STATEMENT ON DAYA BAY 'IN ABOUT 2 OR 3 WEEKS'  
\*\*\*\*\*

THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY WILL PUBLISH A STATEMENT ON DAYA BAY IN ABOUT TWO OR THREE WEEKS' TIME, THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (THURSDAY).

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AFTER OPENING THE SHUI ON RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CENTRE IN CASTLE PEAK, SIR DAVID SAID IT WOULD BE A THOROUGH AND COMPLETE STATEMENT.

+IT WILL TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION ALL THE POINTS THAT HAD BEEN MADE IN THE DEBATE YESTERDAY, AND REVIEW THE WHOLE CIRCUMSTANCES OF DAYA BAY AS IT AFFECTS HONG KONG,+ HE SAID.

ASKED TO COMMENT ON A SUGGESTION THAT SOME COUNCILLORS WOULD USE THE POWERS AND PRIVILEGES ORDINANCE TO GET MORE INFORMATION, SIR DAVID SAID: +I DO THINK WE SHOULD WAIT UNTIL THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S STATEMENT IS AVAILABLE AND, AS HE SAID, IT WILL BE AS FULL A DISCLOSURE AS POSSIBLE OF ALL THE FACTS LEADING UP TO DAYA BAY.+

ASKED TO COMMENT ON YESTERDAY'S LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DEBATE, SIR DAVID SAID IT WAS A VERY LONG BUT ALSO A GOOD DEBATE.

+I THINK MEMBERS SPOKE THEIR MINDS FRANKLY AND OF COURSE THE DEBATE ON DAYA BAY ENDED WITH A MOTION WHICH WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED BY THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL. SO I THINK ON THE WHOLE IT WAS A VERY GOOD DEBATE, AND VERY USEFUL,+ SIR DAVID SAID.

KOWLOON CITY DB ELECTION A SUCCESS

A TOTAL OF 2 048 PEOPLE HAVE CAST THEIR VOTES IN THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT BOARD HO MAN TIN (SOUTH) CONSTITUENCY BY-ELECTION WHEN POLLING CLOSED AT 10.30 PM TONIGHT.

THIS REPRESENTS 13 PER CENT OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS OF THE CONSTITUENCY.

DESCRIBING THE TURNOUT AS VERY SATISFACTORY, THE REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR T.H. CHAU SAID THE TURNOUT TODAY WAS HIGHER THAN ANY OF THE BY-ELECTION IN THE PAST.

MR CHAU ADDED THAT THE ENCOURAGING TURNOUT WAS A DEMONSTRATION OF RESIDENTS' SUPPORT OF THE DISTRICT BOARD AND DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME.

MR CHAU MADE THE REMARK DURING A VISIT TO THE VOTE-COUNTING STATION AT THE MARTHA BOSS COMMUNITY CENTRE SHORTLY AFTER POLLING ENDED.

VOTE-COUNT IS GOING ON AT PRESENT AND ELECTION RESULTS ARE EXPECTED AFTER MIDNIGHT.

EARLIER IN THE EVENING, THE DEPUTY REGIONAL SECRETARY FOR HONG KONG AND KOWLOON, MR KEVIN MAK, URGED VOTERS IN THE HO MAN TIN SOUTH CONSTITUENCY TO MAKE USE OF THE REST OF THE EVENING TO CAST THEIR VOTES TO ELECT A DISTRICT BOARD MEMBER FOR THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT BOARD.

MR MAK MADE THE REMARKS DURING A TOUR OF THE TWO POLLING STATIONS.

+IT'S NOW UP TO THE VOTERS TO EXERCISE THEIR CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY,+ HE SAID.

THE DEPUTY CHIEF SECRETARY, MR ALAN SCOTT, ALSO VISITED THE TWO POLLING STATIONS AND WAS BRIEFED BY THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT OFFICER, MR ALEX FONG, ON THE POLLING SITUATION.

UP TO 6.30 PM, A TOTAL OF 866 PEOPLE OR 5.5 PER CENT OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS IN THE CONSTITUENCY HAVE CAST THEIR VOTES.

THE ELECTION TODAY WILL FILL A VACANCY IN THE BOARD FOLLOWING THE RESIGNATION OF A MEMBER.

VOTERS ARE URGED TO GO TO THE POLLING STATIONS AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE TO AVOID A LATE RUSH BEFORE THEY CLOSE AT 10.30 PM.

BY NOON, A TOTAL OF 288 PEOPLE OR 1.8 PER CENT OF THE REGISTERED VOTERS IN THE CONSTITUENCY HAD CAST THEIR VOTES.

MR FONG POINTED OUT THAT TO VOTE TOOK ONLY A FEW MINUTES AND IT WOULD DEMONSTRATE SUPPORTS FOR THE DISTRICT BOARD AND FOR THE DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME.

HE CALLED ON POTENTIAL VOTERS TO VOTE AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE SO AS TO AVOID A RUSH BEFORE THE POLLING STATIONS CLOSE AT 10.30 PM.

TWO CANDIDATES ARE CONTESTING THE SEAT: MR SO CHOI-HING (42) AND MR CHIANG SAI-CHEONG (30).

THE TWO POLLING STATIONS ARE LOCATED AT THE MUSIC HALL OF OI MAN ESTATE AT CHUNG HAU STREET AND THE HOLY CARPENTER SOCIAL SERVICE CENTRE AT BLOCK 8, GROUND FLOOR, VALLEY ROAD ESTATE.

APPROVAL GIVEN TO 432 TAVA SCHEME APPLICANTS

\*\*\*\*\*

THE GOVERNOR-IN-COUNCIL HAS APPROVED EX GRATIA PAYMENTS AMOUNTING TO \$83 MILLION TO BE MADE TO 432 SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS UNDER THE SUPPLEMENTARY TRAFFIC ACCIDENT VICTIMS ASSISTANCE SCHEME, THE DIRECTOR OF LEGAL AID, MR PATRICK MOSS, ANNOUNCED TODAY (THURSDAY).

THE SCHEME WAS SET UP FOLLOWING A RESOLUTION PASSED IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL LAST DECEMBER TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION TO PERSONS WHO SUFFERED BODILY INJURIES AND TO DEPENDENTS OF THOSE WHO DIED FROM TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS INVOLVING MOTOR VEHICLES INSURED WITH FIVE INSURERS WHICH HAVE BECOME INSOLVENT.

THE FIVE INSURERS ARE THE SINGAPORE INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED, THE KYOTO INSURANCE LIMITED, THE SCOTLAND INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED, THE CHINA UNDERWRITERS LIFE AND GENERAL INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED AND THE BEDFORD INSURANCE COMPANY LIMITED.

+THE GOVERNOR-APPOINTED ADMINISTRATIVE COMMITTEE, HAVING CONSIDERED ALL OF THE 444 APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED, HAS APPROVED 432 OF THEM AND REJECTED SIX. ANOTHER SIX HAVE BEEN WITHDRAWN FROM THE SCHEME,+ MR MOSS SAID.

HE POINTED OUT THAT SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS WOULD BE NOTIFIED OF THE RESULT OF THEIR APPLICATIONS IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS. +THEREAFTER, THEY WILL BE GIVEN 14 DAYS TO CONSIDER THE AWARD. IF THEY WISH TO REJECT THE AWARD AND PURSUE THEIR LEGAL REMEDIES PERSONALLY AGAINST THE DEFENDANTS CONCERNED, THEY MUST SO NOTIFY THE LEGAL AID DEPARTMENT. OTHERWISE IT WILL BE ASSUMED THAT THEY ACCEPT THE EX GRATIA AWARD.+

MR MOSS APPEALED TO SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS TO WAIT FOR THE RESULTS OF THEIR APPLICATIONS AND NOT TO TELEPHONE THE LEGAL AID DEPARTMENT UNLESS THEY WISHED TO NOTIFY ANY CHANGE OF ADDRESS THAT MIGHT HAVE OCCURRED SINCE THEIR APPLICATIONS WERE SUBMITTED.

MATERIALS TESTING HAS IMPORTANT ROLE

THE GOVERNMENT'S DECISION TO BUILD A NEW MATERIALS TESTING LABORATORY AT KOWLOON BAY REFLECTS THE IMPORTANCE IT ATTACHES TO REVIEWING AND IMPROVING TESTING STANDARDS, THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (THURSDAY).

ADDRESSING THE OPENING CEREMONY OF THE SHUI ON RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CENTRE IN CASTLE PEAK, SIR DAVID SAID THE LABORATORY AT KOWLOON BAY WAS SCHEDULED TO OPEN IN 1989.

HIGH QUALITY LABORATORY TESTING WAS BECOMING INCREASINGLY NECESSARY IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY BECAUSE OF THE INCREASE IN THE VARIETY OF MATERIALS IN USE AND DEVELOPMENTS IN MATERIAL TECHNOLOGY AND DESIGN PROCESSES, SIR DAVID SAID.

HE NOTED THAT LAST YEAR A TOTAL OF 80 000 NEW FLATS WERE BUILT BY GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE DEVELOPERS TO PROVIDE HOUSING FOR ABOUT 300 000 PEOPLE. EVERY DAY NEW ROADS AND FLYOVERS WERE BEING BUILT TO IMPROVE THE TERRITORY'S INFRASTRUCTURE.

+BOTH THE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PURCHASERS HAVE A RIGHT TO EXPECT HIGH QUALITY CONSTRUCTION AND GOOD WORKMANSHIP,+ HE SAID. INADEQUATE OR DOUBTFUL MATERIAL TESTING COULD NEVER BE ACCEPTED.

SIR DAVID CONGRATULATED THE SHUI ON GROUP ON ITS INITIATIVE IN ESTABLISHING FIRST CLASS MATERIALS TESTING FACILITIES AND CONTINUAL RESEARCH TO IMPROVE MATERIAL QUALITY.

FACTORY INSPECTIONS STEPPED UP  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE FACTORY INSPECTORATE OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT HAS INTENSIFIED ITS ENFORCEMENT ACTION AND HAS BROUGHT FORWARD ITS SCHEDULED INSPECTIONS OF ALL LEATHER AND FUR-PROCESSING FACTORIES.

THERE ARE MORE THAN 60 SUCH FACTORIES OPERATING IN HONG KONG AND SO FAR THE MAJORITY OF THEM HAD BEEN INSPECTED IN THE PAST FEW DAYS.

+THE ROUND OF INSPECTIONS IS STILL CONTINUING AND PROSECUTIONS FOR BREACHES OF THE RELEVANT REGULATIONS WILL BE INSTITUTED IF ANY IRREGULARITIES ARE FOUND,+ A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE SPOKESMAN NOTED THAT INSPECTIONS OF FACTORIES ARE CONDUCTED ON AN INTERNATIONALLY-RECOGNISED RATING SYSTEM WHEREBY FACTORIES HAVING GREATER POTENTIAL HAZARDS ARE INSPECTED MORE FREQUENTLY.

IT IS UNDER THIS SYSTEM THAT CIPEL-MARCO LIMITED IN KWAI CHUNG WHERE AN EXPLOSION OCCURRED LAST WEEK WAS INSPECTED BY THE FACTORY INSPECTORATE THREE TIMES IN THE PAST 18 MONTHS. HOWEVER, IT MUST BE POINTED OUT THAT INSPECTIONS AND PROSECUTIONS CAN ONLY RESULT IN A TEMPORARY IMPACT.

+THE MOST IMPORTANT THING IS FOR EMPLOYERS WHO HAVE BOTH LEGAL AND MORAL RESPONSIBILITIES TO PROVIDE A SAFE AND HEALTHY PLACE OF WORK FOR HIS WORKERS, AND FOR WORKERS TO OBSERVE SAFETY RULES AT ALL TIMES.+

ON THE PART OF THE GOVERNMENT, HE STRESSED THAT IT WOULD CONTINUE ITS THREE-PRONGED APPROACH, THAT IS EDUCATION, PUBLICITY AND ENFORCEMENT, IN IMPROVING INDUSTRIAL SAFETY.

MEANWHILE, THE DEPARTMENT'S SPECIAL TEAM SET UP TO INVESTIGATE THE CIPEL-MARCO ACCIDENT IS STILL CONTINUING ITS WORK.

THE NINE-MEMBER TEAM, HEADED BY A SUPERINTENDENT OF FACTORY INSPECTORS, AIMS TO FIND OUT THE CAUSE OF THE EXPLOSION AND WHETHER ANY SAFETY LEGISLATION HAD BEEN VIOLATED BEFORE THE ACCIDENT.

SO FAR, THE TEAM HAS INTERVIEWED TEN WORKS AND EYE WITNESSES.

IT IS EXPECTED THAT INVESTIGATION WILL BE COMPLETED BY NEXT WEEK.

MANUFACTURERS URGED TO UPGRADE MANAGEMENT  
\* \* \* \* \*

MANUFACTURERS WERE ADVISED TODAY (THURSDAY) TO INVEST MORE IN MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT IN ORDER TO ENSURE THE FUTURE VIABILITY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF THEIR BUSINESSES.

POSSIBLY BECAUSE THE CALCULATION OF BENEFITS WAS LESS TANGIBLE, TOO FEW COMPANIES PLACED PRIORITY ON INVESTING TIME AND MONEY IN DEVELOPING THEIR MANAGEMENT TEAMS, MR S.L. CHEN SAID.

MR CHEN, GROUP MANAGING DIRECTOR OF HONG KONG ELECTRIC HOLDINGS LIMITED, WAS ADDRESSING 100 EXECUTIVES FROM MANUFACTURING COMPANIES AT A BRIEFING ORGANISED BY THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL'S MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT CENTRE.

+IF WE ARE TO SURVIVE IN BUSINESS TODAY, IT IS VITALLY IMPORTANT THAT WE CONTINUALLY REVIEW NOT ONLY OUR PRODUCTION METHODS, AND USE HIGH TECHNOLOGY PRODUCTION PROCESSES, BUT ALSO OUR MANAGEMENT METHODS AND THE RANGE OF TECHNIQUES WHICH ARE NOW READILY AVAILABLE TO USE.+

+IN OTHER WORDS, WE MUST CONTINUALLY DEVELOP THE MANAGEMENT OF OUR COMPANIES,+ HE SAID.

THE PROCESS OF MAKING MANAGEMENT MORE EFFECTIVE NEEDED TO BE CONTINUOUS AND REQUIRED CONSIDERABLE THOUGHT AND PLANNING BY TOP MANAGEMENT, MR CHEN SAID.

+IT MUST INCLUDE PROVISIONS FOR SUPERVISORS AND MANAGERS TO DEVELOP, UPDATE AND UPGRADE THEMSELVES IN THE MANAGEMENT FIELD. MANAGERS MUST BE ENCOURAGED TO APPLY NEW TECHNOLOGY TO ASSIST THEM IN THE MANAGING PROCESS.+

MR CHEN NOTED THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD RECOGNISED THE IMPORTANCE OF DESIGNING MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE LOCAL BUSINESS COMMUNITY. IT HAD SET UP, THROUGH THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING COUNCIL, THE MANAGEMENT DEVELOPMENT CENTRE TO PROVIDE GUIDANCE IN THIS TASK.

KWUN TONG MEET THE PUBLIC SCHEME A SUCCESS  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD HAS PROVIDED HELP TO MORE THAN HALF THE CASES BROUGHT UP BY RESIDENTS UNDER A MEET THE PUBLIC SCHEME BETWEEN APRIL AND SEPTEMBER THIS YEAR.

A KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID BOARD MEMBERS HANDLED A TOTAL OF 176 CASES DURING THE PERIOD. OF THESE, 92 CASES (OR 52 PER CENT) HAD BEEN DEALT WITH AND ASSISTANCE GIVEN TO THE APPLICANTS.

ANOTHER 52 CASES (OR 29.5 PER CENT) WERE STILL BEING CONSIDERED BY THE DEPARTMENTS CONCERNED. THE REMAINING 32 CASES (18 PER CENT) HAD NOT BEEN TAKEN UP BECAUSE THEY WERE IN CONFLICT WITH EXISTING GOVERNMENT POLICY.

MOST OF THE CASES (73 PER CENT) RAISED RELATED TO REQUESTS AND COMPLAINTS ON HOUSING MATTERS. THE REMAINING CASES WERE ON ENVIRONMENT, TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT, ILLEGAL HAWKING, LAW AND ORDER SITUATION.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE RESPONSE OF LOCAL RESIDENTS TO THE MEET THE PUBLIC SCHEME HAD BEEN ENCOURAGING.

HE SAID MOST RESIDENTS SEEKING HELP WERE RESIDENTS OF PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES.

THE AVERAGE WAITING TIME BETWEEN THE DAY OF APPOINTMENT AND INTERVIEW WAS ABOUT ONE WEEK. HOWEVER, WAITING TIME FOR URGENT CASES WERE MUCH SHORTER AS SPECIAL ARRANGEMENT COULD BE MADE, THE SPOKESMAN ADDED.

AT PRESENT, THE MEET THE PUBLIC SCHEME IN KWUN TONG IS BEING OPERATED ON A ONE-CENTRE-ONE EVENING BASIS FROM MONDAY TO THURSDAY (EXCEPT PUBLIC HOLIDAY) FROM 8 PM TO 10 PM.

THE MEET THE PUBLIC CENTRES ARE IN SAU MAU PING, NGAU TAU KOK, LAM TIN AND TING HONG.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WISHING TO MEET THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS CAN MAKE APPOINTMENT EITHER BY PHONING 3-416315, 3-421443, OR IN PERSON AT ANY PUBLIC ENQUIRY COUNTER OF THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT OFFICE OR ITS SUB-OFFICES.

UNDER THE SCHEME, DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS ALSO CONDUCT PERIODIC VISITS TO LOCAL ORGANISATIONS. BETWEEN APRIL AND SEPTEMBER THIS YEAR, THEY HAD VISITED 76 DISTRICT ORGANISATIONS, INCLUDING MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES, OWNERS' CORPORATIONS, RESIDENTS' ASSOCIATIONS AND VOLUNTARY AGENCIES.

CLOSURE ORDERS SOUGHT FOR ILLEGAL STRUCTURES  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE OCCUPIERS OF ILLEGAL STRUCTURES AT THREE LOCATIONS IN KOWLOON AND ON HONG KONG ISLAND HAVE BEEN ADVISED THAT COURT ORDERS HAVE BEEN SOUGHT TO CLOSE THE STRUCTURES.

THE OCCUPIERS OF STRUCTURES ON THE FLAT ROOF ADJACENT TO FLAT B, FIRST FLOOR, 1-7 SHELTER STREET, HONG KONG, WERE INSTRUCTED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE (BOO) MORE THAN TWO YEARS AGO TO DEMOLISH THEM, BUT THE ORDER HAD NEVER BEEN CARRIED OUT.

THE BUILDING AUTHORITY IS TO APPLY TO VICTORIA DISTRICT COURT FOR A CLOSURE ORDER ON DECEMBER 17 AND HAS POSTED NOTICES OF ITS INTENTION ON CONSPICUOUS PARTS OF THE STRUCTURES.

AN APPLICATION FOR A CLOSURE ORDER IS TO BE MADE AT THE SAME COURT THE NEXT DAY IN RESPECT OF ILLEGAL STRUCTURES ON THE MAIN ROOF OF 110, CHUN YEUNG STREET, HONG KONG.

THE OCCUPIERS, WHO HAVE BEEN NOTIFIED OF THE BUILDING AUTHORITY'S INTENTION, HAVE REFUSED TO COMPLY WITH A BOO INSTRUCTION ISSUED IN JANUARY THIS YEAR TO DEMOLISH THE STRUCTURES.

THE FINAL APPLICATION FOR A CLOSURE ORDER IS IN RESPECT OF ILLEGAL STRUCTURES ON THE MAIN ROOF OF 148-152, YEE KUK STREET, KOWLOON.

IT WILL BE MADE AT KOWLOON DISTRICT COURT ON DECEMBER 11 AND THE OCCUPIERS HAVE BEEN INFORMED THROUGH NOTICES PLACED ON THE STRUCTURES.

A BOO INSTRUCTION TO DEMOLISH THE STRUCTURES ISSUED A YEAR AGO HAD BEEN IGNORED.

IN ALL THREE CASES DEMOLITION WILL TAKE PLACE IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE COURT ORDER HAS BEEN OBTAINED.

# Royal Visit.

## Special Traffic Arrangements for the Royal Visit

Special traffic arrangements will be implemented territory-wide next week during the visit of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh.

Announcing details at a press conference today (Thursday), a police spokesman advised spectators wishing to attend the various events to make full use of public transport whenever possible in reaching vantage points on routes to be taken by the Royal visitors.

He urged spectators to exercise restraint and be considerate and courteous to children and the elderly in crowded places.

"The police will not tolerate illegal parking and waiting in order to maintain traffic flow," he said.

"Illegally parked vehicles will be towed away without prior notice."

He also appealed to motorists to drive with care and patience.

For the arrival of the Royal visitors on Tuesday (October 21), fairways in the harbour will be closed by sections between 8:50 am and 9:50 am to provide a free passage for the HMY Britannia.

In Central, certain roads including a section of Chater Road, Ice House Street, Jackson Road and Des Voeux Road Central will be closed from 12:01 am until noon for a ceremony at the Edinburgh Place and the City Hall.

The civic luncheon at Government House, and visits to the Hong Kong Polytechnic in Hung Hom and the Hong Kong Convention Centre site in Wanchai in the afternoon will also affect traffic flow.

To facilitate the youth spectacular at the Hong Kong Coliseum in the evening, a number of roads in Hung Hom will be closed from 7 pm. These will include a section of Granville Road, Mody Lane, Mody Road, Science Museum Road, Science Museum Path, Cheong Wan Road flyover, railway approach road leading from Hong Chong Road, Salisbury Road, and the down ramp from Kowloon KCR Station multi storey carpark leading onto the podium.

In view of the road closure, restriction on access to carparks in the area will be implemented.

/MOTORISTS ARE .....

Motorists are advised to park or leave the carparks before the implementation of the special traffic arrangements and should be prepared to accept that their cars cannot leave the carparks until the cessation of the road closures.

On the following day (October 22), the Queen will visit Lung Hang Estate, New Town Plaza in Shatin in the morning before attending the race meeting at the Shatin Racecourse. Traffic in the area is likely to be affected.

Highlight of the second day's events will be the Royal Fireworks in the harbour at 8 pm.

To enable members of the public to fully enjoy the fireworks display, many roads on both sides of the harbour, including a long stretch of the Island Eastern Corridor, all roads south of Granville Road in Tsim Sha Tsui and some in Central and Wan Chai will be closed.

Details of the special traffic arrangements for the Royal Fireworks are :

#### Hong Kong Island

##### Pedestrian Precinct in Central

The pedestrian precinct in Central involving the closure of Chater road between Peddar Street and Jackson Road and Ice House Street between Queen's Road Central and Connaught Road Central to all vehicular traffic will be implemented from 7 am to 12 midnight.

##### Temporary Closure of Roads Commencing from 6 pm

All uphill vehicles will be prohibited from entering Peak Road beyond the Magazine Gap Road junction except Police/emergency vehicles, franchised buses, PLB 'maxicabs' private omnibus, taxis and local residents' vehicles displaying a police label.

All Closed Road Permits will be invalid during the road closure period. Peak residents requiring access to the area during the closure period are advised to contact the Peak Police Station to obtain a police label.

##### Temporary Closure of Roads Commencing from 6:30 pm

- + Edinburgh Place East will be closed to all vehicular traffic except those requiring access to or exit from HMS Tamar and those leaving City Hall Car Park;
- + Fenwick Pier Street;
- + The westbound Inner Gloucester Road between Percival Street and Arsenal Street;
- + The northbound carriageway of Percival Street between Jaffe Road and Inner Gloucester Road;
- + The northbound carriageway of Fenwick Street between Jaffe Road and Inner Gloucester Road;

- + Luard Road between Jaffe Road and Inner Gloucester Road;
- + The northbound carriageway of Fleming Road between Jaffe Road and Inner Gloucester Road will be closed to all vehicular traffic except those wishing to proceed eastward along Jaffe Road, which will be permitted to make a U-turn under the Fleming Road flyover near the junction of Inner Gloucester Road;
- + Tonnochy Road will be closed to all vehicular traffic. However, eastbound traffic on Jaffe road will be permitted to cross Tonnochy Road to proceed further east on Jaffe Road;
- + The northbound carriageway of Marsh Road between Jaffe road and Inner Gloucester Road will be closed to all vehicular traffic except those wishing to proceed eastward along Jaffe Road, which will be permitted to make a U-turn under Marsh Road flyover near the junction of Inner Gloucester Road;
- + The northbound carriageway of Canal Road West between Jaffe Road and Inner Gloucester Road will be closed to all vehicular traffic except those wishing to proceed eastward along Jaffe Road, which will be permitted to make a U-turn under Canal Road flyover near the junction of Inner Gloucester Road;
- + Harbour Road between Fenwick Street and Tonnochy Road;
- + Hung Hing Road between Tonnochy Road and the Yacht Club;
- + Wan Shing Street;
- + Marsh Road flyover;
- + Fleming Road flyover;
- + Eastbound traffic on Gloucester Road will only be permitted to turn north into Fenwick Street as far as Hong Kong Arts Centre but will have to turn back to eastbound Gloucester Road. Vehicles will be prohibited from turning into Fleming Road, Tonnochy Road and Marsh Road.
- + The cul-de-sac on eastbound Victoria Park Road to the east of the Jardine Gun site;
- + Access to Bowen Road east of the junction of Borrett Road will be prohibited until such time as crowds have cleared the area; and
- + The slip road linking Gloucester Road and Inner Gloucester Road near O'Brien Road.

Temporary Closure of Roads for the Pedestrianisation  
of Island Eastern Corridor

- + The section of Island Eastern Corridor (IEC) west of the Healthy Street Interchange will be closed to all vehicular traffic with effect from 6 pm. Traffic from Taikoo Shing will leave the IEC at the Healthy Street exit;
- + the eastbound section of the IEC between Hing Fat Street and Tong Shui Road will be pedestrianised at about 6:30 pm and after police consider it safe. Spectators access to this eastbound section of IEC will be allowed from Hing Fat Street down-ramp in Causeway Bay and from Tong Shui Road down-ramp in North Point only;

- + Whitfield Road and Watson Road will be closed to all vehicular traffic at the commencement of the display to facilitate pedestrian movement at the conclusion of the display;
- + Chung Yeung Street will be closed to all vehicular traffic from 6:30 pm;
- + Electric Road south of Yacht Street will be closed to all vehicular traffic from 6 pm.

The temporary road closures on Hong Kong Island will be retained until crowds have dispersed and Police are of the opinion that it is safe to revert to normal traffic flow.

Traffic Re-routing Commencing from 6 pm

- + Mody Road between Chatham Road South and Science Museum Road will be re-routed one way eastbound and the right turn from Mody Road into Mody Lane southbound will be banned.

Restriction on Car Parks

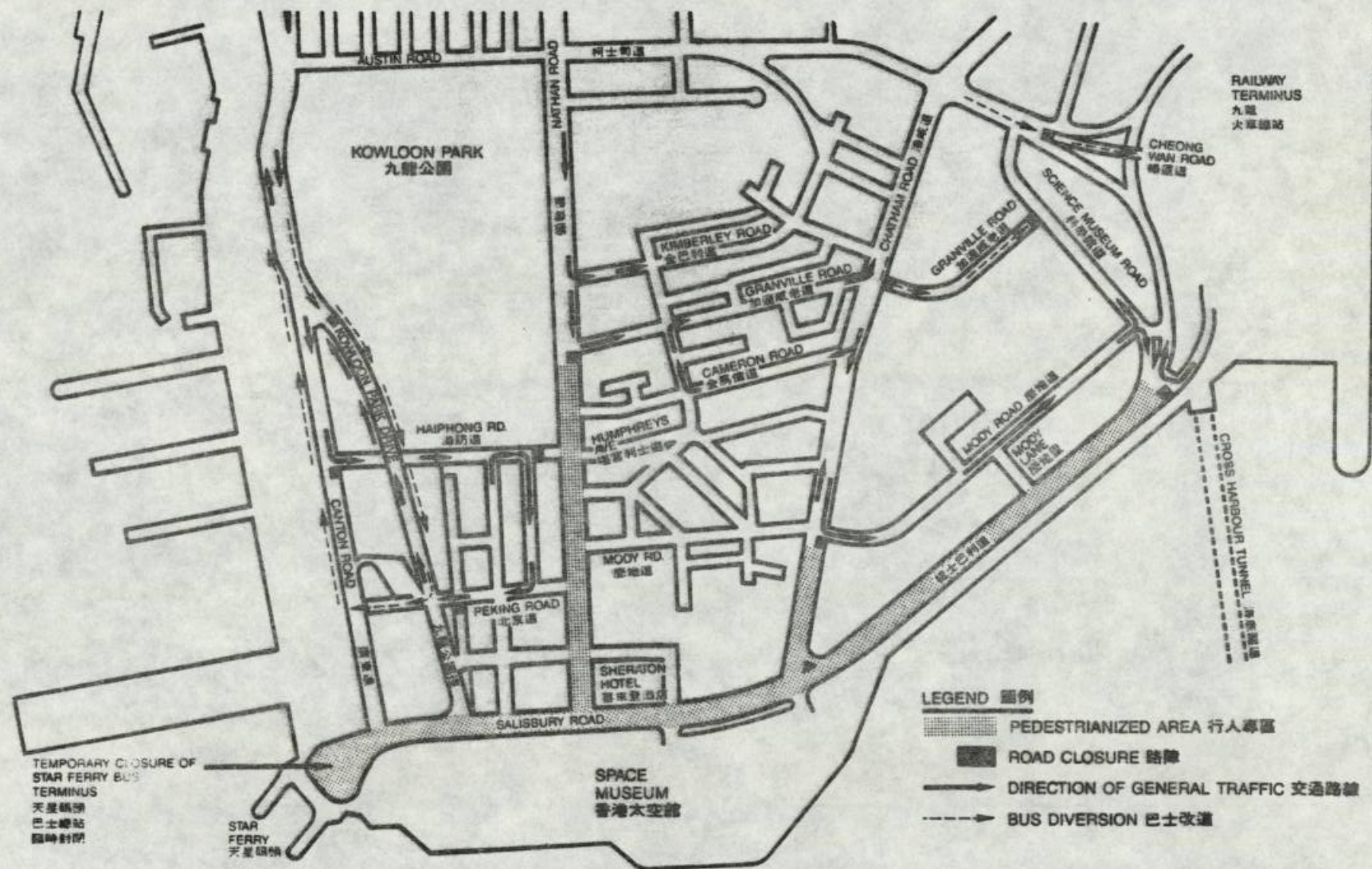
The following restriction on access to and from car parks will be implemented concurrent with the above road closures :-

Motorists wishing to park in these car parks are advised to do so well before 6:30 pm and should be prepared to accept that their cars will not be permitted to leave until the cessation of the road closures.

Temporary Suspension of Parking Spaces Commence from 3 pm

All parking spaces in roads south of Austin Road will be suspended and all illegally parked vehicles will then be towed away without prior notification.




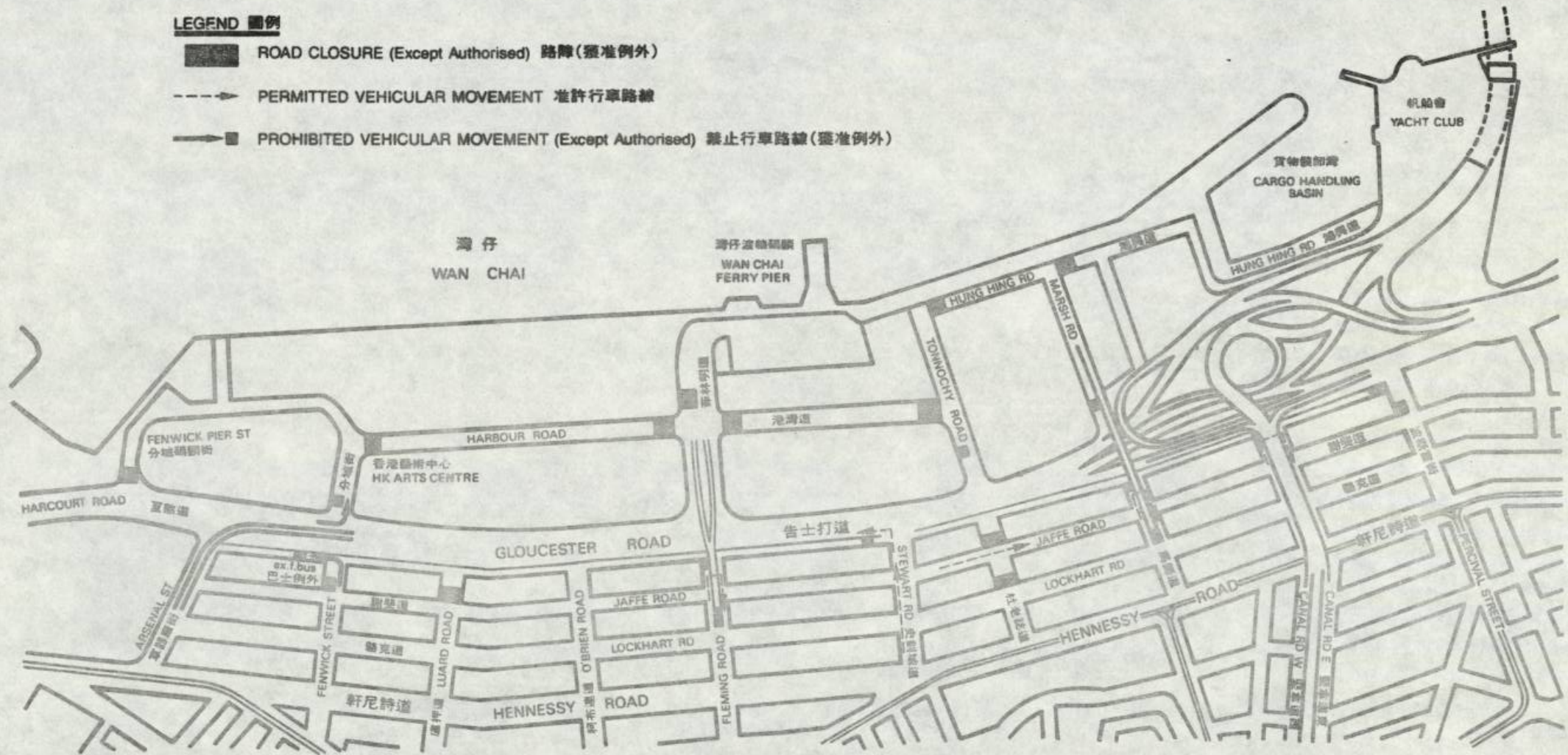

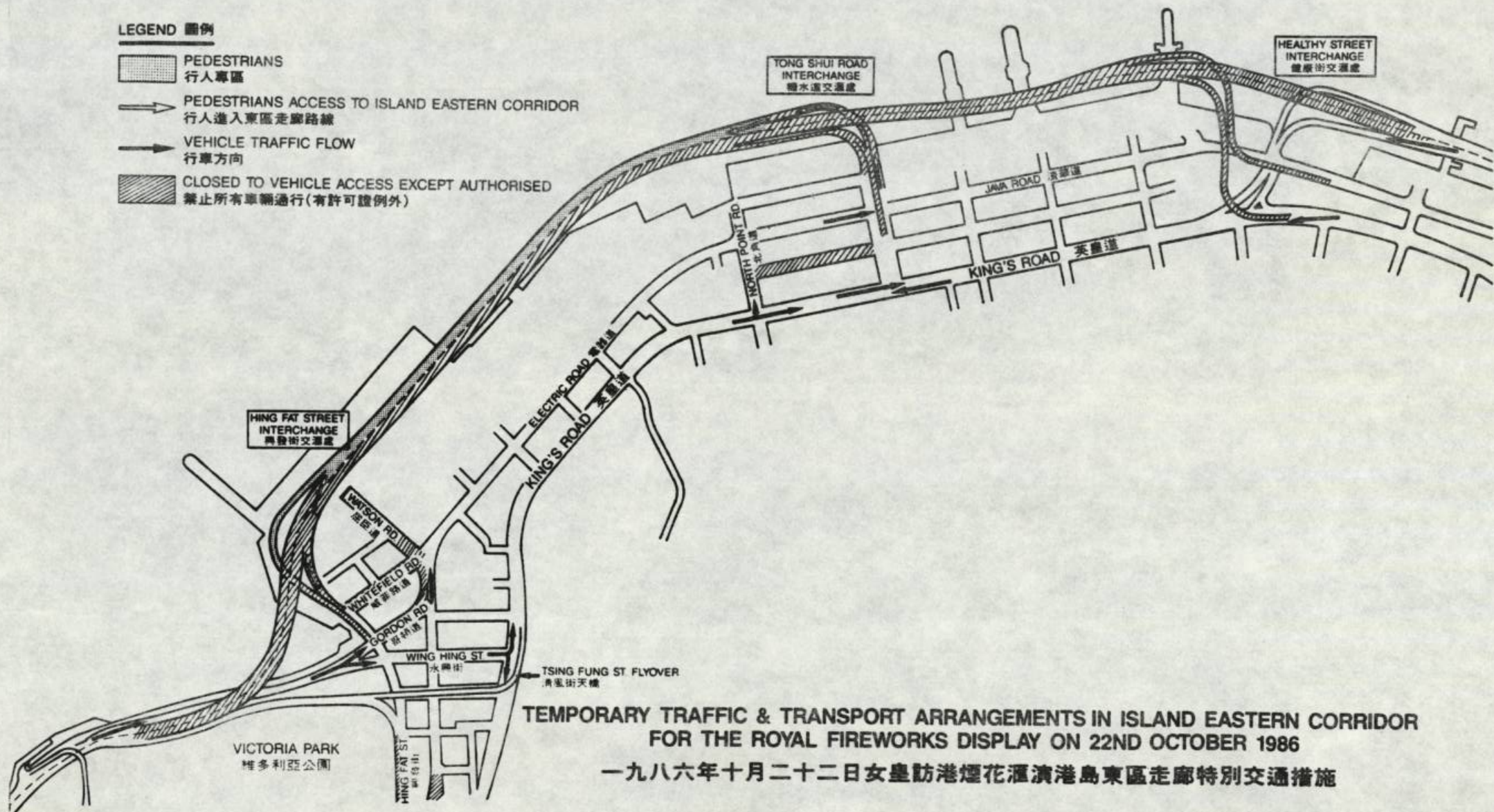
