BUS SERVICES 'COMPARATIVELY GOOD'

\* \* \* \*

BUS SERVICES IN HONG KONG ARE GOOD, AS ANY COMPARISON WILL SHOW, ALTHOUGH BUS PASSENGERS AND BUS OPERATORS AND THE AUTHORITIES WOULD SAY THEY ARE NOT GOOD ENOUGH.

THIS WAS SAID BY THE SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, MR DENIS BRAY AT THE OPENING OF A NEW MAINTENANCE AND RESEARCH CENTRE OF THE KOWLOON MOTOR BUS COMPANY AT KWAI CHUNG TODAY.

+PASSENGERS WOULD OBVIOUSLY LIKE BETTER SERVICES. THE OPERATORS WOULD LIKE TO PROVIDE BETTER SERVICES - HENCE THIS MAINTENANCE CENTRE - AND THE AUTHORITIES WOULD LIKE TO SEE BETTER SERVICES. WE CAN NEVER SAY SERVICES CANNOT BE IMPROVED UPON,+ MR BRAY SAID.

HE SAID BUS SERVICES PLAYED SUCH A VITAL PART IN THE DAILY LIVES OF PRACTICALLY EVERYBODY IN HONG KONG THAT IT WAS SMALL WONDER THERE WAS SO MUCH DEBATE OVER THEIR OPERATIONS AND THEIR COST.

+BUS FARES OVER THE YEARS HAVE RISEN AT MUCH THE SAME RATE AS THE PRICES OF OTHER DAILY NECESSITIES. EVEN SO EVERYBODY NATURALLY WANTS TO BE SURE HE IS GETTING THE BEST VALUE FOR MONEY WHEN THE PRICE OF EVERYTHING IS GOING UP. SO DOES THE GOVERNMENT. THIS IS WHY THE AUTHORITIES CONCERNED ARE ENGAGED IN A MORE EXHAUSTIVE STUDY OF BUS OPERATIONS THAN HAS EVER TAKEN PLACE BEFORE,+ HE SAID.

HE SAID THIS WAS ALSO WHY KMB BUILT THE NEW WORKSHOPS WHICH HE DESCRIBED AS ONE OF THE LARGEST BUS MAINTENANCE AND RESEARCH CENTRES IN ASIA.

MR BRAY POINTED OUT THAT IT WAS NOT EASY TO NOTICE CHANGES IN STANDARDS OF SERVICES DAY BY DAY WHEN THEY WERE PROVIDED BY THOUSANDS OF BUSES CARRYING MILLIONS OF PASSENGERS. BUT WITH A LONGER TIME PERSPECTIVE SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES COULD BE RECALLED.

+PERHAPS NOT MANY WILL REMEMBER THE FIRST POST-WAR KMB BUSES WHICH WERE CONVERTED LORRIES- A GATE OPERATOR HAD TO BE HANDY NOT ONLY WITH HIS ARMS BUT ALSO HIS FEET TO BE ABLE TO PULL THE GATES SHUT THROUGH THRONGS OF STRUGGLING PASSENGERS.

+IT WAS NOT LONG AGO THAT HONG KONG PASSENGER MOVEMENTS SEEMED TO BE VERY UNUSUAL. THERE WERE NO PEAK HOURS. TRAVEL STARTED AT ABOUT 7 AM AND LASTED TILL 10 PM AT ABOUT THE SAME LEVEL ALL DAY. THERE WERE NEVER ANY EMPTY BUSES.

+TODAY THERE ARE MARKED PEAK HOURS WHEN QUEUES ARE LONG AND BUSES CROWDED BUT ALSO LONG PERIODS IN THE DAY WHEN PASSENGERS HAVE NO DIFFICULTY IN FINDING SEATS,+ MR BRAY SAID.

MORE HOSPITAL BEDS FOR WONG TAI SIN INFIRMARY  
\* \* \* \*

WONG TAI SIN INFIRMARY'S BED CAPACITY IS BEING EXPANDED BY 50 PER CENT TO MEET THE GROWING DEMAND FOR THE SERVICE.

THE EXTENSION PROJECT IS DESIGNED TO PROVIDE THE MUCH NEEDED BACK-UP SERVICE TO KWONG WAH HOSPITAL AND OTHER GOVERNMENT MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS WHICH ARE ALSO BEING EXPANDED.

THE FIRST PHASE OF THE PROJECT HAS BEEN COMPLETED, AND WAS OPENED TODAY BY DR K.L. THONG, WHO ALSO AT THE SAME TIME PERFORMED THE EARTH BREAKING CEREMONY FOR THE SECOND PHASE.

THE INFIRMARY, ONE OF THE INSTITUTIONS RUN BY THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS, HAS BEEN SERVING THE LOCAL PEOPLE FOR NEARLY 20 YEARS SINCE THE MID-60S.

+IT PLAYS A SIGNIFICANT ROLE IN PROVIDING ACCOMMODATION FOR CONVALESCENT PATIENTS AND THOSE SUFFERING FROM LONG-TERM DISEASES AT A VERY LOW COST,+ SAID DR THONG.

PHASE ONE OF THE PROJECT WILL PROVIDE AN ADDITIONAL 106 BEDS, AND WITH THE COMPLETION OF THE SECOND PHASE, THE EXISTING 681 BEDS WILL BE INCREASED BY 300.

THE DIRECTOR DESCRIBED THE EXPANSION AS +TIMELY+ BECAUSE WITH THE GRADUAL INCREASE IN POPULATION, +THERE IS A GROWING NEED OF SERVICES OF THIS NATURE.+

HE COMMENDED THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS FOR THEIR FAR-SIGHTEDNESS IN INITIATING THE PROJECT WHICH HAD THE FULL SUPPORT OF THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

DR THONG ALSO PRAISED THE DIRECTORS FOR THEIR VALUABLE CONTRIBUTION OVER THE YEARS TOWARDS THE PROMOTION OF MEDICAL WELFARE FOR THE COMMUNITY.

+WE HAVE ALL WITNESSED THE EXCELLENT RECORDS OF SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE VARIOUS MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS OPERATED UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS.

+THEY HAVE DEMONSTRATED THEIR CONSTANT CONCERN FOR THE COMMUNITY BY THEIR EFFORTS TO IMPROVE EXISTING FACILITIES. THE PRESENT ACHIEVEMENT IS BUT ONE OF THE NUMEROUS EXAMPLES OF THE GOOD WORKS THEY HAVE ACCOMPLISHED,+ HE SAID.

RATES FOR THIRD QUARTER DUE  
\* \* \* \*

THE TREASURY REMINDED RATEPAYERS TODAY (THURSDAY) THAT RATES FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF THIS YEAR SHOULD BE PAID ON OR BEFORE JULY 31.

A SURCHARGE OF FIVE PER CENT WOULD BE IMPOSED ON LATE PAYMENTS, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TREASURY SAID. AND IF THE PAYMENTS ARE STILL NOT SETTLED, A SURCHARGE OF 10 PER CENT MIGHT BE ADDED.

+RATEPAYERS SHOULD HAVE BY NOW RECEIVED DEMAND NOTES AND THOSE WHO HAVE NOT SHOULD APPLY FOR A COPY AT THE RATES SECTION OF THE TREASURY, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES (WEST WING), 9TH FLOOR, ICE HOUSE STREET, HONG KONG.+

+WHETHER OR NOT THE DEMAND NOTE IS RECEIVED, IT DOES NOT ALTER THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE RATES SHOULD BE PAID BEFORE THE DUE DATE,+ HE POINTED OUT.

THE SPOKESMAN ALSO SAID THAT RATES WERE PAYABLE ON VACANT PREMISES BUT WERE REFUNDABLE UNDER CONDITIONS SPECIFIED IN THE RATING ORDINANCE.

HOWEVER, NO REFUNDS WOULD BE PAYABLE IN THE CASE OF A VACANT TENEMENT LAST USED, OR INTENDED TO BE USED, WHOLLY OR PRIMARILY FOR DOMESTIC PURPOSES (UNLESS VACANT BY REASON OF AN ORDER OF THE GOVERNMENT).

TO AVOID QUEUEING, RATEPAYERS ARE URGED TO PAY BY CHEQUE OR MONEY ORDER SENT BY POST OR BY EARLY PERSONAL ATTENDANCE AT ANY OF THE DEPARTMENT'S OFFICES LISTED ON THE BACK OF THE DEMAND NOTE.

THEY ARE ALSO REMINDED THAT THEY CAN NOW MAKE USE OF THE NEWLY-INTRODUCED AUTOPAY SERVICE TO SETTLE THEIR RATES.

A LEAFLET NOTIFYING ALL RATEPAYERS OF THE NEW SERVICE HAS BEEN SENT OUT WITH THE RATES DEMAND NOTE FOR THE THIRD QUARTER OF THIS YEAR.

+ANYONE WHO HAS A CURRENT OR SAVINGS ACCOUNT WITH ANY LICENSED BANK IN HONG KONG CAN MAKE USE OF THIS SERVICE,+ HE ADDED.

DIRECT DEBIT AUTHORISATION FORMS MAY BE OBTAINED IN PERSON FROM ANY TREASURY COLLECTION OFFICE, BY WRITING TO DIRECTOR OF ACCOUNTING SERVICES, P.O. BOX 8 000, HONG KONG OR BY TELEPHONING 5-221394, 5-258845 OR 5-232741. COMPLETED FORMS SHOULD BE RETURNED AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO THE TREASURY AS INDICATED IN THE FORM.

RATEPAYERS WHO HAVE ALREADY SUBMITTED THEIR AUTOPAY FORMS SHOULD READ THEIR DEMAND NOTES CAREFULLY TO SEE IF THEY CONTAIN THE WORDING +PAYMENT BY AUTOPAY AS AUTHORISED+. THE ABSENCE OF SUCH WORDING MEANS THEIR FORMS HAVE NOT YET BEEN PROCESSED, IN WHICH CASE THEY SHOULD CONTINUE TO PAY THEIR RATES IN THE NORMAL WAY, I.E. IN PERSON OR BY CHEQUE OR MONEY ORDER.

POSTAL SERVICES TO CANADA SUSPENDED DUE TO STRIKE

DUE TO A POSTAL STRIKE IN CANADA, ALL POSTAL SERVICES TO THAT COUNTRY HAVE BEEN TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED, THE POST OFFICE ANNOUNCED TODAY.

+NO MAIL FOR CANADA WILL THEREFORE BE ACCEPTED AT POST OFFICES UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE,+ A SPOKESMAN SAID.

PUBLIC REMINDED ABOUT TAX OBLIGATIONS  
\*\*\*\*\*

INDIVIDUALS AND EMPLOYERS ARE REMINDED BY THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT OF THEIR OBLIGATIONS CONCERNING PAYMENT OF TAXES AND REPORTING OF INFORMATION CONCERNING PERSONNEL.

UNDER THE INLAND REVENUE ORDINANCE, EVERY PERSON CHARGEABLE TO TAX MUST REPORT THIS TO THE COMMISSIONER IN WRITING NOT LATER THAN FOUR MONTHS AFTER THE END OF THE BASIS PERIOD FOR THE TAX YEAR.

AND, ANY PERSON WHO CEASES TO CARRY ON A TRADE, PROFESSION OR BUSINESS OR CEASES TO HOLD AN OFFICE OR EMPLOYMENT, OR CEASES TO HAVE A SOURCE OF INCOME FOR WHICH HE IS ASSESSED, MUST ADVISE THE COMMISSIONER IN WRITING WITHIN ONE MONTH OF SUCH CESSATION.

ANY PERSON LIABLE TO PAY TAX, WHO IS ABOUT TO LEAVE HONG KONG FOR LONGER THAN ONE MONTH, MUST GIVE NOTICE AT LEAST ONE MONTH BEFORE LEAVING, UNLESS THE PERSON IS REQUIRED TO LEAVE FREQUENTLY FOR BUSINESS OR EMPLOYMENT REASONS.

ANY CHANGE OF ADDRESS MUST ALSO BE MADE KNOWN TO THE COMMISSIONER.

EMPLOYERS ARE REQUIRED TO FURNISH IN WRITING, WITHIN THREE MONTHS, PARTICULARS OF ANY NEWLY-HIRED EMPLOYEE WHO IS LIKELY LIABLE TO PAY TAX. THEY MUST ALSO ADVISE THE COMMISSIONER IN WRITING AT LEAST ONE MONTH BEFORE CEASING TO EMPLOY ANY PERSON.

NOTICE MUST ALSO BE GIVEN TO THE COMMISSIONER WHENEVER AN EMPLOYEE CHARGEABLE TO TAX IS ABOUT TO LEAVE HONG KONG FOR MORE THAN A MONTH, EXCEPT IF THE EMPLOYEE IS REQUIRED TO LEAVE AT FREQUENT INTERVALS ON BUSINESS.

THEY ARE ALSO REMINDED OF CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS PLACED ON PAYMENT OF WAGES TO EMPLOYEES WHOSE EMPLOYMENT HAS CEASED IN HONG KONG.

EACH YEAR DURING THE TYPHOON SEASON, THE HOME AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT ARRANGES FOR TYPHOON SHELTERS TO BE OPENED FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC SEEKING REFUGE FROM THE WIND AND RAIN.

+THIS YEAR, WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE HOUSING, SOCIAL WELFARE AND EDUCATION DEPARTMENTS, COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS AND KAI FONG ASSOCIATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT HAS ARRANGED FOR MORE THAN 110 TYPHOON SHELTERS TO BE OPENED TO THE PUBLIC WHEN TYPHOON SIGNAL NO. 8 IS HOISTED,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (THURSDAY).

AT THE SPECIAL REQUEST OF BOAT SQUATTERS, THE DEPARTMENT HAS ALSO ARRANGED FOR SOME OF THE TEMPORARY SHELTERS AT EASTERN AND SOUTHERN DISTRICTS ON THE ISLAND, AND AT YAU MA TEI IN KOWLOON, TO BE OPENED WHEN TYPHOON SIGNAL NO. 3 IS HOISTED,+ HE ADDED.

SAN HUI SHOP OPERATORS URGED TO SUBMIT CLAIMS

A GROUP OF SHOP OPERATORS AT SAN HUI, TUEN MUN, WHO ARE DUE TO BE CLEARED IN NOVEMBER TO MAKE WAY FOR A VITAL NEW TOWN ROAD PROJECT BUT WHO HAVE NOT YET SUBMITTED CLAIMS FOR BUSINESS LOSSES, HAVE BEEN URGED TO DO SO.

THE DISTRICT OFFICER, MR BILLY LAM, WHO MET AGAIN WITH THE OPERATORS THIS MORNING (THURSDAY), ASKED THEM TO GET THEIR CLAIMS IN AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

OPERATORS OF THE 97 SHOPS IN THE AREA ARE ENTITLED TO AN EX-GRATIA ALLOWANCE CALCULATED ON THE BASIS OF LOSSES INCURRED AS A RESULT OF REMOVAL, MR LAM SAID.

MEETINGS HAD BEEN HELD BETWEEN THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND OPERATORS SINCE FEBRUARY, DURING WHICH CLAIMS FORMS WERE DISTRIBUTED AND ADVICE GIVEN ON HOW TO COMPLETE THEM.

IN ADDITION STAFF OF THE DISTRICT OFFICE CALLED ON INDIVIDUAL SHOPKEEPERS TO ANSWER QUERIES.

SEVERAL OF THE FORMS HAVE BEEN RETURNED, BUT THE REMAINDER WERE REQUIRED URGENTLY SO THAT CLAIMS COULD BE ASSESSED AND PAYMENTS MADE.

MR LAM SAID A LIST OF ALTERNATIVE COMMERCIAL PREMISES FOR RENT IN TUEN MUN HAD BEEN GIVEN TO THE OPERATORS TO ASSIST THEM TO RE-ESTABLISH THEIR BUSINESSES IN THE VICINITY FOLLOWING CLEARANCE.

ANOTHER MEETING HAS BEEN ARRANGED FOR MONDAY (JULY 6) FOR OPERATORS WHO MIGHT FIND DIFFICULTIES IN SUBMITTING CLAIMS.

MR LAM SAID THE MAJORITY OF THE OPERATORS ACCEPTED THE CLEARANCE AND THE REASONS FOR IT.

+ ONLY A MINORITY ARE NOT CO-OPERATING, + HE SAID.

HE SAID CLEARANCE COULD NOT BE DELAYED ANY FURTHER AS IT WOULD AFFECT OTHER IMPORTANT DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS.

AN ESTATE SPORTS SCHEME AIMED AT PROMOTING HEALTHY ACTIVITIES AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE AS WELL AS EDUCATING THEM ON THE DANGERS OF DRUG ABUSE WILL BEGIN TOMORROW (FRIDAY) IN TIN WAN ESTATE, ABERDEEN.

THE SCHEME IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE ACTION COMMITTEE AGAINST NARCOTICS AND THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE AS PART OF ACAN'S PREVENTIVE EDUCATION AND PUBLICITY PROGRAMME FOR THIS YEAR.

FRESH WATER SUPPLY TO A NUMBER OF PREMISES IN CHAI WAN WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR SEVEN HOURS FROM 11 PM ON MONDAY (JULY 6) TO 6 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY FOR LEAKAGE TESTS.

AFFECTED PREMISES ARE AT CHAI WAN ROAD FROM ITS JUNCTIONS WITH A KUNG NGAM ROAD AND HONG MAN ROAD, LOK MAN ROAD, CHEUNG MAN ROAD, HING WAH ESTATE, PAK SHA WAN AND SHAN TSUI COURT.
