WHOLE OF HONG KONG BECOMES SMOKE CONTROL AREA

\* \* \* \* \*

MAJOR SECTIONS OF KOWLOON AND NEW TERRITORIES TODAY OFFICIALLY BECAME CONTROL AREAS—BRINGING ALL OF HONG KONG UNDER ANTI-POLLUTION REGULATIONS.

THE MOVE IS ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT STEPS YET TAKEN BY THE GOVERNMENT IN ITS CONTINUING CAMPAIGN TO COMBAT INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL AIR POLLUTION.

+OUR EFFORTS TO REDUCE AERIAL POLLUTION HAVE MET WITH A MARKED DEGREE OF SUCCESS SO FAR AND THIS WILL HELP US CONTINUE TO WIN THE FIGHT,+ THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT'S AIR POLLUTION CONTROL OFFICER, MR. DAVID NEWBURY, SAID TODAY.

+ALL OF HONG KONG NOW COMES UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE CLEAN AIR ORDINANCE, SOMETHING THE GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN PROGRESSIVELY AIMING AT.+

THE REGULATIONS STRICTLY LIMIT THE VOLUME OF POLLUTION PRODUCING DARK SMOKE WHICH CAN BE EMITTED. AS A RESULT, THE GOVERNMENT CAN NOW STEP UP ITS EFFORTS TO REDUCE AERIAL POLLUTION TO AN ACCEPTABLE LEVEL .

IN THE TWO MONTHS SINCE THE REMAINING AREAS OF HONG KONG WERE GAZETTED AS SMOKE CONTROL AREAS, STAFF FROM THE AIR POLLUTION CONTROL UNIT HAD BEEN CONCENTRATING ON AN EDUCATION AND ADVICE PROGRAMME.

+WE HAVE VISITED ALL THE FACTORIES AND VARIOUS UNDERTAKINGS AND RESTAURANTS WHICH ARE NOW AFFECTED BY THE PROVISIONS,+ MR. NEWBURY SAID.

+WE HAVE BEEN EXPLAINING JUST WHAT IS REQUIRED AND OFFERING OUR HELP AND SUGGESTIONS ON HOW THE REGULATIONS CAN BE MET.+

+OUR ADVICE APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN VERY WELL RECEIVED.+

+WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO POINT OUT TO PEOPLE THAT EXCESSIVE BLACK SMOKE, WHICH CAUSES POLLUTION, IS USUALLY THE RESULT OF INEFFICIENT BURNING.

+WE HAVE BEEN SUGGESTING METHODS OF PROPER BURNING WHICH CAN SAVE THE OPERATORS UP TO 25 PER CENT ON THEIR FUEL BILLS.+

MR. NEWBURY ADDED THAT BREACHES OF THE REGULATIONS CARRIED A FINE OF UP TO \$2,000.

SPECIAL CONVERSION PROGRAMME INTRODUCED  
TO SPEED UP ISSUE OF LAMINATED DRIVING LICENCES

\*\*\*\*\*

TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT HAS STARTED A SPECIAL CONVERSION PROGRAMME TO SPEED UP THE PROCESS OF REPLACING BOOKLET DRIVING LICENCES BY THE NEW LAMINATED CARD TYPE.

UNDER THE PROGRAMME, NOTIFICATIONS ARE BEING SENT TO LICENCE-HOLDERS OFFERING THEM THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONVERT THEIR DRIVING LICENCES BEFORE THEY ARE DUE FOR RENEWAL.

IT IS INTENDED TO SEND THESE NOTIFICATIONS IN BATCHES OF ABOUT 50,000 PER MONTH, AND THE PROGRAMME IS EXPECTED TO TAKE ABOUT SIX MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

A TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN TODAY ADVISED MOTORISTS, WHO HAD YET TO RECEIVE A NOTIFICATION, TO REFRAIN FROM ENQUIRING ABOUT THE MATTER AT THIS STAGE.

DRIVERS WHOSE LICENCES ARE DUE FOR RENEWAL WITHIN THE NEXT FOUR MONTHS OR WHO APPLY FOR INCLUSION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSES IN THEIR LICENCE, WILL BE ISSUED WITH A NEW LAMINATED CARD LICENCE ON RENEWAL.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT MOTORISTS WHO RECEIVE A NOTIFICATION SHOULD SEND OR POST THE RETURN SLIP TO THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT, TOGETHER WITH THEIR BOOKLET LICENCE, TWO IDENTIFICATION PHOTOGRAPHS AND THEIR HONG KONG IDENTITY CARD.

THE DEPARTMENT WILL SUBSEQUENTLY RETURN THE NEW LAMINATED LICENCE, THE INVALIDATED OLD BOOKLET LICENCE AND THE IDENTITY CARD TO THE LICENCE HOLDER, HE SAID.

HE STRESSED THAT ONLY IN THOSE CASES WHERE AN IDENTITY CARD HAD NOT BEEN ISSUED WOULD A PASSPORT OR SOME OTHER ACCEPTABLE IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENT BE CONSIDERED AS A SUBSTITUTE.

THE SIZE OF THE IDENTIFICATION PHOTOGRAPHS MUST BE RESTRICTED TO 1-1/4" X 1" BECAUSE THE LAMINATED LICENCE IS SIMILAR IN SIZE TO A HONG KONG IDENTITY CARD. PHOTOGRAPHS OF THIS SIZE, IF NOT READILY AVAILABLE ELSEWHERE, CAN BE OBTAINED FROM THE PHOTO-VENDING MACHINES INSTALLED IN THE DEPARTMENT'S LICENSING OFFICES.

**FRANCHISES OF FERRY COMPANIES EXTENDED**  
**\*\*\*\*\***

THE GOVERNMENT HAS AGREED TO EXTEND THE FRANCHISES OF THE TWO MAJOR FERRY COMPANIES - HONG KONG AND YAUMATI FERRY COMPANY AND THE STAR FERRY COMPANY - FOR ANOTHER FIVE YEARS.

THE CONCESSION WILL RUN FROM JANUARY 1, 1975 UNTIL DECEMBER 31, 1979.

BOTH COMPANIES HAD PREVIOUSLY REQUESTED AN EXTENSION IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE APPROPRIATE ORDINANCES UNDER WHICH THEY OPERATE. AS NEITHER COMPANY HAD COMMITTED ANY BREACH OF THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE RESPECTIVE ORDINANCES, APPROVAL WAS GRANTED.

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN EXPLAINED TODAY THAT BECAUSE THE EXTENSION IS FOR A THIRD AND FINAL TERM OF FIVE YEARS, NEGOTIATIONS DURING THIS PERIOD WILL BE HELD BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT AND THE COMPANIES WITH A VIEW TO CONCLUDING REVISED FRANCHISES FOR EACH COMPANY TO TAKE EFFECT FROM JANUARY 1, 1980.

LEGO MEETING TOMORROW

\* \* \* \* \*

THE PUBLIC OMNIBUS SERVICES BILL WHICH GIVES THE GOVERNMENT WIDER POWERS TO CONTROL THE OPERATIONS OF FRANCHISED BUS COMPANIES WILL BE INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TOMORROW (WEDNESDAY).

THIS IS ONE OF THE SIX BILLS TO BE PRESENTED TO THE COUNCIL FOR THEIR FIRST AND SECOND READINGS. THE OTHER FIVE ARE :-

- \* THE FIXED PENALTY (TRAFFIC CONTRAVENTIONS) (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 WHICH PROPOSES TO FURTHER IMPROVE TRAFFIC FLOW BY THE DELINEATION OF +CONTROLLED AREAS=+
- \* THE RATING (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 DEALS WITH THE VALUATION OF TENEMENTS IN A NEWLY SPECIFIED RATING AREA=
- \* THE INTERPRETATION AND GENERAL CLAUSES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 WHICH CONCERNS THE EXCHANGE RATE BETWEEN HONG KONG DOLLARS AND POUND STERLING=
- \* THE MARRIAGE (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 WHICH SEEKS TO ENABLE THE REGISTRAR TO DISPENSE WITH THE ISSUE OF A CERTIFICATE GIVING NOTICE OF AN INTENDED MARRIAGE= AND
- \* THE LANDLORD AND TENANT (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 WHICH SEEKS TO ELIMINATE THE REQUIREMENT OF TENANTS HAVING TO NOTIFY LANDLORDS OF ANY SUBLETTING, UNLESS SO REQUESTED BY THEIR LANDLORDS.

IN ADDITION, FIVE OTHER BILLS WILL PASS THE COMMITTEE STAGE AND THIRD READING TOMORROW. THEY ARE THE PUBLIC REVENUE PROTECTION (AMENDMENT) BILL 1974, THE COMPANIES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1974, THE LAW REVISION (MISCELLANEOUS REPEALS) BILL 1974, THE FORESTRY (AMENDMENT) BILL 1974, AND THE HONG KONG PRODUCTIVITY COUNCIL (AMENDMENT) BILL 1974.

UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL WILL RAISE 11 QUESTIONS DEALING WITH A VARIETY OF SUBJECTS INCLUDING THE CLOSURE OF DES VOEUX ROAD CENTRAL TO PRIVATE VEHICULAR TRAFFIC, SMALL DEBTS COURT, IMPORT OF WILD ANIMALS, PUBLIC ASSISTANCE, CODE OF AID FOR SPECIAL SCHOOLS AND SILICOSIS AS AN INDUSTRIAL DISEASE.

CLARIFICATION OF METHADONE MAINTENANCE TREATMENT

\* \* \* \* \*

THE MAXIMUM CAPACITY OF THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT'S THREE NEW METHADONE MAINTENANCE CENTRES IS TO DISPENSE METHADONE IN ORANGE JUICE TO 1,000 PATIENTS IN EACH CENTRE A DAY.

+IF THE NEED ARISES,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY,+EVEN MORE CENTRES WILL BE OPENED.+

HE EXPLAINED THAT A NEW PATIENT COULD NOT BE GIVEN METHADONE WITHOUT A PHYSICAL EXAMINATION AND AN INVESTIGATION INTO THEIR DRUG ADDICTION HISTORY,WHICH IS A TIME-CONSUMING PROCESS AND TAKES ABOUT HALF AN HOUR FOR EACH CASE.

+BUT ONCE HE IS ACCEPTED FOR TREATMENT, HE WILL BE GIVEN HIS DAILY DOSAGE UNDER SUPERVISION WITH NO DELAY AT ALL,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE REFUTED A NEWSPAPER REPORT THAT APPLICANTS FOR METHADONE TREATMENT HAD BEEN +TURNED AWAY+ FROM THE CLINICS WHICH OPENED YESTERDAY.

+THEY WERE NOT TURNED AWAY, OR DENIED TREATMENT. IT WAS EXPLAINED TO THEM THAT THEY HAD TO AWAIT THEIR TURN, THAT THEY HAD TO BRING ALONG WITH THEM THEIR IDENTITY CARDS AND THREE PASSPORT-SIZE PHOTOGRAPHS -- WHICH MANY HAD FAILED TO DO -- AND THAT IF THEY COULD NOT BE SEEN ON ONE DAY, THEY WOULD BE ATTENDED TO ON THE NEXT.

+THIS IS THE NORMAL PRACTICE AT ANY OUT-PATIENT CLINIC RUN BY THE DEPARTMENT,+ THE SPOKESMAN COMMENTED.

HE REPEATED THAT NEW PATIENTS WERE BEING SEEN AT THE NEW TREATMENT CENTRES ON THE AVERAGE OF ABOUT 30 A DAY AT EACH CENTRE BETWEEN 9 A.M. AND 5 P.M. ON WEEKDAYS, AND BETWEEN 9 A.M. AND 1 P.M. ON SATURDAYS.

FOR PATIENTS COMING FOR THEIR DAILY DOSAGE, THE CLINICS WERE BEING KEPT OPEN THROUGHOUT THE YEAR BETWEEN 7 A.M. AND 9.30 P.M.

THE CLINICS ARE LOCATED AT THE HO MAN TIN HEALTH CENTRE IN PRINCESS MARGARET ROAD, THE ROBERT BLACK HEALTH CENTRE IN SAN PO KONG, AND THE LADY TRENCH POLYCLINIC IN TSUEN WAN. THE FEE IS \$1 A VISIT WHICH CAN BE WAIVED IN CASE OF NEED.

NOVEMBER WEATHER DRIER AND CLOUDIER THAN USUAL  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE WEATHER LAST MONTH WAS DRIER, CLOUDIER AND LESS SUNNY THAN USUAL. THE TOTAL RAINFALL RECORDED WAS ONLY 24.9 MM, WHICH AMOUNTED TO ONLY ABOUT 58 PER CENT OF THE AVERAGE RAINFALL FOR NOVEMBER.

THE MONTH'S MEAN WIND SPEED OF 4.1 KNOTS WAS THE SECOND LOWEST RECORDED IN NOVEMBER SINCE RECORDS BEGAN IN 1884.

THE MAIN FEATURE OF THE MONTH'S WEATHER, ACCORDING TO THE MONTHLY WEATHER REPORT ISSUED BY THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY, WAS THE CONTINUING DRY CONDITIONS IN THE LATTER HALF OF THE MONTH. A TOTAL OF 15 RED OR YELLOW FIRE DANGER WARNINGS WAS ISSUED DURING THE MONTH.

ALTHOUGH FOUR TROPICAL CYCLONES WERE FORMED IN THE WESTERN NORTH PACIFIC AND THE SOUTH CHINA SEA, ONLY ONE HAD POSED A THREAT TO HONG KONG.

THE STAND BY SIGNAL, NO.1, WAS HOISTED ON NOVEMBER 7 WHEN TYPHOON +GLORIA+ WAS CENTRED ABOUT 400 MILES SOUTH-EAST OF HONG KONG. THE SIGNAL WAS LOWERED TWO DAYS LATER.

+GLORIA+ WAS ONE OF THE FEW TYPHOONS WHICH HAVE THREATENED HONG KONG IN NOVEMBER SINCE 1972.

DURING THE MONTH, NO AIRCRAFT WERE DIVERTED FROM HONG KONG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT BECAUSE OF ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS.

THE MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE OF 29.2 DEGREES CELSIUS FOR THE MONTH WAS RECORDED ON NOVEMBER 5 AND THE MINIMUM TEMPERATURE OF 15.5 DEGREES CELSIUS ON NOVEMBER 27.

NEW POSTER FOR FIRE PREVENTION CAMPAIGN

\*\*\*\*\*

A NEW POSTER, DESIGNED TO PUBLICISE THE CURRENT FIRE PREVENTION CAMPAIGN, IS NOW ON DISPLAY IN VARIOUS PARTS OF HONG KONG.

IT SHOWS THE AFTERMATH OF A DISASTROUS FIRE, WITH THE WORDS: +THIS IS THE ASH FROM ONE CIGARETTE+.

A FIRE SERVICES DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE OBJECT OF THE POSTER WAS TO CALL PEOPLE'S ATTENTION TO THE FACT THAT TWO IN EVERY FIVE FIRES IN HONG KONG WERE CAUSED BY THE CARELESS HANDLING OF LIGHTED CIGARETTE ENDS.

+DURING THE TWO FISCAL YEARS 1972/74,+ HE STATED, +MORE THAN 4,700 FIRES WERE BLAMED ON PEOPLE DISPOSING OF CIGARETTE ENDS WITHOUT FIRST MAKING SURE THEY WERE PROPERLY OUT. AS A RESULT, A TOTAL OF 84 PEOPLE WERE INJURED.+

HE SAID IT WAS BY FAR THE MOST PREVALENT CAUSE OF FIRE, NOT ONLY IN HONG KONG BUT ALL OVER THE WORLD. IN UNITED STATES, FOR EXAMPLE, IN 1973, THERE WERE MORE THAN 100,000 CIGARETTE-END FIRES WHICH HAD CAUSED MILLIONS OF DOLLARS WORTH OF DAMAGE.

ONE OF THE BIGGEST FIRES IN HONG KONG ATTRIBUTED TO A CIGARETTE END BROKE OUT AT A WAN CHAI HOTEL IN DECEMBER, 1972, WHICH CLAIMED EIGHT LIVES AND INJURED 21 PEOPLE.

A LARGE NUMBER OF HILL AND FOREST FIRES WHICH OCCUR DURING THE DRY MONTHS IS ALSO CAUSED BY PEOPLE CARELESSLY THROWING AWAY LIGHTED CIGARETTE ENDS AND MATCHES.

THE SPOKESMAN URGED SMOKERS TO USE ASH TRAYS IN THEIR HOMES WHEN DISPOSING OF CIGARETTE ENDS AND NOT TO THROW THEM OUT OF WINDOWS OR BALCONIES.

IN THE STREET, THE SPECIAL RECEPTACLES ATTACHED TO LITTER BINS SHOULD BE USED AND, WHEN IN THE COUNTRYSIDE, CIGARETTE ENDS SHOULD BE GROUND UNDERFOOT AND NOT LEFT TO SMOULDER.

+WE APPEAL TO SMOKERS TO BE CAREFUL AT ALL TIMES, BUT ESPECIALLY NOW WHEN THE HUMIDITY IS MUCH LOWER AND FIRES OCCUR MORE EASILY,+ HE SAID.

THE FIRE PREVENTION CAMPAIGN HAS BEEN TIMED FOR THIS MONTH WHEN THE NUMBER OF FIRES CAN BE FROM TWO TO FIVE TIMES AS GREAT AS DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS.
