MORE VISITS BY TWO WAY PERMIT HOLDERS
* * *

AS PART OF THE CONTINUING CONTACTS BETWEEN THE HONG KONG AND GUANGDONG AUTHORITIES ON IMMIGRATION MATTERS, A MEETING WAS HELD IN HONG KONG TODAY TO REVIEW PROGRESS OF THE SCHEME INTRODUCED ON DECEMBER 23, 1982, WHEREBY VISITORS ARE REQUIRED TO RETURN HOME BY THE EXPIRY DATE OF THEIR TWO-WAY PERMITS.

THE MEETING WAS ATTENDED BY A GROUP OF HONG KONG OFFICIALS HEADED BY THE POLITICAL ADVISER, MR ROBIN MCLAREN, AND A DELEGATION OF GUANGDONG OFFICIALS LED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE PROVINCIAL FOREIGN AFFAIRS OFFICE, MR ZHANG QING PING.

THE DISCUSSIONS TOOK PLACE IN A FRIENDLY ATMOSPHERE AND BOTH SIDES AGREED THAT THE SCHEME WAS WORKING WELL.

IN THESE CIRCUMSTANCES IT WAS AGREED IN PRINCIPLE THAT THE NUMBER OF VISITORS WOULD BE INCREASED IN A GRADUAL AND CONTROLLED MANNER.

GOVERNOR MEETS TUNG WAH PAST CHAIRMEN

THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, TODAY ATTENDED A LUNCHEON GATHERING HOSTED BY THE ASSOCIATION OF PAST CHAIRMEN OF THE TUNG WAH GROUP OF HOSPITALS.

HE WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE SECRETARY FOR HOME AFFAIRS, MR DENIS BRAY, WHO IS ALSO CHAIRMAN OF THE TUNG WAH ADVISORY BOARD.

DURING THE LUNCH, SIR EDWARD PAID TRIBUTE TO THE FORMER TUNG WAH CHAIRMEN FOR THEIR SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY.

THERE WAS ALSO A GENERAL DISCUSSION ON HONG KONG AFFAIRS.

THE ASSOCIATION WAS FORMED IN 1976 TO MAINTAIN SOCIAL TIES AMONG PAST TUNG WAH CHAIRMEN, TO OFFER ADVICE AND BACKING SOCIALLY AND FINANCIALLY TO THE TUNG WAH BOARD OF DIRECTORS WHEN AND WHERE NECESSARY, TO PROVIDE SUPPORT FOR COMMUNITY PROJECTS OF WORTHY CAUSE, AND TO CONCERN MEMBERS OVER IMPORTANT COMMUNITY ISSUES.

IT HAS 28 MEMBERS WHO COME FROM A VARIETY OF PROFESSIONS.

SIR PHILIP SEES MARINE POLICE OPERATIONS
* * * *

THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR PHILIP HADDON-CAVE, THIS (THURSDAY) AFTERNOON VISITED THE MARINE POLICE TO SEE FOR HIMSELF THEIR DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONS.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, MR. ROY HENRY, THE CHIEF SECRETARY FIRST CALLED AT MARINE POLICE HEADQUARTERS IN TSIM SHA TSUI.

HE WAS MET BY THE REGIONAL COMMANDER OF MARINE, MR. JOHN MACDONALD, WHO BRIEFED HIM ON THE REORGANISATION OF THE REGION AND THE 10-YEAR EXPANSION PROGRAMME FOR THE MARINE POLICE.

SIR PHILIP ALSO LISTENED WITH INTEREST TO DETAILS OF THE MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR JOINT MARITIME COMMUNICATION PROJECT, A PACKAGE WHICH WILL PROVIDE THE MARINE POLICE, THE ROYAL NAVY AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS CONCERNED WITH MARITIME SECURITY, WITH ONE OF THE MOST SOPHISTICATED RADIO AND RADAR NETWORKS IN THE WORLD.

THE CHIEF SECRETARY WAS THEN TAKEN ON A RIDE FROM KOWLOON PUBLIC PIER TO TAI LAM CHUNG ON BOARD A LOGISTICS LAUNCH. HE WAS TOLD THAT THE 26-METRE LAUNCH WAS ONE OF THE THREE NEW 'DAMEN' LOGISTICS LAUNCHES WHICH HAVE BEEN IN SERVICE SINCE FEBRUARY LAST YEAR.

THE NEW BOATS, CAPABLE OF SPEEDS OF UP TO 24 KNOTS, WERE BUILT AT A COST OF \$8.5 MILLION EACH. THEY PROVIDE AN EFFICIENT BACK UP SERVICE FOR THE FLEET OF PATROL LAUNCHES AND CAN ALSO FILL IN PATROL DUTIES OR ACT AS FORWARD OPERATIONAL BASES.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE SENIOR STAFF OFFICER, OPERATIONS, MR. GEOFF COX, SIR PHILIP WAS MET IN TAI LAM CHUNG BY THE OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE SMALL BOAT UNIT, MR. ANDY BURT. A DEMONSTRATION OF SBU TACTICS WAS LAID ON FOR THE CHIEF SECRETARY.

SIR PHILIP WAS TOLD THAT THE UNIT WAS SET UP IN NOVEMBER 1979 MAINLY TO COUNTER THE INFLUX OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS ACROSS THE SEA BOUNDARY. HE WAS ALSO BRIEFED ON THE FLEET OF SMALL INFLATABLE CRAFT AND THE TACTICS USED BY THE UNIT.

THE CHIEF SECRETARY WHO WAS ALSO ACCOMPANIED BY HIS ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT, MR. ALISTAIR ASPREY, CONCLUDED HIS VISIT SHORTLY AFTER 4.30 P.M. AND FLEW BACK TO HONG KONG ISLAND BY HELICOPTER.

CUSTOMS OFFICERS CRACK DOWN ON COPYING

* * * *

GOODS VALUED AT \$10.7 MILLION HAVE BEEN SEIZED SO FAR THIS YEAR IN A CONTINUING CRACKDOWN ON COUNTERFEIT MERCHANDISE IN HONG KONG.

NEARLY 600 CASES HAVE BEEN INVESTIGATED AND 281 PEOPLE PROSECUTED, RESULTING IN FINES OF \$1.6 MILLION AND THREE PRISON SENTENCES.

THE FIGURES WERE GIVEN TODAY BY MR JOHN HOWARD, PRINCIPAL INDUSTRY OFFICER OF THE TRADE CONTROLS INVESTIGATION BRANCH (TCIB), CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DEPARTMENT.

MR HOWARD, ADDRESSING A LUNCH MEETING OF THE RETAIL MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION, ASKED MEMBERS TO BE ALERT AND TO REPORT CASES OF SUSPECTED COUNTERFEITING TO THE AUTHORITIES.

+IT IS IMPORTANT THAT HONG KONG'S TRADING REPUTATION SHOULD NOT BE TARNISHED BY A FEW UNPRINCIPLED TRADERS, AND IT IS AT YOUR LEVEL WHERE BUSINESS INTEGRITY STANDS OR FALLS,+ HE SAID.

MR HOWARD SAID THAT COUNTERFEIT GOODS WERE COVERED BY THE TRADE DESCRIPTIONS ORDINANCE, WHICH CAME INTO EFFECT ON APRIL 1, 1981. CONVICTIONS BY INDICTMENT CARRIED A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$500 000 AND IMPRISONMENT FOR FIVE YEARS, WHILE SUMMARY CONVICTION CARRIED A MAXIMUM FINE OF \$100 000 AND TWO YEARS' IMPRISONMENT. MOST CASES IN HONG KONG WERE DEALT WITH SUMMARILY.

MR HOWARD SAID THAT THE TCIB WAS THE MAIN ENFORCEMENT BODY FOR THE ORDINANCE. THE TCIB MAINTAINED CLOSE LIAISON WITH THE CONSUMER COUNCIL, THE HONG KONG TOURIST ASSOCIATION, THE WATCH INDUSTRY AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS TO HELP STAMP OUT COUNTERFEITING.

+BUT WHAT IS ALSO REQUIRED IS GREATER PUBLIC AWARENESS AND COOPERATION,+ HE SAID. +COMPLAINTS RECEIVED ARE KEPT IN STRICT CONFIDENCE, AND NO COMPLAINANT IS REQUIRED TO GIVE TESTIMONY IN OPEN COURT UNLESS HE IS WILLING TO DO SO.

+PROFESSIONAL OFFICERS ARE TRAINED TO DO THIS WHERE FAKE GOODS ARE FOUND, AND THE OWNER OF A REGISTERED TRADE MARK IS ONLY TOO PLEASED TO GIVE EXPERT TESTIMONY WHERE EVIDENCE IS ADDUCED TO PROVE FORGERY OF HIS TRADE MARK,+ HE SAID.

MR HOWARD SAID THAT IN 1981, THE TCIB HAD INVESTIGATED NEARLY 700 CASES AND SEIZED COUNTERFEIT GOODS VALUED AT SOME \$20 MILLION. THE INVESTIGATIONS LED TO 240 PROSECUTIONS, FINES OF \$1.3 MILLION, AND SIX PRISON SENTENCES.

+IN 1982 WE INVESTIGATED SOME 650 CASES AND SEIZED \$16 MILLION WORTH OF GOODS. THE NUMBER OF PROSECUTIONS ROSE TO 330, WHILE FINES AMOUNTED TO \$2.6 MILLION AND 15 PEOPLE WERE SENTENCED TO JAIL,+ HE SAID.

MR HOWARD SAID THAT THE APPLICATION OF COMMONSENSE COULD HELP RETAILERS TO PROTECT THEIR CUSTOMERS AND THEMSELVES.

+IT IS ALWAYS ADVISABLE TO BUY SPECIFICALLY MARKED GOODS FROM THE KNOWN AUTHORISED AGENT OR, IF THE GOODS BEAR A DESCRIPTION IMPLYING CERTAIN QUALITIES OR PROPERTIES OR CLAIMS AS TO PERFORMANCE, YOU MUST BE SURE THAT THESE ARE CORRECT,+ HE SAID.

LABOUR ADVISORY BOARD MEETS

* * * *

MEMBERS OF THE LABOUR ADVISORY BOARD SUGGESTED TODAY THAT THE WAGE CEILING FOR NON-MANUAL EMPLOYEES SPECIFIED BY THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE BE RAISED FROM \$7 500 TO \$8 500 PER MONTH IN THE NEXT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL SESSION IN OCTOBER.

THE WAGE CEILING WAS ONE OF THE FOUR MAIN TOPICS DISCUSSED BY THE BOARD AT A MEETING THIS AFTERNOON.

THE MEMBERS ALSO REVIEWED THE MATERNITY PROTECTION PROVISIONS IN THE ORDINANCE, AND FELT THAT APART FROM MINOR AMENDMENTS NOW IN HAND, THE PROVISIONS WOULD NOT REQUIRE MAJOR REVISION FOR THE TIME BEING.

AS THE CHING MING FESTIVAL AND GOOD FRIDAY FALL ON THE SAME DAY IN 1985, THE BOARD WAS ASKED TO ADVISE WHICH DAY SHOULD BE NAMED A GENERAL HOLIDAY UNDER THE HOLIDAYS ORDINANCE IN PLACE OF THE CHING MING HOLIDAY. THE BOARD FELT THAT A MONDAY WHICH IS NOT CLOSE TO ANY OTHER HOLIDAY SHOULD BE CHOSEN.

THE BOARD ALSO EXPRESSED FURTHER VIEWS ON THE SEVERANCE PAY PROVISIONS IN THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE. ITS VIEWS AND RECOMMENDATIONS WILL BE SUBMITTED TO THE GOVERNMENT FOR CONSIDERATION.

THE MEETING WAS CHAIRED BY THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR RON BRIDGE, AND WAS ATTENDED BY ALL EMPLOYEE AND EMPLOYER REPRESENTATIVES.

THE BOARD COMPRISES THE COMMISSIONER OR THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER AS THE CHAIRMAN EX-OFFICIO AND SIX EMPLOYER REPRESENTATIVES AND SIX EMPLOYEE REPRESENTATIVES AS MEMBERS. IT ADVISES THE COMMISSIONER ON SUCH MATTERS AS HE MAY REFER TO IT INCLUDING LEGISLATION.
