**\$100 000 INDUSTRIAL SAFETY QUIZ DRIVE STARTS**

**\* \* \* \* \***

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT TODAY (TUESDAY) LAUNCHED THE FIRST PROJECT IN ITS MILLION-DOLLAR INDUSTRIAL SAFETY CAMPAIGN FOR 1981/82 - A QUIZ CONTEST WHICH CARRIES MORE THAN \$100 000 WORTH OF PRIZES, INCLUDING A \$30 000 CHARADE PRIVATE CAR.

THE FOUR-MONTH LONG CONTEST IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT, HONG KONG DAILY NEWS AND REDIFFUSION TELEVISION LTD. AND CO-SPONSORED BY TAI FAT HONG LTD., PHILIPS HONG KONG LTD. AND KONG KING TRADING COMPANY.

ANNOUNCING DETAILS OF THE COMPETITION AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY, THE DEPARTMENT'S CHIEF FACTORY INSPECTOR, MR CHAN SHIU-LAP, POINTED OUT THAT THE CONTEST AIMED AT INCREASING AWARENESS OF THE NEED TO IMPROVE STANDARDS OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY.

+WHILE WE CONTINUE TO ENFORCE STRICTLY THE LAW TO MINIMISE RISKS IN PLACES OF WORK, WE FEEL THAT THIS HAS TO BE SUPPORTED BY EDUCATING THE PUBLIC, IN PARTICULAR THE WORKERS AND EMPLOYERS, TO BE MORE SAFETY CONSCIOUS,+ HE STRESSED.

MR CHAN SAID THE NEWS MEDIA IN HONG KONG HAD CONTRIBUTED ENORMOUSLY TO PROMOTING INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THEY WOULD CONTINUE TO SUPPORT IT THIS YEAR.

ALSO PRESENT AT THE CONFERENCE WERE REPRESENTATIVES OF HONG KONG DAILY NEWS, RTV AND THE CO-SPONSORS.

THE REPRESENTATIVE OF PHILIPS HONG KONG LTD. SAID ANY INDUSTRIAL SAFETY CAMPAIGN SHOULD INVOLVE FOUR PARTIES - THE WORKERS, EMPLOYERS, THE GOVERNMENT AND THE MEDIA, AND THAT PHILIPS WAS PARTICIPATING IN THE QUIZ COMPETITION AS EMPLOYERS.

+WE BELIEVE THAT INDUSTRIAL SAFETY IS AN EXTREMELY WORTHWHILE COMMUNITY CAUSE TO SUPPORT. WE HOPE THAT BY DONATING TELEVISION SETS AS PRIZES IN THE QUIZ, WE WILL CONTRIBUTE TO INCREASING THE AWARENESS OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY AMONG HONG KONG RESIDENTS,+ SHE ADDED.

THE CONTEST IS SPLIT INTO TWO PARTS - THE FIRST PART CONSISTS OF THREE PRELIMINARY COMPETITIONS AND THE SECOND PART FEATURES A GRAND FINALE.

THE FIRST PRELIMINARY IS SCHEDULED TO BE HELD THIS MONTH AND THE SECOND IN JULY AND THE THIRD IN AUGUST.

FROM TOMORROW, THE HONG KONG DAILY NEWS WILL PUBLISH A LINE DRAWING AND MULTIPLE CHOICE QUESTIONS FOR THE FIRST PRELIMINARY DAILY FROM MONDAY TO SATURDAY THROUGHOUT THIS MONTH. HONG KONG TV NEWS AND RTV'S TV TIMES WILL ALSO PUBLISH THE DRAWING AND QUESTIONS TWICE IN THE SAME MONTH.

LINE DRAWINGS AND MULTIPLE-CHOICE QUESTIONS FOR THE OTHER PRELIMINARIES WILL BE PUBLISHED IN THE SAME WAY IN THE FOLLOWING TWO MONTHS.

#### **NO-SMOKING CAMPAIGN TO START IN HOSPITALS**

**SMOKING WILL BE PROHIBITED FOR A SIX-MONTH TRIAL PERIOD  
IN MOST AREAS IN THE THREE MAJOR GOVERNMENT HOSPITALS -- QUEEN  
MARY, QUEEN ELIZABETH AND PRINCESS MARGARET -- TO ENSURE A  
CLEAN AND HEALTHY ATMOSPHERE.**

**THE RESTRICTION WILL BE ENFORCED FROM MONDAY, JUNE 8, AND IS  
IN LINE WITH GOVERNMENT POLICY TO DISCOURAGE PEOPLE FROM SMOKING  
IN PUBLIC PLACES. AS THE DEPARTMENT IS DIRECTLY CONCERNED WITH  
THE HEALTH OF THE PUBLIC, IT CONSIDERS IT NECESSARY TO TAKE THE  
LEAD IN ANY ANTI-SMOKING CAMPAIGN, A SPOKESMAN FOR THE MEDICAL AND  
HEALTH DEPARTMENT SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).**

**NO-SMOKING AREAS IN THE HOSPITALS ARE THE WARDS, CONSULTATION  
AND TREATMENT ROOMS, OPERATING THEATRES, DISPENSARIES, LABORATORIES,  
X-RAY DEPARTMENTS, KITCHENS AND PANTRIES, LIFTS, LIBRARIES AND  
CONFERENCE ROOMS.**

**+PATIENTS, VISITORS AND STAFF ALIKE WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO  
SMOKE IN THESE AREAS,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.**

**AS A REMINDER AND TO HELP CARRY THE ANTI-SMOKING MESSAGE,  
STICKERS AND POSTERS WILL BE PUT UP IN ALL CONSPICUOUS PLACES  
IN THE NO-SMOKING AREAS.**

**+THE TRIAL SCHEME WILL BE REVIEWED TO DETERMINE WHETHER TO  
EXTEND THE MEASURES TO ALL OTHER MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS WITHIN  
THE DEPARTMENT,+ HE SAID.**

MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WERE URGED TO COOPERATE IF APPROACHED BY HOSPITAL STAFF AND TOLD NOT TO SMOKE.

+IT IS ONLY WITH THE COOPERATION OF PATIENTS, VISITORS AND STAFF CAN WE MAINTAIN A HEALTHIER ENVIRONMENT FOR EVERYONE IN OUR HOSPITALS,+ HE SAID.

### MORE YOUTHS SOUGHT FOR COMMUNITY CLUBS \* \* \* \* \*

A RECRUITMENT DRIVE FOR COMMUNITY YOUTH CLUBS (CYC) MEMBERS HAS JUST STARTED AND STAFF FROM THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL VISIT SOME 200 SCHOOLS IN THE NEXT TWO MONTHS TO BOOST MEMBERSHIP, MR MICHAEL LEUNG, DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION SAID TODAY (TUESDAY).

SPEAKING AT A LUNCHEON MEETING OF THE CITY LIONS CLUB OF HONG KONG, HE SAID THAT AT PRESENT MORE THAN 50 000 PRIMARY AND SECONDARY STUDENTS FROM 474 SCHOOLS HAVE JOINED THE CYC SCHEME.

THE LIONS CLUB HAS BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH THE SCHEME SINCE IT FIRST STARTED IN 1978 TO TRAIN YOUNG PEOPLE IN GOOD CITIZENSHIP, MR LEUNG NOTED.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE SCHEME IS CONFINED TO STUDENTS FROM PRIMARY 4 TO FORM 7 LEVELS, AND IT TAKES THE FORM OF SCHOOL CLUBS ENGAGED IN EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES INVOLVING SOCIALLY ORIENTATED TOPICS.

+IN THE COMING SCHOOL YEAR, WE HAVE PLANNED NO LESS THAN 16 SUCH AREAS OF WORK, AND THE MAIN ONES INCLUDE: CLEAN HONG KONG, FIGHT CRIME, COUNTRYSIDE CONSERVATION, ROAD SAFETY AND CONSUMER EDUCATION,+ MR LEUNG SAID.

BY THEIR INVOLVEMENT IN RELATED EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES, CYC MEMBERS BECOME USEFUL MEMBERS OF SOCIETY AND DEVELOP CORRECT SOCIAL ATTITUDES WHEN THEY ARE STILL AT SCHOOL.

THE CYC PROMOTES PRACTICAL MORAL EDUCATION BY ENCOURAGING THE YOUNG TO SEE BEYOND THEMSELVES INTO A WIDER WORLD AND TO DEVELOP A SENSE OF CONCERN AND RESPONSIBILITY FOR OTHERS, MR LEUNG SAID.

GOVERNOR TO VISIT TSING YI ISLAND

THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, WILL VISIT TSING YI ISLAND ON THURSDAY, JUNE 4, ACCOMPANIED BY SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR DAVID AKERS-JONES.

HIS PROGRAMME WILL INCLUDE A TOUR OF THE HONG KONG UNITED DOCKYARD, VISITS TO CHEUNG CHING AND CHEUNG HONG PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES ACCOMPANIED BY THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (WEST), MR CHAN PAK, A BRIEFING ON TSING YI ISLAND DEVELOPMENTS BY THE TOWN MANAGER AND DISTRICT OFFICER TSUEN WAN, DR JAMES HAYES, AND A MEETING AND LUNCH WITH LOCAL LEADERS.

PWD APRIL CONTRACTS TOTAL \$241 MILLION

THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AWARDED 76 CONTRACTS WORTH MORE THAN \$241 MILLION IN APRIL.

THE LARGEST CONTRACT, WORTH ABOUT \$74 MILLION, WAS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE TAI HANG ROAD FLYOVER.

THE FLYOVER, MEASURING 550 METRES IN LENGTH, WILL RUN FROM THE LOWER END OF TAI HANG ROAD THROUGH MORETON TERRACE CROSSING CAUSEWAY ROAD TO JOIN GLOUCESTER ROAD ON THE WESTERN SIDE OF VICTORIA PARK.

WORK ON THE CONTRACT WILL ALSO INCLUDE THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PEDESTRIAN FOOTBRIDGE AND AN OFF-STREET BUS TERMINUS.

OF THE CONTRACTS AWARDED DURING THE MONTH, 39 WERE RECOMMENDED BY THE CENTRAL TENDER BOARD AND OTHERS BY PWD TENDER BOARD.

APPLICATION MAY NOW BE MADE UNTIL JUNE 29 FOR GRANTS FROM THE HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB MUSIC FUND FOR THE 1981-1982 YEAR.

THE GRANTS ARE FROM A TRUST FUND ESTABLISHED WITH A DONATION OF \$10 MILLION FROM THE ROYAL HONG KONG JOCKEY CLUB TO PROMOTE MUSIC AND DANCE ACTIVITIES IN HONG KONG.

GRANTS AMOUNTING TO MORE THAN TWO MILLION DOLLARS HAVE ALREADY BEEN MADE IN THE PAST FROM INCOME FROM THE TRUST FUND TO SUPPLY INSTRUMENTS FOR NEW YOUTH ORCHESTRAS, TO ORGANISE INSTRUMENTAL TRAINING FOR CHILDREN AND GENERALLY TO DEVELOP MUSIC ACTIVITIES AND THE PERFORMING ARTS.

SO FAR SOME 170 SCHOOLS AS WELL AS MUSIC AND DANCE ORGANISATIONS HAVE BENEFITED FROM THE GRANTS.
