FINDING ONE'S WAY AROUND HONG KONG HAS NOW BECOME MUCH SIMPLER THANKS TO A COMPREHENSIVE NEW BILINGUAL STREET GUIDE JUST PUBLISHED BY THE P.W.D.'S LANDS AND SURVEY DEPARTMENT.

ENTITLED 'HONG KONG STREETS AND PLACES', THE GUIDE COMES IN A HANDY, POCKET SIZE BOOKLET ATTRACTIVELY DESIGNED WITH COLOUR MAPS SUPPORTED BY AN EASY REFERENCE DIRECTORY FOR RAPID LOCATION OF EVERY STREET AND IMPORTANT BUILDINGS, AS WELL AS PLACES OF INTEREST.

THE BOOKLET IS THE FIRST OFFICIAL STREET GUIDE FOR HONG KONG AND IS BEING PRODUCED IN TWO VOLUMES.

THE FIRST VOLUME, NOW ON SALE, COVERS HONG KONG ISLAND, LANTAU AND OUTLYING ISLANDS, INCLUDING CHEUNG CHAU, PENG CHAU AND MA WAN.

A SECOND VOLUME, COVERING KOWLOON AND THE NEW TERRITORIES, IS BEING PREPARED BY THE P.W.D. CARTOGRAPHERS AND SHOULD BE PUBLISHED IN THE SECOND HALF OF THIS YEAR.

INTRODUCING THE NEW GUIDE TODAY, MR. JIM BENTLEY, THE MAN IN CHARGE OF THE P.W.D.'S MAP-MAKING ACTIVITIES, SAID THE OFFICIAL GUIDE WAS DESIGNED TO MEET A LONG FELT NEED FOR AN AUTHORITATIVE AND ACCURATE DIRECTORY OF HONG KONG STREETS AND PLACES.

+RAPID DEVELOPMENTS IN RECENT YEARS HAVE BROUGHT DRAMATIC PHYSICAL CHANGES TO HONG KONG, SO MUCH SO THAT EVEN PEOPLE WHO HAVE LIVED HERE FOR SOME TIME -- LET ALONE VISITORS -- ARE BARELY ABLE TO IDENTIFY SOME OF THE AREAS THEY HAVE BEEN USED TO.

+THE NEW GUIDE INCORPORATES ALL THE LATEST ROADS, STREETS, FLYOVERS AND MAJOR PUBLIC AS WELL AS COMMERCIAL BUILDINGS AND IS INTENDED TO HELP PEOPLE IN FINDING THEIR WAY ABOUT QUICKLY AND CONVENIENTLY,+ HE SAID.

ONE OF THE GREAT ADVANTAGES OF THE OFFICIAL GUIDE, HE SAID, WAS THAT IT WOULD BE KEPT FULLY UP TO DATE.

+REVISED EDITIONS WILL BE PUBLISHED REGULARLY TO KEEP PACE WITH NEW DEVELOPMENTS,+ HE SAID.

MR. BENTLEY NOTED THAT OPINIONS WERE LIKELY TO DIFFER AS TO WHAT SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE GUIDE, BUT HE SAID THE P.W.D. CARTOGRAPHERS WOULD WELCOME SUGGESTIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT FROM USERS.

SOME 20,000 COPIES OF THE FIRST VOLUME HAVE BEEN PRINTED AND THESE ARE NOW ON SALE AT \$7 PER COPY FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT'S MAP-SALES COUNTER ON THE 19TH FLOOR OF MURRAY BUILDING, AND FROM THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS CENTRE IN THE NEW GENERAL POST OFFICE IN CENTRAL.

COPIES ARE ALSO AVAILABLE FROM ALL CITY DISTRICT OFFICES, DISTRICT OFFICES, HONG KONG TOURIST ASSOCIATION BOOTHS, HOTELS AND LEADING BOOKSTORES.

THE GUIDE IS COMPLETELY BILINGUAL WITH THE REFERENCE DIRECTORY CONVENIENTLY ARRANGED IN STROKE NUMBER ORDER FOR CHINESE READERS, AND ALPHABETICALLY FOR ENGLISH READERS.

FOR EASY REFERENCE, THE VARIOUS MAPS IN THE GUIDE ARE GROUPED UNDER SPECIAL COLOUR CODED MARGINS ACCORDING TO THE SCALE OF THE MAP.

IN GENERAL, THE LARGE SCALE MAPS (PRODUCED TO 1 : 10,000) OUTLINED IN GREY, SHOULD BE USED TO LOCATE A PARTICULAR STREET OR PLACE. THE EXACT POSITION ON THE MAP CAN READILY BE LOCATED BY CHECKING THE PAGE NUMBER AND GRID SQUARE REFERENCE AGAINST THE NAME OF THE ITEM REQUIRED IN THE REFERENCE DIRECTORY.

THE SMALLEST SCALE MAPS (1 : 40,000 OUTLINED IN LIGHT RED) COVER THE WHOLE AREA AND ARE USEFUL FOR PLANNING A DAY'S OUTING.

THE INTERMEDIATE SCALE MAPS (1 : 20,000 OUTLINED IN LIGHT BLUE) COVER THE WHOLE OF HONG KONG ISLAND AND CHEUNG CHAU AND PROVIDE A DETAILED STUDY OF PARTICULAR LOCALITIES.

SYMBOLS ARE USED EXTENSIVELY IN THE GUIDE TO SIMPLIFY LOCATION OF HOSPITALS, POLICE STATIONS, POST OFFICES, PUBLIC TELEPHONES, CHURCHES, BUS TERMINI, CARPARKS, MARKETS AND BEACHES.

ANOTHER FEATURE OF THE GUIDE IS THAT BUILDINGS AND PLACES OF INTEREST SUCH AS ASSOCIATIONS, BEACHES, CONSULATES, GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, HOSPITALS, HOTELS, PARKS, SCHOOLS, LIBRARIES, MUSEUMS AND TRANSPORT FACILITIES, ARE GROUPED UNDER SPECIAL HEADINGS FOR EASY REFERENCE.

BRIEF NOTES ON HONG KONG WHICH MAY BE OF PARTICULAR INTEREST TO VISITORS ARE ALSO INCLUDED.

THE P.W.D. CARTOGRAPHERS HAVE ALSO INSERTED A SECTION ON SAFETY HINTS FOR HIKERS, AS WELL AS THE COUNTRY CODE WHICH IS SPELLED OUT IN CHINESE AND ENGLISH AS A REMINDER TO RAMBLERS OF THE NEED TO PROTECT HONG KONG'S NATURAL ENVIRONMENT.

DRAGON DANCE PERFORMANCE IN LONDON
* * * * *

FOR THE FIRST TIME EVER IN BRITAIN, A CHINESE DRAGON DANCE WILL BE PERFORMED IN TRAFALGAR SQUARE ON FEBRUARY 20 (SUNDAY).

THE EVENT IS BEING ORGANISED BY THE HONG KONG COMMUNITY RESIDENTS IN BRITAIN TO MARK THE CHINESE NEW YEAR - AND AS ITS TRIBUTE TO THE QUEEN ON HER SILVER JUBILEE.

APPROPRIATELY, THE 140-FOOT LONG DRAGON WILL BE PREDOMINATELY SILVER IN COLOUR. IT HAS BEEN SPECIALLY MADE IN HONG KONG AND SHIPPED TO LONDON FOR THE OCCASION BY THE HONG KONG GOVERNMENT.

THE SAME TEAM TAKING PART IN THE DRAGON DANCE IN TRAFALGAR SQUARE WILL PERFORM IT AGAIN IN LONDON LATER IN THE YEAR, AS PART OF HONG KONG'S CONTRIBUTION TO THE SILVER JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS.

THE FULL DRAGON DANCE TEAM CONSISTS OF ABOUT 80 MEN. MOSTLY WAITERS AND COOKS IN CHINESE RESTAURANTS, THEY ARE BEING TRAINED IN THEIR SPARE TIME BY +MASTERS+ OF THE ANCIENT RITUAL OF THE DRAGON DANCE.

AMONG THE CHINESE, IT IS CONSIDERED A GREAT HONOUR TO BE INVITED TO +DOT THE EYE+ OF THE DRAGON, AND IN TRAFALGAR SQUARE THIS TRADITIONAL CEREMONY WILL BE PERFORMED BY THE LORD MAYOR OF WESTMINSTER, ALDERMAN JACK GILLET.

THE DRAGON DANCE WILL BEGIN AT NOON, AND AFTERWARDS THE DRAGON WILL DANCE TO SOHO'S +CHINA TOWN+, BY WAY OF WHITOMB STREET AND WARDOUR STREET, TO WELCOME THE YEAR OF THE SNAKE - AND BRIGHTEN LONDON'S WINTER SCENE WITH THE COLOUR AND EXCITEMENT OF A CHINESE FESTIVAL.

HRH PRINCESS ALEXANDRA TO OPEN HK'S FIFTH ARTS FESTIVAL

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCESS ALEXANDRA WILL OFFICIALLY OPEN HONG KONG'S FIFTH ARTS FESTIVAL IN CITY HALL ON FEBRUARY 6.

THE PRINCESS WILL ARRIVE IN FRONT OF THE CITY HALL AT 7.30 P.M. TO A FANFARE OF TRUMPETS PROVIDED BY MEMBERS OF THE BAND AND BUGLES, FIRST BATTALION, THE LIGHT INFANTRY.

ON ARRIVAL, HER ROYAL HIGHNESS, ACCOMPANIED BY THE HONORABLE ANGUS OGILVY, WILL BE GREETED AT THE DIAS BY ARTS FESTIVAL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN MR. RUN RUN SHAW.

THE PRINCESS AND MR. SHAW WILL BE JOINED BY THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, LADY MACLEHOSE AND THE PRINCESS'S LADY IN WAITING, LADY MARY FITZALAN-HOWARD.

MISS BARBARA FEI WILL RECITE A POEM SPECIALLY WRITTEN IN DEDICATION TO THE ARTS FESTIVAL BY MR. HSU YU AND A SCROLL BEARING THE POEM IN CHINESE CALLIGRAPHY WILL BE PRESENTED TO THE PRINCESS.

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS WILL THEN DOT THE EYES OF A DRAGON. THIS WILL BE THE SIGNAL FOR ARTS FESTIVAL FLAGS AND BANNERS TO BE UNFURLED, FOR SEARCH LIGHTS TO BE SWITCHED ON AND FOR THE ARTS FESTIVAL LOGO TO BE PROJECTED ONTO THE EAST WALL OF THE CITY HALL HIGH BLOCK.

INSIDE THE CITY HALL SIR MURRAY WILL PRESENT URBAN COUNCIL CHAIRMAN MR. A. DE O. SALES AND MRS. SALES TO HER ROYAL HIGHNESS.

THE PARTY WILL THEN PROCEED TO THE CONCERT HALL WHERE MR. SHAW AND THE PRINCESS WILL BE GREETED BY A SECOND FANFARE OF TRUMPETS BY MEMBERS OF THE BAND AND BUGLES, FIRST BATTALION, THE LIGHT INFANTRY.

AFTER SHORT SPEECHES BY MR. SHAW AND HER ROYAL HIGHNESS, THE OPENING CONCERT OF THE 1977 HONG KONG ARTS FESTIVAL WILL BE GIVEN BY THE HONG KONG PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA UNDER THE BATON OF CONDUCTOR, HELEN QUACH.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA WILL ALSO ATTEND THE FIRST CONCERT OF THE BERLIN RADIO SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ON FEBRUARY 7 AND THE SECOND NIGHT OF EMLYN WILLIAMS AS +DYLAN THOMAS GROWING UP+ ON FEBRUARY 8.

FIRE HAZARD ABATEMENT NOTICES

* * * *

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT TODAY URGED MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE FIRE HAZARD ABATEMENT NOTICES SERVED ON THEM AND TO CO-OPERATE WITH FIRE OFFICERS ON INSPECTION VISIT TO THEIR PREMISES.

THE APPEAL CAME AFTER A RECENT COURT CASE IN WHICH A PLASTIC FACTORY OWNER WAS FINED \$1,000 FOR FAILING TO COMPLY WITH SUCH NOTICES AND \$500 FOR OBSTRUCTING A FIRE OFFICER WHILST IN THE EXECUTION OF HIS DUTIES.

HE SAID THAT THE OWNER OF THE FACTORY IN BELCHER STREET WAS ISSUED WITH A FIRE HAZARD ABATEMENT NOTICE ON DECEMBER 13, 1976 REQUIRING HIM TO REMOVE THE BAGS OF PLASTIC MATERIALS, METAL SHEETS, TABLES, METAL CARTS AND BASKETS OF FINISHED PRODUCTS WHICH WERE STORED IN THE LIFT LOBBY AND ON THE REAR STAIRCASE.

DURING A FOLLOW-UP INSPECTION TEN DAYS LATER, IT WAS FOUND THAT NO ACTION HAD BEEN TAKEN TO ABATE THE FIRE HAZARDS.

AS THE SENIOR FIREMAN WHO CONDUCTED THIS INSPECTION TRIED TO OBTAIN MORE INFORMATION, THE FACTORY OWNER SUDDENLY ASSAULTED HIM AND CAUSED INJURIES TO BOTH HIS HANDS AND LEGS.

COMMENTING ON THE CASE, THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE FIRE SERVICES WOULD MUCH PREFER TO ENJOY THE CO-OPERATION OF THE PUBLIC THAN TO TAKE PEOPLE TO COURT.

+HOWEVER, IF PEOPLE CHOOSE TO IGNORE OUR WARNING,+ HE SAID, +WE HAVE NO ALTERNATIVE BUT TO TAKE THE NECESSARY ACTION.+

LADY MACLEHOSE VISITS MEDICAL CENTRE

LADY MACLEHOSE TODAY PAID AN HOUR-LONG VISIT TO THE MARGARET TRENCH MEDICAL REHABILITATION CENTRE AT KWUN TONG TO SEE FOR HERSELF THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE CENTRE.

ACCOMPANIED BY DR. HARRY FANG, CHAIRMAN OF THE HONG KONG SOCIETY FOR REHABILITATION, AND MR. TOM GARNER, VICE-CHAIRMAN, LADY MACLEHOSE TOURED VARIOUS SECTIONS OF THE CENTRE AND CHATTED WITH SOME OF THE PATIENTS.

THE CENTRE, RUN BY THE HONG KONG SOCIETY FOR REHABILITATION, WAS THE FIRST IN HONG KONG TO BE EQUIPPED WITH A HYDROTHERAPY POOL.

IT WAS COMPLETED IN SEPTEMBER 1962 AS THE MEDICAL REHABILITATION CENTRE, BUT WAS OFFICIALLY RENAMED IN MARCH 1971.

THE CENTRE, A MEMBER OF THE COMMUNITY CHEST, IS SUPPORTED BY GOVERNMENT SUBVENTION AND PUBLIC DONATIONS.

IT CAN ACCOMMODATE 80 PATIENTS WHO MAY BE SENT FROM ANY HOSPITAL IN HONG KONG OR BE REFERRED FOR ADMISSION TO THE CENTRE BY CHARITABLE ORGANISATIONS, PRIVATE PRACTITIONERS, INDIVIDUALS AND THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

TEXTILE QUOTA UTILISATION POSITION

THE COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT TODAY PUBLISHED THE END OF DECEMBER 1976 FIGURES ON THE UTILISATION OF QUOTA IN RESPECT OF ALL RESTRAINED MARKETS.

COMMENTING ON THE FIGURES, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY DEPARTMENT SAID THAT WHILST THE RATE OF UTILISATION WAS HIGH IN A NUMBER OF CATEGORIES TO CERTAIN MARKETS, THE FLEXIBILITY PROVISIONS IN THE AGREEMENTS COULD ENABLE HONG KONG TO EXPORT UP TO CERTAIN SPECIFIED PERCENTAGES OVER AND ABOVE THE RESTRAINT LIMITS.

HE ALSO POINTED OUT THAT FREE QUOTAS FOR CERTAIN CATEGORIES AND MARKETS WERE STILL AVAILABLE FOR APPLICATION AND INTERESTED PARTIES SHOULD GET IN TOUCH WITH THE DEPARTMENT FOR FURTHER DETAILS.

FOLLOWING IS A BRIEF OUTLINE OF THE QUOTA POSITION OF THE UNITED STATES AND EEC, HONG KONG'S TWO MAJOR TEXTILE MARKETS.

USA

THE CURRENT 12-MONTH RESTRAINT PERIOD BEGAN ON OCTOBER 1, 1976. IN THE FIRST THREE MONTHS OF THE PERIOD, TOTAL QUOTAS USED AMOUNTED TO 150.82 MILLION EQUIVALENT SQ. YDS. OR 15.99 PER CENT OF THE OVERALL RESTRAINT LIMIT. FIGURES SHOWING THE QUANTITIES LICENSED FOR EXPORTS AND PERCENTAGE UTILISATION ON A GROUP BASIS ARE SET OUT BELOW:

OF THE CATEGORIES SUBJECT TO SPECIFIC LIMIT IN THE HONG KONG/US TEXTILE AGREEMENT, THE RATE OF UTILISATION IN FOUR OUT OF 21 CATEGORIES COULD BE DESCRIBED AS RELATIVELY HIGH. THESE FOUR CATEGORIES WERE CATEGORY 41/42/43/62(2) (COTTON KNIT T-SHIRTS, OTHER KNIT SHIRTS AND BLOUSES, EXCEPT SWEAT-SHIRTS), CATEGORY 48 (COTTON RAINCOATS, 3/4 LENGTH OR LONGER, NOT KNIT), CATEGORY 229 (COATS, NOT KNIT) AND CATEGORY 237 (SUITS, NOT KNIT).

EEC

THE 1976 TEXTILE RESTRAINT PERIOD FOR THE EEC EXPIRED ON DECEMBER 31, 1976 AND DURING THE PERIOD, TOTAL QUOTA USED AMOUNTED TO 101.08 MILLION EQUIVALENT KGS. OR 80.58 PER CENT OF THE OVERALL LIMIT. QUOTA UTILISATION POSITION ON MEMBER STATE BASIS ARE GIVEN BELOW:

THE POPULAR CATEGORIES INCLUDED CATEGORY 3 (KNIT SHIRTS AND BLOUSES), CATEGORY 8 (WOVEN TROUSERS), CATEGORY 10 (WOVEN DRESSES), CATEGORY 11 (WOVEN BLOUSES, WOMEN'S, GIRLS' AND INFANTS'), CATEGORY 12 (WOVEN SHIRTS, MMEN'S AND BOYS') AND CATEGORY 13 (WOVEN NIGHTWEAR).

PRISON STAFF AND INMATES RAISE \$10,000

STAFF AND INMATES OF TWO PRISONS DEPARTMENT INSTITUTIONS RAISED MORE THAN \$10,000 IN LAST SUNDAY'S COMMUNITY CHEST +WALK FOR A MILLION+.

FOURTEEN INMATES AND 25 STAFF FROM THE TAI LAM CENTRE FOR WOMEN WERE JOINED BY FOUR FORMER INMATES TO RAISE A TOTAL OF JUST OVER \$4,000. ALSO IN THE GROUP WERE 20 INMATES AND 14 STAFF OF THE TAI LAM ADDICTION TREATMENT CENTRE WHO RAISED ABOUT \$7,200.

THE WALKERS WERE SPONSORED BY STAFF AND INMATES OF THE TWO CENTRES, THE TONG FUK ADDICTION TREATMENT CENTRE, THE HEI LING CHAU ADDICTION TREATMENT CENTRE, FRIENDS AND RELATIVES.

ALL INMATES TAKING PART WERE ELIGIBLE FOR 24 HOURS HOME LEAVE, BUT VOLUNTEERED TO USE THE TIME TO RAISE FUNDS FOR THE COMMUNITY CHEST.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE PRISONS DEPARTMENT, SENIOR SUPERINTENDENT (TREATMENT OF DRUG ADDICTS), MR. LO KWOK-KUEN, SAID THAT THE PARTICIPATION OF THE INMATES SHOWED THAT THEY WERE ON THE ROAD TO COMPLETE REHABILITATION.
