INDEPENDENCE OF LOCAL ORGANISATIONS ENCOURAGED
* * * * *

IT IS GOVERNMENT'S INTENTION THAT LOCAL COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS SHOULD BE HELPED TO A STAGE WHERE THEY CAN BE INDEPENDENT IN PROMOTING COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT ACTIVITIES AND SELF-SUFFICIENT FINANCIALLY, THE YAU MA TEI DISTRICT OFFICER, MR AUGUSTINE CHENG, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

+THIS VIEW IS ALSO SHARED BY THE DISTRICT BOARD WHICH USES ITS FUNDS FOR PUMP-PRIMING ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE DISTRICT TO ASSIST LOCAL ORGANISATIONS TO GROW AND MATURE,+ HE SAID.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE DISTRICT'S WATER CARNIVAL, MR CHENG SAID HE WAS PLEASED TO KNOW THAT THE YAU MA TEI AND TSIM SHA TSUI RECREATION AND SPORTS ASSOCIATION, WHICH ORGANISED TODAY'S EVENT WITH THE URBAN COUNCIL, WAS ONE OF THOSE ORGANISATIONS ON THE PATH OF SELF-SUFFICIENCY.

HE NOTED THAT WHEN THE ASSOCIATION WAS SET UP IN 1981 IT WAS SERVED BY AN AD HOC COMMITTEE OF ABOUT 10 MEMBERS.

TODAY THE ASSOCIATION HAD ABOUT 300 MEMBERS AND MANAGED TWO TENNIS COURTS AT HAMILTON STREET.

+IN FACT, THE EXPANSION HAS BEEN SO RAPID THAT THE RECURRENT EXPENDITURE OF THE ASSOCIATION IN THE PAST FINANCIAL YEAR WAS FULLY MET BY ITS OWN RESOURCES,+ HE SAID.

MR CHENG ALSO COMMENDED THE ASSOCIATION FOR ITS CONTINUOUS EFFORTS IN PROMOTING SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES FOR RESIDENTS.

ONE OF THE HIGHLIGHTS IN SPORTS ACTIVITIES PLANNED BY THE ASSOCIATION THIS YEAR WOULD BE THE 'YAU MA TEI SPORTS FESTIVAL FOR PEOPLE IN EMPLOYMENT' TO BE HELD FROM OCTOBER 12 TO 28.

+THE EVENT IS TO PROVIDE FUN AND RECREATION AS WELL AS TO PROMOTE BETTER RELATIONSHIPS AMONG WORKING PEOPLE IN THE DISTRICT,+ HE SAID.

OTHER THAN ACTIVITIES, THE ASSOCIATION ALSO CONDUCTED, IN CONJUNCTION WITH GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, TRAINING COURSES IN SQUASH, TENNIS, TABLE TENNIS, FOLK DANCE AND PHYSICAL FITNESS.

AT THE WATER CARNIVAL HELD AT THE LAI CHI KOK PARK SWIMMING POOL, MORE THAN 400 CONTESTANTS TOOK PART IN VARIOUS EVENTS.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY WERE URBAN COUNCILLOR, DR PHILIP KWOK, AND DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER, MR WAI KIN-BONG.

CALL TO SUPPORT CIVIC EDUCATION ACTIVITIES
* * * * *

ACTING SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MRS ANGELA TSANG, TODAY (SATURDAY) CALLED ON RESIDENTS TO SUPPORT CIVIC EDUCATION ACTIVITIES JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD AND DISTRICT OFFICE OVER THE NEXT FEW MONTHS.

SPEAKING AT A SEMINAR FOR RESIDENT BODIES IN STANLEY AND SHEK O, MRS TSANG SAID MORE THAN 30 ACTIVITIES WERE LINED UP FOR THE DISTRICT'S SIX AREAS UNTIL THE END OF THE YEAR TO PROMOTE THE VIRTUES OF COURTESY, CIVIC-MINDEDNESS, NEIGHBOURLINESS AND ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE.

THESE ACTIVITIES WOULD BE CARRIED OUT BY CIVIC EDUCATION TEAMS FORMED UNDER EACH AREA COMMITTEE.

APART FROM WORKING WITH THE DISTRICT BOARD'S COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE EVERY MONTH TO SELECT A +CITIZEN OF THE MONTH+ FROM EACH AREA, THE TEAMS WOULD ALSO TOUR THEIR AREAS TO TAKE A LOOK AT THE ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS, AND VISIT HOMES TO AROUSE RESIDENTS' AWARENESS OF THEIR CIVIC RESPONSIBILITIES.

OTHER ACTIVITIES WOULD INCLUDE THE SELECTION OF THE CLEANEST SQUATTER AREA, FACTORY BUILDING AND PUBLIC HOUSING BLOCKS, ESSAY WRITING, DRAWING, SLOGAN AND LOGO DESIGN COMPETITIONS, QUIZZES, CIVIC EDUCATION NIGHTS, BOOKS EXHIBITION AND DRIVES AGAINST THROWING OBJECTS FROM BUILDINGS.

MORE THAN 80 REPRESENTATIVES FROM MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES, OWNERS CORPORATIONS AND RESIDENT ASSOCIATIONS IN STANLEY AND SHEK O ATTENDED TODAY'S SEMINAR TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, MANAGEMENT AND ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS, AND COMMUNITY BUILDING MATTERS.

MRS TSANG SAID DISTRICT BOARDS, AREA COMMITTEES AND RESIDENT ORGANISATIONS FORMED AN IMPORTANT THREE-TIER CONSULTATIVE SYSTEM WHICH REFLECTED THE VIEWS AND GAUGED THE NEEDS OF DISTRICT RESIDENTS.

SHE SAID THE STANLEY AND SHEK O AREA COMMITTEE HAD BEEN VERY ACTIVE IN DISTRICT AFFAIRS WITH MEMBERS VOICING CONCERN ABOUT MATTERS THAT NOT ONLY AFFECTED RESIDENTS BUT THE COMMUNITY AT LARGE.

THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICE WOULD ORGANISE SIMILAR SEMINARS WITH OTHER AREA COMMITTEES IN THE DISTRICT LATER IN THE YEAR.

ANTI-NARCOTICS ROLE FOR SOCIAL WORKERS VITAL
* * * * *

SOCIAL WORKERS, ESPECIALLY THOSE WORKING WITH YOUTHS, HAVE AN IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY IN THE FIGHT AGAINST DRUG ABUSE.

NOT ONLY WERE THEY ABLE TO STEER YOUTHS AWAY FROM DRUGS, BUT WERE ALSO IN A POSITION TO HELP REHABILITATED DRUG ADDICTS RE-INTEGRATE INTO SOCIETY.

UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, DR CHIU HIN-KWONG, SAID THIS TODAY (SATURDAY) WHEN ADDRESSING MORE THAN 80 SOCIAL WORKERS WHO ATTENDED A HALF-DAY SEMINAR ORGANISED BY THE NARCOTICS DIVISION AND THE COMMITTEE ON DRUG ABUSE OF THE HONG KONG COUNCIL OF SOCIAL SERVICE.

THE SEMINAR, THE FOURTH OF ITS KIND, WAS ORGANISED TO ENLIST THE SUPPORT OF SOCIAL WORKERS IN THE FIGHT AGAINST NARCOTICS, TO SERVE AS A CHANNEL WITH CLOSE LIAISON BETWEEN THE NARCOTICS DIVISION AND SOCIAL WORKERS AND TO PROVIDE THEM WITH UP-TO-DATE INFORMATION ON THE OVERALL DRUG SITUATION - THE TYPES OF DRUGS COMMONLY USED AND THE TREATMENT FACILITIES AVAILABLE.

DR CHIU CALLED ON SOCIAL WORKERS TO BE BETTER EQUIPPED WITH IN-DEPTH INFORMATION AND KNOWLEDGE OF THE DRUG PROBLEM IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE THIS ROLE.

+A SEMINAR OF THIS KIND WILL CERTAINLY TAKE YOU A STEP FURTHER IN THIS RESPECT SO THAT YOU CAN JOIN FORCES WITH VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS AND THE PUBLIC IN COMBATING THE DRUG MENACE,+ HE SAID.

THE SEMINAR, ENTITLED +DRUG ABUSE AMONG YOUTHS+, FOCUSED ON THE PSYCHOLOGY OF YOUNG DRUG ABUSERS, AS SUCH KNOWLEDGE WOULD UNDOUBTEDLY BENEFIT SOCIAL WORKERS DEALING WITH THOSE HAVING A DRUG PROBLEM.

CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGIST OF THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, MR ROBERT TANG, ALSO SPOKE ON THIS SUBJECT AND PRESENTED A CASE STORY FOR GROUP DISCUSSION.

OTHER SPEAKERS AT THE SEMINAR INCLUDED MR RICHARD TANG OF THE NARCOTICS BUREAU, ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE FORCE, MR SIMON YEUNG OF THE NARCOTICS DIVISION, DR M.B. ALI OF THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT AND MISS TANG YIN-PING OF THE BOYS' AND GIRLS' CLUB ASSOCIATION.
