BIGGEST MODEL CAR GRAND PRIX HELD

THE 1983 INTERNATIONAL RADIO CONTROLLED MODEL RACING CAR GRAND PRIX HELD AT TUEN MUN IN THE WEEKEND WAS UNDOUBTEDLY THE BIGGEST SUCH EVENT ORGANISED IN THE WORLD, THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (NORTH REGION) OF NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES, MR BOWEN LEUNG, SAID TODAY (SUNDAY).

SPEAKING TO MORE THAN 150 VISITING AND LOCAL MODEL RACING-CAR ENTHUSIASTS AT A RECEPTION AT TUEN MUN RESTAURANT TODAY, MR LEUNG SAID THE EVENT ATTRACTED 120 COMPETITORS FROM 10 OVERSEAS COUNTRIES, THE BIGGEST NUMBER OF ANY SIMILAR WORLD-WIDE GRAND PRIX.

CASH PRIZES TOTALLING \$40 000, WHICH WERE AWARDED WERE ALSO THE BIGGEST, MR LEUNG SAID.

MR LEUNG PRAISED PARTICIPANTS FOR THEIR PERFORMANCE AND SPORTSMANSHIP IN MAKING THE TWO-DAY COMPETITION SUCH A SUCCESS.

AND THE SPECTATORS FROM TUEN MUN AND OTHER PARTS OF HONG KONG ALSO ENJOYED THE EVENT VERY MUCH, MR LEUNG SAID.

THE GRAND PRIX, ORGANISED JOINTLY BY THE HONG KONG MODELLERS CLUB AND THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT, WAS AIMED AT ENHANCING LOCAL MODEL CAR RACING STANDARDS AND GIVING THE PUBLIC A CHANCE TO ENJOY AN ENTERTAINING AND EXCITING COMPETITION.

PARTICIPANTS CAME FROM THE PHILIPPINES, THAILAND, INDONESIA, AUSTRALIA, JAPAN, SINGAPORE, MALAYSIA, CHINA, TAIWAN AND MACAU.

MR LEUNG SAID THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT WAS LOOKING INTO THE FEASIBILITY OF EARMARKING SOME LOCATIONS UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR THIS SPORT.

A MINI-SOCCER PITCH NEAR TAI HING ESTATE IN TUEN MUN WOULD BE DESIGNATED AS AN ARENA FOR RADIO CONTROLLED MODEL CAR RACING AT SPECIFIED TIMES IN THE NEAR FUTURE, HE SAID.

+IF THIS PILOT SCHEME PROVES SUCCESSFUL, MORE VENUES WILL BE INTRODUCED IN OTHER DISTRICTS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES,+ HE ADDED.

TECHNICAL INSTITUTES TO HOLD OPEN DAYS

HONG KONG'S FIVE TECHNICAL INSTITUTES WILL HOLD A SERIES OF OPEN DAYS, STARTING FROM TUESDAY AND SPREADING OVER TWELVE DAYS, FOR VISITORS TO HAVE A CLOSER LOOK AT TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

PROGRAMMES RANGING FROM FASHION SHOWS, CAREERS TALKS FOR SENIOR SECONDARY STUDENTS, WORKSHOP DEMONSTRATIONS AND EXHIBITIONS OF STUDENTS WORKS WILL BE ORGANISED.

LEADING OFF ON TUESDAY WILL BE THE KWAI CHUNG TECHNICAL INSTITUTE. IT WILL BE OPEN BETWEEN 12.30 AND 4.45 PM, AND WILL FEATURE A TALK ON TECHNICAL EDUCATION AND CAREERS DEVELOPMENT FOR FORM THREE AND FOUR STUDENTS FROM SOME 100 SCHOOLS.

ON FRIDAY, THE HAKING WONG TECHNICAL INSTITUTE IN SHAM SHUI PO AND MORRISON HILL TECHNICAL INSTITUTE IN WAN CHAI WILL CONCURRENTLY HOLD THEIR OPEN DAYS BETWEEN 1.30 AND 6 PM.

ON SATURDAY LEE WAI LEE TECHNICAL INSTITUTE IN KOWLOON TONG WILL BE OPEN FROM 10 AM TO 5 PM.

ALL WORKSHOPS, LABORATORIES AND CLASSROOMS WILL BE OPEN TO VISITORS.

VISITORS WILL SEE DRAWINGS AND THREE-DIMENSIONAL OBJECTS BY DESIGN STUDENTS. THEY WILL ALSO BE ABLE TO SEE STUDENTS CONCENTRATING ON OPTICAL DISPENSING OR METROLOGY EXPERIMENTS OR EVEN JEWELLERY DESIGN.

THE FINAL OPEN DAY WILL BE HELD BY KWUN TONG ON SATURDAY WEEK BETWEEN 9.30 AM AND 4.30 PM, WHEN STUDENTS OF THE CLOTHING DEPARTMENT WILL STAGE TWO FASHION SHOWS.

THE STUDENTS WILL MODEL A TOTAL OF 100 GARMENTS, INCLUDING CASUAL WEAR, SPORTSWEAR AND EVENING WEAR.

LANGUAGE INSTITUTE OFFERS REFRESHER COURSES
* * * * *

PRIMARY SCHOOL HEADS ARE INVITED TO NOMINATE LANGUAGE TEACHERS TO ATTEND A NUMBER OF FULL-TIME REFRESHER COURSES ORGANISED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT'S NEW INSTITUTE OF LANGUAGE IN EDUCATION BETWEEN SEPTEMBER 1983 AND JUNE 1984.

THERE WILL BE FOUR COURSES — TWO FOR TEACHERS OF ENGLISH AND TWO FOR TEACHERS OF CHINESE. EACH OF THEM WILL LAST 16 WEEKS AND ACCOMMODATE 100 TEACHERS.

THE MAIN OBJECTIVES OF THESE COURSES ARE TO ACQUAINT TEACHERS WITH THE MOST RECENT TRENDS AND DEVELOPMENTS IN LANGUAGE EDUCATION, TO ENABLE THEM TO EXTEND AND UPDATE THEIR APPROACHES TO LANGUAGE TEACHING AND TO PROVIDE THEM WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO IMPROVE THEIR OWN LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY.

NO FEES WILL BE CHARGED, AND CERTIFICATES WILL BE ISSUED TO PARTICIPANTS WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE A COURSE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT SAID THAT PREFERENCE WILL BE GIVEN TO TEACHERS WHO HAVE AT LEAST FIVE YEARS' POST-QUALIFICATION TEACHING EXPERIENCE AND WHO HAVE NOT ATTENDED A FULL-TIME REFRESHER COURSE DURING THE LAST THREE YEARS.

PREFERENCE WILL ALSO BE GIVEN TO THOSE WHO HAVE SPENT MORE THAN HALF OF THEIR TEACHING TIME IN THE TEACHING OF CHINESE OR ENGLISH DURING THE LAST TWO YEARS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID SCHOOLS MAY NOMINATE PARTICIPANTS FOR BOTH THE CHINESE AND ENGLISH COURSES. HOWEVER, HE ADDED THAT NOMINATIONS MUST BE MADE IN PAIRS, THAT IS, A NOMINATION FOR THE FIRST CHINESE COURSE MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A NOMINATION FOR THE OTHER CHINESE COURSE. THIS ALSO APPLIES TO THE ENGLISH COURSES.

SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WILL BE RELEASED FROM NORMAL SCHOOL DUTIES TO ATTEND THE COURSES ON A FULL-TIME BASIS. THE SCHOOLS CONCERNED WILL BE ALLOWED TO EMPLOY A FULL-TIME REPLACEMENT TEACHER FOR THE WHOLE OF THE SCHOOL YEAR.

THE REPLACEMENT TEACHER WILL BE EMPLOYED AT THE CERTIFICATED MASTER/MISTRESS RANK ON A MONTH-TO-MONTH BASIS AND THE SERVICE WILL COUNT FOR PROMOTION AND INCREMENTAL PURPOSES.

SCHOOL HEADS SHOULD SUBMIT THEIR NOMINATIONS TO THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, INSTITUTE OF LANGUAGE IN EDUCATION AT PARK-IN COMMERCIAL CENTRE, 21/F, 56 DUNDAS STREET, KOWLOON ON OR BEFORE MARCH 20, 1983.

THREE PART-TIME FAMILY PLANNING CLINICS RUN BY THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT WILL EXTEND THEIR OPERATING HOURS TO COVER THE LUNCH-TIME PERIOD FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF WORKERS.

LUNCH-TIME SERVICE IS TO BE PROVIDED AT THE CENTRAL CLINIC ON HONG KONG ISLAND AND LI PO CHUN AND KWUN TONG CLINICS IN KOWLOON FROM TUESDAY (MARCH 1).

LI PO CHUN MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH CENTRE IN MONG KOK, WHICH OFFERS FAMILY PLANNING SERVICE EVERY TUESDAY WILL OPERATE FROM 9 AM TO 5 PM, WHILE THE KWUN TONG CLINIC WILL BE OPEN FROM 9 AM TO 5 PM ON MONDAYS, TUESDAYS AND THURSDAYS.

THE CENTRAL CLINIC AT KAU YU FONG, WHICH NORMALLY STARTS ITS FAMILY PLANNING ADVISORY SERVICE AT 2 PM ON TUESDAYS AND THURSDAYS, WILL NOW START AN HOUR EARLIER, FROM 1 PM TO 5 PM.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID THE HOURS ARE BEING EXTENDED TO GIVE GREATER CONVENIENCE TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO CAN ONLY GO FOR COUNSELLING AND EXAMINATION DURING LUNCH TIME.

OTHER GOVERNMENT FAMILY PLANNING CLINICS WILL ALSO BE EXTENDING OPERATING HOURS, HE SAID.

AT PRESENT, THE GOVERNMENT RUNS 45 FAMILY PLANNING CLINICS THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY.

ATTENDANCE AT THE CLINICS IS FREE BUT A NOMINAL FEE OF \$1 IS CHARGED FOR CONTRACEPTIVES AND INCIDENTAL SERVICES.

LAST YEAR OVER 110 000 PEOPLE USED FAMILY PLANNING SERVICE RUN BY THE GOVERNMENT.

MEANWHILE, THE YAU TONG MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH CENTRE AT KO CHIU ROAD ESTATE WILL BECOME A FULL-TIME CLINIC WITH EFFECT FROM MARCH, OPERATING 5-1/2 DAYS A WEEK.
