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TRADE DESCRIPTION BILL READY FOR LEGCO
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THE GOVERNMENT PLANS TO INTRODUCE LEGISLATION SOON THAT WOULD GIVE THE PUBLIC GREATER CONSUMER PROTECTION.

THE TRADE DESCRIPTION BILL 1980 WILL BE PUBLISHED IN THE GOVERNMENT GAZETTE ON FRIDAY NEXT WEEK (JUNE 20) AND IS EXPECTED TO BE INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ON JUNE 25.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE BILL WOULD UP-DATE THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ORDINANCE AND STRENGTHEN THE LAW WITH REGARD TO CONSUMER PROTECTION BY EXTENDING THE EXISTING LEGISLATION RELATING TO FALSE AND MISLEADING DESCRIPTION OF GOODS, AND BY INTRODUCING NEW PROVISIONS FOR THE MARKING OF GOODS.

HE SAID THE CONSUMER COUNCIL AND SEVERAL TRADE ASSOCIATIONS HAD BEEN CLOSELY INVOLVED IN ITS PREPARATION.

THE BILL RELATES TO TRADE DESCRIPTIONS, MARKING ORDERS, ADVERTISEMENTS, TRADE MARKS, AND THE PROHIBITION OF IMPORTS AND EXPORTS BEARING FALSE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS OR FORGED TRADE MARKS.

AT PRESENT UNDER THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ORDINANCE A +TRADE DESCRIPTION+ IS DEFINED AS ANY STATEMENT OR INDICATION - DIRECT OR INDIRECT - REFERRING TO THE PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS, COMPOSITION, QUALITY, FITNESS OF PURPOSE AS WELL AS THE PLACE AND MODE OF MANUFACTURE.

HOWEVER, THE SPOKESMAN SAID, UNDER THE PROPOSED BILL THE DEFINITION WOULD EXTEND TO ALL CHARACTERISTICS OF GOODS WHICH COULD BE FACTUALLY ASSESSED AND WHICH WERE LIKELY TO BE IMPORTANT TO THE BUYER.

+IN PARTICULAR,+ HE SAID, +THE NEW DEFINITION INCLUDES THE METHOD OF PROCESSING OR RECONDITIONING, TESTING AND ITS RESULTS, AND OTHER HISTORY SUCH AS PREVIOUS OWNERSHIP OR USE, WHICH MAY BE OF INTEREST TO THE PURCHASER.+

THE BILL CONTINUES TO MAKE IT AN OFFENCE FOR ANYONE TO APPLY FALSE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS TO GOODS, OR TO SUPPLY GOODS TO WHICH FALSE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS HAVE BEEN APPLIED.

THE SPOKESMAN FURTHER EXPLAINED THAT AT PRESENT THERE WERE NO REQUIREMENTS FOR SUCH AS THE COMPOSITION, INGREDIENTS, NET WEIGHT AND MANUFACTURE DATE TO BE APPLIED TO GOODS.

THE BILL EMPOWERS THE GOVERNOR-IN-COUNCIL TO STIPULATE THAT GOODS ARE IN FUTURE SO MARKED, OR ACCOMPANIED BY THE RELEVANT INFORMATION.

+IT IS ENVISAGED,+ SAID THE SPOKESMAN, +THAT MARKING ORDERS WILL BE SOUGHT FOR GOODS IN RESPECT OF WHICH PURCHASERS CAN BE EASILY DECEIVED, FOR EXAMPLE CERTAIN FOODSTUFFS AND GOLD ARTICLES.+

/HE SAID

HE SAID IT WAS PLANNED TO ESTABLISH AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE, TO INCLUDE TRADE AND CONSUMER COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVES, TO ADVISE ON WHICH GOODS SHOULD BE SUBJECT TO MARKING ORDERS.

FOR GOLD ARTICLES A 1972 AMENDMENT TO THE MERCHANDISE MARKS ORDINANCE PROHIBITS THE DESCRIPTION OF AN ARTICLE AS GOLD IF ITS GOLD CONTENT IS LESS THAN EIGHT CARATS. THIS PROVISION WILL BE RETAINED.

AS A MEANS OF STOPPING POSSIBLE UNETHICAL PRACTICES BY ADVERTISERS OR THEIR AGENTS, IT IS INTENDED TO EXTEND THE LAW BY BRINGING WITHIN ITS OPERATION MISDESCRIPTIONS USED IN ADVERTISEMENTS, AND ORAL MISDESCRIPTIONS.

THE DEFINITION OF ADVERTISEMENT INCLUDES CATALOGUES, CIRCULARS AND PRICE LISTS.

THE SPOKESMAN ADDED: +IN ORDER TO CONFER PROTECTION ON INNOCENT PUBLISHERS, THE BILL PROVIDES THAT IT WOULD BE A VALID DEFENCE IF THEY COULD PROVE THEY RECEIVED THE ADVERTISEMENT IN THE COURSE OF THEIR BUSINESS AND DID NOT KNOW THAT IT INFRINGED PROVISIONS OF THE BILL.+

THE BILL RETAINS EXISTING PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FORGING OF TRADE MARKS, THEIR APPLICATION AND OTHER CONNECTED OFFENCES.

OFFENCES INCLUDE FORGING, FALSIFYING ANY GENUINE TRADE MARK, AND +MAKING OR HAVING INSTRUMENTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF FORGING.+

+THE BILL PROHIBITS THE IMPORT OR EXPORT OF GOODS TO WHICH A FALSE TRADE DESCRIPTION OR FORGED TRADE MARK IS APPLIED,+ EXPLAINED THE SPOKESMAN, +BUT A DEFENCE IS PROVIDED WHERE THE OFFENDER WAS ABLE TO PROVE HE DID NOT KNOW, HAD NO REASON TO SUSPECT AND COULD NOT REASONABLY HAVE FOUND OUT THAT THE GOODS HAD A FALSE TRADE DESCRIPTION OR FORGED TRADE MARK, OR IF HE WAS ABLE TO PROVE THAT THE GOODS WERE NOT INTENDED FOR TRADE OR BUSINESS.+

GOODS IN TRANSIT ARE NOT SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS.

ALSO, THE BILL EXEMPTS GOODS FOR EXPORT FROM THE QUANTITY, SIZE AND GAUGE ASPECTS OF A TRADE DESCRIPTION. THIS IS BECAUSE UNITS OF QUANTITY SOMETIMES HAVE DIFFERENT MEANINGS IN DIFFERENT COUNTRIES.

NOR ARE PROVISIONS MADE FOR THE PROHIBITION OF MISDESCRIPTION IN RESPECT OF PRICES, SERVICES, ACCOMMODATION AND FACILITIES. THESE ARE TO BE LOOKED AT IN CONSULTATION WITH THE NEW ADVISORY COMMITTEE AT A LATER STAGE.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE DIRECTOR OF TRADE, INDUSTRY AND CUSTOMS WOULD BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ENFORCEMENT.

THE BILL PROVIDED, TOO, THAT WHERE AN OWNER SUFFERED A LOSS THROUGH WRONGFUL SEIZURE OR DETENTION OF HIS GOODS, HE COULD MAKE A CLAIM FOR COMPENSATION.

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REINFORCED DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION WILL
HELP DEVELOPMENT OF NEW TOWNS

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THE +TIMELY+ PROPOSAL BY THE GOVERNMENT TO REINFORCE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION WILL HELP SIGNIFICANTLY IN FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF NEW TOWNS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES, ACTING SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR AUGUSTINE CHUI KAM, SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

MR CHUI WAS SPEAKING TO THE LIONS CLUB OF THE NEW TERRITORIES ON THE GREEN PAPER, +A PATTERN OF DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION IN HONG NONG+, PUBLISHED LAST FRIDAY.

MR CHUI SAID AN IMPORTANT PROPOSAL IN THE GREEN PAPER WAS TO DIVIDE THE NEW TERRITORIES INTO CONSTITUENCIES, EACH OF WHICH WOULD HAVE A REPRESENTATIVE ELECTED BY THE PUBLIC TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION. THESE REPRESENTATIVES WOULD BE ELECTED TO DISTRICT BOARDS, WHICH WOULD REPLACE THE EIGHT DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARDS SET UP IN 1977.

THE GREEN PAPER, HE SAID, HAD SUGGESTED THAT AN ELECTED ELEMENT WOULD STRENGTHEN THE POSITION OF UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARDS AND INCREASE THEIR INFLUENCE.

HE RECALLED THAT IN RECENT YEARS THE GOVERNMENT HAD ATTACHED GREAT IMPORTANCE TO IMPLEMENTATION OF POLICIES AT DISTRICT LEVEL AND HAD REVIEWED AND STUDIED REGULARLY WAYS OF BETTER SERVING THE NEEDS OF PEOPLE IN THE DISTRICTS.

AS NEW TOWNS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES BEGAN TO BE ESTABLISHED DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION HAD BEEN STRENGTHENED BY THE FORMATION OF TOWN MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES.

MEMBERS OF THESE COMMITTEES INCLUDED REPRESENTATIVES OF GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS IN THE DISTRICTS. TOWN MANAGERS OR DISTRICT OFFICERS, AS CHAIRMEN, WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR CO-ORDINATING GOVERNMENT PLANS AND POLICIES.

CO-ORDINATION AMONG DIFFERENT DEPARTMENTS HAD ALSO HELPED INCREASE GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATIVE EFFECTIVENESS AS A WHOLE AT DISTRICT LEVEL.

MR CHUI SAID A SUCCESSFUL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION WOULD BE ENHANCED BY THE PARTICIPATION OF ELECTED REPRESENTATIVES.

THE GOVERNMENT FELT THAT ITS SERVICES SHOULD BE ASSESSED BY RESIDENTS OF DISTRICTS AND INADEQUACIES DRAWN TO THE ATTENTION OF GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS AT THE DISTRICT LEVEL.

MEMBERS OF THE DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARDS CAME FROM ALL WALKS OF LIFE. THEY WERE CAPABLE AND KNOWLEDGEABLE PEOPLE, FAMILIAR WITH LOCAL CONDITIONS.

SINCE THE INCEPTION OF THE DISTRICT ADVISORY BOARD SCHEME THE EFFECTIVENESS OF DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION HAD BEEN INCREASED.

BESIDES THOSE APPOINTED TO THE BOARDS BY THE GOVERNMENT, THE CHAIRMEN OF RURAL COMMITTEES ALSO SERVED AS MEMBERS. THUS, PROBLEMS IN THE NEW TOWNS AND OLD VILLAGES COULD BOTH BE LOOKED AFTER BY THE BOARD.

MR CHUI SAID THE GREEN PAPER STATED CLEARLY THAT THE GOVERNMENT WOULD CONTINUE TO GIVE DUE REGARD TO THE POSITION AND WORK OF THE HEUNG YEE KUK AND RURAL COMMITTEES TO ENSURE THAT BOTH TRADITION AND PROGRESS WOULD HAVE A PLACE IN DISTRICT AFFAIRS SO THAT INDIGENOUS PEOPLE AND NEW RESIDENTS WOULD LIVE TOGETHER HARMONIOUSLY.

TURNING TO THE URBAN AREA, MR CHUI SAID A DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE HAD BEEN SET UP IN KWUN TONG, SIMILAR IN NATURE TO TOWN MANAGEMENT COMMITTEES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE GREEN PAPER PROPOSED THAT THE DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE SCHEME BE EXTENDED TO OTHER DISTRICTS IN THE NEXT TWO YEARS.

ONCE THESE COMMITTEES WERE ESTABLISHED, UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS WOULD BE APPOINTED AND DISTRICT BOARDS, TO BE CHAIRED BY CITY DISTRICT COMMISSIONERS, FORMED. SEATS WOULD BE RESERVED ON EACH BOARD FOR ELECTED AND APPOINTED MEMBERS OF THE URBAN COUNCIL SO THAT THEY COULD PARTICIPATE IN ITS WORK.

TO AVOID INFRINGING UPON THE PREROGATIVE OF THE URBAN COUNCIL AND DUPLICATION OF THE ELECTORAL SYSTEM, THERE WOULD BE NO ELECTED MEMBERS ON THESE URBAN BOARDS AND THEIR TERMS OF REFERENCE WOULD BE SLIGHTLY NARROWER IN SCOPE THAN THOSE OF THEIR NEW TERRITORIES COUNTERPARTS.

AS URBAN COUNCILLORS WOULD BE PROVIDED WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WORK OF DISTRICT BOARDS, THEIR CONTRIBUTION TO DISTRICTS WOULD BE GREATER AND THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES INCREASED SINCE THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS COULD INCLUDE ALL MATTERS DISCUSSED AT BOARD MEETINGS.

MR CHUI SAID THE GREEN PAPER ALSO PROPOSED THAT SUFFRAGE BE EXTENDED THROUGH LEGISLATION TO ALL RESIDENTS OVER THE AGE OF 21 WITH AT LEAST THREE YEARS RESIDENCE IN HONG KONG.

HE HOPED THAT MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WOULD STUDY THE PROPOSALS IN THE GREEN PAPER CAREFULLY AND MAKE THEIR VIEWS KNOWN TO THE GOVERNMENT FOR CONSIDERATION.

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KWUN TONG CLEAN-UP * * * *

THE ENVIRONMENT SUB-COMMITTEE OF THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE IS LAUNCHING A LARGE-SCALE OPERATION TO CLEAN UP ALL BACK LANES IN THE DISTRICT'S INDUSTRIAL AREA.

THE CAMPAIGN, KNOWN AS +OPERATION IMPACT+, IS TO IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENT IN THE AREA AND TO CREATE A VISUAL IMPACT ON WORKERS AND FACTORY OPERATORS ON THE EFFECTS OF A CLEAN AND HEALTHY ENVIRONMENT.

THE FOUR-WEEK OPERATION, WHICH COVERS THE DISTRICT'S INDUSTRIAL AREA BOUNDED BY KWUN TONG ROAD, HOI BUN ROAD, LAI YIP STREET AND WING YIP STREET, STARTED ON JUNE 2.

MR DAVID TSUI, KWUN TONG CITY DISTRICT COMMISSIONER WHO IS ALSO THE CHAIRMAN OF THE DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE SAID THE EXERCISE HAD BEEN PROVED TO BE VERY WORTHWHILE AS PEOPLE IN THE AREA COULD EASILY FEEL THE DIFFERENCE AT A BACK LANE BEFORE AND AFTER IT WAS CLEANED UP.

THE TIDY-UP OPERATION IS BEING CARRIED OUT BY CLEANSING STAFF OF THE URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT BACKED BY A WATER TANK AND TWO REFUSE COLLECTION LORRIES.

+WE INTEND TO CARRY OUT THIS EXERCISE SYSTEMATICALLY BY DIVIDING THE WHOLE INDUSTRIAL AREA INTO 16 ZONES, AND WE HOPE THAT BY DOING THIS WE CAN MAKE FACTORY OPERATORS MORE AWARE WHAT A CLEAN ENVIRONMENT WOULD MEAN TO THEM AND THEIR WORKERS,+ SAID MR TSUI.

HE NOTED THAT UNDER THE LEASE CONDITIONS, THE 3-METRE WIDE STRIP ON EACH SIDE OF A BACK LANE IS THE LAND GRANTED TO RESPECTIVE FACTORY OWNERS AND IT IS THEIR RESPONSIBILITY TO MAINTAIN THE AREA CLEAN AND TIDY, WHILE THE GOVERNMENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CLEANLINESS OF THE CENTRAL PART OF THE BACK LANE.

+AS A START,+ MR TSUI SAID, +OUR SPECIAL WORKFORCE HAS CLEARED ALL DEBRIS AND REFUSE ON THE WHOLE WIDTH OF EACH BACK LANE AND HOSING IT DOWN WITH DETERGENT. SO FAR ABOUT THREE TONNES OF REFUSE AND DEBRIS HAVE BEEN DISPOSED OF EACH DAY BY THE CLEANSING TEAM.

+BY DOING THIS, WE HOPE TO CREATE A VISUAL IMPACT ON PEOPLE IN THE AREA AND HOPE THE FACTORY OPERATORS CONCERNED WILL KEEP UP OUR GOOD WORK BY MAINTAINING THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS CLEAN AND TIDY THEREAFTER.+

TO FURTHER IMPROVE THE ENVIRONMENT IN KWUN TONG, THE LOCAL DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE HAS ALSO APPROVED A PLAN TO LANDSCAPE A VACANT LOT OF CROWN LAND AT WAN HON STREET AND TO CONVERT IT INTO A SITTING-OUT AREA.

IN ADDITION, THE COMMITTEE HAS ALLOCATED \$50 000 FOR A TREE-PLANTING SCHEME TO BEAUTIFY THE CENTRAL DIVIDER AREA ALONG A SECTION OF KWUN TONG ROAD BETWEEN SHUN YEE STREET AND HONG TAK ROAD WHICH IS KNOWN AS ONE OF THE GREY AREAS IN THE DISTRICT.

ALL THESE PROJECTS ARE BEING CARRIED OUT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE URBAN COUNCIL.

HK TEAM LEAVING FOR GARRISON TALKS

A TEAM OF OFFICIALS HEADED BY THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE, WILL LEAVE SHORTLY FOR LONDON WHERE SUBSTANTIVE NEGOTIATIONS WILL TAKE PLACE WITH OFFICIALS OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE ON THE POSSIBILITY OF INCREASING THE SIZE OF THE HONG KONG GARRISON AND ARRANGEMENTS FOR ITS COSTING.

THE TEAM WILL ALSO INCLUDE THE SECRETARY FOR SECURITY, MR L.M. DAVIES AND THREE OTHER OFFICERS. THE NEGOTIATIONS WILL START ON JUNE 16.

MR F.K. LI, SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, WILL ACT AS CHIEF SECRETARY IN SIR PHILIP'S ABSENCE.

A ROUND OF PRELIMINARY DISCUSSIONS WAS HELD IN MARCH 1980 AT WHICH ISSUES WERE IDENTIFIED AND A FRAMEWORK FOR SUBSTANTIVE NEGOTIATIONS WAS ESTABLISHED.

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COMMENTS WELCOME ON GREEN PAPER

VIEWS ARE BEING SOUGHT ON THE RECENTLY PUBLISHED GREEN PAPER ON DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION IN HONG KONG, A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN REMINDED THE PUBLIC TODAY.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WISHING TO STUDY THE GREEN PAPER BEFORE SUBMITTING THEIR COMMENTS CAN OBTAIN COPIES FROM ALL CITY DISTRICT OFFICES IN THE URBAN AREAS AND DISTRICT OFFICES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID SUBMISSIONS SHOULD BE ADDRESSED TO THE DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT SERVICES, GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES, LOWER ALBERT ROAD, HONG KONG.

THREE MONTHS HAVE BEEN SET ASIDE FOR THOSE INTERESTED TO STUDY ALL ASPECTS OF THE PROPOSALS AND, BASED ON COMMENTS RECEIVED, IT IS HOPED TO INTRODUCE LEGISLATION EARLY NEXT YEAR FOLLOWING PUBLICATION OF A WHITE PAPER.

+THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF VIEWS THEREFORE IS AUGUST 31, 1980,+ THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT.

THE GREEN PAPER, PUBLISHED ON JUNE 6, CONTAINS PROPOSALS PRINCIPALLY DIRECTED TO THE BETTER CO-ORDINATION AND RESPONSIVENESS OF ADMINISTRATION AT DISTRICT LEVEL, AND TO THE GREATER PARTICIPATION OF RESIDENTS OF EACH DISTRICT.

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PUBLIC TALKS ON LABOUR MATTERS

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OFFICERS OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT GAVE A TOTAL OF 14 TALKS TO THE PUBLIC LAST MONTH.

THE TALKS COVERING DIFFERENT TOPICS WERE GIVEN TO TRADE UNIONS, TECHNICAL INSTITUTES, AN INDUSTRY PROMOTION ORGANISATION, A SERVICE CLUB AND NURSES OF A GOVERNMENT HOSPITAL.

TOPICS INCLUDED INDUSTRIAL SAFETY, THE STRUCTURE AND FUNCTION OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT AND LABOUR LEGISLATION.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT TODAY POINTED OUT THAT A TOTAL OF 54 TALKS WERE GIVEN DURING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS OF THIS YEAR TO KEEP MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC BETTER INFORMED OF THE LOCAL LABOUR SCENE, LABOUR LAW, LABOUR RELATIONS AND INDUSTRIAL SAFETY.

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NO RIGHT-TURN INTO ARRAN STREET

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VEHICLES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO TURN RIGHT INTO ARRAN STREET FROM NATHAN ROAD FROM 10 PM ON THURSDAY (JUNE 12) TO 6 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY.

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SUPPLY OF SALT WATER FOR FLUSHING TO EAST KOWLOON WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR 12 HOURS ON THURSDAY (JUNE 12) BETWEEN 10 AM AND 10 PM.

THE AREAS TO BE AFFECTED ARE HUNG HOM, TO KWA WAN, KOWLOON TONG AND KOWLOON CITY, AND INCLUDE WANG TAU HOM, LO FU, TUNG TAU AND WONG TAI SIN ESTATES.

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WATER CUT
