


Explanatory Note.

(This Note is not part of the by-laws, but is intended to indicate their general purport).


At present, by virtue of the provisions of by-law 2 of the Conservancy By-laws, the charges for the conservancy service provided by the Urban Council vary according to the purposes for which premises are used. It has been decided that this variation in the charges should be dispensed with, and that the charges for this service should no longer be dependent on the user of premises. These by-laws amend the Conservancy By-laws to give effect to that decision and their effect is to substitute for the present charges a standard charge of sixteen dollars per quarter. The opportunity has been taken to make provision for the payment of these charges where the provision of the conservancy service is commenced during the currency of any half-yearly period.



Resolved, pursuant to section 4 of the Dutiable Commodities Ordinance, Chapter 109, that the duties on Tobacco set forth in the Resolution of the Legislative Council published as Government Notification No. A. 13 in the *Gazette* of the 14th January, 1949, be revoked with effect from 2 o'clock P.M. on Wednesday, the 25th February, 1959, and that thereafter duty shall be payable on tobacco at the following rates per lb.:





In exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Business Registration Ordinance, 1959, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—



Explanatory Note.

(This Note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to
 indicate their general purport).

1. These regulations provide for the various forms to be used in connexion
 with the Ordinance (regulations 3, 5, 6 and 9). The application for exemption,
 Form 3, being a declaration, requires stamping to the value of \$3.00 under
 the Stamp Ordinance, Cap. 117.

2. Regulation 4 provides that the register shall consist of the application forms submitted and as kept up to date by the Commissioner.

3. The fees chargeable under regulation 7 are for the issue of a certified copy of a document kept by the Commissioner under the Ordinance, and for the issue of duplicate business registration certificates issued by the Commissioner to a person required to exhibit it at his places of business.

4. Regulation 8 exempts the business of bootblack and all such hawkers as are required to be licensed under the Hawkers By-laws other than those hawkers carrying on business within the main structure of any building. This exception is made on the grounds that these hawkers are usually carrying on a substantial business; but they will, however, be exempted from the payment of fees under section 9 of the Ordinance if their profits are small.

HONG KONG AUXILIARY POLICE FORCE ORDINANCE, 1959.

(No. 2 of 1959).

HONG KONG AUXILIARY POLICE FORCE (PENSIONS) REGULATIONS, 1959.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 28 of the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force Ordinance, 1959, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force (Pensions) Regulations, 1959, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force Ordinance, 1959.

Citation and commencement.

2. In calculating, for the purpose of determining the amount of any pension which may be payable under these regulations, the amount of pay which was payable to any member at the date or time of the injury as a result of which the pension has become payable, it shall be presumed that the member had been called out for active service notwithstanding that he had been called out under subsection (2) of section 16 of the Ordinance for the purpose of training or of assisting the Police Force or was under instruction.

Provisions as to calculation of pay.

3. If a member is permanently injured—

(a) in the actual discharge of his duty; and

(b) without his own default; and

(c) on account of circumstances specifically attributable to the nature of his duty,

Pension on account of injury of member.

he may be granted a pension at the annual rate of the proportion of his pay at the date of his injury appropriate to his case as shown in the following table—

When, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, his capacity to contribute to his own support is—

Slightly impaired	: five sixtieths
Impaired	: ten sixtieths
Materially impaired	: fifteen sixtieths
Totally destroyed	: twenty sixtieths.

4. (1) If a member dies as a result of injuries received—

(a) in the actual discharge of his duty; and

(b) without his own default; and

Pension to dependants when member killed on duty.

- (c) on account of circumstances specifically attributable to the nature of his duty,

it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant—

- (i) to the dependants of such member a gratuity not exceeding nine months' pay:

Provided that the dependants who shall be recipients of any gratuity granted under this regulation shall be such as may be named in the award in each particular case and the gratuity shall not form part of the estate for the purpose of distribution nor shall it be taken into account in computing estate duty:

- (ii) if the deceased member leaves a widow, a pension to her, while unmarried and of good character, at a rate not exceeding ten sixtieths of his annual pay at the date of the injury or four hundred and eighty dollars a year, whichever is the greater, or, in exceptional cases, at a rate not exceeding one fourth of such pay;
- (iii) if the deceased member leaves a widow to whom a pension is granted under sub-paragraph (ii) and a child or children, a pension in respect of each child of an amount not exceeding one eighth of the pension prescribed under sub-paragraph (ii);
- (iv) if the deceased member leaves a child or children, but does not leave a widow or no pension is granted to the widow, a pension in respect of each child, of double the amount prescribed by sub-paragraph (iii);
- (v) if the deceased member leaves a child or children and a widow to whom a pension is granted under sub-paragraph (ii), and the widow subsequently dies, a pension in respect of each child as from the date of the death of the widow of double the amount prescribed in sub-paragraph (iii);
- (vi) if the deceased member does not leave a widow, or if no pension is granted to his widow, and if his mother was wholly or mainly dependent on him for her support, a pension to the mother, while of good character and without adequate means of support, of an amount not exceeding the pension which might have been granted to his widow:

Provided that—

- (a) pensions shall not be payable under this regulation at any time in respect of more than six children;
- (b) in the case of a pension granted under sub-paragraph (vi), if the mother is a widow at the time of the grant of the pension and subsequently remarries; such pension shall cease as from the date of remarriage; and if it appears to the Governor in

Council at any time that the mother is adequately provided with other means of support, such pension shall cease as from such date as the Governor in Council may determine; and


- (c) a pension granted to a child under this regulation shall cease in the case of a male at the age of eighteen years and in the case of a female on marriage or at the age of twenty one years.
- (2) For the purposes of this regulation—
- (a) where a member contracts a marriage and by reason of the form thereof he is precluded from being married to another person at the same time, "wife" shall mean the woman to whom such member is lawfully married;
- (b) where a member contracts a marriage and by reason of the form thereof he is or becomes lawfully married to more than one woman at the same time, "wife" shall mean the woman whom such member first married:

Provided that in the event of any wife eligible for a pension under this regulation ceasing to be so eligible and at the time of such cessation the member was lawfully married as aforesaid to another wife or other wives the member shall be deemed for the purposes of this regulation to have become a widower at the time of such cessation aforesaid and simultaneously to have married the woman who at such time was his wife and whom he married first after his marriage to the wife who has ceased to be eligible as aforesaid;

- (c) where a member contracts a lawful Chinese customary marriage "wife" shall mean the kit fat or tin fong wife;
- (d) "widow" shall mean the woman who is the wife of a member at the time of his death;
- (e) "child" shall mean—

(i) the child of a member borne by a woman who is the wife of such member at the time of the birth; and

(ii) a person wholly or mainly dependent upon the deceased member for support, adopted as a child by such member before the date of injury in a manner recognized by the Governor.

These regulations are consequential upon the enactment of the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force Ordinance, 1959. Regulations 10 and 11 of the Police Reserve Regulations and the First Schedule to the Emergency (Special Constabulary) Regulations, 1950, which these regulations replace, made identical provisions for the payment of gratuities and pensions to members of the Police Reserve and the Special Constabulary, respectively, and their dependants. These regulations make provision for the payment of gratuities and pensions to members of the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force and their dependants. The provisions of these regulations are identical with the provisions of the regulations which they replace.

HONG KONG AUXILIARY POLICE FORCE ORDINANCE, 1959.

(No. 2 of 1959).

HONG KONG AUXILIARY POLICE FORCE REGULATIONS, 1959.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 28 of the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

Citation and commencement.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force Regulations, 1959, and shall come into operation on the day appointed for the commencement of the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force Ordinance, 1959.

Interpretation.

2. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—
“instruction” means any period of duty, not being active service and not exceeding six hours in duration, performed at such time and at such place as may from time to time be directed by order of the Commissioner;

“instruction period” means instruction for any period not exceeding one hour in duration;

“Pay Code” means the code and regulations relating to pay and allowances applicable to Her Majesty’s Military Forces for the time being in force;

“training” means duty, not being active service, exceeding six hours in duration in any one day and performed at such time and at such place as may from time to time be directed by order of the Commissioner;

(24 of 1951).

“volunteer” means a member other than a person upon whom a liability to enrol therein has been imposed under the provisions of the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1951.

Application of Pay Code.

3. For the purposes of these regulations, the Pay Code shall be applied subject to the following provisions—

First Schedule.

- (a) no member shall be deemed to be locally domiciled; and
(b) the ranks of members specified in the first column of the First Schedule shall be deemed to correspond with the ranks in Her Majesty’s Military Forces specified in the second column of that Schedule.

4. (1) Save in so far as the Commissioner may by order in writing exempt any member therefrom, every member shall in each year of service comply with the following requirements as to efficiency—

- (a) perform such periods of training, not exceeding in the aggregate fourteen days, as the Commissioner may from time to time by order direct; and
(b) perform, to the satisfaction of the Commissioner, such number of instruction periods, not being less than sixty nor more than one hundred, as the Commissioner may from time to time by order direct.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation every year shall be deemed to commence on the 1st day of October and expire on the 30th day of September next following.

(3) Nothing in this regulation shall be construed to prevent a member from volunteering, subject to the prior consent of the Commissioner, for additional training or instruction.

5. Every member who is called out for active service shall be entitled in respect of each day or part of a day of such service to the pay and allowances prescribed in the Pay Code. Pay, allowances, for active service.

6. Every member who is called out for training shall be entitled in respect of each day of training to the pay and allowances prescribed in the Pay Code at the rates applicable on the 31st day of December, 1955. Pay and allowances for training.

7. Every member when under instruction shall be entitled to the allowances specified in the following table— Allowances for instruction.

TABLE.

Rank of member	Allowance in respect of each instruction period	Maximum amount payable in respect of any one day's instruction
Constables	\$ 0.70	\$ 4.20
Corporals	0.90	5.40
Sergeants and above	1.10	6.60
Inspectors and Gazetted Officers	1.30	7.80

8. (1) Any member who in addition to fulfilling all of the requirements as to efficiency prescribed in regulation 4, completes in excess of the minimum number of instruction periods required by that regulation— Bounty.

- (a) ten instruction periods, shall be entitled to a bounty of fifty dollars; or

(b) thirty instruction periods, shall be entitled to a bounty of two hundred dollars.

(2) For the purposes of this regulation, notwithstanding any order of the Commissioner to the contrary, the minimum number of instruction periods required by regulation 4 shall be deemed to be sixty.

9. Such clothing, equipment and weapons as the Commissioner may direct shall be issued to members, but shall be and shall remain the property of the Government and shall be produced or delivered up at any time as directed by the Commissioner.

10. Applications for enrolment in the Force by volunteers shall be made in writing in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule and addressed to the Commissioner.

11. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3), a volunteer may resign from the Force by giving to the Commissioner not less than one month's notice in writing of his intention to resign.

(2) If, at the time any such notice of intention to resign expires, the volunteer by whom such notice was given is on active service, he shall, notwithstanding the expiration of such notice, continue to serve until the order by which he was called out for active service is cancelled, and any volunteer who fails so to continue to serve shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of one thousand dollars and to imprisonment for twelve months.

(3) Save with the permission of the Commissioner, no volunteer may resign from the Force until he has completed one year's service from the day on which he was enrolled therein, and any volunteer who purports to resign from the Force without such permission within one year from such day shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of five hundred dollars.

12. The resignation of a member, other than a volunteer, shall be subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1951.

Retirement.

13. Every member shall be retired on reaching the age of fifty years:

Provided that the Commissioner may, on the application of any member, extend his membership for periods not exceeding two years at a time until such member reaches the age of sixty years.

Recovery of
the cost of

14. If any volunteer ceases to be a member by resignation or dismissal, otherwise than under the provisions of regulation 15, within twelve months after enrolment, he shall, if so required by the Com-

missioner, in addition to delivering up any clothing issued to him for the purpose of his service in the Force, pay to the Commissioner the cost price to Government of such clothing at the date of issue, and such price shall be recoverable by the Commissioner upon complaint before a magistrate.

15. Any member who sustains any injury or contracts any illness in the course of and arising out of the discharge of duty or which is directly attributable to the discharge of such duty shall be entitled— Medical treatment.

(a) to medical treatment, including admission to hospital, in the manner prescribed by the General Orders of the Government for members of the Police Force of equivalent rank; and

(b) to receive pay and allowances at the rates prescribed by regulation 6 in respect of training until such time as—

(i) a Government medical officer certifies that he has recovered from such injury or illness; or

(ii) he is awarded a pension in respect of such injury or illness under the Hong Kong Auxiliary Police Force (Pensions) Regulations, 1959.

16. Whenever any member is certified, by a medical board appointed by the Governor, unfit for further service on account of ill health, the Commissioner shall inform such member in writing that he has been invalidated out of the Force and he shall thereupon cease to be a member. Invalidating.

17. It shall be lawful for the Commissioner upon report made by the Commandant to grant rewards to any member who may distinguish himself by extraordinary diligence, zeal or exertion in the execution of his duties. Rewards for extraordinary service.







EXPORTATION OF COTTON MANUFACTURES (PROHIBITION)
REGULATIONS, 1959.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Importation and Exportation Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Exportation of Cotton Manufactures (Prohibition) Regulations, 1959. Citation.


2. No person shall, except under an export licence granted by the Director of Commerce and Industry, export from the Colony to the United Kingdom any manufactures wholly or mainly of cotton other than manufactures specified in the Schedule. Prohibition of export of cotton manufactures except under licence. Schedule.

3. These regulations shall have effect from the 1st day of February, 1959, until the 31st day of January, 1962, both dates inclusive. Duration.


A specially appointed Negotiating Committee, representative of the Hong Kong textile industry, after holding discussions with representatives of the United Kingdom Cotton Board, has undertaken to restrict exports of cotton goods to the United Kingdom to an agreed annual amount for a period of three years only and has asked the Hong Kong Government to make the necessary legal and administrative arrangements for the proper carrying out of the undertaking.

2. These regulations therefore, provide that with the exception of those manufactures specified in the Schedule thereto, no person shall export any manufacture wholly or mainly of cotton without an export licence.
