CENTRAL COMMITTEE ON YOUTH SET UP  
\* \* \* \* \*

A CENTRAL COMMITTEE HAS BEEN SET UP TO ADVISE THE GOVERNMENT ON MATTERS RELATING TO YOUTH DEVELOPMENT. KNOWN AS THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE ON YOUTH, IT COMPRISES 14 UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS AND A NUMBER OF GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES. THE INAUGURAL MEETING WILL BE HELD EARLY THIS MONTH.

THE CHAIRMAN IS A LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL MEMBER, MRS ROSANNA TAM.

THE GOVERNMENT'S AIM IN SETTING UP THE COMMITTEE IS TO PROVIDE A FOCAL POINT FOR DISCUSSION AND RESEARCH ON THE NEEDS AND ASPIRATIONS OF HONG KONG'S YOUNG PEOPLE. ITS TERMS OF REFERENCE ARE:

- \* TO COLLATE INFORMATION AND CONDUCT RESEARCH ON THE NEEDS AND ASPIRATIONS OF YOUNG PEOPLE AND TO BUILD UP A CENTRAL REPOSITORY OF INFORMATION ON YOUTH MATTERS FOR REFERENCE BY INTEREST PARTIES;
- \* TO LIAISE WITH AND ASSIST ORGANISATIONS TO PROMOTE YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND TO WIDEN THE CHANNELS OF YOUTH PARTICIPATION WHEREVER POSSIBLE;
- \* TO ADVISE ON TERRITORY-WIDE YOUTH ACTIVITIES SUCH AS THE SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMME, AND THEIR FUNDING;
- \* TO SERVE AS A CONTACT POINT AND CLEARING HOUSE FOR HONG KONG'S PARTICIPATION IN INTERNATIONAL YOUTH ACTIVITIES EXCEPT WHERE AN APPROPRIATE ORGANISATION ALREADY EXISTS FOR THIS PURPOSE;

AND IN THE LIGHT OF THE FOREGOING, TO EXAMINE THE NEED FOR A COMPREHENSIVE YOUTH POLICY.

UNOFFICIAL MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE: MR CHRISTOPHER CHAN CHEUK, MR ALBERT CHAN WAI-YIP, DR PHILEMON CHOI YUEN-WAN, MR CHUNG KING-FAI, MR FAN KAM-PING, MR KWOK KA-MING, MISS KWOK LUN-SHUI, MR PETER LEE SHUN-TAK, MR ERIC LI KA-CHEUNG, DR AGNES NG, MR NG SHUI-LAI, MR NG WAI-KI AND MR PAUL YOUNG.

THEY COME FROM MANY WALKS OF LIFE AND INCLUDE PROFESSIONALS, SOCIAL WORKERS, EDUCATIONALISTS, DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS, MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL AND REGIONAL COUNCILS AND EXPERTS IN THE CULTURAL AND SPORTS FIELDS. THEY ARE ALL DIRECTLY INVOLVED IN YOUTH ACTIVITIES.

TUEN MUN DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS WILL DISCUSS THE DOCUMENT ON TRIAD PROBLEMS AND THE REPORT ON THE DELIVERY OF MEDICAL SERVICES IN HOSPITALS ON TUESDAY (JUNE 3).

REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION DEPARTMENT, MR DANIEL LAU AND MR J.E. BOXALL, WILL BRIEF MEMBERS AT THE MEETING ON ENVIRONMENTAL ASPECTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PULVERISED FUEL ASH LAGOON AT TSANG TSUI.

THE SUBJECT WAS RAISED BY MEMBERS DURING A RECENT SITE VISIT AT THE INVITATION OF CHINA LIGHT AND POWER COMPANY WHICH IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PROPOSED PROJECT.

OTHER ITEMS ON THE AGENDA INCLUDE THE RENTAL POLICY IN PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES, A REPORT OF THE WORKING PARTY ON THE REVIEW OF THE JUNIOR SECONDARY EDUCATION ASSESSMENT SYSTEM, SAFETY MEASURES OF THE NUCLEAR PLANT TO BE CONSTRUCTED IN DAYA BAY, AND PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE DRAFT TUEN MUN OUTLINE ZONING PLAN.

REMINDER ON TUEN NG HOLIDAY \*  
\* \* \*

THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT HAS REMINDED EMPLOYERS THAT UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE THE TUEN NG (DRAGON BOAT) FESTIVAL ON JUNE 11 IS ONE OF THE 11 STATUTORY HOLIDAYS.

A SPOKESMAN SAID THAT ALL MANUAL EMPLOYEES AND THOSE NON-MANUAL EMPLOYEES EARNING NOT MORE THAN \$10 500 A MONTH ARE ENTITLED TO THE HOLIDAY AND MUST BE PAID FOR THE DAY-OFF IF THEY HAVE WORKED CONTINUOUSLY FOR THREE MONTHS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY.

HOLIDAY PAY SHOULD BE EQUIVALENT TO AN EMPLOYEE'S EARNINGS ON A NORMAL WORKING DAY AND SHOULD INCLUDE BASIC WAGES AS WELL AS ALLOWANCES THAT CAN BE EXPRESSED IN MONEY TERMS SUCH AS MEALS AND COST OF LIVING ALLOWANCES.

+WHERE THE EARNINGS VARY FROM DAY TO DAY, HOLIDAY PAY SHOULD BE THE AVERAGE DAILY EARNINGS DURING EVERY COMPLETE WAGE PERIOD, WHICH COULD BE BETWEEN 28 DAYS TO 31 DAYS, PRECEDING THE HOLIDAY,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IF AN EMPLOYEE IS REQUIRED TO WORK ON A STATUTORY HOLIDAY, HE MUST BE GIVEN AN ALTERNATIVE DAY-OFF WITHIN 60 DAYS BEFORE OR AFTER THAT DAY.+

ENQUIRIES ABOUT STATUTORY HOLIDAYS MAY BE MADE TO THE NEAREST BRANCH OFFICE OF THE LABOUR RELATIONS SERVICE.

COLOURFUL SEA PARADE LAUNCHES SAFETY DAY

A COLOURFUL SEA-PARADE COMPRISING DRAGON BOATS, SAILING AND SPEED BOATS, CANOES, LAUNCHES, CRUISERS AND ABOUT 20 WINDSURFERS ATTRACTED A LARGE CROWD TO THE TSIM SHA TSUI PROMENADE THIS (SUNDAY) AFTERNOON.

THE PARADE WAS THE PRELUDE TO THE 1986 WATER SPORTS SAFETY DAY LAUNCHED ON THE WATERFRONT BY THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL FOR RECREATION AND SPORT, MR F.K. HU.

ALSO TAKING PART IN THE LAUNCHING CEREMONY WERE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE COMMITTEE ON SAFETY IN OUTDOOR PURSUITS, DR S.F. LAM, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE WORKING PARTY ON THE 1986 WATER SPORTS SAFETY CAMPAIGN, MR J.A. FORTUNE, AND SECRETARY FOR MUNICIPAL SERVICES, MR G. BARNES.

OTHER ATTRACTIONS OF THE DAY INCLUDED AN AIR-SEA RESCUE DEMONSTRATION BY RHKAAF HELICOPTERS AND MARINE POLICE LAUNCHES, DEMONSTRATIONS OF CANOEING, WINDSURFING, DIVING, WATER SKIING, AND STATIC DISPLAYS ON LAND BY 15 WATER SPORTS ORGANISATIONS.

MR HU WARNED THOSE TAKING PART IN WATER SPORTS NOT TO OVERLOOK THE ELEMENT OF RISK, BUT HE ASKED THE PUBLIC NOT TO SHY AWAY FROM TAKING PART AS THERE WERE EXCELLENT FACILITIES IN HONG KONG FOR A WIDE RANGE OF WATER SPORTS.

+INSTEAD WE SHOULD ADOPT A POSITIVE ATTITUDE AND TRY TO ELIMINATE THE RISK WHILE TAKING PART,+ HE SAID.

MR HU ALSO APPEALED TO THOSE PRESENT TO BRING HOME THE +PLAY SAFE+ MESSAGE AND HELP SPREAD IT AMONG FRIENDS AND RELATIVES.

IN HIS WELCOMING SPEECH, MR FORTUNE SAID THAT FAR TOO MANY ACCIDENTS OCCURRED TO PEOPLE NOT USING COMMON SENSE, NOT OBTAINING PROPER TRAINING AND IGNORING BASIC SAFETY RULES DESPITE THE COMMITTEE'S REPEATED CALLS TO +PLAY SAFE+.

DISTRICT BOARD SUPPORT FOR SPORTS EVENTS

MORE THAN 20 SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL EVENTS, REQUIRING SPONSORSHIP OF \$100 300 FROM THE DISTRICT BOARD, ARE BEING PLANNED BY THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT RECREATION AND SPORTS COUNCIL THIS YEAR.

ANNOUNCING THIS TODAY, SOUTHERN DISTRICT OFFICER, MR SIMON LORD, SAID THE DISTRICT BOARD'S COMMUNITY BUILDING COMMITTEE RECENTLY ENDORSED \$24 525 TO SPONSOR SEVEN COUNCIL-ORGANISED PROJECTS BETWEEN MAY 25 AND AUGUST 17.

HE WAS SPEAKING AT A PRIZE PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT COLOURED BOAT COMPETITION IN REPULSE BAY.

MR LORD COMMENDED THE COUNCIL FOR PROMOTING RECREATION AND SPORTS IN THE DISTRICT THROUGH THE VARIETY OF HEALTHY AND ENJOYABLE ACTIVITIES IT ORGANISED.

HE SAID THE COLOURED BOAT RACE, WHICH HAD PROVEN POPULAR AND SUCCESSFUL IN THE PAST, IS ONE OF SUCH PROJECTS WHICH PROVIDED EXCITEMENT AND FUN FOR PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS ALIKE.

THE COUNCIL'S 1986-87 PROGRAMME CONTAINS A VARIETY OF SPORTS EVENTS, SUCH AS BASKETBALL, BADMINTON, SOCCER, SWIMMING AND AN ATHLETIC MEET.

VOLLEYBALL AND TABLE-TENNIS COMPETITIONS, AS WELL AS BASKETBALL AND VOLLEYBALL MATCHES FOR WOMEN, WILL ALSO BE INTRODUCED THIS YEAR.

TWO POPULAR EVENTS, THE SANDSCAPING COMPETITION AND THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT TELEMATCH, WILL BE HELD ON A WIDER SCALE THIS YEAR TO COINCIDE WITH THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT FESTIVAL.

PROGRAMME FOR DRAGON BOAT RACES IN ABERDEEN

FORTY-TWO TEAMS WILL BE TAKING PART IN DRAGON BOAT RACES TO BE HELD IN ABERDEEN ON JUNE 11 (WEDNESDAY) TO CELEBRATE THE ANNUAL TUEN NG FESTIVAL, THE CHAIRMAN OF THE 1986 ABERDEEN DRAGON BOAT RACES ORGANISING COMMITTEE, MR KEUNG YIN-MAN, SAID.

SPEAKING AT A PRESS CONFERENCE TODAY (SUNDAY), MR KEUNG SAID RACES WOULD TAKE PLACE ALONG A 330-METRE CHANNEL OFF THE ABERDEEN WATERFRONT FROM 9.30 AM TO 4.30 PM.

RACES WILL BE DIVIDED INTO FULL-SIZED DRAGON BOAT AND MEDIUM-SIZED DRAGON BOAT DIVISIONS, WITH THE LATTER SUB-DIVIDED INTO AN OPEN, LADIES OPEN, AND INVITATION SECTIONS.

THERE ARE 10 TEAMS COMPETING IN THE FORMER DIVISION AND 32 TEAMS IN THE LATTER DIVISION.

PARTICIPATING TEAMS ARE FROM FIRMS, FACTORIES, LOCAL ORGANISATIONS, GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, WOMEN ASSOCIATIONS AND FISHERMEN BODIES. WINNERS OF THE FOUR SECTIONS WILL COMPETE FOR THE OVERALL CHAMPIONSHIP AT 4 PM.

THE GOVERNMENT IS PROPOSING TO CLOSE BIK WAN ROAD IN KWUN TONG TO FACILITATE ITS UPGRADING AND WIDENING.

THE WORK IS CONNECTED WITH DEVELOPMENT OF A PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE IN THE AREA.

BIK WAN ROAD WILL BE WIDENED FROM 7.3 METRES TO 11 - 12.65 METRES, WHILE ITS JUNCTION WITH KO CHIU ROAD WILL BE MODIFIED.

THE WORK WILL LAST ABOUT 15 MONTHS. PEDESTRIAN ACCESS BETWEEN KO CHIU ROAD AND RENNIE'S MILL WILL BE MAINTAINED AT ALL TIMES DURING THE COURSE OF THE WORK.
