SENIOR APPOINTMENTS IN CIVIL SERVICE

\* \* \* \* \*

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN TODAY ANNOUNCED THAT THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR. I.R. PRICE, WILL RETIRE FROM THE HONG KONG CIVIL SERVICE ON MAY 30.

MR. PRICE, AGED 56, WAS IN THE MALAYAN CIVIL SERVICE FOR 14 YEARS, WHERE HIS FINAL APPOINTMENT WAS COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR.

HE CAME TO HONG KONG AS A SENIOR LABOUR OFFICER IN 1965 AND WAS APPOINTED ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR IN 1968, DEPUTY COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR AND MINES IN 1971 AND COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR AND MINES IN 1973. HE WAS APPOINTED AN OFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL IN 1974 AND WAS AWARDED THE CBE IN 1976.

MR. PETER B. WILLIAMS, PRESENTLY SECRETARY FOR ADMINISTRATION, WILL BE POSTED AS COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR IN SUCCESSION TO MR. PRICE.

MR. WILLIAMS, AGED 50, JOINED THE HONG KONG CIVIL SERVICE IN 1953 AND HAS SERVED IN A WIDE VARIETY OF POSTS, INCLUDING ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY TO THE POLICE FORCE, DEFENCE SECRETARY AND ESTABLISHMENT OFFICER. HE HAS SERVED AS AN OFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS.

MR. I.M. LIGHTBODY WILL BE POSTED AS SECRETARY FOR ADMINISTRATION. MR. LIGHTBODY, AGED 55, IS AT PRESENT SECRETARY FOR HOUSING. MR. LIGHTBODY JOINED THE HONG KONG CIVIL SERVICE IN 1946, AND DURING HIS 30 YEARS' SERVICE HAS OCCUPIED MANY SENIOR POSTS, INCLUDING ESTABLISHMENT OFFICER, DISTRICT COMMISSIONER NEW TERRITORIES, COMMISSIONER FOR TRANSPORT, COMMISSIONER FOR RESETTLEMENT, DEFENCE SECRETARY AND SECRETARY FOR HOUSING. HE IS AN OFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND WAS AWARDED THE CMG IN 1974.

MR. A.J. SCOTT, PRESENTLY SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE, WILL BE POSTED AS SECRETARY FOR HOUSING.

MR. SCOTT AGED 43, WAS APPOINTED TO THE FIJI CIVIL SERVICE IN 1958, AND HIS FINAL APPOINTMENT THERE WAS CONTROLLER OF ORGANISATION AND ESTABLISHMENTS, AFTER WHICH HE LEFT TO JOIN THE HONG KONG CIVIL SERVICE.

HIS FIRST POSTING WAS AN ASSISTANT FINANCIAL SECRETARY, AND AFTER A SPELL AS PRINCIPAL ASSISTANT FINANCIAL SECRETARY, HE WAS APPOINTED SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE IN 1973. HE IS AN OFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

THE POST OF SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE WILL BE FILLED BY MR. R.G.B. BRIDGE, AGED 44, AT PRESENT DEPUTY SECRETARY FOR SECURITY.

MR. BRIDGE JOINED THE HONG KONG CIVIL SERVICE IN 1957, AND HAS SERVED IN THE RESETTLEMENT DEPARTMENT, THE FORMER LANDS BRANCH OF THE SECRETARIAT AND AS PRINCIPAL ASSISTANT COLONIAL SECRETARY (ESTABLISHMENT) AND DEPUTY SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE FROM 1971 TO 1976.

A PRESS CONFERENCE ON A HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME WILL BE HELD AT 3 P.M. TOMORROW (FRIDAY).

THE FINANCIAL SECRETARY, MR. PHILIP HADDON-CAVE WILL CHAIR THE CONFERENCE WHICH WILL TAKE PLACE IN THE G.I.S. THEATRE ON THE FIFTH FLOOR OF BEACONSFIELD HOUSE.

ALSO ATTENDING THE CONFERENCE WILL BE MR. IAN LIGHTBODY, SECRETARY FOR HOUSING, MR. DONALD LIAO, DIRECTOR OF HOUSING, MR. H.M.G. FORSGATE, URBAN COUNCILLOR, AND MR. YEUNG KAI-YIN, ASSISTANT FINANCIAL SECRETARY, WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE WORKING PARTY ON HOME OWNERSHIP.

YOU ARE CORDIALLY INVITED TO SEND REPRESENTATIVES TO COVER THE CONFERENCE. COPIES OF A BACKGROUND BRIEF ON THE HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO PRESS REPRESENTATIVES AT 2.30 P.M., HALF AN HOUR BEFORE THE START OF THE CONFERENCE.

WARNING TO FISHERMEN AND SMALL CRAFT OPERATORS

THE MARINE DEPARTMENT HAS ISSUED A NAVIGATIONAL WARNING TO FISHERMEN AND SMALL CRAFT OPERATORS SAILING IN OR NEAR CASTLE PEAK BAY TO AVOID INTERFERING WITH HYDROGRAPHIC STUDIES TO BE CARRIED OUT THERE.

THEY ARE ASKED TO GIVE A WIDE BERTH TO VESSELS AND RIGS WHICH WILL BE STATIONED THERE TO UNDERTAKE THE STUDIES FOR THE DESIGN OF A TYPHOON SHELTER FOR TUEN MUN NEW TOWN.

FROM 8 A.M. TOMORROW (FRIDAY) TO 10 A.M. ON SATURDAY (MARCH 5) THREE VESSELS WILL BE ANCHORED BETWEEN PEARL ISLAND AND EAST BROTHER ISLAND.

TO RECORD THE WAVE EFFECTS AND FLOW CURRENT, TWO INSTRUMENTED MOORED RIGS WILL BE LAID IN OR NEAR CASTLE PEAK BAY FOR ABOUT SIX MONTHS, FROM MARCH 23 TO OCTOBER 5.

A DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN TODAY URGED ALL VESSELS, IN PARTICULAR FISHING CRAFT, TO EXERCISE CARE AND CAUTION WHEN NAVIGATING IN THE VICINITY OF THE MOORINGS AND THEY SHOULD, IN NO CIRCUMSTANCES, GO ALONGSIDE THE BUOYS.

THEIR CO-OPERATION IS REQUIRED TO ENSURE THAT THE STUDIES CAN BE PROPERLY CARRIED OUT.

THE TYPHOON SHELTER FOR TUEN MUN NEW TOWN IS SCHEDULED TO BE COMPLETED SOMETIME IN 1980.

LICENTIATE EXAM. FOR OVER 1,000 UNREGISTRABLE DOCTORS

MORE THAN 1,000 UNREGISTRABLE DOCTORS HAVE PAID THEIR FEES IN ORDER TO SIT FOR PART I OF THE LICENTIATE EXAMINATION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 15.

THE FIRST OF THE THREE-PART EXAMINATION WILL BE A MULTIPLE-CHOICE QUESTION PAPER ON PROFESSIONAL KNOWLEDGE, AND CANDIDATES MAY ANSWER THE QUESTIONS IN EITHER ENGLISH OR CHINESE.

THE SECRETARY OF THE LICENTIATE COMMITTEE OF THE HONG KONG MEDICAL COUNCIL, MR. I.A.S. YOUNG, SAID THAT UP TO 5 P.M. YESTERDAY (WEDNESDAY), A TOTAL OF 1,029 CANDIDATES HAD PAID UP FEES FOR PART I OF THE EXAMINATION.

AT THE REQUEST OF A NUMBER OF CANDIDATES WHO HAVE NOT YET PAID, HE SAID, LATE PAYMENT OF FEES WOULD BE ACCEPTED UP TO NOON ON SATURDAY (MARCH 5).

MR. YOUNG ADDED THAT CANDIDATES SUCCESSFUL IN PART I OF THE EXAMINATION WOULD BE ADVISED IN WRITING WHEN TO PAY FEES FOR PART II, THE PROFESSIONAL ENGLISH PAPER, TO BE HELD ON APRIL 15.

HE REITERATED THAT THIS WOULD BE A SIMPLE TEST OF PROFESSIONAL ENGLISH DESIGNED TO ENSURE THAT CANDIDATES' COMMAND OF THE LANGUAGE IS ADEQUATE TO DEAL WITH SUCH MATTERS AS PRESCRIPTIONS, STATUTORY FORMS, CLINICAL CASE NOTES, REPORTS AND REFERRALS.

+IT WILL NOT GO OUTSIDE THE PROFESSIONAL FIELD OR SEEK TO TEST GENERAL COMPETENCE IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE,+ HE SAID.

PART III OF THE EXAMINATION, AN ORAL TEST ON PROFESSIONAL KNOWLEDGE WHICH CAN BE TAKEN IN EITHER LANGUAGES, WILL BE HELD IN JULY.

WATER CUT

A NUMBER OF PREMISES IN SHAU KEI WAN ON HONG KONG ISLAND WILL BE WITHOUT WATER FOR FIVE HOURS FROM 1 A.M. ON SATURDAY (MARCH 5) TO ALLOW THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT TO CARRY OUT A NIGHT LEAKAGE TEST.

THE AREA AFFECTED STRETCHES FROM ALDRICH STREET TO SUN SING STREET AND FROM SHAUKIWAN ROAD TO THE SEAFRONT, INCLUDING FU TAU WAT VILLAGE, TSIN SHUI MA TAU VILLAGE AND ALDRICH VILLAGE.

ON THE SAME DAY, SEA WATER FLUSHING SUPPLY TO A NUMBER OF PREMISES IN HUNG HOM, KOWLOON, WILL BE TURNED OFF FOR 14 HOURS FROM 10 A.M. TO ENABLE REPAIR WORK TO BE CARRIED OUT ON THE DISCHARGE PIPE OF A PUMPING STATION AT QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL.

PLANNING OF NEW SCHOOL BUILDINGS

\* \* \* \* \*

THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION (DEVELOPMENT), MR. DEREK HOGAN, TODAY OUTLINED THE STEPS REQUIRED TO PUT TOGETHER AN EDUCATION BUILDING PROGRAMME. THESE INCLUDED PLANNING THE NUMBER AND TYPES OF SCHOOLS NEEDED, THEIR LOCATION, DESIGN AND FINANCING.

HE WAS ADDRESSING THE LUNCHEON MEETING OF THE ROTARY CLUB OF KOWLOON.

MR. HOGAN RECALLED THE MASSIVE BUILDING PROGRAMMES OF THE FIFTIES AND SIXTIES WHICH RAISED THE NUMBER OF PRIMARY PLACES IN GOVERNMENT AND AIDED SCHOOLS TO OVER 600,000.

TURNING TO THE PRESENT SITUATION, MR. HOGAN REFERRED SPECIFICALLY TO THE NEEDS OF THE NEW TOWNS WHERE MANY SCHOOLS WOULD BE BUILT IN THE COMING YEARS. IN MOST CASES THESE SCHOOLS WILL BE BUILT AS PART OF THE PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATE CONTRACTS THUS PRODUCING ECONOMIES OF TIME AND MONEY. THE SCHOOL BUILDINGS THEMSELVES, HOWEVER, WOULD HAVE A HIGH STANDARD OF ACCOMMODATION, WITH MORE AND LARGER SPECIAL ROOMS THAN THE STANDARD SECONDARY GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

THE CURRENT PROGRAMME OF 83 SECONDARY SCHOOLS TO BE BUILT BETWEEN APRIL 1976 AND SEPTEMBER 1981, HE SAID, WOULD PRODUCE A TOTAL OF 94,000 ADDITIONAL SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACES.

ALTHOUGH GOVERNMENT'S POLICY OF PROVIDING A GOVERNMENT OR AIDED PRIMARY PLACE FOR EVERY CHILD HAS ALREADY BEEN ACHIEVED, HE SAID, THERE REMAINED A NEED FOR A PRIMARY SCHOOLS BUILDING PROGRAMME TO PROVIDE FOR CHILDREN GOING TO LIVE IN NEW PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES IN AREAS OF SHORTAGE.

THE PROGRAMME FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 1977/78 CONTAINED TEN ESTATE PRIMARY SCHOOLS. THE OPENING OF THESE NEW CLASSES OR SCHOOLS WOULD BE BALANCED, HE POINTED OUT, BY CLOSURES ELSEWHERE.

PLANNING FOR THE NEXT SECONDARY SCHOOL BUILDING PROGRAMME WAS ALREADY WELL ADVANCED, HE SAID. THE OBJECTIVE OF THIS PROGRAMME WOULD BE TO PROVIDE PLACES IN FORMS IV AND V FOR 40 PER CENT OF CHILDREN IN THE 15-16 AGE GROUP. THIS WAS ONE OF THE 1974 WHITE PAPER AIMS.

MR. HOGAN EMPHASISED THE IMPORTANCE OF THE USE MADE OF SCHOOLS AFTER THEY HAD BEEN BUILT. HERE THE ADMINISTRATIVE AND PROFESSIONAL QUALITIES OF SCHOOL MANAGERMENTS AND TEACHERS WERE VITAL.

THE POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT REGRETS TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE MAIL DESPATCH FROM CHEUNG CHAU TO THE GENERAL POST OFFICE YESTERDAY (WEDNESDAY) WENT DOWN WITH THE FERRY WHICH SANK AFTER A COLLISION NEAR HEI LING CHAU.

THE MAIL WAS RECOVERED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF MARINE DEPARTMENT DIVERS, BUT UNFORTUNATELY MOST OF THE ADDRESSES HAVE BEEN RENDERED ILLEGIBLE BY IMMERSION IN THE SEA.

SEMINAR ON TEACHING AND LEARNING OF PHYSICS

ABOUT 120 SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHERS WILL ATTEND A SEMINAR ON THE TEACHING AND LEARNING OF PHYSICS ON SATURDAY, AT THE CHUNG CHI COLLEGE, THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY OF HONG KONG.

THE SEMINAR IS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE ADVISORY INSPECTORATE OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY'S SCHOOL OF EDUCATION.

AS THE AIM OF THIS SEMINAR IS TO INTRODUCE INNOVATIONS IN THE TEACHING AND LEARNING OF PHYSICS, TEACHERS TAKING PART IN THE SEMINAR WILL HAVE A CHANCE TO EXCHANGE IDEAS AND DISCUSS MATTERS OF COMMON INTEREST.

TRAFFIC ARRANGEMENT IN KOWLOON

PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES WILL BE PROHIBITED FROM STOPPING TO PICK UP OR SET DOWN PASSENGERS IN BOTH CARRIAGEWAYS ALONG THE SECTION OF TAI KOK TSUI ROAD BETWEEN TUNG CHAU STREET AND CHERRY STREET BETWEEN 7 A.M. AND MIDNIGHT.

THE RESTRICTION, WHICH WILL COME INTO EFFECT AT 10 A.M. ON SATURDAY (MARCH 5), IS INTENDED TO IMPROVE TRAFFIC CONDITIONS IN TAI KOK TSUI ROAD.

APPROPRIATE TRAFFIC SIGNS WILL BE PUT UP TO INDICATE THE PROHIBITED ZONE.

ALSO FROM SATURDAY, THE EXISTING URBAN CLEARWAY IN MA TAU WEI ROAD WILL BE EXTENDED FOR A SHORT DISTANCE IN ORDER TO REDUCE CONGESTION ON THAT SECTION OF THE ROAD NEAR FAT KWONG STREET.

THE HOURS OF OPERATION WILL REMAIN THE SAME, THAT IS, BETWEEN 7 A.M. AND 10 A.M. AND BETWEEN 4 P.M. AND 7 P.M.

NO VEHICLES, OTHER THAN FRANCHISED BUSES, WILL BE ALLOWED TO STOP TO PICK UP OR SET DOWN PASSENGERS OR LOAD OR UNLOAD GOODS.

TRAFFIC SIGNS WILL BE SET UP TO GUIDE MOTORISTS AND PLB DRIVERS.

IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE EXTENSION OF THE CLEARWAY RESTRICTION, A PUBLIC LIGHT BUS STAND WILL BE SET UP ON THE WESTERN SIDE OF GILLIES AVENUE BETWEEN HOK YUEN STREET AND PAK KUNG STREET.
