## MORE JOB VACANCIES IN MANUFACTURING SECTOR

\* \* \* \*

THERE HAS BEEN A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF VACANCIES IN THE MANUFACTURING SECTOR AS A RESULT OF THE RECOVERY OF HONGKONG'S EXPORT SECTOR AND MORE EMPLOYEES ARE NOW WORKING LONGER HOURS.

THIS WAS STATED TODAY (TUESDAY) BY THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, SIR JOHN BREMRIDGE.

SPEAKING AT THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE FEDERATION OF HONG KONG INDUSTRIES, SIR JOHN POINTED OUT THAT IN THE THREE MONTHS ENDING MAY, THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WAS FIVE PER CENT AND THE UNDEREMPLOYMENT RATE WAS 2.2 PER CENT, BOTH BELOW THEIR PEAKS RECORDED EARLIER IN THE YEAR.

+MOREOVER, THERE ARE CLEAR INDICATIONS, WHICH MAY SOON BE CONFIRMED BY STATISTICS, THAT THESE FALLS HAVE CONTINUED,+ HE SAID.

LOOKING AHEAD, SIR JOHN SAID THERE WERE SIGNS THAT HONGKONG'S DOMESTIC EXPORT PERFORMANCE WOULD REMAIN STRONG IN THE COMING MONTHS.

+FIRST, MANY MANUFACTURERS ARE REPORTING A CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT IN THEIR ORDER BOOK POSITIONS. SECOND, THE GROWTH RATE IN REAL TERMS OF RETAINED IMPORTS OF RAW MATERIALS AND SEMI-MANUFACTURES PICKED UP RAPIDLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER OF THIS YEAR.

+I THUS EXPECT MANUFACTURING ACTIVITY TO INCREASE FURTHER AS THESE RETAINED IMPORTS ARE PROCESSED INTO FINISHED GOODS FOR EXPORT,+ HE SAID.

SIR JOHN DESCRIBED THE ECONOMY AT PRESENT AS BEING IN THE FOOTHILLS OF AN EXPORT-LED RECOVERY.

+IT IS TOO SOON FOR TOTAL OPTIMISM, FOR THERE REMAIN HEAVY CLOUDS - NOT LEAST OVER THE INTERNATIONAL MONETARY SCENE - BUT EVEN A CONSERVATIVE MAN WILL ACCEPT THAT THE SKY IS BRIGHTER,+ HE SAID.

HONG KONG'S DOMESTIC EXPORT GROWTH HAS GATHERED MOMENTUM SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THIS YEAR, IMPROVING BY 14 PER CENT IN MONEY TERMS, OR ABOUT NINE PER CENT IN REAL TERMS, IN THE FIRST SIX MONTHS AGAINST THE SAME PERIOD OF LAST YEAR.

+MORE SIGNIFICANTLY, ALTHOUGH THE YEAR ON YEAR GROWTH RATE IN REAL TERMS WAS ONLY THREE PER CENT IN THE FIRST QUARTER, IT WAS ABOUT 14 PER CENT IN THE SECOND.

+IN PARTICULAR, DOMESTIC EXPORTS TO THE UNITED STATES, BY FAR OUR LARGEST MARKET, GREW BY 25 PER CENT IN MONEY TERMS, OR ABOUT 16 PER CENT IN REAL TERMS, IN THE FIRST HALF OF THE YEAR,+ HE SAID.

/SIR JOHN .....

SIR JOHN NOTED THAT ONCE AGAIN, HONG KONG'S HIGHLY FLEXIBLE AND WELL-MOTIVATED INDUSTRIALISTS TOGETHER WITH THE EXCELLENT LABOUR FORCE HAD DEMONSTRATED THEIR ABILITY TO RESPOND QUICKLY TO A REVIVAL IN EXTERNAL MARKET DEMAND.

+AND, DARE I SAY, GOVERNMENT POLICIES HAVE BEEN VINDICATED. THEY HAVE OF COURSE REMAINED STEADY, CONSISTENT AND PREDICTABLE,+ HE SAID.

TAC GROUPS REPORT ON CMB PERFORMANCE  
\* \* \*

THE WORKING GROUPS WHICH WERE RECONVENED EARLIER THIS YEAR TO TAKE A FURTHER LOOK AT THE PERFORMANCE OF CHINA MOTOR BUS COMPANY HAVE REPORTED CONSIDERABLE IMPROVEMENTS IN SOME AREAS SINCE THE REVIEW IN 1982 BUT THAT SHORTCOMINGS REMAIN IN OTHER AREAS.

THE FOUR BUS OPERATION REVIEW SUB-GROUPS - ON THE ROUTE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (RDP), MAINTENANCE, DEPOT REQUIREMENTS, AND SPARE PARTS - WERE RECONVENED IN MARCH THIS YEAR ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE TRANSPORT ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO EXAMINE PROGRESS MADE BY CMB IN MEETING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE 1982 REVIEW.

IN A REPORT TO THE TAC TODAY, THE RDP SUB-GROUP FOUND THAT THE COMPANY WAS NOW ABLE TO MOBILISE SUFFICIENT BUSES TO MEET THE SCHEDULES OF SERVICE. BY THE END OF JUNE THIS YEAR, THE COMPANY WAS ABLE TO ALLOCATE A SCHEDULED NUMBER OF 759 BUSES EACH DAY, WHICH WAS ONLY NINE SHORT OF THE RDP REQUIREMENT, DUE LARGELY TO DEFERRED INTRODUCTION OF SERVICE IN AREAS WHERE POPULATION BUILD-UP HAD BEEN SLOWER THAN EXPECTED.

THE SUB-GROUP ALSO NOTED THAT THE COMPANY HAD TAKEN UP THE SUGGESTION THAT IT SHOULD ECONOMISE BY EMPLOYING MORE HIGH CAPACITY BUSES. AT THE END OF MAY THIS YEAR, 22 THREE-AXLE BUSES WERE IN SERVICE, EACH CAPABLE OF ACCOMMODATING 170 PASSENGERS. ELEVEN MORE OF THESE WERE BEING CONSTRUCTED AND 15 MORE WOULD BE ORDERED.

THE SUB-GROUP FURTHER REPORTED THAT A START HAD BEEN MADE BY THE COMPANY IN DEVELOPING A MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM, IN PARTICULAR A SYSTEM OF ROUTE COSTING FOR MONITORING AND PLANNING PURPOSES.

IT RECOMMENDED THAT THE COMPANY SHOULD CONTINUE THESE EFFORTS AND THAT IT SHOULD BE ENCOURAGED TO CONSIDER INSTALLING A COMPUTER SYSTEM TO HELP COMPILE AND OBTAIN MANAGEMENT AND OPERATIONAL DATA.

/THE MAINTENANCE .....

THE MAINTENANCE SUB-GROUP OBSERVED THAT WHILE CERTAIN CHANGES AND IMPROVEMENTS HAD BEEN MADE, CMB STILL FELL SHORT TO SOME EXTENT, ESPECIALLY IN THE PROVISION OF WORKSHOP EQUIPMENT AND THE INTRODUCTION OF CONTROL SYSTEMS AND PROCEDURES.

THE SUB-GROUP RECOGNISED THAT A MAJOR CONSTRAINT ON THE IMPROVEMENT OF MAINTENANCE FACILITIES WAS THE LACK OF ADEQUATE MAINTENANCE SPACE IN DEPOTS. THIS SHORTAGE WAS EXPECTED TO BE ALLEVIATED WITH THE REDEVELOPMENT OF THE COMPANY'S WONG CHUK HANG DEPOT, DUE FOR COMPLETION IN 1985/86, AND THE PROVISION OF A TEMPORARY DEPOT ON THE WESTERN RECLAMATION.

WITH THE FACILITIES OF THE TEMPORARY DEPOT ON THE WESTERN RECLAMATION, BUSES WOULD BE ABLE TO PARK OVERNIGHT IN BUS TERMINI IN CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICTS, AND WOULD NOT HAVE TO RETURN TO NORTH POINT OR CHAI WAN FOR COIN BOX CHANGING, REFUELLING, PARKING AND MINOR MAINTENANCE.

THE DEPOT REQUIREMENTS SUB-GROUP ALSO NOTED THAT THE NUMBER OF BUSES PARKED OVERNIGHT ON STREET AT CHAI WAN HAD BEEN REDUCED BY 25 PER CENT AND WOULD BE FURTHER REDUCED WITH THE SCRAPPING OF OLD BUSES NOW OCCUPYING SPACE IN A TEMPORARY DEPOT IN THE DISTRICT.

THE SPARE PARTS SUB-GROUP REPORTED TO TAC MEMBERS THAT CMB HAD IMPROVED ITS PURCHASING PROCEDURES BUT THAT THERE HAD NOT BEEN ANY CHANGES IN PROCEDURES FOR STOREHOUSE OPERATIONS AND FOR TRANSFERRING STOCKS BETWEEN DEPOTS, AND FOR THE RETURN OF SURPLUS AND UNSUITABLE MATERIAL FROM WORKSHOPS.

THE SUB-GROUP STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT WRITTEN POLICIES AND PROCEDURES SHOULD BE ESTABLISHED IN ALL AREAS OF THE COMPANY'S STORES FUNCTION.

THE FINDINGS OF THE SUB-GROUPS WILL BE SUBMITTED TO THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL.

IN THEIR MEETING TODAY, TAC MEMBERS ALSO CONSIDERED A REPORT ON THE CONTRACT HIRE CAR SCHEME FOR THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF THIS YEAR.

THEY NOTED THAT +PAK PAI+ OPERATIONS HAD REMAINED AT A LOW LEVEL GENERALLY, ALTHOUGH OPERATORS WERE STILL RELATIVELY ACTIVE IN THE FRONTIER AND YUEN LONG DISTRICTS OF THE NEW TERRITORIES. THE COMMITTEE WAS INFORMED THAT THE POLICE WOULD CONTINUE TO ENFORCE THE RELEVANT LAWS IN THESE AREAS.

## LEGCO TO RESUME DEBATE ON 11 BILLS

DEBATE WILL RESUME ON 11 BILLS TOMORROW, AT THE FINAL SITTING OF THE 1982-83 SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

THE BILLS ARE THEN EXPECTED TO GO THROUGH THEIR COMMITTEE STAGE AND FINAL READINGS.

THEY ARE: SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION (1982-83) BILL 1983, CRIMINAL PROCEDURE (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, CRIMINAL PROCEDURE (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL 1983, CRIMINAL PROCEDURE (PRELIMINARY PROCEEDINGS ON AN INDICTABLE OFFENCE) BILL 1983, SUPREME COURT (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, HONG KONG BAPTIST COLLEGE BILL 1983, HEUNG YEE KUK (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, SMOKING (PUBLIC HEALTH) (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, MASSAGE ESTABLISHMENTS BILL 1983, POLICE FORCE (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, POLICE SUPERVISION (REPEAL) BILL 1983.

THREE OTHER BILLS ARE SCHEDULED FOR FIRST AND SECOND READINGS, PRIOR TO ADJOURNMENT OF DEBATE TO OCTOBER 12. THEY ARE: THE DEPOSIT-TAKING COMPANIES (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, BANKING (AMENDMENT) BILL 1983, AND PAWNBROKERS BILL 1983.

IN ADDITION, A MOTION IS TO BE RAISED TO AMEND PART V OF THE SCHEDULE TO THE TELEPHONE ORDINANCE WITH THE ADDITION OF AN ITEM 18, LAYING DOWN A CHARGE FOR VISITS BY TELEPHONE COMPANY TECHNICIANS IN CASES WHERE THE LINE FAULT REPORTED IS FOUND TO TERMINATE ON EQUIPMENT NOT SUPPLIED BY THE COMPANY.

SUCH INSTANCES ARE EXPECTED TO ARISE VERY SELDOM, AND WILL INVOLVE PABX AND OTHER SYSTEMS NOT USUALLY USED BY DOMESTIC SUBSCRIBERS.

OTHER BUSINESS WILL INCLUDE 13 QUESTIONS TO BE ASKED BY UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS, DEALING WITH A WIDE VARIETY OF MATTERS.
