## MORE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS GETTING FINANCIAL HELP

\* \* \* \* \*

MORE THAN HALF OF HONG KONG'S UNIVERSITY STUDENT BODY IS NOW RECEIVING GOVERNMENT FINANCIAL AID AS MORE STUDENTS FROM THE LOWER INCOME CLASS ARE ADMITTED TO THE UNIVERSITIES.

DISCLOSING THIS TODAY, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE JOINT UNIVERSITIES COMMITTEE ON STUDENT FINANCE, MR. S.F. BAILEY, SAID 3,919 NEEDY UNDERGRADUATES AND POST-GRADUATES, AS WELL AS STUDENTS TAKING A HIGH DEGREE OR DIPLOMA COURSE IN THE TWO UNIVERSITIES WERE RECEIVING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE.

+THIS REPRESENTS OVER 57 PERCENT OF THE TOTAL UNIVERSITY STUDENT BODY AND A CONSIDERABLE INCREASE COMPARED WITH THE SITUATION IN 1969,+ HE SAID.

IN 1969, 1,599 STUDENTS -- REPRESENTING 32.7 PER CENT OF THE THEN UNIVERSITY STUDENT BODY -- WERE AWARDED FINANCIAL AID.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IS GIVEN IN THE FORM OF GRANTS AND INTEREST-FREE LOANS. THE SCHEME IS ADMINISTERED BY THE JOINT UNIVERSITIES COMMITTEE ON STUDENT FINANCE WHICH COMPRISES REPRESENTATIVES FROM STUDENTS AND STAFF OF THE TWO UNIVERSITIES, THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE SECRETARY OF THE UNIVERSITY AND POLYTECHNIC GRANTS COMMITTEE.

+THE BASIC AIMS ARE TO ENSURE THAT NO STUDENT OFFERED A PLACE BY EITHER UNIVERSITY HAS TO TURN IT DOWN FOR LACK OF FINANCIAL RESOURCES, AND TO ENSURE AS FAR AS POSSIBLE THAT THE ASSISTANCE GIVEN IS ADEQUATE,+ MR. BAILEY EXPLAINED.

MR. BAILEY SAID SOME \$4.25 MILLION WAS AWARDED TO STUDENTS THIS YEAR AS AGAINST \$2.45 MILLION IN 1969. THE ALLOCATION OF LOANS FOR THE CURRENT YEAR IS \$13.50 MILLION -- FOUR TIMES THE AMOUNT OF \$3.06 MILLION IN THE YEAR 1969.

THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FINANCIAL AID HAS INCREASED CONSIDERABLY SINCE A 1971 RE-EXAMINATION OF STUDENT REQUIREMENTS, HE NOTED.

+FURTHERMORE, THE TWO UNIVERSITIES NOW ENROL NOT PRIMARILY MIDDLE-CLASS STUDENTS, BUT A LARGE NUMBER OF STUDENTS WITH RELATIVELY FEW FAMILY RESOURCES.+

ALL ASSISTED STUDENTS OBTAINED INTEREST-FREE LOANS ON A SCALE RANGING FROM \$600 TO \$4,000 PER ANNUM. THE AVERAGE AMOUNT OF THIS KIND OF LOAN IS \$3,426 FOR EACH STUDENT DURING THIS YEAR.

MOST ASSISTED STUDENTS ALSO RECEIVED GOVERNMENT GRANTS OF UP TO \$2,620 -- THE AVERAGE GRANT FOR A STUDENT BEING AN ESTIMATED \$1,279.

THE ESSENCE OF THE GOVERNMENT GRANT IS THAT IT PROVIDES ADEQUATE FUNDS TO NEEDY STUDENTS TO COVER TUITION FEES AND CERTAIN OTHER UNAVOIDABLE EXPENSES SUCH AS BOOKS, STATIONERY AND EQUIPMENT.

THE LOANS, ON THE OTHER HAND, ARE GENERALLY INTENDED TO ASSIST STUDENTS IN MEETING THEIR LIVING EXPENSES. SINCE 1969, A TOTAL OF \$43.57 MILLION IN LOANS WAS ALLOCATED TO STUDENTS.

THE LOANS HAVE TO BE REPAID BY 20 QUARTERLY INSTALMENTS WITHIN FIVE YEARS AFTER THE STUDENT HAS LEFT THE UNIVERSITY OR HAS FINISHED AN APPROVED COURSE OF FURTHER EDUCATION.

MR. BAILEY SAID THAT UP TO NOVEMBER THIS YEAR RECOVERY ACTION HAD BEEN STARTED AGAINST 3,392 STUDENTS FOR THE REPAYMENT OF LOANS.

HE POINTED OUT THAT DEFERMENTS OR SUSPENSIONS OF REPAYMENT WERE ALLOWED WHERE STUDENTS TOOK UP APPROVED COURSES OF FURTHER EDUCATION AFTER LEAVING UNIVERSITY OR WHERE PERSONAL CIRCUMSTANCES, SUCH AS UNEMPLOYMENT, MADE RECOVERY IMPRACTICAL FOR THE TIME BEING.

+THERE HAVE SO FAR BEEN 152 DEFERMENTS AND SUSPENSIONS AND NO LOAN HAS YET BEEN WRITTEN-OFF AS IRRECOVERABLE,+ HE SAID.

HOWEVER, MR. BAILEY WARNED THAT FALSIFICATION OF A STATUTORY DECLARATION OF FAMILY RESOURCES WAS A SERIOUS OFFENCE UNDER THE PERJURY ORDINANCE AND HE URGED STUDENT APPLICANTS AND THEIR PARENTS TO BEAR THIS IN MIND.

+SINCE 1972, 33 CASES HAVE BEEN TAKEN TO COURT AND IN EVERY CASE THE PERSON WHO SIGNED THE STATUTORY DECLARATION WAS FINED AND THE MONEY GRANTED IN ASSISTANCE WAS RECOVERED,+ HE SAID.

TUEN MUN LAND MAY BE SOLD BY TENDER

\* \* \* \* \*

IN ORDER TO ELIMINATE SPECULATION IN INDUSTRIAL REAL ESTATE, IT IS PROPOSED THAT SOME LAND IN TUEN MUN BE OFFERED FOR SALE BY TENDER.

THIS WAS DISCLOSED TODAY BY THE SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR. DAVID AKERS-JONES AT A LUNCHEON MEETING OF THE HONG KONG COTTON SPINNERS ASSOCIATION.

MR. AKERS-JONES SAID THE SUCCESSFUL TENDERER WOULD BE REQUIRED TO PRODUCE EVIDENCE THAT HE HAD THE NECESSARY CAPITAL RESOURCES AND REAL INTENTION TO DEVELOP THE LAND IMMEDIATELY UPON PURCHASE.

+BY THIS MEANS I WOULD HOPE TO ELIMINATE THE SPECULATOR,+ HE SAID.

MR. AKERS-JONES ALSO REVEALED THAT ANOTHER 400,000 SQ. FT. OF LAND IN TUEN MUN WOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR SALE NEXT YEAR.

HE SAID THE GOVERNMENT HAD CHANGED ITS LAND POLICY IN ORDER TO PERMIT THE SALE BY PRIVATE TREATY OF LARGE SITES FOR NEW INDUSTRIES INTRODUCING NEW SKILLS AND TECHNOLOGY TO HONG KONG.

+THIS WAS A RADICAL DEPARTURE FROM A PRINCIPLE WHICH HAD BEEN A CORNERSTONE OF OUR LAND POLICY FOR A HUNDRED YEARS.

+HOWEVER, WE HAVE RESISTED THE ALL-OUT CHANGE FROM OUR POLICY OF LETTING THE MARKET DECIDE THE PRICE AND THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH OUR INDUSTRIAL LAND IS SOLD. I BELIEVE THIS IS WISE BECAUSE THE PRIVATE INDUSTRIALIST KNOWS BEST WHAT IS A VIABLE ENTERPRISE IN OUR CIRCUMSTANCE,+ HE ADDED.

MR. AKERS-JONES SAID IT HAD BEEN ARGUED THAT THERE WAS A NEED TO MAKE SOME LAND AVAILABLE FOR LESS INTENSIVE USE WITHIN THE PLANNED AREAS OF THE NEW TOWNS — THAT IS, LAND FOR LOW RISE BUILDINGS FOR CAPITAL-INTENSIVE FACTORIES EMPLOYING A RELATIVELY SMALL LABOUR FORCE.

LAND IN THESE INDUSTRIAL ESTATES, HE SAID, WOULD BE LEASED OR SOLD DIRECT TO APPLICANTS AT A PRICE WHICH WOULD PROTECT THE CAPITAL INVESTED IN THE DEVELOPMENT.

IN HONG KONG, HE ADDED, WE WERE NOT TIED TO THE PURSUIT OF PURELY POLITICAL OBJECTIVES WHICH COULD DAMAGE THE ECONOMY. +WE ARE FREE TO PURSUE SENSIBLE POLICIES WHICH DIRECTLY BENEFIT THE PEOPLE AND WE ARE ABLE TO RESPOND AND CHANGE THOSE POLICES FAIRLY QUICKLY WHEN THERE IS A NEED TO DO SO.+

GOVERNOR TOURS SHEUNG WAN DISTRICT  
\*\*\*\*\*

THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, TODAY DESCRIBED OWNERS' INCORPORATIONS IN MULTI-STOREY BUILDINGS AS A MEANS OF COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND THE PEOPLE.

HE VISITED THE OWNERS' INCORPORATION OF THE NAM PAK HONG BUILDING WHILE HE WAS ON A MORNING TOUR OF THE SHEUNG WAN DISTRICT, AND MET WITH THE CHAIRMAN OF THE INCORPORATION, MR. CHAN FOOK-LAI.

FORMED IN 1972, THE OWNERS' INCORPORATION OF THIS BUILDING IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENERAL MANAGEMENT OF THE BUILDING, INCLUDING WATCHMEN SERVICE, CLEANSING SERVICE IN COMMON AREAS, REFUSE COLLECTION, LIFT SERVICE AND REPAIR WORKS. WATCHMEN SERVICE IS PROVIDED ON A 24-HOUR BASIS, AND MR. CHAN SAID NO ROBBERIES HAD EVER OCCURRED IN THE BUILDING.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE CITY DISTRICT OFFICER (WESTERN), MR. NICHOLAS NG, SIR MURRAY BEGAN HIS TOUR WITH A STROLL DOWN THE SLOPE OF SAI STREET, ALONG WHICH MORE THAN 30 HAWKER STALLS WERE DOING BRISK BUSINESS SELLING FRESH VEGETABLES TO HOUSEWIVES LIVING IN THE AREA.

SOME OF THE STALLS ARE TEMPORARILY RESITED THERE TO HELP FACILITATE THE WORK OF THE URBAN RENEWAL PILOT SCHEME.

THE GOVERNOR TALKED WITH SOME OF THE HAWKERS, MANY OF WHOM HAD BEEN PLYING THEIR TRADE IN THE AREA FOR OVER 20 YEARS, AND ASKED THEM HOW THEIR BUSINESS WAS AFFECTED BY THE PILOT SCHEME.

SIR MURRAY NEXT VISITED A TEMPORARY SITTING-OUT AREA AT 362-366 QUEEN'S ROAD CENTRAL WHICH IS PROVIDED UNDER THE RENEWAL SCHEME. HE ALSO INSPECTED SEVEN LOTS OF DILAPIDATED BUILDINGS IN LOWER LASCAR ROW ABOUT TO BE RESUMED FOR THE URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT BEFORE HE WALKED DOWN TO BOMHAM STRAND WEST TO SEE THE TRADING ACTIVITIES.

THIS AREA, GENERALLY KNOWN AS THE NAM PAK HONG (SOUTH-AND-NORTH TRADING COMPANIES), HAS SEEN SOME OF THE EARLIEST BUSINESS TRANSACTIONS IN HONG KONG.

THE TRADERS SPECIALIZE MOSTLY IN THE IMPORT AND EXPORT OF CHINESE HERBS AND OTHER PRECIOUS ORGANIC MEDICINE BETWEEN CHINA AND SOUTH-EAST ASIA.

FOR THE LAST PART OF HIS VISIT, SIR MURRAY PROCEEDED ON FOOT TO THE WATERFRONT ALONG CONNAUGHT ROAD WEST WHERE RECLAMATION WORK IS NOW ALREADY IN ITS FIFTH STAGE OF DEVELOPMENT.

/THE NEW .....

THE NEW RECLAMATION WILL ADD 16 MORE ACRES OF MUCH-NEEDED LAND TO HONG KONG ON COMPLETION SOMETIME IN SEPTEMBER NEXT YEAR.

THE ADDED SPACE WILL BE USED FOR WIDENING CONNAUGHT ROAD, AN EXTENSION TO THE MACAU FERRY WHARF AND FOR A NEW SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT.

AT PRESENT, PART OF THE RECLAMATION AT THE WESTERN END HAS BEEN FENCED OFF AND IS USED AS A TEMPORARY CARGO HANDLING AREA.

REAL ESTATE ASSOCIATION MEETS COLONIAL SECRETARY  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE PRESIDENT OF THE REAL ESTATE DEVELOPERS ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG, MR. HENRY FOK, TOGETHER WITH SEVEN VICE-PRESIDENTS AND DIRECTORS OF THE ASSOCIATION TODAY MET THE COLONIAL SECRETARY, MR. DENYS ROBERTS, AND SENIOR GOVERNMENT STAFF TO DISCUSS THE PROBLEMS FACING PROPERTY DEVELOPERS AND OWNERS.

THE ASSOCIATION REPRESENTATIVES EXPLAINED THE DIFFICULTIES IN THE PROPERTY MARKET AS REFLECTED BY THE LARGE NUMBERS OF FLATS STILL REMAINING UNSOLD EVEN AT REDUCED PRICES.

THE ASSOCIATION WAS PARTICULARLY CONCERNED ABOUT RATES AND STATUTORY CONTROLS. THEY NOTED THAT RATES ARE AT PRESENT PAYABLE IN FULL ON VACANT PREMISES AND THAT THE RATE-FREE PERIOD ON NEWLY COMPLETED PREMISES IS NOW ONLY THREE MONTHS COMPARED WITH SIX MONTHS PREVIOUSLY- THAT THE EXISTING CONTROLS ON LUXURY FLATS WERE UNREASONABLE AND INVOLVED FLAT OWNERS IN SUBSIDISING WELL-OFF TENANTS, INCLUDING GOVERNMENT, COMMERCIAL COMPANIES AND THE ARMED SERVICES- AND THAT DEVELOPERS ARE DETERRED FROM GOING AHEAD WITH NEW PROJECTS BY THE LIKELIHOOD THAT THESE NEW PROJECTS WHEN COMPLETED MIGHT BECOME SUBJECT TO THE LANDLORD AND TENANT CONTROLS WHEN THE PRESENT LEGISLATION EXPIRES IN DECEMBER 1976.

THE GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES UNDERTOOK TO LOOK INTO THESE POINTS AND TO GIVE THEM SYMPATHETIC CONSIDERATION.

THEY STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE WHICH THE GOVERNMENT ATTACHES TO THE PRIVATE SECTOR'S CONTRIBUTION TO NEW BUILDING DEVELOPMENT, TO MEET HONG KONG'S GROWING HOUSING REQUIREMENTS.

RATING AND VALUATION BILL CLARIFIED

TENANTS OF POST-WAR DOMESTIC BUILDINGS WILL STILL BE REQUIRED TO OBTAIN WRITTEN CONSENT FROM THEIR LANDLORDS BEFORE SUB-LETTING ANY PART OF THE PREMISES, THE COMMISSIONER OF RATING AND VALUATION SAID TODAY.

HE EMPHASISED THAT NO CHANGE TO THIS REQUIREMENT IS PROPOSED IN THE LANDLORD AND TENANT (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT) BILL WHICH WAS GAZETTED LAST FRIDAY.

UNDER THE PROPOSED NEW LEGISLATION, ONCE A TENANT HAS RECEIVED THE LANDLORD'S CONSENT IN WRITING THERE WILL BE NO NEED FOR HIM TO SUBMIT FULL DETAILS OF THE SUB-LETTING UNTIL REQUESTED TO DO SO BY THE LANDLORD.

AT PRESENT, A TENANT IS OBLIGED TO INFORM HIS LANDLORD OF ANY SUB-LETTING MADE AFTER DECEMBER 14, 1973, WHETHER OR NOT THE LANDLORD ASKS FOR THE INFORMATION.

WEEKLY WATER SITUATION REPORT

THE TOTAL WATER STORAGE IN ALL RESERVOIRS AT 9 A.M. TODAY (DECEMBER 9) STOOD AT 56,064 MILLION GALLONS, REPRESENTING 83.3 PER CENT OF THE FULL CAPACITY OF 67,300 MILLION GALLONS AND ALSO AN INCREASE OF 563 MILLION GALLONS OVER THE STORAGE AT THE SAME TIME LAST YEAR.

AT THIS TIME LAST YEAR THERE WERE 55,501 MILLION GALLONS IN STORE.

THIS MORNING'S STORAGE AT PLOVER COVE WAS 40,274 MILLION GALLONS, COMPARED WITH 43,547 MILLION GALLONS ON THE SAME DAY LAST YEAR. PLOVER COVE'S PRESENT STORAGE REPRESENTS 79.8 PER CENT OF ITS FULL CAPACITY OF 50,500 MILLION GALLONS.

NO RAINFALL WAS RECORDED AT THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY DURING THE PAST 24 HOURS ENDING AT 9 A.M. TODAY. TOTAL RAINFALL RECORDED SO FAR THIS YEAR IS 2,312.9 MM (91.06 IN).

THE MEAN AVERAGE RAINFALL SINCE JANUARY 1 STANDS AT 2,148.5 MM (84.59 IN), REPRESENTING AN INCREASE OF 7.7 PER CENT.

HONG KONG MAY JOIN ESCAP MEMBERS  
IN BID TO REDUCE TARIFF BARRIERS IN WORLD TRADE  
\* \* \* \* \*

HONG KONG HOPES TO JOIN A NEW INTERNATIONAL FORUM DESIGNED TO HELP THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES PROTECT THEIR INTERESTS IN THE COMING ROUND OF NEGOTIATIONS IN GENEVA AIMED AT REDUCING TARIFF AND NON-TARIFF BARRIERS TO THE WORLD TRADE.

THIS WAS DISCLOSED BY MR. PETER TSAO, ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY ON HIS RETURN TO HONG KONG FROM A WEEK-LONG MEETING IN BANGKOK OF THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COMMISSION FOR ASIA AND PACIFIC, ESCAP.

MR. TSAO SAID THE MEETING DISCUSSED AT LENGTH THE FORTHCOMING ROUND OF MULTILATERAL TRADE NEGOTIATIONS AND DECIDED THAT THE DEVELOPING MEMBERS OF ESCAP SHOULD FORM A GROUP TO PREPARE THEMSELVES FOR THE GENEVA TALKS WITH THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES.

THE ESCAP GROUP PLANS TO MEET IN GENEVA BOTH BEFORE AND AFTER THE MEETING OF THE TRADE NEGOTIATION COMMITTEE OF THE GATT WHICH IS DUE TO TAKE PLACE VERY SOON. THE MULTILATERAL TRADE NEGOTIATIONS WILL BEGIN IN EARNEST WHEN THE US CONGRESS PASSES ITS TRADE REFORM BILL WHICH WILL AUTHORISE THE WHITE HOUSE TO ENTER INTO ANY AGREEMENT ARISING FROM THE NEGOTIATIONS.

THE US DELEGATE TO THE MEETING STATED IN THE FORMAL SESSIONS THAT MOST OF THE OBSTACLES WHICH HAVE DELAYED THE BILL'S PASSAGE THROUGH CONGRESS HAVE NOW BEEN OVERCOME AND IT IS EXPECTED TO BE PASSED BEFORE THE END OF THIS YEAR.
