GERMAN INDUSTRIALISTS INTERESTED IN HONG KONG  
\* \* \* \*

GERMAN INDUSTRIALISTS ARE VERY INTERESTED IN SETTING UP FACTORIES IN HONG KONG, ACCORDING TO THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY, MR. ROY PORTER.

MR. PORTER HAS JUST RETURNED FROM A THREE-WEEK INDUSTRIAL PROMOTION TRIP TO EUROPE, MOST OF WHICH WAS SPENT IN GERMANY.

HE REPORTED THAT NEARLY HALF OF THE 40 FIRMS HE VISITED +EXPRESSED IMMEDIATE INTEREST IN SETTING UP MANUFACTURING PLANTS HERE.+

A FURTHER 50 PER CENT WERE INTERESTED IN HAVING COMPONENTS MANUFACTURED HERE BY HONG KONG COMPANIES AND SOME OF THE REMAINING 10 PER CENT, WHO WERE NOT READY TO CONSIDER ANY MANUFACTURING IN HONG KONG AT PRESENT, HAD LONG-TERM PLANS WHICH MR. PORTER DESCRIBED AS OF +GREAT INTEREST TO HONG KONG+.

MR. PORTER, WHO VISITED GERMANY EXACTLY ONE YEAR AGO, SAID HE FOUND GERMAN INDUSTRIALISTS MUCH MORE KNOWLEDGEABLE ABOUT HONG KONG THIS TIME, AND THERE WAS CLEARLY MORE READY INTEREST.

+THEY ARE FINDING OUT,+ HE SAID, +THAT IT IS BECOMING INCREASINGLY DIFFICULT TO COMPETE IN SOME OF THEIR EXPORT MARKETS AND THAT THERE IS A NEED TO SET UP OFF-SHORE PLANTS.+

HE ADDED : +THERE IS A VERY APPARENT NEW INTEREST AMONG EUROPEAN INDUSTRIALISTS IN THE ASIAN MARKET. IN THIS RESPECT, HONG KONG IS AN IDEAL BASE FOR THEM.+

MR. PORTER SAID A LOT OF HARD WORK AND FOLLOW-UP WORK HAD GONE INTO THE LATEST TRIP. IT IS NOW UP TO US TO SUSTAIN THIS INTEREST AND TO BE ABLE TO MAKE THE RIGHT ARRANGEMENTS FOR THEM WHEN THEY COME HERE, HE SAID.

HE POINTED OUT THAT MANY OF THE INDUSTRIALISTS ARE SEEKING HONG KONG PARTNERS OR COMPANIES TO MANUFACTURE FOR THEM. HE URGED LOCAL INDUSTRIALISTS TO CONTACT HIM FOR FULL DETAILS OF THE OPPORTUNITIES AVAILABLE.

THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR MENTIONED A FEW OF THE PRODUCTS WHICH THESE OVERSEAS INDUSTRIALISTS HAVE INDICATED THEY WOULD LIKE TO PRODUCE HERE. THEY INCLUDE INDUSTRIAL EQUIPMENT, ELECTRIC TOOLS, ELECTRIC SWITCHES, MEASURING INSTRUMENTS, PRINTING MACHINES, DICTATING MACHINES, INDUSTRIAL VALVES, ELECTRICAL CABLES AND TEXTILE MACHINERY.

PLB'S TO HAVE DESTINATION INDICATORS FITTED BY AUGUST 1

\* \* \* \* \*

REGULATIONS REQUIRING ALL PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES TO DISPLAY DESTINATION INDICATORS AND FARE CARDS WILL COME INTO FORCE ON AUGUST 1.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ADVISED PLB OWNERS AND OPERATORS TO COMPLY WITH THE NEW REQUIREMENTS OTHERWISE WHEN THEIR VEHICLES ARE PRESENTED FOR INSPECTION THEY WILL NOT BE RE-LICENSED.

THE SPOKESMAN POINTED OUT THAT THE REGULATIONS, KNOWN AS THE ROAD TRAFFIC (PUBLIC OMNIBUS, PUBLIC LIGHT BUS AND PUBLIC CAR) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, WERE AMENDED IN NOVEMBER 1975, BUT WERE NOT BROUGHT INTO FORCE IMMEDIATELY IN ORDER TO GIVE PLB OPERATORS SUFFICIENT TIME TO COMPLY WITH THE NEW REQUIREMENTS.

+THEY NOW HAVE HAD MORE THAN SUFFICIENT TIME TO COMPLY WITH THE NEW REQUIREMENTS AND IF THEY PRESENT THEIR VEHICLES FOR INSPECTION WITHOUT THE DESTINATION INDICATORS THEY WILL SIMPLY NOT BE RE-LICENSED,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

HE SAID THAT THE REGULATIONS PROVIDE GREATER SAFETY AND BETTER SAFEGUARD OF SERVICES FOR PEOPLE USING PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES AND ALSO PROTECT PLB DRIVERS AGAINST PASSENGERS NOT PAYING THE STIPULATED FARE.

THE REGULATIONS LAY DOWN SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR THE DISPLAY AND COLOURS OF DESTINATION INDICATORS AND FARE CARDS ON PLB'S AND FORBID THE CHANGING OF AN INDICATOR DURING A JOURNEY WITH INTENT TO CHARGE EXTRA FARES OR TO CUT SHORT THE ORIGINAL JOURNEY.

ONE PROVISION REQUIRES A PLB DRIVER TO DISPLAY NOT MORE THAN ONE DESTINATION INDICATOR OF AN APPROVED DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION ON THE FRONT OF THE VEHICLE.

THE INDICATOR, IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE CHARACTERS, MUST SHOW THE DESTINATION CLEARLY BY REFERENCE TO A ROAD JUNCTION OR SOME OTHER EASILY RECOGNISED PLACE. IT SHOULD BE ILLUMINATED AT NIGHT.

UNDER THE REGULATIONS, A SERIES OF STANDARD COLOURS OF DESTINATION INDICATORS WILL BE INTRODUCED FOR DIFFERENT ZONES. ALL INDICATORS WILL HAVE WHITE LETTERS AND CHARACTERS, BUT THE COLOURS OF THE BACKGROUND WILL VARY.

IT WILL BE A DARK BLUE BACKGROUND FOR ANY ROUTE ON HONG KONG ISLAND OTHER THAN A CROSS-HARBOUR ROUTE= A GREEN BACKGROUND FOR ANY ROUTE WHICH OPERATES WHOLLY IN KOWLOON AND NEW KOWLOON, A YELLOW BACKGROUND FOR ANY ROUTE WHOLLY IN THE NEW TERRITORIES OR BETWEEN THE NEW TERRITORIES AND KOWLOON AND NEW KOWLOON= AND A RED BACKGROUND FOR ANY CROSS-HARBOUR TUNNEL ROUTE.

A PLB DRIVER WILL ALSO BE REQUIRED TO DISPLAY AT AN APPROVED POSITION ON THE VEHICLE A FARE CARD, IN ENGLISH AND CHINESE CHARACTERS, OF AN APPROVED DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION. THE FARE SHOULD BE INDICATED IN RED LETTERS AND CHARACTERS ON A WHITE BACKGROUND.

THE REGULATIONS PROVIDE FOR BETTER SAFEGUARD OF SERVICES FOR PLB PASSENGERS TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE CARRIED TO THE INDICATED DESTINATION AND ARE NOT CHARGED A HIGHER FARE THAN THEY EXPECTED TO PAY WHEN BOARDING THE VEHICLE.

PLB OPERATORS WILL BE PROHIBITED FROM CHANGING A DESTINATION INDICATOR DURING A JOURNEY WITH INTENT TO INDUCE ANY PASSENGER TO GET OFF FROM THE VEHICLE BEFORE REACHING THE DESTINATION INDICATED AT THE TIME THE PASSENGER BOARDED THE VEHICLE, OR TO PAY A FARE ADDITIONAL TO THE FARE INDICATED AT THE TIME THE PASSENGER BOARDED THE VEHICLE.

IN ADDITION, PLB OPERATORS SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED TO REQUIRE ANY PASSENGER, WITHOUT REASONABLE EXCUSE, TO GET OFF BEFORE REACHING THE DESTINATION INDICATED AT THE TIME HE BOARDED THE VEHICLE.

TO PROTECT PLB OPERATORS, THE REGULATIONS MAKE IT AN OFFENCE FOR A PERSON TO BOARD A PLB KNOWING HE CANNOT PAY THE FARE OR WITH INTENT TO AVOID PAYING IT.

THE RESULTS OF THE SECONDARY SCHOOL ENTRANCE EXAMINATION ARE EXPECTED TO BE AVAILABLE TO PARENTS AND CHILDREN AT THEIR PRIMARY SCHOOLS FROM FRIDAY (JULY 15), MR. HERBERT WOO, THE SECRETARY OF THE EXAMINATION, ANNOUNCED TODAY.

HEADS OF PRIMARY SCHOOLS ARE BEING ADVISED WHEN AND WHERE TO COLLECT THEIR RESULTS IN THE USUAL WAY.

INDIVIDUAL RESULTS WILL NOT BE ISSUED TO NEWSPAPERS.

+THIS IS BEING DONE TO SAVE TIME AND PARENTS WILL BE ABLE TO LEARN THEIR CHILDREN'S RESULTS AT LEAST TWO DAYS EARLIER THAN WOULD HAVE BEEN POSSIBLE IF THE PRESS LIST HAD TO BE COMPILED AND CHECKED,+ THE SECRETARY SAID.

THIS YEAR, CANDIDATES ELIGIBLE FOR FIVE-YEAR PLACES ARE GROUPED INTO FIVE BLOCKS, CALLED X1, X2, X3, X4 AND X5, EACH HAVING ABOUT 5,000 PUPILS- CANDIDATES ELIGIBLE FOR THREE-YEAR PLACES FORM TWO BLOCKS, Y1 AND Y2, EACH HAVING ABOUT 23,000 PUPILS, AND THE REMAINDER WILL BE IN FIVE BLOCKS, Z1, Z2, Z3, Z4 AND Z5, EACH HAVING ABOUT 5,000 PUPILS.

CANDIDATES' PERFORMANCE IN INDIVIDUAL SUBJECTS, CHINESE, ENGLISH AND MATHEMATICS ARE GRADED AS BEFORE, GRADE 1 BEING THE BEST AND GRADE 9 BEING THE WORST.

LEGCO MEETING

THE GOVERNMENT WILL BE ASKED IN THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEETING TOMORROW TO SPECIFICALLY DRAW THE ATTENTION OF RADIO AND TELEVISION COMMENTATORS ON FOOTBALL MATCHES THAT ANY COMMENT OR STATEMENT INTENDED OR LIKELY TO INCITE DISORDER CONSTITUTES A SERIOUS OFFENCE.

THIS IS ONE OF 20 QUESTIONS TO BE RAISED BY UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS IN THE COUNCIL MEETING -- THE SECOND LAST ONE IN THE CURRENT SESSION.

THE QUESTION ON FOOTBALL COMMENTARY WILL BE FOLLOWED BY OTHERS ON THE PROSECUTION OF SUCH COMMENTATORS WHO ACT IN BREACH OF SECTION 26 OF PUBLIC ORDER ORDINANCE, AND THE STEPS TO BE TAKEN TO ENSURE THAT LAW AND ORDER IS MAINTAINED BOTH DURING AND AFTER THE MATCHES.

THE RECENT ANNOUNCEMENT OF A SURPLUS OF OVER \$902 MILLION IN GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1976-77 WILL DRAW A QUERY WHY THE SURPLUS HAS EXCEEDED THE PREDICTION OF \$850 MILLION, AND WHETHER THIS WILL HAVE ANY IMPLICATIONS FOR BUDGETARY POLICY IN THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR.

THERE ARE ALSO A NUMBER OF QUESTIONS ON WELFARE SERVICES FOR THE AGED, TREATMENT OF ADDICTS, PROGRESS IN REVIEWING CHILD CARE CENTRE REGULATIONS, AND THE IMPROVEMENTS TO THE ENVIRONMENT OF THE KOWLOON WALLED CITY AND TO LIVING CONDITIONS AND REHOUSING OF RESIDENTS IN LICENSED AREAS.

QUESTIONS ON PUBLIC SAFETY INCLUDE CONTROL OVER TEMPORARY MATSHED AND BAMBOO STANDS USED IN PUBLIC PERFORMANCES, STEPS TO PREVENT RECURRENCE OF ROBBERIES AT KNOWN BLACK-SPOTS, AND THE RIDING AND HIRING OF BICYCLES IN AREAS CLOSED TO VEHICULAR ACCESS.

THE GOVERNMENT WILL ALSO BE ASKED IF IT WILL PUBLISH THE REPORT ON THE COLLISION BETWEEN A HYDROFOIL AND A PASSENGER FERRY OFF CHEUNG CHAU ISLAND, TO ENSURE PROMPT ANSWERS TO WRITTEN ENQUIRIES BY APPLICANTS FOR PUBLIC HOUSING, TO EXAMINE THE POSSIBILITY OF ENCOURAGING FILM PRODUCERS AND DISTRIBUTORS TO SHOW MORE WHOLESOME FILMS FOR CHILDREN.

MATTERS OF GOVERNMENT CLERICAL STAFF SALARIES, WATER FOR SHEUNG YUEN LING, DEVELOPMENT OF LAMMA ISLAND, AND THE DISSEMINATION OF SUPPLEMENTARY QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS IN THE COUNCIL FOR USE IN CHINESE NEWSPAPERS WILL BE RAISED.

TSING YI SQUATTERS HAVE SAFE AND PROPER ELECTRICITY  
\* \* \* \* \*

PROPER AND SAFE ELECTRICITY SUPPLY WAS BROUGHT TO SOME 3,500 SQUATTERS ON TSING YI ISLAND TODAY UNDER THE ELECTRIFICATION SCHEME INTRODUCED LAST YEAR FOR SQUATTER AREAS.

A SWITCH-ON CEREMONY WAS HELD THIS MORNING TO MARK THE BEGINNING OF THE NEW ERA FOR RESIDENTS OF THE TSING YI LAGOON SQUATTER AREA.

THE ELECTRIFICATION PROJECT IS THE SECOND JOINT VENTURE BY THE GOVERNMENT AND THE CHINA LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY AND IS SIMILAR TO THE FIRST NOW OPERATING IN THE LION ROCK AREA. ITS CAPITAL COST IS BORNE BY THE COMPANY.

SOME 400 CONNECTIONS TO THE COMPANY'S SUPPLY HAVE BEEN MADE IN THE TSING YI PROJECT, ENABLING LEGAL ELECTRICITY SUPPLY TO BE BROUGHT TO THE RESIDENTS AT THE NORMAL TARIFF.

THIS MORNING'S SWITCH-ON CEREMONY WAS PERFORMED BY THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICER (DEVELOPMENT), MR. JAMES BLACK, AND THE COMPANY'S COMMERCIAL ENGINEER, MR. COLIN STEELE.

MR. BLACK SAID: +THE PROJECT WILL NO DOUBT CONSIDERABLY RAISE THE LIVING STANDARDS OF THE PEOPLE LIVING IN THE SQUATTER AREA.+

HE NOTED THAT ABOUT 20 FAMILIES WHO COULD NOT AFFORD THE CONNECTION FEE CHARGED BY THE ELECTRICAL CONTRACTOR WERE HELPED FINANCIALLY EITHER THROUGH THE SOCIAL WELFARE DEPARTMENT OR THE AMERICAN RELIEF AGENCY, C.A.R.E.

COMMENTING ON THE PROJECT, MR. STEELE SAID THE CHINA LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY WAS VERY INTERESTED IN PROJECTS OF THIS SORT.

+I WAS PLEASSED TO NOTICE HOW SMOOTHLY AND HAPPILY ALL PARTIES CONCERNED WORKED TOGETHER IN TSING YI TO GET THIS SCHEME GOING.

+AS A RESULT, A LARGE NUMBER OF PEOPLE CAN NOW ENJOY THE FULL BENEFIT OF DOMESTIC ELECTRICITY SUPPLY FROM OUR MAINS SOURCE,+ HE SAID.

GIVING A BRIEF ACCOUNT OF HOW THE PROJECT HAD COME INTO BEING, MR. BLACK SAID: +WE WERE ASKED LATE LAST YEAR BY THE TSING YI RURAL COMMITTEE WHETHER SUCH A SCHEME WOULD BE POSSIBLE ON TSING YI.+

SINCE THEN, HE SAID, THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND THE CHINA LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY HAD WORKED CLOSELY TOGETHER TO GET THE SCHEME COMPLETED IN THE SHORTEST POSSIBLE TIME.

HE SAID THIS HAD INVOLVED CLOSE CONTACT WITH THE LOCAL PEOPLE, AND HE ATTRIBUTED THE SUCCESS OF THE PROJECT TO THE COOPERATION AND ASSISTANCE GIVEN BY THE SQUATTER AREA REPRESENTATIVES AND THE RURAL COMMITTEE.

IT IS NOW PLANNED TO FORM A MUTUAL AID COMMITTEE IN THE SQUATTER AREA TO ADMINISTER THE ELECTRICITY SCHEME, HE SAID.

REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA  
EFFECTIVE JULY 15, 1977

\* \* \*

THE TERMS SUCH AS +PROPER LOOK-OUT+ AND +SAFE SPEED+ ARE MORE CLEARLY DEFINED IN THE 1972 REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTING COLLISIONS AT SEA, WHICH WILL COME INTO FORCE AT NOON ON FRIDAY (JULY 15), A MARINE DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN ANNOUNCED TODAY.

ALL SHIPBOARD PERSONNEL AND CANDIDATES FOR THE CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY AND NAUTICAL SCHOOL INSTRUCTORS ARE REMINDED THAT THE NEW REGULATIONS WILL REPLACE THE 1960 REGULATIONS.

THE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE NEW INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS, WHICH HAVE SO FAR BEEN ACCEPTED BY 36 NATIONS, INCLUDE SEVERAL IMPORTANT AMENDMENTS.

+THE TERM 'PROPER LOOK-OUT', WHICH IS USED IN BOTH REGULATIONS, IS MORE CLEARLY DEFINED, AND MAKES IT A POSITIVE RATHER THAN AN IMPLIED REQUIREMENT,+ HE SAID.

THE NEW REGULATIONS ALSO REQUIRE SHIPS TO MAINTAIN A 'SAFE SPEED', RATHER THAN 'MODERATE SPEED' AS STIPULATED IN THE 1960 REGULATIONS, EVEN IN GOOD VISIBILITY, HE ADDED.
