NO SIGNIFICANCE IN WALLED CITY VISIT

* * * *

THERE WAS NO SPECIAL SIGNIFICANCE IN THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, MR MICHAEL THOMAS'S VISIT TO THE WALLED CITY ON THURSDAY, THE CHIEF SECRETARY, SIR DAVID AKERS-JONES, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING TO REPORTERS AFTER TOURING THE AUTUMN FAIR OF THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, SIR DAVID SAID MR THOMAS JUST WANTED TO SEE FOR HIMSELF WHAT THE CONDITIONS WERE LIKE IN THE WALLED CITY.

+IT'S ALWAYS USEFUL FOR PEOPLE TO KNOW WHAT THE CONDITIONS ARE LIKE IN THE WALLED CITY,+ HE NOTED.

SIR DAVID SAID WHAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD BEEN DOING IN THE WALLED CITY DURING THE PAST FEW YEARS WAS TO HELP WITH THE COLLECTION OF REFUSE, GENERALLY TO PUT SOME STREET LIGHTING IN, TO PAVE THE PATHWAYS OF THE WALLED CITY, AND TO TRY AND HELP WITH THE WATER SUPPLY.

+IT HAS BEEN A CONTINUING PROGRAMME FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS NOW,+ HE ADDED.

ASKED WHETHER THE ISSUE OF THE WALLED CITY WOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE AGENDA OF THE NEXT MEETING OF THE JOINT LIAISON GROUP, SIR DAVID SAID: +THE AGENDA FOR THE JOINT LIAISON GROUP IS A CONFIDENTIAL MATTER, SO I CAN'T DISCUSS THE AGENDA OF THE JOINT LIAISON GROUP.+

THE GOVERNOR, SIR EDWARD YOUDE, THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING VISITED THE HANG SENG SCHOOL OF COMMERCE AT SIU LEK YUEN, SHA TIN, TO INSPECT THE SCHOOL'S LATEST FACILITIES.

SIR EDWARD WAS WELCOMED BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE SCHOOL'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS, MR S.H. HO; THE VICE-CHAIRMAN AND SUPERVISOR OF THE SCHOOL, MR Q.W. LEE; A MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, MR A.S.K. AU- THE SCHOOL'S PRESIDENT, MR N.M. HO, AND VICE-PRESIDENT, MR L.B. CURZON.

SIR EDWARD WAS SHOWN A SELECTION OF THE SCHOOL'S EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES, DESIGNED TO MEET THE NEEDS OF SOME 600 STUDENTS WORKING ON A TWO-YEAR FULL-TIME DIPLOMA IN BUSINESS STUDIES. THESE INCLUDED THE COMPUTER INSTALLATION USED TO TEACH STUDENTS THE PRACTICAL APPLICATION OF COMPUTER TECHNIQUES IN THE BUSINESS SECTOR.

SIR EDWARD SHOWED GREAT INTEREST IN A TUTORIAL GROUP LEARNING PUTONGHUA AND TALKED TO A FEW STUDENTS.

HE LATER SAW AN EXHIBITION OF A STUDENTS' PROJECT ON +THE YOUTH OF HONG KONG+.

JENKINS BILL +COMING TO A HEAD+

IT NOW SEEMED CLEAR THAT THE JENKINS BILL ISSUE WOULD COME TO A HEAD IN THE SENATE NEXT WEEK, THE DIRECTOR OF TRADE, MR HAMISH MACLEOD, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

MR MACLEOD SAID THE UNITED STATES SENATE WILL PROBABLY DEBATE THE BILL AND VARIOUS AMENDMENTS TO IT ON WEDNESDAY (NOVEMBER 13) AND THURSDAY.

HE EXPLAINED THAT AGREEMENT HAS BEEN REACHED AMONG KEY SENATORS TO BRING UP THE ORIGINAL VERSION OF THE THURMOND/JENKINS BILL AS PASSED BY THE HOUSE FOR FULL SENATE CONSIDERATION ON WEDNESDAY AS A FREE STANDING BILL. IF 60 OR MORE SENATORS SUPPORT THIS COURSE OF ACTION, DEBATE WILL FOLLOW.

+WE UNDERSTAND THAT IT HAS BEEN FURTHER AGREED THAT NO MORE THAN 24 AMENDMENTS TO THE BILL WILL BE ALLOWED, AND A SPECIFIED TIME LIMIT HAS BEEN SET FOR DEBATING EACH OF THEM.

+FINAL VOTING ON THE BILL, WITH ANY AMENDMENTS AGREED, WILL PROBABLY OCCUR NO LATER THAN NOON (U.S. TIME), ON THURSDAY,+ MR MACLEOD SAID.

THE PREVIOUS REVISION OF THE BILL (OR A FURTHER REVISED VERSION OF IT) PROPOSED BY SENATORS THURMOND AND HOLLINGS WILL BE DEALT WITH AS ONE AMENDMENT. OTHER AMENDMENTS ARE LIKELY TO INCLUDE A PROPOSAL TO EXEMPT THOSE COUNTRIES HAVING MORE OPEN MARKETS THAN THE UNITED STATES FROM THE APPLICATION OF THE BILL, AND TWO SEPARATE PROPOSALS TO STRIKE OUT THE PROVISION FOR IMPORT LICENSING. THERE IS ANOTHER AMENDMENT PROPOSING TO APPLY THE BILL TO COUNTRIES INCLUDING THE EEC AND CANADA.

+OUR WASHINGTON TEAM IS MONITORING THE SITUATION VERY CLOSELY AND WILL ACT AS NECESSARY IN THE LIGHT OF DEVELOPMENTS,+ SAID MR MACLEOD.

MR MACLEOD ALSO MENTIONED AN ENCOURAGING DEVELOPMENT. SENATOR DANIEL EVANS MET PRESIDENT REAGAN IN THE WHITE HOUSE ON THURSDAY (NOVEMBER 7), AND SAID AFTERWARDS: +I AM ABSOLUTELY CONVINCED THE PRESIDENT WILL VETO THE PROTECTIONIST TEXTILE BILL IN ANY FORM. I HATE TO SEND A BILL DOWN TO HIM THAT REQUIRES HIM TO GO THROUGH ALL THE PROBLEMS OF A VETO. WE WILL DO EVERYTHING WE CAN TO KEEP THAT FROM HAPPENING IF THE MEASURE PASSES. I ASSURED HIM THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE TO SUSTAIN HIS VETO.+

THE BILL TO BE CONSIDERED BY THE SENATE ON NOVEMBER 13 WILL BE IN ITS ORIGINAL EXTREME VERSION PROPOSING TO CUT BACK EXPORTS OF MANY DEVELOPING COUNTRIES, E.G. HONG KONG BY 13 PER CENT, CHINA AND BRAZIL BY 54 TO 65 PER CENT, KOREA AND PAKISTAN BY 34-36 PER CENT AND INDONESIA BY 85 PER CENT.

THE BILL EXEMPTS THE EEC ALTHOUGH IT IS THE THIRD LARGEST TEXTILE EXPORTING TERRITORY TO THE UNITED STATES. IT ALSO PROVIDES FOR IMPORT LICENSING AND RESTRAINT OF ALL TEXTILE PRODUCTS INCLUDING THOSE OF RAMIE AND SILK MATERIALS. HOWEVER, THE EVENTUAL SHAPE OF THE BILL AFTER DEBATE IS LIKELY TO BE CONSIDERABLY MODIFIED.

MAJOR HOUSING PROJECTS PLANNED FOR EASTERN

* * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT PLANS TO BUILD A NUMBER OF MAJOR PUBLIC HOUSING AND HOME OWNERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS TO COPE WITH THE EXPECTED GROWTH OF POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENTS IN EASTERN, DISTRICT OFFICER, MR BOWEN LEUNG, SAID TONIGHT (SATURDAY).

THE IMPROVED TRAFFIC INFRASTRUCTURE IN THE DISTRICT AND RECLAMATIONS BEING CARRIED OUT IN MANY AREAS, HAVE HELPED BOOST THE ECONOMY IN THE DISTRICT AND FOCUSED GREATER POTENTIAL FOR DEVELOPMENTS, HE SAID.

IN THE LONG-TERM, HE SAID, NEW PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES IN CHAI WAN WOULD PROVIDE 2 400 UNITS FOR 9 700 PEOPLE, WHILE THE HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEMES AT SIU SAI WAN AND KORNHILL WOULD PROVIDE 4 000 AND 2 000 FLATS FOR ABOUT 25 000 PEOPLE.

MR LEUNG WAS SPEAKING AT THE INAUGURATION CEREMONY OF THE 12TH TERM OF THE EXECUTIVE AND SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE OF THE NORTH POINT KAIFONG WELFARE ADVANCEMENT ASSOCIATION LIMITED.

HE SAID THAT WITHIN THE NEXT FIVE YEARS, THE POPULATION IN EASTERN DISTRICT WOULD INCREASE FROM THE PRESENT 520 000 TO 630 000, WHICH WOULD RESULT IN THE INCREASING DEMAND FOR COMMUNITY FACILITIES.

IN THIS RESPECT, HE SAID, KAIFONG ASSOCIATIONS WOULD HAVE AN IMPORTANT ROLE TO PLAY IN CONSOLIDATING RESIDENTS' SENSE OF BELONGING, WHILE TAKING AN ACTIVE PART IN COMMUNITY AFFAIRS AND DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION.

RECLAMATION AT HUNG HOM BAY, JUNK BAY PLANNED

* * * * *

GOVERNMENT INTENDS TO RECLAIM ABOUT 25 HECTARES OF FORESHORE AND SEABED AT HUNG HOM BAY AND AT JUNK BAY NEAR RENNIE'S MILL.

THE HUNG HOM PROJECT, INVOLVING 20.5 HECTARES, WILL PROVIDE LAND FOR THE EXPANSION OF THE EXISTING KOWLOON GOODS YARD OF THE KOWLOON-CANTON RAILWAY CORPORATION.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START EARLY NEXT YEAR.

PHASE II OF THE RECLAMATION FOR THE REMAINING AREA OF HUNG HOM BAY WILL BE IMPLEMENTED AT A LATER DATE.

AT JUNK BAY, 4.04 HECTARES WILL BE RECLAIMED TO PROVIDE A WORKS AREA FOR THE SITE FORMATION OF A PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE AT LAM TIN EXTENSION PHASE III AND LAM TIN SOUTH.

THE WORKS AREA WILL BE USED FOR STOCKPILING SURPLUS EXCAVATED MATERIAL FROM THE LAM TIN PROJECT AND TO ACCOMMODATE A ROCK CRUSHING PLANT.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START IN MARCH AND ON COMPLETION, THE RECLAMATION WILL BE INCORPORATED INTO PHASE II OF THE JUNK BAY NEW TOWN DEVELOPMENT.

NO EFFECT ON EXISTING NAVIGATION RIGHTS, MOORING OR ACCESS TO THE FORESHORE IS ANTICIPATED.

THE EXTENT OF THE AREA AFFECTED IN THE TWO PROPOSED RECLAMATIONS ARE DESCRIBED IN THE LATEST ISSUE OF THE GAZETTE.

ANY PERSON WHO CONSIDERS THAT HE HAS AN INTEREST, RIGHT OR EASEMENT IN OR OVER THE FORESHORE AND SEABED AFFECTED MAY SUBMIT A WRITTEN OBJECTION TO THE DIRECTOR OF LANDS BEFORE JANUARY 7.

NOTICES (IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE) TOGETHER WITH THEIR RELATED PLANS CAN BE SEEN ON NOTICE BOARDS POSTED NEAR THE SITES.

160 000 YOUTHS TAKE PART IN IYY ACTIVITIES

OVER 160 000 YOUNG PEOPLE HAVE TAKEN PART IN 280 EVENTS ORGANISED BY THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT THIS YEAR IN SUPPORT OF THE INTERNATIONAL YOUTH YEAR (IYY).

+IT IS A VERY ENCOURAGING RESULT,+ SAID MRS SELINA CHOW, CHAIRMAN OF THE CENTRAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE ON 1985 IYY, WHEN SHE OPENED THE DEPARTMENT'S EXHIBITION ON THE +BEST OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUTH SCHEME PROJECTS AND SERVICES FOR YOUNG PEOPLE+ AT THE CITY HALL THIS (SATURDAY) MORNING.

SHE HOPED THAT ALL THE PLANS DESIGNED FOR YOUTHS IN CONNECTION WITH IYY THIS YEAR COULD CONTINUE IN ORDER TO RAISE COMMUNITY CONCERN ON THE CARE AND DEVELOPMENT OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE.
