITTEE SECRETARY AT LEAST TWO WEEKS BEFORE EACH COMMITTEE MEETING AND LATE APPLICATIONS WILL ONLY BE CONSIDERED IN EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

DEADLINES FOR APPLICATIONS FOR MEETINGS IN 1987-88 ARE JUNE 8, AUGUST 10, SEPTEMBER 28, NOVEMBER 23 AND JANUARY 18.

EACH APPLICATION WILL BE STUDIED CAREFULLY BEFORE DECIDING WHETHER THE PROJECT SHOULD BE SUPPORTED AND THE APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO BE GRANTED.

PRIMARY SCHOOLS TO BE BUILT  
\*\*\*\*\*

THE ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAS AWARDED TWO PILING CONTRACTS, TOTALLING \$2.17 MILLION, FOR CONSTRUCTION OF PRIMARY SCHOOLS AT MA ON SHAN AND SHEK WU HUI, FANLING.

AT MA ON SHAN, THE SCHOOL WILL BE BUILT ON A 4 500-SQUARE-METRE SITE IN HANG SHUN STREET, WHILE THE SCHOOL AT SHEK WU HUI WILL BE BUILT ON A 3 700-SQUARE-METRE SITE IN JOCKEY CLUB ROAD.

WORKS ON BOTH CONTRACTS HAVE ALREADY STARTED AND WILL TAKE THREE MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

WORK ON BUILDING THE SUPERSTRUCTURE WILL THEN BEGIN UNDER SEPARATE CONTRACTS AND THE SCHOOLS ARE EXPECTED TO BE READY NEXT SUMMER.

EACH SCHOOL WILL BE A SIX-STOREY BUILDING WITH 24 CLASSROOMS AND AN ASSEMBLY HALL. THERE WILL ALSO BE A COVERED PLAY AREA AND AN EXTERNAL PLAY AREA WITH BASKETBALL COURT.

CHILDREN WITH A TALENT FOR ART WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO DISPLAY THEIR WORK AT THE 29TH WORLD SCHOOL CHILDREN'S ART EXHIBITION ORGANISED BY THE YOOK YOUNG FOUNDATION OF SOUTH KOREA.

THE EXHIBITION WILL BE HELD AT THE KOREAN CHILDREN'S CENTRE IN SEOUL TOWARDS THE END OF THIS YEAR.

THE EXHIBITION IS AIMED AT STRENGTHENING INTERNATIONAL MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING AND FRIENDSHIP AMONG CHILDREN AND TO PROMOTE ART EDUCATION THROUGH THE EXCHANGE OF CHILDREN'S ART.

SCHOOL HEADS WISHING TO TAKE PART IN THE EXHIBITION ARE REMINDED TO STATE IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE PARTICULARS OF THE STUDENT (INCLUDING NAME, AGE, SEX AND NATIONALITY), THEME OF WORK, NAME AND ADDRESS OF SCHOOL AT THE BACK OF EACH ENTRY.
