CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES FOR JULY  
\*\*\*\*\*

THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (A) ROSE BY 2.5 PER CENT AND THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (B) BY 2.9 PER CENT BETWEEN JULY 1984 AND JULY 1985, ACCORDING TO FIGURES PUBLISHED TODAY BY THE CENSUS AND STATISTICS DEPARTMENT.

THE CPI(A) AND CPI(B) FOR JULY 1985 WERE 159.6 AND 159.9 RESPECTIVELY, OR 4.0 POINTS AND 4.5 POINTS RESPECTIVELY HIGHER THAN THOSE FOR JULY 1984. COMPARED WITH JUNE 1985 AND BEARING IN MIND THAT THIS COMPARISON IS AFFECTED BY SEASONAL FACTORS, CPI(A) DECREASED BY 0.2 POINT OR 0.2 PER CENT AND CPI(B), BY 0.2 POINT OR 0.1 PER CENT.

THE AVERAGE CPI(A) AND AVERAGE CPI(B) FOR THE 12 MONTHS ENDED JULY 1985, AT 157.8 AND 157.9 RESPECTIVELY, WERE 4.2 PER CENT AND 4.7 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY HIGHER THAN THE AVERAGES FOR THE 12 MONTHS ENDED JULY 1984.

DURING THE THREE-MONTH PERIOD ENDED JULY 1985, THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED CPI(A) AND CPI(B) BOTH INCREASED, ON THE AVERAGE, MARGINALLY EACH MONTH.

DURING JULY, RETAIL PRICES OF FRESH FRUIT AND FRESH-WATER FISH WERE LOWER. ON THE OTHER HAND, CHARGES FOR MEALS IN RESTAURANTS AND OTHER EATING PLACES AND FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT WENT UP.

THE CPI(A) AND CPI(B) ARE BASED ON THE EXPENDITURE PATTERNS OF 50 PER CENT AND 30 PER CENT RESPECTIVELY, OF URBAN HOUSEHOLDS IN HONG KONG, WHICH WERE DERIVED FROM THE 1979/80 HOUSEHOLD EXPENDITURE SURVEY. THE CPI(A) REFERS TO HOUSEHOLDS SPENDING BETWEEN \$1 000 AND \$3 499 A MONTH, AND THE CPI(B) TO HOUSEHOLDS SPENDING BETWEEN \$3 500 AND \$6 499 A MONTH AT THAT TIME.

THE INDEXES FOR JULY 1985 IN RESPECT OF THE NINE COMMODITY-SERVICE SECTIONS IN THE TWO CONSUMER PRICE INDEXES ARE GIVEN BELOW, TOGETHER WITH THOSE FOR JUNE 1985 AND JULY 1984.

COMPARED WITH JUNE 1985, THE INDEX FOR FOODSTUFFS DECREASED BY 0.6 POINT IN BOTH CPI(A) AND CPI(B), LARGELY REFLECTING THE FALL IN THE AVERAGE RETAIL PRICES OF FRESH FRUIT AND FRESH-WATER FISH. THIS MORE THAN OFFSET THE INCREASE IN CHARGES FOR MEALS IN RESTAURANTS AND OTHER EATING PLACES DURING THE MONTH. THE EFFECT OF MOVEMENTS IN THE RETAIL PRICES OF OTHER FOOD ITEMS ON THE INDEX FOR FOODSTUFFS WAS INSIGNIFICANT.

THE INDEX FOR CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR DECREASED BY 1.1 POINTS IN BOTH CPI(A) AND CPI(B) DUE TO LOWER PRICES OF OUTERCLOTHING.

THE INDEX FOR MISCELLANEOUS GOODS DECREASED BY 0.4 POINT IN CPI(A) AND 0.6 POINT IN CPI(B) BECAUSE OF LOWER PRICES OF JEWELLERY, MEDICINES, TOYS AND HOBBIES.

HIGHER CHARGES FOR MEDICAL TREATMENT PUSHED UP THE INDEX FOR SERVICES BY 0.8 POINT IN BOTH CPI(A) AND CPI(B).

PRICE MOVEMENTS IN OTHER SECTIONS WERE INSIGNIFICANT.

OPINION ON HOUSING GREEN PAPER TO BE COLLECTED

\* \* \* \* \*

THE EASTERN DISTRICT OFFICE WILL ORGANISE A SPECIAL SESSION ON TUESDAY (AUGUST 27) TO BRIEF AND COLLECT VIEWS FROM RESIDENTS AND LOCAL ORGANISATIONS ON THE GREEN PAPER ON THE REVIEW OF SUBSIDY TO PUBLIC HOUSING TENANTS.

A DISTRICT OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID THE SESSION WOULD ENABLE RESIDENTS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES, AREA COMMITTEES AND OWNERS CORPORATIONS IN THE DISTRICT TO HAVE A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF PROPOSALS IN THE GREEN PAPER.

EASTERN DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS HAVE BEEN INVITED TO ATTEND THE SESSION AND TWO MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ON HOUSING SUBSIDY TO TENANTS OF PUBLIC HOUSING, MR CHEUNG KIN-CHUNG AND MISS LEUNG WAI-TUNG, WILL INTRODUCE AND EXPLAIN THE GREEN PAPER.

MEANWHILE, THE DISTRICT OFFICE HAD SENT QUESTIONNAIRES TO MORE THAN 600 MUTUAL AID COMMITTEES, AREA COMMITTEES AND OWNERS CORPORATIONS TO COLLECT VIEWS ON PROPOSALS IN THE GREEN PAPER.

+WE HOPE TO COLLECT THE VIEWS OF PUBLIC HOUSING TENANTS AS WELL AS PEOPLE LIVING IN PRIVATE RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS DURING THIS CONSULTATION EXERCISE,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE URGED LOCAL ORGANISATIONS TO COMPLETE THE QUESTIONNAIRES AND RETURN THEM TO THE DISTRICT OFFICE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, SO THAT THEIR VIEWS CAN BE FORWARDED TO THE HOUSING AUTHORITY.

DURING HIS STAY, SIR ALAN WILL HAVE A BUSY PROGRAMME MEETING GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, COMMUNITY LEADERS AND PROMINENT BUSINESSMEN.

LIBERATION DAY CEREMONY

HONG KONG WILL OBSERVE THIS YEAR'S LIBERATION DAY WITH A WREATH-LAYING CEREMONY AT THE CITY HALL ON MONDAY (AUGUST 26).

DURING THE CEREMONY, WHICH WILL BEGIN AT 10.45 AM IN THE GARDEN OF REMEMBRANCE, REPRESENTATIVES OF THE HONG KONG BRITISH FORCES, HONG KONG PRISONERS OF WAR ASSOCIATION, ROYAL HONG KONG REGIMENT (THE VOLUNTEERS), THE MIDDLESEX REGIMENT AND HONG KONG WAR MEMORIAL FUND COMMITTEE WILL LAY WREATHS AT THE SHRINE IN MEMORY OF MEMBERS OF THE HONG KONG VOLUNTEER DEFENCE CORPS WHO DIED IN THE BATTLE OF HONG KONG IN DECEMBER 1941 OR LATER AS PRISONERS OF WAR.

THE COMMANDER BRITISH FORCES, MAJOR-GENERAL ANTHONY BOAM, WILL LAY A WREATH ON BEHALF OF THE HONG KONG BRITISH FORCES.

THE WREATH OF THE PRISONERS OF WAR ASSOCIATION WILL BE LAID BY ITS HONORARY SECRETARY, MR A.E. GOMES.

REGIMENTAL WREATHS OF THE VOLUNTEERS WILL BE LAID BY ITS ADJUTANT, CAPTAIN MICHAEL POON, AND THAT OF THE MIDDLESEX REGIMENT BY WARRANT OFFICER SECOND CLASS G. FRANCE.

THE MIDDLESEX REGIMENT AND THE VOLUNTEERS FOUGHT SIDE BY SIDE IN THE BATTLE OF HONG KONG.

THE WREATH OF THE HONG KONG WAR MEMORIAL FUND COMMITTEE WILL BE LAID BY COLONEL H.A. DE B. BOTELHO.

THE WREATH-LAYING CEREMONY WILL BE FOLLOWED BY THE SOUNDING OF THE LAST POST, A TWO-MINUTE SILENCE AND REVEILLE, AND THE FIRING OF THREE VOLLEYS OF SALUTE.

THE FIRING PARTY, BUGLER AND SENTRIES, WILL BE PROVIDED BY THE VOLUNTEERS.

YOUTH URGED TO PLAY VITAL CIVIC ROLE

THE COMMITMENT AND PARTICIPATION OF YOUNG PEOPLE ARE VITAL TO THE SUCCESS OF HONG KONG'S FUTURE SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT, THE ACTING SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR BARRIE WIGGHAM, SAID TONIGHT.

+WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE GOVERNMENT, YOUNG PEOPLE SHOULD TAKE AN ACTIVE INTEREST IN THE DISTRICT BOARD, URBAN COUNCIL AND LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ELECTIONS WHICH OPEN UP FURTHER OPPORTUNITIES FOR MORE PUBLIC CONSULTATION, PARTICIPATION AND INVOLVEMENT,+ HE SAID.

MAJOR RECREATION GROUND FOR WONG TAI SIN  
\* \* \* \*

A MAJOR RECREATION FACILITY FOR YOUNG AND OLD IS BEING BUILT BY THE URBAN COUNCIL AT A COST OF \$49.5 MILLION ON THE SITE OF THE FORMER KAI TAK AMUSEMENT PARK AT WONG TAI SIN.

CONSTRUCTION OF PHASE ONE OF THE PROJECT IN CHOI HUNG ROAD IS NOW IN ITS FINAL STAGES, AND THE FACILITY IS EXPECTED TO BE OPENED TO THE PUBLIC NEXT MONTH.

FACILITIES INCLUDE TWO FIVE-A-SIDE SOCCER PITCHES, A SITTING-OUT AREA, A JOGGING TRACK, A PAVILION AND AN ARBOUR, PLUS BENCHES AND PLANTERS.

MEANWHILE, PILING AND FOUNDATION WORK FOR THE SECOND PHASE OF THE SCHEME HAVE ALREADY BEEN COMPLETED AND TENDERS WILL BE INVITED SHORTLY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE SUPERSTRUCTURES INVOLVED.

IN THIS PHASE A TWO-HECTARE PLOT OF LAND ADJOINING PHASE ONE AND PREVIOUSLY TAKEN UP BY THE CHOI HUNG ROAD GARDEN WILL BE CONVERTED INTO A MULTI-PURPOSE RECREATIONAL AREA.

IN LINE WITH THE URBAN COUNCIL'S POLICY ON CONSERVATION, ALL MATURE TREES WILL BE PRESERVED, IN ADDITION TO NEW GREENERY BEING PLANTED THERE.

FACILITIES FOR PASSIVE RECREATION IN THIS PHASE INCLUDE A FOUNTAIN, A PAVILION, SITTING-OUT AREAS, CHESS TABLES AND STOOLS, BENCHES AND PLANTERS.
