GOVERNOR'S LUNAR NEW YEAR MESSAGE 1988

* * * * *

THE FOLLOWING IS THE TEXT OF THE LUNAR NEW YEAR MESSAGE DELIVERED THIS EVENING BY THE GOVERNOR, SIR DAVID WILSON:

"THE NEW YEAR IS THE TRADITIONAL TIME FOR FAMILIES TO BE TOGETHER, TO CELEBRATE THE ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE PAST YEAR, AND TO LOOK AHEAD TO THE FUTURE.

"WE IN HONG KONG ARE MEMBERS OF A VERY LARGE FAMILY - THE COMMUNITY OF HONG KONG. THE NEW YEAR IS A GOOD TIME TO THINK ABOUT WHERE WE HAVE GOT TO AS A COMMUNITY AND WHAT LIES IN STORE IN THE YEARS AHEAD.

"THE PAST YEAR HAS BEEN ONE WHERE WE HAVE HAD OUR FAIR SHARE OF BOTH SUCCESSES AND PROBLEMS.

"WE MUST NEVER IGNORE PROBLEMS: NOR TRY TO MINIMISE THEM. WHAT IS IMPORTANT IS HOW WE FACE UP TO THEM. HONG KONG HAS A REMARKABLE RECORD OF OVERCOMING DIFFICULTIES AND EMERGING STRONGER FROM THEM. THAT IS JUST AS TRUE NOW AS IT HAS EVER BEEN.

"EQUALLY WE SHOULD NEVER BELITTLE OUR SUCCESSES. AS A COMMUNITY, WE HAVE MUCH TO BE PROUD OF.

"OUR ECONOMY IS ALWAYS HEAVILY INFLUENCED BY EXTERNAL FORCES BEYOND OUR CONTROL. BUT DESPITE THE COLLAPSE OF STOCK MARKETS ALL ROUND THE WORLD AND THE CONTINUING THREAT OF PROTECTIONISM, WE HAVE RECORDED A GROWTH RATE OF OVER 10 PER CENT FOR THE SECOND YEAR RUNNING. THIS IS A REMARKABLE ACHIEVEMENT.

"IN THE YEAR AHEAD, OUR ECONOMY MAY BE AFFECTED BY PROBLEMS ELSEWHERE IN THE WORLD. BUT I AM CONFIDENT THAT OUR PERFORMANCE WILL AGAIN BE WELL UP IN THE WORLD LEAGUE.

"DURING THE PAST YEAR THERE HAS BEEN A GREAT DEAL OF POLITICAL DEBATE. A WIDE VARIETY OF VIEWS HAVE BEEN EXPRESSED ON WHAT THE NEXT STEPS SHOULD BE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF OUR SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT.

"AT THE END OF EVERY DEBATE, DECISIONS HAVE TO BE TAKEN. THE WHITE PAPER PUBLISHED LAST WEEK MAPS OUT THE COURSE OF OUR POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT OVER THE NEXT FEW YEARS. THE CHANGES PLANNED ARE FAR REACHING AND IMPORTANT, INCLUDING FOR THE FIRST TIME AN ELEMENT OF DIRECT ELECTIONS TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

"I BELIEVE THE PERIOD OF CONSULTATION HAS SHOWN THAT OUR COMMUNITY, AS A WHOLE, WANTS CHANGES TO BE INTRODUCED BY A PROCESS OF STEADY EVOLUTION. PEOPLE ATTACH IMPORTANCE TO MAINTAINING THE COHESION OF OUR SOCIETY.

"THE CHANGES REFERRED TO IN THE WHITE PAPER ARE ONLY A FIRST STEP -- THERE WILL BE MORE TO COME IN THE YEARS AHEAD. DURING 1988 THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG WILL BE LOOKING WITH PARTICULAR INTEREST AND CONCERN AT THE DRAFT BASIC LAW.

"ULTIMATELY, HOWEVER, THE SUCCESS OF HONG KONG, NOW AND IN THE FUTURE, WILL DEPEND ON THE PEOPLE OF HONG KONG. IF WE CONTINUE TO HAVE CONFIDENCE IN OURSELVES, AND IN WHAT WE AS A COMMUNITY CAN ACHIEVE, I AM SURE WE WILL CONTINUE TO PROSPER AND SUCCEED.

"WE ARE NOW ENTERING THE YEAR OF THE DRAGON. THE DRAGON SYMBOLISES DYNAMISM, INTELLIGENCE AND EXCELLENCE. THESE ARE QUALITIES FOR WHICH HONG KONG IS RENOWNED. THEY WILL CARRY US FORWARD TO INCREASING SUCCESS IN THE YEARS TO COME.

"WE WOULD BOTH LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO WISH YOU ALL AND YOUR FAMILIES GOOD HEALTH, HAPPINESS AND GOOD FORTUNE FOR THE NEW YEAR."

FIRM ACTION TAKEN AGAINST ILLEGAL FISH MARKETING

THE DIRECTOR OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES, DR LAWRENCE LEE, TODAY (TUESDAY) REITERATED THE GOVERNMENT'S DETERMINATION TO DETER ILLEGAL FISH MARKETING ACTIVITIES WHICH CONTINUE TO BE AN ISSUE OF CONSIDERABLE CONCERN.

"THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT AND THE FISH MARKETING ORGANISATION (FMO) HAVE NOT ONLY CONTINUED TO ENFORCE THE MARINE FISH (MARKETING) ORDINANCE IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE POLICE, BUT HAVE ALSO MADE PROPOSALS TO AMEND THE ORDINANCE TO COPE WITH THE PRESENT SITUATION," DR LEE SAID.

"THE PROPOSED AMENDMENTS WERE PASSED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL LAST MONTH."

THE AMENDMENTS TO THE ORDINANCE HAVE THE EFFECT OF INCREASING THE MAXIMUM FINES BY TENFOLD, FROM THE PREVIOUS LEVEL OF \$1,000 TO \$10,000, FOR SUCH ILLEGAL MARKETING ACTIVITIES, AND PRESCRIBING MORE STRINGENT CONTROL OVER THE LANDING AND TRANSPORT OF MARINE FISH.

SPEAKING AT THE FMO ANNUAL PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY HELD AT THE ABERDEEN WHOLESALE FISH MARKET, DR LEE SAID THE FMO HAD ALSO REVIEWED THE OPERATION OF INDIVIDUAL MARKETS TO STRENGTHEN MANAGEMENT AND INCREASE EFFICIENCY.

APART FROM SUITABLY ADJUSTING THE BUSINESS HOURS OF INDIVIDUAL MARKETS TO MEET OPERATIONAL NEEDS, THE FMO CONTINUED TO DEVOTE ITS EFFORT TO THE DEVELOPMENT AND REPROVISIONING OF THE MARKETS.

HE SAID THAT CONSTRUCTION WORK ON THE NEW MARKET IN KWUN TONG WAS PROGRESSING SMOOTHLY AND IT WAS EXPECTED TO BE COMPLETED NEXT MONTH.

HE ADVISED FISHERMEN TO ABIDE BY THE MARINE FISH (MARKETING) ORDINANCE AND SELL ALL THEIR CATCHES THROUGH THE FMO FISH MARKETS.

REVIEWING THE PERFORMANCE OF THE FISHING INDUSTRY IN THE PAST YEAR, DR LEE SAID: "THE WEATHER WAS GENERALLY FAVOURABLE FOR FISHING. THE SUPPLY OF FUEL OIL WAS STEADY WHILE THE PRICES FOR FISH WERE QUITE SATISFACTORY.

"THESE FACTORS HAVE HELPED TO SUSTAIN FISHERMEN'S CONFIDENCE IN THE INDUSTRY, RESULTING IN THEIR CONTINUAL INVESTMENT IN BUILDING NEW FISHING VESSELS FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE OFFSHORE FISHERIES INDUSTRY."

THE LANDINGS OF FISHERMEN IN 1987 IN THE FMO FISH MARKETS REMAINED AT THE 1986 LEVEL, TOTALLING 68,000 TONNES VALUED AT \$493 MILLION, HE SAID.

DR LEE ALSO SPOKE OF OTHER SERVICES PROVIDED BY HIS DEPARTMENT TO HELP DEVELOP THE FISHING FLEET AND HELP FISHERMEN INCREASE PRODUCTIVITY.

"OVER THE PAST 12 MONTHS, 102 LOANS TOTALLING \$17.5 MILLION WERE ISSUED FROM THE FISH MARKETING ORGANISATION LOAN FUND AND THE OTHER LOAN FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT," HE SAID.

DR LEE SAID HIS DEPARTMENT ALSO PROVIDED FISHERMEN WITH VOCATIONAL TRAINING COURSES ON NAVIGATION, ENGINEERING AND RADIO-TELEPHONY TO ASSIST THEM TO ACQUIRE THE NECESSARY UP-TO-DATE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS.

"TO CATER FOR THE NEEDS OF THE FISHERMEN, TRAINING COURSES ON FIRST AID AND DIVING SAFETY WERE ORGANISED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE ST JOHN AMBULANCE BRIGADE, THE HONG KONG UNDERWATER FEDERATION, AND LABOUR DEPARTMENT," HE SAID.

TO DATE, MORE THAN 5,900 FISHERMEN HAD ATTENDED VARIOUS TRAINING COURSES.

LAST YEAR, THE FMO AWARDED \$81,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANTS AND LOANS FROM THE MARINE FISH SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO FOUR STUDENTS AND FISHERMEN CHILDREN AND SPONSORED NINE FISHERMEN TO STUDY THE FISHING INDUSTRY IN AUSTRALIA.

AT THE CEREMONY, DR LEE PRESENTED PRIZES TO 26 FISHERMEN WHO LANDED THE TOP CATCHES IN THE FMO WHOLESALE MARKETS LAST YEAR.

SEVEN OF THEM WERE ALSO AWARDED THE TITLES OF CHAMPION FISHERMEN OF THE YEAR. THEY ARE MR LO LEUNG-WING, MR LAI KAU, MR CHOW CHE-KONG, MR WONG FOOK, MR LAU KAM-FAI, MR WONG KWONG-WAH AND MR NG CHUEN-HEE.

CERTIFICATES WERE ALSO PRESENTED TO SIX OTHER FISHERMEN FOR THEIR BRAVE DEEDS IN SAVING 18 PEOPLE AT SEA, AND TO 10 GRADUATES OF A FISHERMEN NAVIGATION TRAINING COURSE ORGANISED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

HOUSING (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988

* * * * *

AN AMENDMENT BILL CONTAINING PROPOSALS THAT WILL ENABLE THE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO IMPLEMENT THE GOVERNMENT'S LONG TERM HOUSING STRATEGY HAS BEEN GAZETTED TODAY FOR PUBLIC INFORMATION.

THE HOUSING (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988 INTRODUCES AMENDMENTS IN RESPECT OF THE AUTHORITY'S MEMBERSHIP, ITS GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES, AND ITS FINANCIAL AFFAIRS.

THE PROPOSED CHANGES ARE DESIGNED TO GIVE THE HOUSING AUTHORITY THE OPERATIONAL FLEXIBILITY IT NEEDS TO IMPLEMENT THE LONG TERM HOUSING STRATEGY.

THE BILL WOULD PROVIDE FOR THE ASSETS AND LIABILITIES ACCOUNTED FOR IN THE HOME OWNERSHIP FUND TO BE HANDED OVER TO THE AUTHORITY ON APRIL 1, 1988.

THE AUTHORITY WOULD ALSO BE GIVEN WIDER FINANCIAL POWERS NECESSARY TO ENABLE IT TO LEND MONEY UNDER THE NEW HOME PURCHASE LOAN SCHEME.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS WOULD REDUCE THE NUMBER OF PUBLIC OFFICERS ON THE HOUSING AUTHORITY FROM SEVEN TO FOUR AND THE APPOINTMENT OF A MEMBER WHO IS NOT A PUBLIC OFFICER TO BE CHAIRMAN OF THE AUTHORITY ON APRIL 1, 1988.

ALTHOUGH SOME PUBLIC SERVICE STAFF WILL BE RE-ASSIGNED, THERE WILL BE NO SIGNIFICANT VARIATION IN THE NUMBER OF STAFF EMPLOYED.

THE BILL HAS NO OTHER PUBLIC EXPENDITURE IMPLICATIONS ASIDE FROM THE TRANSFER OF THE HOME OWNERSHIP FUND. FURTHERMORE, THE BILL WILL NOT AFFECT GOVERNMENT'S POLICY CONTROL OVER THE PUBLIC HOUSING PROGRAMME.

INTEREST ON TAX RESERVE CERTIFICATES INCREASED

* * * *

THE ANNUAL INTEREST RATE ON TAX RESERVE CERTIFICATES WILL BE INCREASED TO 2.76 PER CENT (TAX FREE) FROM FEBRUARY 20 THIS YEAR AS AGAINST THE CURRENT RATE OF 2.04 PER CENT (TAX FREE), THE COMMISSIONER OF INLAND REVENUE ANNOUNCED TODAY (TUESDAY).

THE INCREASE WAS PUBLISHED IN A NOTICE IN THE GAZETTE YESTERDAY.

INTEREST ON TAX RESERVE CERTIFICATES IS CALCULATED IN MONTHLY STEPS AND THE NEW RATE WILL BE \$0.23 PER MONTH PER \$100. INTEREST WILL BE CREDITED AS BEFORE IN RESPECT OF COMPLETE MONTHS BETWEEN PURCHASE AND SURRENDER IN PAYMENT OF TAX.

INTEREST IS ONLY CREDITED WHEN CERTIFICATES ARE USED TO PAY TAX AND NO INTEREST IS DUE WHERE THE PRINCIPAL VALUE OF A CERTIFICATE IS REPAID BY A CHEQUE.

THE NEW RATE WILL APPLY TO ALL CERTIFICATES ISSUED ON OR AFTER FEBRUARY 20.

REMINDER ON FOOD HYGIENE

* * * * *

WITH THE LUNAR NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS BEGINNING TOMORROW, THE PUBLIC ARE REMINDED TO OBSERVE THE PRACTICE OF GOOD PERSONAL AND FOOD HYGIENE, ESPECIALLY IF TRAVELLING TO COUNTRIES WHERE HEPATITIS A IS ENDEMIC.

THE APPEAL WAS MADE BY THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT, DR S.H. LEE, TODAY (TUESDAY).

THE PUBLIC ARE URGED TO TAKE EXTRA PRECAUTIONS IN THE CONSUMPTION OF CERTAIN TYPES OF FOOD, PARTICULARLY SHELLFISH, FROM UNCLEAN WATERS, WHICH MAY BE A MEANS FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF HEPATITIS A.

"SUCH FOOD SHOULD BE THOROUGHLY CLEANSED, WASHED AND PROPERLY COOKED BEFORE CONSUMPTION," DR LEE SAID.

THE PUBLIC ARE ALSO ADVISED TO OBSERVE THE FOLLOWING HYGIENE RULES:

- * WASH HANDS BEFORE MEALS AND AFTER VISITING THE TOILETS;
- * ENSURE ALL FOOD IS PROPERLY WASHED AND COOKED BEFORE CONSUMPTION;
- * AVOID BUYING FOOD FROM UNLICENSED FOOD PLACES OR HAWKERS OR DOUBTFUL SOURCES;
- * ENSURE THAT DRINKING WATER IS BOILED.

PROPOSED BRIDGE WILL IMPROVE ACCESS TO VILLAGES

* * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT PROPOSES TO CONSTRUCT A TWO-WAY VEHICULAR BRIDGE ACROSS TAI PO ROAD IN KIU TAU TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO THE VILLAGES OF KIU TAU, KAU LUNG HANG, YUEN LENG AND TAI WO.

AT PRESENT, THERE IS ONLY ONE ACCESS TO THESE VILLAGES LOCATED IN THE VALLEY BETWEEN WO HOP SHEK AND HONG LOK YUEN, NORTH OF TAI PO.

THE WORKS INVOLVE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BRIDGE, ABOUT SEVEN METRE WIDE, AND ASSOCIATED ROADWORKS TO CATER FOR TWO-WAY TRAFFIC.

/ALL EXISTING

ALL EXISTING ACCESS POINTS TO AND FROM TAI PO ROAD AND TRAFFIC ALONG THE EXISTING ONE-WAY ACCESS ROAD AND TAI WO SERVICE ROAD WEST WILL BE MAINTAINED DURING THE CONSTRUCTION PERIOD.

THE CONSTRUCTION WORK WILL START IN AUGUST THIS YEAR AND BE COMPLETED BY LATE 1989.

A NOTICE CONCERNING THE PROPOSED WORKS WAS PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (TUESDAY).

A PLAN SHOWING THE PROPOSED WORKS CAN BE SEEN AT THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT OFFICE, CENTRAL ENQUIRY SUB-OFFICE, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES, WEST WING, MAIN ENTRANCE LOBBY, HONG KONG.

THE PLAN CAN ALSO BE SEEN AT THE DISTRICT LANDS OFFICE, TAI PO, FIRST FLOOR, TAI PO GOVERNMENT OFFICES BUILDING, TING KOK ROAD, TAI PO, NEW TERRITORIES; AND AT THE TAI PO DISTRICT OFFICE, SECOND FLOOR, TAI PO GOVERNMENT OFFICES BUILDING, TING KOK ROAD, TAI PO, NEW TERRITORIES.

ANY PERSON OBJECTING TO THE PROPOSAL MUST SEND HIS OBJECTION IN WRITING TO THE SECRETARY FOR TRANSPORT, CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES, EAST WING, SECOND FLOOR, LOWER ALBERT ROAD, HONG KONG BEFORE APRIL 16.

HEIGHT RELAXATION FOR NEW CONTAINER TERMINAL CRANES

* * * * *

TO ENABLE THE OWNER OF KWAI CHUNG CONTAINER TERMINAL 6 TO INSTAL NEW CRANES IN APRIL, THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL HAS GIVEN APPROVAL FOR THE HEIGHT LIMIT FOR THE TERMINAL TO BE RELAXED. THE NEW LIMIT IS 97.53 METRES.

THE NEW TERMINAL IS DUE TO OPEN IN THE MIDDLE OF THIS YEAR.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE LANDS AND WORKS BRANCH, SAID, "THE RELAXATION IS NECESSARY AS THE LATEST GENERATION OF CONTAINER SHIPS BEING WIDER, REQUIRE LONGER CRANES FOR LOADING AND UNLOADING."

THE EXISTING BASIC HEIGHT LIMIT FOR KWAI CHUNG CONTAINER TERMINAL IS 60.96 METRES.

THE NEW HEIGHT LIMIT WAS PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (TUESDAY) UNDER THE HONG KONG AIRPORT (CONTROL OF OBSTRUCTIONS) (CONSOLIDATION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 1988.
