REGISTRATION FEES FOR HOSPITALS, NURSING HOMES
AND MATERNITY HOMES REVISED
* * * * *

THE HOSPITALS, NURSING HOMES AND MATERNITY HOMES REGISTRATION (AMENDMENT) BILL 1989, WHICH SEEKS TO INCREASE FEES FOR THE REGISTRATION OF HOSPITALS, NURSING HOMES AND MATERNITY HOMES, WAS PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (FRIDAY).

AT PRESENT, A FEE OF \$20 IS CHARGED FOR THE INITIAL REGISTRATION OF THESE MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS OR FOR THEIR RE-REGISTRATION AT THE END OF EVERY YEAR. THE BILL PROVIDES TWO SEPARATE FEES: FIRST REGISTRATION FEE AT \$1,350, AND SUBSEQUENT REGISTRATION FEE AT \$90.

"IT IS GOVERNMENT POLICY THAT FEES FOR THE REGISTRATION OF THESE INSTITUTIONS SHOULD BE SET AT A LEVEL WHICH ENSURES FULL COST-RECOVERY.

"THE PRESENT FEES HAVE NOT BEEN REVISED SINCE 1966 AS THE REVENUE INVOLVED IS VERY SMALL," A HEALTH AND WELFARE BRANCH SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE PROPOSED FEE INCREASES WILL ONLY AFFECT ABOUT 40 INSTITUTIONS. THE ADDITIONAL REVENUE GENERATED AMOUNTS TO SOME \$4,000 PER ANNUM.

THE BILL ALSO PROVIDES FOR FUTURE CHANGES IN FEES TO BE EFFECTED BY LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL RESOLUTION.

THE BILL WILL BE INTRODUCED INTO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ON OCTOBER 25.

FEES FOR HANDLING EXPLOSIVES REVISED
* * * * *

THE FEES FOR MANUFACTURING, STORING, MOVING OR USING EXPLOSIVES HAVE BEEN INCREASED WITH EFFECT FROM TODAY (FRIDAY).

THE NEW FEES ARE PRESCRIBED IN THE DANGEROUS GOODS (GENERAL) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989, DANGEROUS GOODS (GOVERNMENT EXPLOSIVES DEPOTS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989 AND MINES (SAFETY) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989, WHICH WERE PUBLISHED IN TODAY'S GAZETTE.

THE DANGEROUS GOODS (GENERAL) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989 INCREASE THE FEES FOR LICENCES AND PERMITS RELATING TO MANUFACTURING, STORING, MOVING AND USING VARIOUS CATEGORIES OF EXPLOSIVES.

THE DANGEROUS GOODS (GOVERNMENT EXPLOSIVES DEPOTS) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989 INCREASE THE FEES IN RESPECT OF THE STORAGE AND DELIVERY OF EXPLOSIVES AND EXPLOSIVES ACCESSORIES IN GOVERNMENT EXPLOSIVES DEPOTS.

THE MINES (SAFETY) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1989 PROVIDE FOR INCREASES IN FEES PAYABLE IN RESPECT OF MINE BLASTING CERTIFICATES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE MINES DIVISION OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT SAID THE REVISION FOLLOWED THE RISING OPERATING COSTS AND INCREASED RENTAL FOR THE DEPOTS.

"THE FEES RELATING TO THE ISSUE OF EXPLOSIVE LICENCES/PERMITS, THE STORAGE AND DELIVERY OF EXPLOSIVES AND THE ISSUE OF MINE BLASTING CERTIFICATES WERE LAST REVISED IN 1987," HE SAID.

"THE NEW FEES WILL HAVE MINIMAL EFFECT ON THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY AS THE COSTS OF EXPLOSIVES FORM ONLY A VERY SMALL PART OF THE TOTAL COSTS OF CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS."

THE OLD AND NEW FEES FOR SOME OF THE SERVICES SET OUT IN THE THREE REGULATIONS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THE DANGEROUS GOODS STANDING COMMITTEE HAD BEEN CONSULTED AND HAD AGREED TO THE INCREASES.

DISABLED GIVE MORE AT WORK
* * * * *

THE DISABLED ARE JUST AS COMPETENT AS THEIR ABLE-BODIED COUNTERPARTS IF THEY ARE GIVEN A FAIR CHANCE, THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR TONY HAMMOND, SAID TODAY (FRIDAY).

HE MADE THE REMARK AT THE NINTH SOUVENIRS PRESENTATION CEREMONY FOR EMPLOYERS OF DISABLED PERSONS ORGANISED BY THE SELECTIVE PLACEMENT DIVISION OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

THE ANNUAL EVENT IS TO PAY TRIBUTE TO EMPLOYERS WHO HAVE EITHER EMPLOYED A LARGE NUMBER OF DISABLED PERSONS OR HAVE MADE SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS TO ACCOMMODATE DISABLED EMPLOYEES.

MR HAMMOND TOLD THE GATHERING THAT EMPLOYERS WERE LIKELY TO TAKE ON MORE DISABLED EMPLOYEES AFTER THEY HAD GAINED PERSONAL EXPERIENCE IN ENGAGING DISABLED PERSONS AND KNEW MORE ABOUT THEIR WORKING ABILITIES.

"AMONG THE 12 EMPLOYERS WHO RECEIVE SOUVENIR PLAQUES TODAY, AT LEAST HALF OF THEM HAVE RECEIVED SUCH AWARDS BEFORE," HE SAID.

"DURING THE 12 MONTHS ENDING JUNE THIS YEAR, THE NUMBER OF EMPLOYERS WHO ENGAGED DISABLED EMPLOYEES THROUGH THE DIVISION PASSED THE 500 MARK FOR THE FIRST TIME, THOUGH IT IS NOT EASY TO BRING ABOUT A POSITIVE ATTITUDE TOWARDS THE EMPLOYMENT OF THE DISABLED," HE ADDED.

APART FROM OUTSTANDING EMPLOYERS, MR HAMMOND SAID PUBLIC RECOGNITION SHOULD ALSO BE GIVEN TO PRAISEWORTHY EMPLOYEES.

TO MAKE THIS YEAR'S CEREMONY MORE MEANINGFUL, OUTSTANDING DISABLED EMPLOYEES AWARDS WERE PRESENTED TO SEVEN DISABLED EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE DEMONSTRATED HARD WORK, ABILITY AND LOYALTY AT WORK.

"THEY PROVIDE REAL LIFE EXAMPLES OF THIS YEAR'S MESSAGE - THE DISABLED GIVE MORE AT WORK," MR HAMMOND SAID.

THE 12 ORGANISATIONS WHICH WERE AWARDED SOUVENIR PLAQUES EMPLOYED AMONG THEMSELVES A TOTAL OF 194 DISABLED EMPLOYEES BETWEEN JULY 1988 AND JUNE THIS YEAR.

PROPOSED RECLAMATION AT TUI MIN HOI, SAI KUNG

THE GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO GRANT SHORT TERM TENANCIES FOR BOATYARD PURPOSES AT TUI MIN HOI, SAI KUNG.

RECLAMATION AND ERECTION OF STRUCTURES FOR BOAT REPAIRING AND SLIPWAYS WILL BE ALLOWED WITHIN THE TENANCY AREAS, PART OF WHICH IS WITHIN AN AREA OF APPROXIMATELY 6,180 SQUARE METRES OF FORESHORE AND SEABED.

THE EXTENT OF THE AREA AFFECTED WAS DESCRIBED IN A NOTICE PUBLISHED IN THE GAZETTE TODAY (FRIDAY).

ANY PERSON WHO CONSIDERS THAT HE HAS AN INTEREST, RIGHT OR EASEMENT IN OR OVER THE FORESHORE AND SEABED INVOLVED MAY SUBMIT A WRITTEN OBJECTION TO THE DIRECTOR OF BUILDINGS AND LANDS ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 21.

THE NOTICE OF SUCH OBJECTION SHOULD DESCRIBE THE INTEREST, RIGHT OR EASEMENT OF THE OBJECTOR AND THE MANNER IN WHICH HE ALLEGES HE WILL BE AFFECTED.

PSPS DEVELOPMENT ON TSING YI

A PRIVATE SECTOR PARTICIPATION SCHEME DEVELOPMENT WILL BE UNDERTAKEN ON A 9,860-SQUARE-METRE SITE ON TSING YI ISLAND.

UNDER THE SCHEME, MORE THAN 900 RESIDENTIAL UNITS, RANGING FROM 35 TO 55 SQUARE METRES, WILL BE PROVIDED. OVER 500 OF THEM WILL HAVE THREE BEDROOMS.

THE DEVELOPER IS ALSO REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A THREE-CLASSROOM KINDERGARTEN AND A 3,200-SQUARE-METRE OPEN SPACE, INCLUDING TENNIS COURTS AND A CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND.

THE SITE, WHICH IS LOCATED IN AREA 1 OF THE ISLAND, IS BEING OFFERED FOR SALE BY TENDER BY THE BUILDINGS AND LANDS DEPARTMENT.

THE DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION OF TENDERS IS NOON ON NOVEMBER 17.

TENDERS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED TO THE CENTRAL TENDER BOARD, AND PLACED IN THE TENDER BOX AT THE LIFT LOBBY OF THE EAST WING OF THE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT OFFICES AT LOWER ALBERT ROAD, CENTRAL.

OCCUPYING A SITE AREA OF ABOUT 5,500 SQUARE METRES, THE SCHOOL WILL HAVE SIX STOREYS, COMPRISING 30 STANDARD CLASSROOMS, FOUR SPECIAL CLASSROOMS, AN ASSEMBLY HALL, A BASKETBALL COURT, A COVERED PLAYGROUND AND A ROOFTOP PLAYGROUND.

THE ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE PROJECT WHICH IS EXPECTED TO START IN FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR AND WILL TAKE ABOUT 16 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

HONG KONG'S HIKING AND MOUNTAINEERING GROUPS WILL TURN OUT IN FULL FORCE ON SUNDAY (SEPTEMBER 24) IN SUPPORT OF THE WORLD DAY OF CLEAN MOUNTAINS BY CLEANING UP THE LION ROCK AND KAM SHAN COUNTRY PARKS.

THE CLEANING EXPEDITIONS ARE JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE HONG KONG MOUNTAINEERING UNION, THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF HIKING GROUPS AND THE AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES DEPARTMENT.

THE DAY'S ACTIVITIES WILL BE LAUNCHED BY SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, THE HON PRESIDENT OF THE HONG KONG MOUNTAINEERING UNION, AT A CEREMONY TO BE HELD AT A PICNIC SITE IN THE LION ROCK COUNTRY PARK AT 10.15 AM.

ALSO OFFICIATING AT THE CEREMONY WILL BE AFD'S ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (CONSERVATION AND COUNTRY PARKS), MR FRANK LAU.

THE CLEAN-UP ACTIVITIES ALSO FORM PART OF THE PROMOTION FOR THE HIKING LITTER WARDEN SCHEME ORGANISED BY AFD TO ENCOURAGE PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN KEEPING THE COUNTRYSIDE ENVIRONMENT CLEAN.

THE WORLD DAY OF CLEAN MOUNTAINS IS DESIGNATED BY THE INTERNATIONAL UNION OF ALPINIST ASSOCIATION TO DRAW PUBLIC ATTENTION TO THE NEED FOR BETTER PROTECTION OF THE MOUNTAIN ENVIRONMENT.

THE WORLD DAY OF CLEAN MOUNTAINS WILL BE CELEBRATED ON THE WEEKEND OF SEPTEMBER 23 AND 24 IN THE NORTHERN HEMISPHERE AND IN THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE ON THE WEEKEND OF MARCH 17 AND 18, 1990.

NEW CASE OF CHOLERA CONFIRMED

* * * *

A 30-YEAR-OLD MAN WAS TODAY (FRIDAY) CONFIRMED TO BE SUFFERING FROM CHOLERA, THE 23RD CASE REPORTED SO FAR THIS YEAR.

ANNOUNCING THIS, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SAID THE PATIENT BECAME ILL ON WEDNESDAY (SEPTEMBER 20) AND WAS SUFFERING FROM ABDOMINAL PAIN, VOMITTING AND DIARRHOEA.

HE ATTENDED THE YAN OI POLYCLINIC IN TUEN MUN YESTERDAY AND WAS LATER TRANSFERRED TO PRINCESS MARGARET HOSPITAL WHERE HE WAS ADMITTED.

TESTS CARRIED OUT IN THE HOSPITAL CONFIRMED TODAY THAT THE MAN HAD CONTRACTED CHOLERA. HIS CONDITION WAS TODAY DESCRIBED BY THE ATTENDING DOCTOR AS "FAIR".

THIS PATIENT HAD BEEN AWAY FROM HONG KONG AND RETURNED ONE DAY BEFORE ONSET OF SYMPTOMS. THE CASE WAS ACCORDINGLY CLASSIFIED AS AN IMPORTED ONE.

MEANWHILE, OFFICERS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT HAD VISITED THE PATIENT'S HOME IN TUEN MUN AND ALL FAMILY MEMBERS HAD BEEN EXAMINED AND GIVEN PREVENTIVE DRUGS. THE PREMISES HAD ALSO BEEN DISINFECTED.

THE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THAT DESPITE THE ONSET OF THE COOLER SEASON, MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WERE STILL ADVISED TO OBSERVE FOOD, PERSONAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL HYGIENE TO PREVENT THEIR CONTRACTING DIARRHOEAL DISEASES.

RESIDENTS WHO HAVE NOT YET REGISTERED AS ELECTORS ARE URGED TO DO SO BEFORE THE CURRENT REGISTRATION CAMPAIGN CLOSES AT THE END OF THE MONTH.

THE APPEAL WAS MADE BY THE CENTRAL AND WESTERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR STEPHEN FISHER, THIS (FRIDAY) MORNING AFTER OFFICIATING AT A DRAW OF CORRECT ENTRIES IN THE DISTRICT'S VOTER REGISTRATION CROSSWORD-PUZZLE COMPETITION.

MR FISHER STRESSED THAT RESIDENTS WHO MISS THE REGISTRATION DEADLINE CAN STILL REGISTER WITH THE REGISTRATION AND ELECTORAL DIVISION BY NOVEMBER 20 IF THEY WANT TO HAVE THEIR NAMES ON THE FINAL REGISTER TO BE RELEASED IN JANUARY.
