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IYY FESTIVAL COMES TO A SUCCESSFUL END

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LADY YOUDE TODAY (SATURDAY) PRESENTED PRIZES TO AWARD WINNERS TO BRING THE MONTH-LONG IYY '85 YOUTH FESTIVAL TO A SUCCESSFUL END.

FIVE AWARD SCHEMES WERE ORGANISED DURING THE FESTIVAL, JOINTLY PRESENTED BY THE CENTRAL CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE ON THE 1985 INTERNATIONAL YOUTH YEAR (CCCIYY) AND TELEVISION BROADCASTS LIMITED, TO PROVIDE A WIDE RANGE OF INTERESTING ACTIVITIES FOR YOUTHS TO DEMONSTRATE THEIR TALENT AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN VARIOUS FIELDS.

SPEAKING AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY OF THE IYY '85 YOUTH FESTIVAL, THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE CCCIYY, MRS SELINA CHOW, CALLED ON YOUTHS TO EXERCISE THEIR CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY AND REGISTER AS A VOTER.

+MORE THAN 110 000 YOUNG PEOPLE WOULD REACH THE AGE OF 21 AT THE END OF THIS YEAR AND ARE ELIGIBLE TO REGISTER AS VOTERS,+ SHE SAID.

+BETWEEN NOW AND OCTOBER 1, THEY WILL HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXERCISE THEIR RIGHT AND SIGN UP SO THAT THEY CAN VOTE TO ELECT DISTRICT BOARD MEMBERS, URBAN COUNCILLOR AND REGIONAL COUNCILLOR IN FUTURE.

+THIS IS A CALL TO WHICH ALL YOUNG PEOPLE IN HONG KONG SHOULD RESPOND, AS THEY DID TO THE INTERNATIONAL YOUTH YEAR AND THE '85 YOUTH FESTIVAL,+ SHE ADDED.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE IYY '85 YOUTH FESTIVAL, MR ROBERT CHAN, SAID HE WAS PLEASED WITH THE RESPONSE TO THE FESTIVAL.

+MORE THAN 11 000 YOUNG PEOPLE PARTICIPATED IN THE FIVE AWARD COMPETITIONS COVERING THE FIELDS OF DESIGN, ALTERNATIVE OPPORTUNITY PLANNING, MUSIC AND INTER-SCHOOL EVENTS,+ HE SAID.

+THE FIVE YOUTH FESTIVAL SPECIALS SHOWN ON TELEVISION DURING AUGUST REACHED AN ESTIMATED AUDIENCE OF FOUR MILLION,+ HE ADDED.

DURING A BRIEF CEREMONY AT THE TVB STUDIO, LADY YOUDE PRESENTED PRIZES TO THE FIVE AWARD WINNERS AND SOUVENIRS TO THE CO-ORGANISERS OF THE FESTIVAL.

ALSO PRESENT AT THE FUNCTION WERE THE CHAIRMAN OF TVB, SIR RUN RUN SHAW, AND THE PATRONS OF '85 YOUTH FESTIVAL, SECRETARY FOR DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION, MR DONALD LIAO- MR HILTON CHEONG-LEEN AND DR PHILIP KWOK.

THE YOUNG DESIGNER AWARD WENT TO MR HO SAI DUN, A 23-YEAR-OLD HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC STUDENT WHILE THE YOUNG TOUR CO-ORDINATOR AWARD WAS WON BY MISS SARAH TANG, A REGISTERED TOUR CO-ORDINATOR.

THE HO LAP COLLEGE OF WONG TAI SIN DISTRICT OUTDID NEARLY 100 SCHOOL TEAMS TO TAKE TOP HONOURS IN THE INTER-DISTRICT STUDENT TEAM CHAMPION AWARD.

WINNERS OF THE OTHER TWO AWARDS, CITY APPRENTICE TEAM CHAMPION AWARD AND YOUNG MUSIC PERFORMER AWARD, WENT TO THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY TRAINING AUTHORITY TEAM, AND MISS CHEN WAI, A 16-YEAR-OLD STUDENT OF THE HONG KONG ACADEMY FOR PERFORMING ARTS.

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OUTREACHING SERVICE HELPING YOUTHS WITH PROBLEMS * * * * *

THERE ARE AT PRESENT 18 OUTREACHING SOCIAL WORK TEAMS IN HONG KONG RUN BY EIGHT VOLUNTARY AGENCIES TO PREVENT YOUTH PROBLEMS AND TO HELP YOUNG PEOPLE DEVELOP THEIR POTENTIALS, THE DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF SOCIAL WELFARE, MR STEPHEN LAW, SAID TODAY (SATURDAY).

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING OF THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF YOUTH GROUPS' TSUEN WAN OUTREACHING SOCIAL WORK TEAM OFFICE, HE SAID THE EXISTING SERVICE HAD JUST BEGUN, AND THERE WAS ROOM FOR IMPROVEMENT AND EXPANSION.

APART FROM ORGANISING COMMUNITY AND GROUP ACTIVITIES, THE VARIOUS OUTREACHING TEAMS WERE HANDLING MORE THAN 3 000 CASES.

SOCIAL WORKERS VISITED PLACES FREQUENTED BY YOUTHS SUCH AS SPORTS GROUNDS, FAST FOOD SHOPS AND GAMES HALLS TO TALK TO YOUTHS WHO WERE AGED BETWEEN SIX AND 24.

+AFTER THEY HAD ESTABLISHED INITIAL CONTACT AND WON THE TRUST OF YOUTHS, THE SOCIAL WORKERS CAN PROVIDE COUNSELLING AND HELP THOSE WITH ADAPTATION OR BEHAVIOUR PROBLEMS CAUSED BY PERSONAL OR SOCIAL REASONS,+ MR LAW SAID.

HE SAID THAT THE TSUEN WAN OUTREACHING TEAM OF THE HONG KONG FEDERATION OF YOUTH GROUPS HAD BEEN SERVING THE TAI WO HAU, KWAI CHUNG, FUK LOI AND CHO YIU ESTATES FROM THEIR OFFICE IN TAI KOK TSUI. WITH THE OPENING OF THE TSUEN WAN OFFICE IN TAI WO HAU ESTATE IT WOULD BE A GREAT HELP TO THEIR WORK BY CUTTING DOWN ON TRAVELLING TIME.

+I AM SURE ALL YOUR WORKERS WILL MAKE FULL USE OF THE CONVENIENT LOCATION OF THIS OFFICE AND CO-OPERATE WITH THE COMMUNITY ORGANISATIONS TO CONTINUE SERVING YOUTHS IN THE AREA,+ HE SAID.

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ANTI-NARCOTICS YOUTH CAMP OPENS
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YOUNG PEOPLE WERE TODAY (SATURDAY) URGED TO STAY AWAY FROM DRUGS BY PARTICIPATING IN HEALTHY ACTIVITIES.

THE APPEAL WAS MADE BY THE PRINCIPAL INFORMATION OFFICER OF THE NARCOTICS DIVISION, GOVERNMENT SECRETARIAT, MR HANDRICK NG, AT THE OPENING CEREMONY OF AN ANTI-NARCOTICS YOUTH CAMP.

MR NG SAID THAT THE NUMBER OF PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 21 NEWLY REPORTED FOR INVOLVEMENT IN DRUGS IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1985 DROPPED WHEN COMPARED WITH THE CORRESPONDENT PERIOD OF 1984.

A DECREASE IN THE NUMBER OF PERSONS PROSECUTED FOR MAJOR AND MINOR DRUG OFFENCES WAS ALSO RECORDED DURING THIS PERIOD.

+THESE ARE ENCOURAGING SIGNS WHICH SHOW THAT OUR PREVENTIVE EDUCATION AND PUBLICITY STRATEGY IS ON THE RIGHT TRACK,+ SAID MR NG.

+DESPITE THESE POSITIVE RESULTS, CONTINUING EFFORTS WILL BE MADE TO REACH OUT TO YOUNG PEOPLE, WHO ARE MOST EXPOSED TO THE RISK OF DRUG ABUSE, TO PREVENT THEM FROM GETTING INVOLVED IN DRUGS,+ HE ADDED.

THE TWO-DAY CAMP, ORGANISED BY THE NARCOTICS DIVISION AS ONE OF ITS PREVENTIVE EDUCATION AND PUBLICITY PROGRAMMES FOR 1985-86, AIMED AT AROUSING PARTICIPANTS' AWARENESS OF THE DRUG PROBLEM, ENHANCING THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THE DANGERS OF DRUG ABUSE AND SHOWING HOW THEY COULD HELP IN THE FIGHT AGAINST THE DRUG MENACE.

THE CAMP OFFERED A RICH EDUCATIONAL AND ENTERTAINING PROGRAMME INCLUDING DRUG EDUCATION TALKS, GROUP DISCUSSIONS, SLIDE AND FILM SHOWS, EXHIBITIONS AND GAMES WITH THE ANTI-NARCOTICS THEME.

IT WAS HOPED THAT THE ANTI-NARCOTICS MESSAGE WOULD REACH NOT ONLY THE PARTICIPANTS IN THE CAMP, BUT WOULD ALSO BE FURTHER PROMULGATED BY THEM TO THEIR FRIENDS AND RELATIVES.

THE CAMP, WHICH IS BEING HELD AT THE SAI KUNG OUTDOOR RECREATION CENTRE OF THE REGIONAL SERVICES DEPARTMENT, ATTRACTED SOME 100 YOUNG PEOPLE FROM YOUTH CENTRES IN KOWLOON DISTRICTS.

+THE NEW I.D. CARD ISSUE SCHEME HAS NOW BEGUN TO AFFECT SENIOR RESIDENTS. FOR THEIR CONVENIENCE, A TELEPHONE BOOKING SYSTEM IS TO BE INTRODUCED WITH THE START OF THIS NEW PHASE,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE IMMIGRATION DEPARTMENT SAID.

APPLICANTS MAY FIX AN APPOINTMENT BY CALLING THE ISSUE OFFICES OF THEIR CHOICE BETWEEN 9 AM AND 5 PM FROM MONDAY TO FRIDAY, AND BETWEEN 9 AM AND NOON ON SATURDAY.

+TO COMPLETE THE BOOKING PROCEDURE, APPLICANTS HAVE TO PROVIDE PARTICULARS SUCH AS THEIR NAME, I.D. CARD NUMBER AND YEAR OF BIRTH,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

SINCE SOME OF THE OLD-TYPE IDENTITY CARDS ONLY SHOW THE AGE OF THE HOLDER, IT IS EXPECTED THAT SOME APPLICANTS MAY HAVE DIFFICULTY IN ESTABLISHING THEIR EXACT YEARS OF BIRTH.

+IN SUCH CASES, THEY MAY BE ASKED TO FURNISH MORE PERSONAL DETAILS SO AS TO ENSURE THAT THEY BELONG TO THE RIGHT AGE GROUP,+ HE SAID.

+IF AN APPLICANT WISHES TO VISIT AN OFFICE ON A PARTICULAR DAY, HE IS ADVISED TO MAKE THE TELEPHONE BOOKING WELL IN ADVANCE,+ HE ADDED.

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NEW MARKET COMPLEXES TO BE BUILT
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THE BUILDING DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A 14-STOREY MARKET COMPLEX AT THE JUNCTION OF MONG KOK ROAD AND FA YUEN STREET.

THE NEW COMPLEX WILL BE ON A 1 660-SQUARE-METRE SITE NOW OCCUPIED BY A HAWKER BAZAAR.

THREE FLOORS OF THE COMPLEX WILL BE FOR MARKET STALLS AND ONE FLOOR FOR COOKED FOOD STALLS.

OTHER FACILITIES TO BE PROVIDED INCLUDE OFFICES, A LIBRARY, SQUASH COURTS, GAMES ROOMS AND A MULTI-PURPOSE SPORTS HALL.

WORK ON THE COMPLEX IS EXPECTED TO START IN DECEMBER AND TO BE COMPLETED BY LATE 1987.

MEANWHILE, A \$23.7-MILLION CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A MARKET COMPLEX IN SHUI WO STREET, KWUN TONG, HAS BEEN AWARDED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

THE NINE-STOREY BUILDING WILL HAVE THREE FLOORS OF MARKET STALLS AND A COOKED FOOD CENTRE.

THERE WILL ALSO BE OFFICE ACCOMMODATION, A LIBRARY AND A STUDY ROOM, SQUASH COURTS, A MULTI-PURPOSE SPORTS HALL AND A GAMES ROOM.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START THIS MONTH AND TAKE 21 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

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INTERCHANGE TO BE BUILT FOR JUNK BAY
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THE NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT IS INVITING TENDERS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A GRADE-SEPARATED INTERCHANGE AT THE JUNCTION OF JUNK BAY ROAD AND SAU MAU PING ROAD IN KWUN TONG.

IT WILL FORM PART OF THE PRINCIPAL ACCESS TO JUNK BAY NEW TOWN, AND ALSO PROVIDE ACCESS TO LAM TIN ESTATE BY WAY OF SAU MAU PING ROAD.

THE WORK INCLUDES THE CONSTRUCTION OF A 70-METRE-LONG FLYOVER WITH FOOTPATHS ON BOTH SIDES AND TWO GROUND-LEVEL SLIP ROADS.

WORK IS EXPECTED TO START IN NOVEMBER AND TAKE ABOUT 30 MONTHS TO COMPLETE.

A POST OFFICE SPOKESMAN SAID THAT HONG KONG, SITUATED NEAR THE NORTHERN LIMIT OF THE DISTRIBUTION OF TROPICAL ASIAN FLORA, HAD A LARGE VARIETY OF PLANTS AND THE SIX FLOWERS WERE NOTEWORTHY FOR THEIR BEAUTY OR FRAGRANCE OF THEIR BLOSSOMS.

- * MELASTOMA -- 40 CENTS -- A LARGE AND SHOWY PINK-PURPLE FLOWER.
- * CHINESE LILY -- 50 CENTS -- A WHITE TRUMPET-LIKE FLOWER.
- * GRANTHAM'S CAMELLIA -- 60 CENTS -- A LARGE WHITE FLOWER WITH DISTINCTIVE YELLOW STAMENS.
- * NARCISSUS -- \$1.30 -- FRAGRANT WHITE AND YELLOW FLOWERS.
- * BAUHINIA -- \$1.70 -- A LARGE, FRAGRANT PURPLISH RED ORCHID-LIKE FLOWER.
- * CHINESE NEW YEAR FLOWER -- \$5 -- A PINK AND HANGING FLOWER WITH CURIOUS STAMEN ARRANGEMENT WHICH RESEMBLES A TINY FLOWER WITHIN A FLOWER.

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THE STAMPS, DESIGNED BY MR NICK JESSE, HAVE BEEN PRINTED BY BDT INTERNATIONAL SECURITY PRINTER ON UNWATERMARKED PAPER.

THEY WILL BE ON DISPLAY DAILY FROM SEPTEMBER 11 TO 18 ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, CONNAUGHT PLACE, AND IN TSIM SHA TSUI POST OFFICE, MIDDLE ROAD, KOWLOON, THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

FIRST DAY COVERS AT 50 CENTS EACH WILL BE ON SALE ON WEDNESDAY (SEPTEMBER 11). ADVANCE ORDERS FOR SERVICING FIRST DAY COVERS WILL BE ACCEPTED FROM THAT DAY TO SEPTEMBER 20 AT ALL POST OFFICES.

A SET OF SIX POSTCARDS SHOWING AN ENLARGEMENT OF EACH STAMP WILL ALSO BE ON SALE AT \$1 EACH.

THIS IS THE SECOND TIME THAT THE POST OFFICE HAS ISSUED POSTCARDS DEPICTING SPECIAL STAMPS.

THE FIRST SET WAS ISSUED IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE +AVIATION+ SPECIAL ISSUE IN MARCH LAST YEAR, HE ADDED.
