DRIVING ON LAM KAM ROAD A PLEASURE

* * * * *

THE COMPLETION OF IMPROVEMENT WORKS FOR LAM KAM ROAD BETWEEN LAM KAM ROAD INTERCHANGE AND KADOORIE FARM NOT ONLY MAKES IT A PLEASURE TO DRIVE ON THE ROAD BUT SAFETY HAS ALSO BEEN MUCH ENHANCED.

THE ROAD HAS NOW BEEN BUILT TO A STANDARD 7.3-METRE-WIDE TWO-LANE CARRIAGEWAY. THE ROAD ALIGNMENT AND LINE VISIBILITY HAVE BEEN IMPROVED.

REFUGE ISLANDS AND A CONTINUOUS TWO-METRE-WIDE FOOTPATH ALONGSIDE THE NEW CARRIAGEWAY HAVE BEEN PROVIDED AND COMFORTNESS OF DRIVERS ENHANCED.

WITH THE PROVISION OF A CLIMBING LANE AT THE UPHILL SECTION NEAR KADOORIE FARM, THE POSSIBILITY OF THE THOROUGHFARE TRAFFIC BEING BLOCKED BY THE SLOW-MOVING HEAVY VEHICLES HAS BEEN REDUCED.

THE PROVISION OF PROPER ROAD DRAINAGE SYSTEM AND RIVER TRAINING STRUCTURES REDUCES THE RISK OF FLOODING IN THE ADJACENT AREAS.

THE HYGIENIC CONDITION OF THE NEIGHBOURING VILLAGES HAS BEEN GREATLY IMPROVED WITH THE REPROVISIONING OF FIVE REFUSE COLLECTION POINTS ALONGSIDE LAM KAM ROAD.

SINCE THE ROAD IS A TOURIST ROUTE TO LAM TSUEN VALLEY, NG TUNG CHAI AND KADOORIE FARM, CAREFUL CONSIDERATION WAS GIVEN AT THE DESIGN STAGE TO INCORPORATE LANDSCAPE WORKS INTO THE PROJECT AND TO HARMONISE THE ROAD WITH THE SURROUNDING LANDSCAPE.

MORE THAN 31,000 NUMBERS OF PLANTS COMPRISING 32 SPECIES ARE BEING PLANTED ALONGSIDE THE ROAD.

ALL THESE WORKS WERE PARTS OF THE \$65.5-MILLION CONTRACT TO IMPROVE THE 3.9-KILOMETRE SECTION OF THE ROAD. WORK STARTED IN OCTOBER 1990 AND WAS SUBSTANTIALLY COMPLETED LAST MONTH.

IN THE OLDER DAYS, LAM KAM ROAD HAS BEEN RECOGNISED AS AN IMPORTANT LINK BETWEEN TAI PO AND YUEN LONG.

HOWEVER, AS THE ROAD WAS SUBSTANDARD BOTH IN TERMS OF ALIGNMENT AND WIDTH AND WAS HAZARDOUS TO BOTH DRIVERS AND PEDESTRIANS, IMPROVEMENT TO TWO OF THE MOST CRITICAL SECTIONS OF LAM KAM ROAD BETWEEN CHAI KEK AND PAK NGAU SHEK AND BETWEEN KADOORIE FARM AND NAM SHEUNG TIN WAS COMPLETED IN 1986.

WITH THE OPENING OF TOLO HIGHWAY IN SEPTEMBER 1985, THERE HAS BEEN AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF VEHICLES USING LAM KAM ROAD AS A THROUGH ROUTE TO AND FROM NORTHWEST NEW TERRITORIES.

IT IS THEREFORE NECESSARY TO IMPROVE THE REMAINING SECTIONS OF THE ROAD AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

WITH THE COMPLETION OF IMPROVEMENT WORKS FROM THE LAM KAM ROAD INTERCHANGE ALL THE WAY UP TO KADOORIE FARM, ONLY THE SECTION BETWEEN NAM SHEUNG TIN AND ROUTE TWISK ROUNDABOUT WILL NEED TO BE IMPROVED AT A LATER STAGE.

WORKS DEPARTMENTS PROMISE HIGH QUALITY PUBLIC WORKS

* * * * *

STAFF MEMBERS OF THE WORKS DEPARTMENTS WILL ALL BE DOING THEIR BEST TO CONTINUE PROVIDING HIGH QUALITY PUBLIC WORKS TO MEET THE COMMUNITY NEEDS FOR THE NEXT 150 YEARS.

THIS WAS STATED BY THE DIRECTOR OF ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES, MR HUGH PHILLIPSON, WHEN HE OPENED AN EXHIBITION MARKING THE 150TH ANNIVERSARY OF PUBLIC WORKS IN HONG KONG AT CITYPLAZA THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

MR PHILLIPSON NOTED THAT THE SUCCESSFUL IMPLEMENTATION OF PUBLIC WORKS IN THE PAST 150 YEARS HAD BEEN A MAJOR CONTRIBUTION IN THE TRANSFORMATION AND DEVELOPMENT OF HONG KONG FROM A SMALL FISHING VILLAGE INTO A LEADING MODERN INTERNATIONAL CITY.

"THIS IMPRESSIVE DEVELOPMENT WOULD NOT HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE WITHOUT THE DEDICATION AND HARD WORK OF ALL THOSE CONCERNED OVER MANY YEARS.

"DURING THOSE 150 YEARS MUCH EFFORT HAS BEEN DEVOTED BY TECHNICAL, PROFESSIONAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF IN GOVERNMENT TO PROVIDE PUBLIC WORKS THAT HONG KONG PEOPLE HAD NEEDED," HE SAID.

THESE WORKS INCLUDED RECREATIONAL AND CULTURAL FACILITIES, PORT WORKS, RECLAMATIONS, HIGHWAYS, BRIDGES, DRAINAGE SCHEMES, MANY BUILDINGS AND ALL THE ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES NEEDED FOR THESE PROJECTS.

POINTING OUT THAT THE SIZE OF MANY OF THE WORKS HAD INCREASED EVERY YEAR, MR PHILLIPSON SAID AT PRESENT THE TERRITORY WAS INVOLVED IN PROBABLY THE BIGGEST PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT IN THE WORLD: THE NEW AIRPORT AT CHEK LAP KOK WITH ITS HUGE RECLAMATION AND ASSOCIATED PROJECTS OF HIGHWAYS, BRIDGES, TUNNELS AND RAILWAY.

"AND THE SEWAGE STRATEGY PROJECT IS ANOTHER VERY LARGE IMPORTANT PROJECT NOW UNDER WAY," HE ADDED.

THE EXHIBITION, CONTINUING AT CITYPLAZA TOMORROW, AND AT POPULAR SHOPPING CENTRES AND AN MTR STATION OVER WEEKENDS UNTIL AUGUST, IS ORGANISED BY THE WORKS BRANCH AND WORKS GROUP OF DEPARTMENTS.

VISITORS WILL BE ABLE TO SEE SHORT FILMS ON A FULL-SIZE VIDEO WALL ON HOW PUBLIC MONEY IS SPENT ON BUILDING MORE HOSPITALS, SCHOOLS, PARKS, ROADS AND OTHER INFRASTRUCTURAL PROJECTS.

THE EXHIBITION ALSO FEATURES DISPLAY PANELS CONTAINING CHARTS AND PHOTOGRAPHS WITH SHORT DESCRIPTIONS TO EXPLAIN THE MAIN ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY THE WORKS BRANCH, THE NEW AIRPORT PROJECTS CO-ORDINATING OFFICE, AND SEVEN WORKS DEPARTMENTS - ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, CIVIL ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT, DRAINAGE SERVICES DEPARTMENT, ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT, TERRITORY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT AND WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE CEREMONY WERE THE DEPUTY SECRETARY FOR WORKS, MR LEE SHING-SEE; EASTERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR LUI HAU-TUEN; EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD CHAIRMAN, MR SHUM CHOI-SANG; CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD'S COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE, MR WONG PO-LAM; CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD'S TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT COMMITTEE, MR KONG TZE-WING; AND CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD'S ENVIRONMENTAL IMPROVEMENT COMMITTEE, MR FU YUEN-CHEUNG.

VOTER REGISTRATION AMBASSADORS RECEIVE CERTIFICATES

THE BOUNDARY AND ELECTION COMMISSION TODAY (SATURDAY) PRESENTED CERTIFICATES TO MORE THAN 170 VOTER REGISTRATION AMBASSADORS IN RECOGNITION OF THEIR WORK TO SPREAD "GET-REGISTER" MESSAGE ACROSS THE COMMUNITY.

THE "AMBASSADOR SCHEME" IS A NEW ATTEMPT AND AN IMPORTANT FEATURE OF THIS YEAR'S VOTER REGISTRATION CAMPAIGN.

SPEAKING AT THE CERTIFICATE-PRESENTATION CEREMONY, THE COMMISSION'S CHAIRMAN, MR JUSTICE WOO KWOK-HING, SAID IN PROMOTING VOTER REGISTRATION, THE AMBASSADORS WOULD BE ABLE TO SHARE THE SENSE OF ACHIEVEMENT IN CONTRIBUTING TO COMMUNITY SERVICE.

HE SAID THE SUCCESS OF THE SCHEME WOULD NOT BE MEASURED BY THE NUMBER OF VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS COLLECTED.

MORE IMPORTANTLY, IT IS BY THE ENHANCEMENT OF CIVIC AWARENESS SO THAT MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC UNDERSTAND THEIR CIVIC RIGHTS AND DUTIES IN SOCIETY.

"THIS WILL BE A LONG-TERM MISSION WHICH WILL NOT END WITH THE CLOSE OF OUR CAMPAIGN ON JULY 1," THE CHAIRMAN SAID.

THE CAMPAIGN STARTED ON APRIL 1.

THE AMBASSADORS WORK AT FOUR LEVELS: FIRST, WITH THEIR FAMILY, RELATIVES AND FRIENDS; SECONDLY, AT THEIR WORKPLACE OR SCHOOL; THIRDLY, THROUGH VARIOUS CAMPAIGN ACTIVITIES; AND LASTLY THROUGH THEIR OWN INITIATIVES TO PROMOTE THE CAMPAIGN.

THE LEAGUE OF AMBASSADORS COMPRISE BOTH CORPORATE AND INDIVIDUAL AMBASSADORS.

CORPORATE AMBASSADORS INCLUDE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY, KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY, KOWLOON MOTOR BUS, HONGKONGBANK, HONG KONG AND CHINA GAS COMPANY LTD, CATHAY PACIFIC AIRWAYS, COMMERCIAL RADIO AND GIORDANO LTD.

ALSO ON THE LIST ARE CIVIL AID SERVICES, RADIO AND TELEVISION HONG KONG, HONG KONG PUBLIC DOCTORS' ASSOCIATION, ASSOCIATION OF HONG KONG NURSING STAFF, CARITAS GROUP AND COMMUNITY WORK SERVICE, SOCIETY FOR COMMUNITY ORGANISATION, HONG KONG ELDERLY RIGHTS LEAGUE, VARIOUS VOLUNTARY AGENCIES AND LOCAL RESIDENTS ORGANISATIONS.

INDIVIDUAL AMBASSADORS INCLUDE STUDENTS, ARTISTS AND PUBLIC-SPIRITED INDIVIDUALS FROM DIFFERENT PROFESSIONS.

APART FROM THE COMMISSION'S CHAIRMAN, MEMBERS PROFESSOR LEUNG CHI-KEUNG AND MR NORMAN LEUNG ALSO PRESENTED CERTIFICATES TO THE AMBASSADORS.

DAY CRECHES HELP WORKING PARENTS

* * * * *

PARENTS WHO ARE WORKING AND HAVE DIFFICULTIES IN LOOKING AFTER THEIR CHILDREN AGED UNDER TWO CAN CONSIDER SENDING THEM TO A DAY CRECHE.

THIS OPTION IN CHILD CARE IS SUGGESTED BY MRS ELAINE MA, SENIOR SOCIAL WORK OFFICER (CHILD CARE CENTRES) OF THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT.

TO TIE IN WITH THE WORKING HOURS OF MOST PEOPLE, DAY CRECHES ARE GENERALLY OPEN FROM 8 AM TO 6 PM ON WEEKDAYS AND FROM 8 AM TO 1 PM ON SATURDAYS. THEY WILL BE CLOSED ON SUNDAYS AND PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

"CHILDREN ADMITTED TO DAY CRECHES ARE LOOKED AFTER ACCORDING TO A TIME-TABLE WHICH NORMALLY COVERS SESSIONS RANGING FROM SLEEPING, RESTING, FEEDING, CLEANING, LEARNING TO PHYSICAL TRAINING.

"LEARNING AND PHYSICAL TRAINING WILL BE INTRODUCED GRADUALLY AS THE CHILDREN GROW UP AND DEVELOP THEIR MOTOR AND LEARNING SKILLS," MRS MA SAID.

AT PRESENT, THERE ARE 21 SUBVENTED DAY CRECHES WITH A TOTAL OF 1,208 PLACES THROUGHOUT THE TERRITORY.

MANAGED BY NINE NON-GOVERNMENT WELFARE AGENCIES, THESE CRECHES ARE LOCATED IN WAN CHAI, SAI YING PUN, SHAU KEI WAN, HUNG HOM, KOWLOON CITY, MONG KOK, NGAU TAU KOK, WANG TAU HOM, SAU MAU PING, SHEK KIP MEI, LAM TIN, YAU TONG, TSUEN WAN, KWAI CHUNG, YUEN LONG, TUEN MUN AND FANLING RESPECTIVELY.

TO MEET AN INCREASE IN DEMAND FOR DAY CRECHE SERVICE, MRS MA SAID THE GOVERNMENT PLANNED TO PROVIDE AN ADDITIONAL 989 AIDED DAY CRECHE PLACES IN THE NEXT THREE YEARS.

THIS WILL BRING TO 2,197 BY 1996/97 THE TOTAL NUMBER OF AIDED DAY CRECHE PLACES IN HONG KONG, A TARGET THAT WAS SET OUT BY THE GOVERNOR IN HIS 1992 POLICY ADDRESS.

MRS MA EXPLAINED THAT THE PAST DECADE HAD WITNESSED MARKED SOCIAL CHANGES SUCH AS THE PREVALENCE OF NUCLEAR FAMILIES, AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF WORKING MOTHERS AND THE GROWTH OF SINGLE-PARENT FAMILIES.

"IN ADDITION, THERE IS GROWING PUBLIC CONCERN ABOUT CHILDREN BEING LEFT UNATTENDED AT HOME," SHE SAID.

DAY CRECHES PROVIDE CARE AND CATER FOR THE DEVELOPMENTAL NEEDS OF CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF TWO.

TO ENSURE THE PROVISION OF SERVICE AT DAY CRECHES IS KEPT TO A REQUIRED STANDARD, MRS MA SAID STAFF OF THE DEPARTMENT WOULD PAY REGULAR VISITS TO THESE PREMISES.

"DAY CRECHES ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH CERTAIN STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS IN TERMS OF FLOOR SPACE, STAFF TO CHILDREN RATIO, STAFF QUALIFICATION AND TRAINING, PROGRAMME, DIET, HEALTH AND SANITATION.

"ADVICE IS ALSO GIVEN ON SERVICE FACILITIES AND STAFFING IMPROVEMENTS.

"PARENTS WHO SEND THEIR CHILDREN TO THESE INSTITUTIONS CAN THEREFORE REST ASSURED THAT THEY WILL BE PROPERLY TAKEN CARE OF," SHE SAID.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO WANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT DAY CRECHE SERVICE ARE WELCOME TO CONTACT THE CHILD CARE CENTRE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE ON 836 3114 OR CALL THE DEPARTMENTAL HOTLINE 343 2255.

"THEY CAN ALSO APPROACH ANY DAY CRECHE TO FIND OUT MORE ABOUT THE SERVICE," MRS MA SAID.

PARENTS WHO CANNOT AFFORD TO PAY THE DAY CRECHE FEE CAN APPROACH THE DEPARTMENT'S SOCIAL SECURITY FIELD UNITS FOR HELP.

"THE GOVERNMENT WILL, FROM SEPTEMBER 1 THIS YEAR, DIRECTLY HELP PARENTS PAY THE DAY CRECHE FEE ACCORDING TO A SLIDING SCALE, BASED ON THEIR NET INCOME, UP TO THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE FEE," SHE ADDED.

THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH WILL STAGE AN EXHIBITION IN WAN CHAI TOMORROW (SUNDAY) AS PART OF ITS PUBLICITY DRIVE TO PROMOTE ORGAN DONATION AWARENESS.

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC CAN SIGN ORGAN DONATION CARDS AND HAVE THEM LAMINATED AT THE EXHIBITION WHICH WILL BE SET UP AT THE WAN CHAI MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY STATION ENTRANCE, NEXT TO THE WAN CHAI DISTRICT OFFICE.

THE EXHIBITION IS ORGANISED BY THE DEPARTMENT'S CENTRAL HEALTH EDUCATION UNIT TO SOLICIT POTENTIAL DONORS TO SIGN UP.

AFTER THE EXHIBITION, THE UNIT WOULD CONTINUE TO PROVIDE LAMINATION SERVICE TO THOSE WHO SIGN UP AT ITS OFFICE ON SEVENTH FLOOR, SOUTHOEN CENTRE, 130 HENNESSY ROAD, WAN CHAI.

WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR, THE CARDS ARE AVAILABLE AT 80 STORES OF MANNINGS, 18 WATSONS STORES, 32 BRANCHES OF THE KWONG ON BANK AND OFFICES OF THE CHINA LIGHT AND POWER.

THE CARDS WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE AT ALL THE PUBLIC LIBRARIES AND RECREATIONAL AND AMENITIES VENUES OF THE URBAN AND REGIONAL COUNCILS.

A POST OFFICE DELEGATION HAD FRUITFUL DISCUSSIONS WITH THE MACAU POSTAL ADMINISTRATION ON MATTERS OF MUTUAL INTEREST DURING THEIR RECENT VISIT TO MACAU.

LED BY THE POSTMASTER GENERAL, MR MIKE PAGLIARI, THE DELEGATION COMPRISED FIVE SENIOR OFFICERS OF THE POST OFFICE.

THEY WERE WARMLY RECEIVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS OF MACAU, MR CARLOS A R LOPES AND SENIOR OFFICIALS OF THE MACAU POST OFFICE.

AFTER THE VISIT, MR PAGLIARI SAID BECAUSE THE TWO TERRITORIES WERE CLOSE TO EACH OTHER, THEIR POSTAL ADMINISTRATIONS HAD ALWAYS ENJOYED A CLOSE WORKING RELATIONSHIP.

MORE PEOPLE URGED TO REGISTER AS VOTERS

TO REGISTER AS VOTERS IS THE FIRST STEP TOWARDS PARTICIPATING IN POLITICS AND ACHIEVING DEMOCRATIC GOALS IN HONG KONG, NORTH DISTRICT OFFICER, MR TIMOTHY TONG, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT A VOTER REGISTRATION CARNIVAL AT SHEK WU HUI, MR TONG HOPED THAT ALL WHO HAD REGISTERED WOULD ACTIVELY TAKE PART IN THE FORTHCOMING DISTRICT BOARD, MUNICIPAL COUNCIL AND LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS.

IN THIS WAY, MR TONG SAID, VOTERS CAN REFLECT THEIR VIEWS TO THE GOVERNMENT ON EDUCATION, ENVIRONMENT AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES.
