

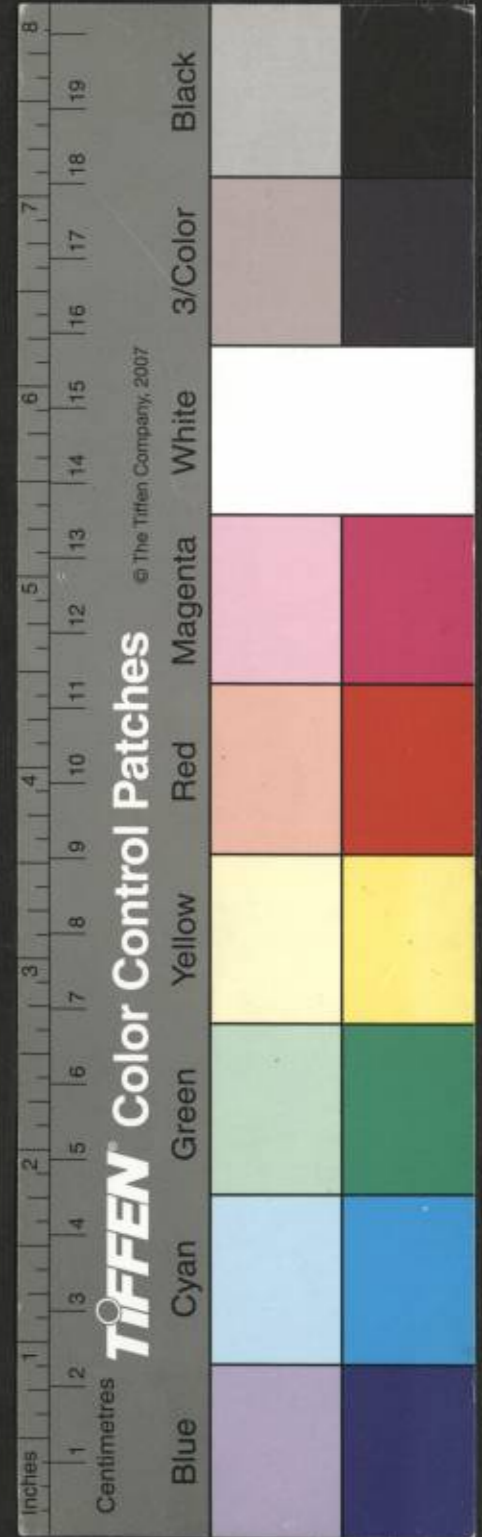



**TALLYCLERKS (LICENSING) REGULATIONS, 1955.**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 9 of the Tallyclerks (Licensing) Ordinance, the Governor in Council has made the following regulations—

**1.** These regulations may be cited as the Tallyclerks Citation. (Licensing) Regulations, 1955.

**2.** (1) Every application for a tallyclerk's licence shall be made on the form provided for that purpose at the Marine Department. Application for licence.

(2) Every such application shall be accompanied by three copies of a photograph of the applicant, one of which shall be attached to the licence.

**3.** The annual licence fee for a tallyclerk's licence shall be five dollars. Fee.

**4.** Every tallyclerk's licence shall be in the form prescribed in the Schedule to these regulations and may be renewed by endorsement thereon. Forms.

**5.** Where the Director is satisfied that a tallyclerk's licence has been lost or destroyed or accidentally defaced, he may issue a duplicate of such licence to the licensee on payment of a fee of five dollars. Issue of duplicate licences.

**6.** (1) The Director may issue armbands and badges required under the Ordinance. Issue of armbands and badges.

(2) Where the Director is satisfied that any armband or badge so issued has been lost or destroyed or accidentally defaced, he may issue a duplicate of such armband or badge on payment of a fee of one dollar.

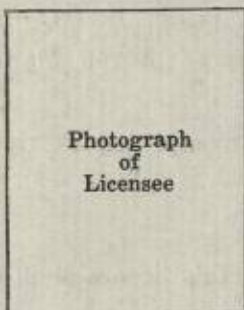





**PUBLIC HEALTH (FOOD) ORDINANCE.**  
**(Chapter 140).**

**RESTAURANTS AND FOOD STALLS (AMENDMENT)**  
**BY-LAWS, 1955.**

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 5 of the Public Health (Food) Ordinance, the Urban Council has made the following by-laws—

**1.** These by-laws may be cited as the Restaurants and Food Stalls (Amendment) By-laws, 1955. Citation.

**2.** By-law 5 of Part IV of the Restaurants and Food Stalls By-laws (hereinafter referred to as the principal by-laws) is rescinded and replaced by the following—

Rescission and replacement of by-law 5 of Part IV. (Vol. X, p. 157).

“Cafes requirements.

**5.** No premises shall be operated or maintained as a cafe unless they—

Ground surfaces to be in accordance with the provisions of s. s. (1) and (2) of s. 20 of Cap. 123.

(a) comprise the whole or part of a building of substantial construction, the whole of the ground surfaces of which shall be in accordance with the provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of section 20 of the Buildings Ordinance, or of any legislation subsequently enacted in revision or amendment thereof: Provided that in the case of buildings erected before the year 1936, the Council may waive or modify the requirements in the matter of ground surfaces;

Floor surfaces.

(b) in the case of upper floors have floor surfaces of non-absorbent material finished off smooth;

Requirements for latrine accommodation.

(c) are provided with flyproof latrine accommodation but this requirement may be waived or modified in respect of cafes licensed as such on or before 28th February, 1955;

Ablution facilities for customers and staff.

(d) are provided with ablution facilities. Such facilities shall include clean towels, soap, and basins of impervious construction, with water from the public mains connected thereto and fitted with wastepipes which discharge in the open air over or into a gully trap;

Scullery accommodation.

(e) are provided with scullery accommodation comprising sinks of impervious construction, with water from the public mains connected thereto and fitted with wastepipes which discharge in the open air over or into a gully trap. Each sink shall be provided with a drip board or tray draining into the sink. The scullery accommodation shall be so situated as to obviate the need to pass through a yard or other open space in order to gain access to the main premises;

Water supply.

(f) are provided with an ample supply of potable water which, except with the special permission of the Council, shall be laid on from the public mains; and

Water storage.

(g) are provided with tanks for the storage of potable water and installed in accordance with a permit obtained from the Water Authority. The tanks so provided shall be protected against dust and mosquitoes."

Addition of new by-law 5A in Part IV.

3. The principal by-laws are amended by the addition after by-law 5 of Part IV of the following new by-law—

"Grant of licence in spite of non-compliance with the provisions of by-law 5.

5A. In any case where the Council is satisfied that the requirements of public health will not be prejudiced thereby, the Council may before granting a licence waive, modify or vary any of the provisions of by-law 5, subject to such special conditions as the Council may deem fit to impose."

The main purpose of by-law 2 is to require the provision of (a) latrine accommodation in all cafes licensed after 28th February, 1955, and (b) water storage tanks in all cafes. The opportunity has also been taken to amend paragraphs (b), (d) and (e) of by-law 5 of the Cafes By-laws so as to make the wording therein more specific.

2. By-law 3 empowers the Council to waive, modify or vary any of the provisions of by-law 5 of the Cafes By-laws.





LETTERS PATENT passed under the Great Seal of the Realm, amending the Letters Patent of the 14th of February, 1917, constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies, and providing for the Government thereof.

*Dated 19th January, 1955.*

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

WHEREAS by certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm bearing date the fourteenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventeen (hereinafter called "the principal Letters Patent"), as amended by the Letters Patent specified in the Schedule to these Presents,

the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies was constituted and provision was made for the government thereof :

AND WHEREAS We are minded further to amend the provisions of the principal Letters Patent in manner hereinafter appearing :

Now Know Ye that We have ordered and declared and do hereby order and declare Our will and pleasure as follows—

1. (1) These Our Letters may be cited as the Hong Kong Letters Patent, 1954, and shall be construed as one with the principal Letters Patent.

Citation, construction and commencement.

(2) The principal Letters Patent may be cited as the Hong Kong Letters Patent, 1917, and the Letters Patent specified in the Schedule to these Presents may be cited by the respective titles given in that Schedule.

(3) The principal Letters Patent, the Letters Patent specified in the Schedule to these Presents and these Our Letters may be cited together as the Hong Kong Letters Patent, 1917 to 1954.

(4) These Our Letters shall be published in the *Hong Kong Government Gazette* and shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by Proclamation published in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal Letters Patent shall be amended by the insertion after Article XIV thereof of the following new Article—

Insertion of new Article XIVA in Hong Kong Letters Patent, 1917.

XIVA. (1) When the holder of the Office of Governor or of any office constituted under Article XIV of these Letters Patent is on leave of absence pending relinquishment of his office, it shall be lawful for another person to be appointed substantively to the same office.

(2) When two or more persons are holding the same office by reason of an appointment made pursuant to paragraph (1) of this Article, then for the purposes of Articles XVII and XVIII of these Letters Patent and for the purpose of any function conferred upon the holder of that office, the person last appointed to the office shall be deemed to be the holder of the office."

ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTIONS to Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies, or other Officer for the time being Administering the Government of Our said Colony.

WHEREAS by certain Instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our Colony of Hong Kong and its Dependencies bearing date the fourteenth day of February, 1917 as amended by Additional Instructions bearing date the thirtieth day of April, 1938 (which Instructions, as so amended, are hereinafter called "the existing Instructions") provision is made amongst other things for the constitution of the Executive Council and the Legislative Council of the Colony :

AND WHEREAS We are minded to amend the existing Instructions in the following manner :

NOW, THEREFORE, We do hereby direct and enjoin and declare Our will and pleasure as follows—

(Chapter 32).

AUTHORIZED AUDITORS (DISCIPLINARY INQUIRY PROCEEDINGS)

RULES, 1955.

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 131D of the Companies Ordinance, the Authorized Auditors Board with the approval of the Governor, has made the following rules—

1. These rules may be cited as the Authorized Auditors Citation. (Disciplinary Inquiry Proceedings) Rules, 1955.

2. In these rules unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.

“auditor” means an authorized auditor whose name is included in the authorized list kept by the Registrar of Companies pursuant to subsection (3) of section 131 of the Ordinance; (Cap. 32)

“Board” means the Authorized Auditors Board established pursuant to section 131A of the Ordinance;

“Committee” means the Penal Cases Committee referred to in subsection (4) of section 131B of the Ordinance;

“secretary” means the person appointed to carry out the duties of secretary to the Board or if a separate secretary be appointed for the purpose of these rules, then the person so appointed.

PART I.

3. An application requesting the Board to inquire into an allegation made against an auditor under the provisions of subsection (2) of section 131B of the Ordinance shall be in writing under the hand of the complainant in Form I in the Schedule and sent in the first instance to the Registrar of Companies together with an affidavit by the complainant in Form II in the Schedule stating the matters of fact on which he relies in support of his application. Application for an inquiry into allegations against an auditor. Schedule, Forms I and II.



Application to be referred to Committee.

4. The Registrar of Companies shall refer such application and affidavit to the Committee and shall furnish all such documents relating to the application as may have been received by him.

Registrar may require further particulars.

5. Before referring the application to the Committee the Registrar of Companies may require the complainant to furnish such further information and documents relating to the application as he thinks fit.

Powers of Committee to dismiss an application.

6. If the Committee is of the opinion that an allegation made under the provisions of paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection (2) of section 131B of the Ordinance is not well founded or in the case of an allegation made under the provisions of paragraph (c) of the said subsection of section 131B is not made in good faith, the Committee may dismiss the application without requiring the auditor concerned to answer the allegation. If required so to do, either by the complainant or the auditor, the Committee shall make a formal order dismissing such application.

Notice of hearing of application.

7. Where an inquiry under subsection (6) of section 131B is to be held, the Board shall fix a day for the hearing and the secretary shall serve notice thereof on the complainant and on the auditor concerned. There shall be at least twenty-one days between the service of any such notice and the day fixed therein for the hearing.

Parties to supply secretary and each other with list of documents relied upon. Schedule, Forms III and IV.

8. The notice of hearing shall be in Form III or IV in the Schedule, and shall require the complainant and the auditor respectively to furnish to the secretary and to each other a list of all documents relied upon in support of the allegation or in answer thereto as the case may be. Such lists shall, unless otherwise ordered by the Board, be furnished by the complainant and by the auditor respectively at least fourteen days before the day of hearing.

Inspection of listed documents.

9. Either party may inspect the documents included in the list furnished by the other; and a copy of any document mentioned in the list of either party shall, on the request in writing and at the expense of the party requiring it, be furnished to that party by the other party within three days after receipt of such written request.

10. The complainant and the auditor concerned shall be entitled to appear and be represented by counsel or solicitor at the hearing:

Appearance and representation by a legal practitioner.

Provided that if the complainant or the auditor concerned intends to be so represented, not less than seven days' notice in writing of such intention shall be given to the secretary.

11. At the hearing, the complainant or his legal representative, or in accordance with the proviso contained in subsection (3) of section 131D of the Ordinance the Legal Adviser, shall present the case to the Board and shall submit any evidence in support of the application, and the auditor concerned or his legal representative shall be entitled to cross-examine the complainant or any witness appearing against him on matters relevant to the application.

Presentation of case for complainant.

12. When the presentation of the case by the complainant or his legal representative or the Legal Adviser, as the case may be, and the evidence in support thereof is concluded, the auditor concerned or his representative shall be invited by the Chairman of the Board to present his case and call witnesses in answer to the allegation of the complainant and address the Board, and the complainant or his legal representative or the Legal Adviser, as the case may be, shall be entitled to cross-examine the auditor concerned or any witness tendered in answer to the allegation and then to reply upon the whole case.

Presentation of case for the auditor.

13. If either party fails to appear at the hearing, either personally or by counsel or solicitor, the Board may upon proof of service of the notice of hearing proceed to hear and determine the case in his absence.

Determination of case in absence of either party.

14. Upon the conclusion of the hearing, the Board shall consider the relevant evidence, both oral and written, and either pronounce its findings and order forthwith or at a subsequent hearing.

Findings and order of the Board.

15. If the findings and order of the Board are not pronounced on the day of the hearing, the secretary shall give notice to the parties of the date of hearing when the findings and order will be pronounced.

Notice to parties.

Service of copy of findings and order.

16. Within seven days of the date when the findings and order shall have been pronounced, the secretary shall serve a copy thereof on each party to the proceedings.

PART II.

Board quorum.

17. For the purposes of any inquiry under Part I hereof, three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

Hearings of Board to be private.

18. The Board shall hear all applications in private, but shall pronounce its findings and orders in public.

Withdrawal of an application.

19. Unless the Board otherwise directs no application shall be withdrawn after it has been sent to the Registrar of Companies.

Adjournment of hearing.

20. The Board may of its own motion, or upon the application of any party, adjourn the hearing upon such terms as to costs or otherwise as the Board shall think fit.

Amendment of application upon the hearing.

21. If upon the hearing it shall appear to the Board that an allegation in an application requires to be amended, or added to, the Board may permit such amendment or addition, but if in the opinion of the Board such amendment or addition is not within the scope of the application, the Board may require the same to be embodied in a further application provided always that if a permitted amendment or addition be such as to take any party by surprise, or prejudice the conduct of his case, the Board shall grant an adjournment of the hearing, upon such terms as the Board shall think fit.

Record of proceedings before the Board.

22. Shorthand notes of proceedings before the Board shall be taken, by a person appointed by the Board; and any party who appeared at such proceedings shall be entitled to inspect the transcript thereof. The shorthand writer shall supply to the Board and if required to any person entitled to be heard upon an appeal against an order of the Board, but to no other person, a copy of the transcript of such notes on payment of his charges. The scale of charges of the shorthand writer shall be subject to the approval of the Board. The charges for all transcripts of the shorthand notes furnished for the use of the Board or on the direction of the Board shall be payable out of the general revenue of the Colony.

23. Service of any notice or document required by these rules may be effected by registered post addressed to the last known place of abode, or business, of the person to be served, and proof that such letter was so addressed and posted shall be proof of service.

Service of documents.

24. The Board may extend the time for taking any step required by these rules.

Extensions of time.

25. The Board may dispense with any requirement of these rules respecting notices, affidavits, documents, service, or time, in any case where it appears to the Board to be just so to do.

Powers of Board to dispense with certain requirements of rules.

26. The costs of the application and all proceedings thereunder shall be in the discretion of the Board who may direct to and by whom and in what manner the same or any part thereof shall be paid and may award costs to be paid as between solicitor and client and such costs shall be taxed by the Registrar of the Supreme Court.

Costs of an application.

27. All documents shall be filed and kept by the secretary. The Board may order that any books, papers, or other exhibits produced or used at a hearing, shall be retained by the secretary until the time within which an appeal may be entered in accordance with section 131F of the Ordinance has expired, and, if notice of appeal is given, until the appeal is heard or otherwise disposed of.





**1.** These by-laws may be cited as the Domestic Cleanliness and Prevention of Disease (Amendment) By-laws, 1955. Citation.

**2.** The by-laws contained in Schedule A to the Public Health (Sanitation) Ordinance, 1935, under the heading "Domestic Cleanliness and Prevention of Disease", set forth on pages 194 to 197 of the annual volume of the Ordinances of Hong Kong for the year 1935 are amended by the addition— Addition of new by-laws 8A and 12. (Schedule A to Ord. No. 15/35).

(a) after by-law 8 of the following new by-law—

"Destruction of rodents, etc.

**8A.** (1) (a) The Council may at any time with the view to the prevention or mitigation of any epidemic, endemic, contagious or infectious disease, direct that destructive action be taken for the extermination of rodents in all or any premises in any district in which the Council may deem such action necessary.

(b) Any destructive action directed by the Council shall be undertaken only by members of the Urban Services Department.

(c) No destructive action directed by the Council shall be undertaken unless due notice thereof in writing has been given to the occupiers concerned.

(2) Any occupier of any premises in which bait, whether poisoned or not, or any trap has been placed for the purpose as aforesaid or any other person not being a duly authorized member of the Urban Services Department who handles, removes, destroys or in any

way interferes with such bait or trap, knowing the same to have been so placed by the Urban Services Department, or knowingly permits or induces any unauthorized person or domestic animal or bird so to do shall be guilty of an offence.

(3) (a) The Council may direct that no person other than a member of the Urban Services Department or other person authorized in writing by the Director of Urban Services shall touch, remove or in any way interfere with any rodent which has been found dead or any trap containing any living or dead rodent.

(b) On such direction being given as aforesaid, any person who knowingly acts in contravention of such direction shall be guilty of an offence.

(4) For the purposes of this by-law, when notice of any direction given under this by-law has been given to the owner of the premises in respect of which such direction was given, and a copy of such notice in English and Chinese has been posted up in a conspicuous position on such premises, and a period of forty-eight hours has elapsed since such notice was both given and posted up as aforesaid—

(a) in the case of a direction given under paragraph (1)(a), notice in writing thereof shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been given to the occupiers concerned; and

(b) in the case of a direction given under paragraph (3)(a), any person who acts in contravention of such direction shall, unless the contrary is proved, be deemed to have knowledge thereof.

(5) Any person who commits an offence against the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a fine of five hundred dollars.

(6) In this by-law—

“destructive action” means systematic baiting, laying of poison baits or trapping and the doing of all or two or more of such things simultaneously.

(7) Any member of the Urban Services Department authorized in writing by the Director of Urban Services may enter any premises for the purposes of this by-law together with such other members under his control as he may deem necessary.”;

(b) after by-law 11 of the following new by-law—

“Citation. **12.** These by-laws may be cited as the Domestic Cleanliness and Prevention of Disease By-laws.”

(4) For the avoidance of doubt it is declared—

(a) that in any prosecution for a contravention of paragraph (1) or paragraph (2) of this by-law in trading in an area or street specified in Part I or Part II of Appendix IV it shall be unnecessary to prove that paragraph (3) of by-law 2 of these by-laws has been complied with;

(b) that it shall be no defence to such charge to prove that the provisions of that paragraph have not been complied with.

5. Every licensee shall trade only between the hours of 6 a.m. and 10 p.m."

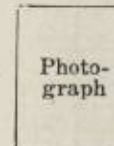





WHEREAS—

- (i) Section 4 of the Hong Kong and Yaumati Ferry Company (Services) Ordinance, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance") provides that the ferry services authorized by the Ordinance shall be maintained and operated upon the terms and conditions specified in the Schedule thereto;
- (ii) Section 5 of the Ordinance provides that the Schedule thereto may be varied at any time, with consent of the Company, by Resolution of Legislative Council;
- (iii) Paragraph 5 of the Schedule to the Ordinance makes provision for the Company to pay to the Government a royalty of twenty-five per cent of the net profit of the Company for each year;
- (iv) It has always been intended that no deduction for royalty should be made in ascertaining the net profit on which royalty is payable and no such deduction has been made;
- (v) Doubt has arisen whether the wording of paragraph 5 of the Schedule to the Ordinance clearly gives effect to the intention aforesaid;
- (vi) It is desired to remove such doubt;
- (vii) The Company has consented to the variation of the terms of paragraph 5 of the Schedule;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, with the consent of the Company, that sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 5 of the Schedule to the Ordinance be varied by the substitution of a semi-colon for the full stop at the end thereof and by the addition of the following—

“and provided further that in ascertaining the net profit as aforesaid no deduction shall be made of any sum payable as royalty by the Company to the Government.”
