PRINCESS ENDS VISIT WITH POLICE TEA PARTY

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA, AS HONORARY COMMANDANT GENERAL OF THE ROYAL HONG KONG POLICE, THIS AFTERNOON WOUND UP HER EIGHT-DAY VISIT TO HONG KONG BY ATTENDING A POLICE TEA PARTY IN THE FURAMA HOTEL.

ON HER ARRIVAL AT THE HOTEL, THE PRINCESS AND HER HUSBAND, THE HON. ANGUS OGILVY, WERE MET BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, MR. BRIAN SLEVIN, AND HIS WIFE, GAY.

MR. AND MRS. SLEVIN THEN ESCORTED THE ROYAL COUPLE AND THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE, TO THE JADE BALLROOM WHERE ABOUT 600 MEMBERS OF THE FORCE AND THEIR WIVES WERE GATHERED.

THE 600 REPRESENTED EVERY FORMATION IN THE FORCE.

ON ENTERING THE BALLROOM, THE COMMISSIONER PRESENTED TO PRINCESS ALEXANDRA AND MR. OGILVY THE CHIEF STAFF OFFICER RECRUITMENT AND DEVELOPMENT, MISS ANN CALDERWOOD, AND SENIOR INSPECTOR AU-YEUNG LAU WING-LING.

THE PRINCESS, ACCOMPANIED BY MISS CALDERWOOD AND SENIOR INSPECTOR AU-YEUNG, THEN MADE HER WAY AROUND THE BALLROOM MEETING AND CHATTING WITH POLICE OFFICERS AND CIVILIANS ATTACHED TO THE FORCE.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA VISITS LIGHT INFANTRY

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCESS ALEXANDRA TODAY (WEDNESDAY) SPENT THREE HOURS VISITING MEMBERS AND FAMILIES OF THE 1ST BATTALION THE LIGHT INFANTRY AT STANLEY FORT IN HER CAPACITY AS DEPUTY COLONEL-IN-CHIEF OF THE REGIMENT.

ON THE LAST DAY OF HER EIGHT-DAY VISIT, THE PRINCESS LOOKED AS REFRESHED AND KEEN AS THE FIRST DAY HER ROYAL HIGHNESS ARRIVED.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA WAS MET ON ARRIVAL AT STANLEY FORT BY MAJOR GENERAL D.N.H. TYACKE, COLONEL OF THE REGIMENT, AND LIEUTENANT COLONEL M.J.A. WILSON, COMMANDING OFFICER OF THE 1ST BATTALION.

AFTER A BRIEF VISIT TO THE COMMANDING OFFICER'S HOME, THE PRINCESS PROCEEDED TO THE SPORTS GROUND WHERE HER ROYAL HIGHNESS SAW SOLDIERS OF THE BATTALION'S MORTAR, RECCE, SIGNALS AND ANTI-TANK PLATOONS GO THROUGH THEIR PACES.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA EVIDENTLY ENJOYED THE CRISP AND FRESH MORNING AIR IN STANLEY, STOPPING AND CHATTING FREQUENTLY WITH SOLDIERS AND THEIR FAMILIES WHO CAME OUT TO GET A GLIMPSE OF THEIR ROYAL VISITOR.

ACCOMPANIED BY THE BATTALION'S FAMILIES OFFICER, CAPTAIN V. WOOD, HER ROYAL HIGHNESS THEN VISITED THE HOMES OF TWO SOLDIERS AND MET MEMBERS OF THEIR FAMILIES.

FROM THERE, THE PRINCESS WENT ON TO THE WARRANT OFFICERS AND SERGEANTS' MESS AND THEN THE OFFICERS' MESS WHERE HER ROYAL HIGHNESS HAD LUNCH.

A COPY OF THE BATTALION'S NEW RECORD ENTITLED '+SALAMANCA+' WAS LATER PRESENTED TO THE PRINCESS AS A SOUVENIR.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA HAS A LONG ASSOCIATION WITH THE LIGHT INFANTRY AND HAS BEEN THE REGIMENT'S DEPUTY COLONEL-IN-CHIEF SINCE 1968 WHEN THE COUNTY REGIMENTS OF THE LIGHT INFANTRY WERE DISBANDED AND THE LIGHT INFANTRY REGIMENT FORMED.

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS LAST VISITED THE 1ST BATTALION IN LEMGO, WEST GERMANY, ON MAY 25, 1972 WHEN THE PRINCESS PRESENTED THE BATTALION WITH THEIR REGIMENTAL AND QUEEN'S COLOURS.

PRINCESS ALEXANDRA LEAVES AFTER EIGHT-DAY VISIT

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCESS ALEXANDRA AND THE HON. ANGUS OGILVY LEFT HONG KONG BY AIR AT 10.45 P.M. TONIGHT (WEDNESDAY) AFTER AN EIGHT-DAY VISIT HERE.

THE ROYAL COUPLE WERE SEEN OFF AT HONG KONG INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT BY THE GOVERNOR, SIR MURRAY MACLEHOSE AND LADY MACLEHOSE.

ALSO AT THE AIRPORT TO SAY FAREWELL TO THE PRINCESS WERE GOVERNOR'S AIDE-DE-CAMP, MR. DENIS SHACKLETON= THE COMMANDER BRITISH FORCES, LT. GENERAL SIR JOHN ARCHER AND LADY ARCHER= THE CHIEF JUSTICE, THE HON. SIR GEOFFREY BRIGGS= THE CHIEF SECRETARY, THE HON. SIR DENYS ROBERTS= THE HON. SIR YUET-KEUNG KAN, SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL AND LADY KAN= DR. THE HON. S.Y. CHUNG, SENIOR UNOFFICIAL MEMBER OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AND MRS. CHUNG= THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, MR. BRIAN SLEVIN= THE ROYAL VISIT DIRECTOR, SIR JOHN CURLE AND LADY CURLE.

LUNAR NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS

* * * *

THE COMMISSIONER FOR LABOUR, MR. IAN PRICE, TODAY REMINDED EMPLOYERS THAT THE FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD DAYS OF THE LUNAR NEW YEAR WHICH FALL ON FEBRUARY 18, 19 AND 20, 1977 ARE THREE OF THE 10 STATUTORY HOLIDAYS APPOINTED UNDER THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE.

THIS YEAR THE THIRD DAY OF THE LUNAR NEW YEAR FALLS ON A SUNDAY WHICH IS LIKELY ALSO TO BE A REST DAY FOR MANY EMPLOYEES COVERED BY THE ORDINANCE.

+IN THESE CIRCUMSTANCES,+ SAID MR. PRICE, +AN EMPLOYER MUST GRANT HIS EMPLOYEES ANOTHER REST DAY. IF AN EMPLOYER AND AN EMPLOYEE AGREE, ANY DAY WITHIN 30 DAYS OF A STATUTORY HOLIDAY OR ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY MAY BE TAKEN BY THE EMPLOYEE AS A SUBSTITUTED HOLIDAY, BECAUSE THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE STIPULATES THAT A REST DAY SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO ANY STATUTORY HOLIDAY.+

MR. PRICE EMPHASISED THAT THE PROVISIONS OF THE EMPLOYMENT ORDINANCE APPLIED TO ALL EMPLOYEES WHEREVER THEY WORK.

UNDER THE ORDINANCE, ALL NON-MANUAL EMPLOYEES EARNING NOT MORE THAN \$2,000 A MONTH AND ALL MANUAL EMPLOYEES INCLUDING DOMESTIC SERVANTS AND IRRESPECTIVE OF THEIR EARNINGS ARE ENTITLED TO THE HOLIDAYS. AND THEY MUST ALSO BE PAID FOR THE THREE DAYS OFF IF THEY HAVE WORKED CONTINUOUSLY FOR THEIR EMPLOYERS FOR THREE MONTHS IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE STATUTORY HOLIDAYS.

+AN EMPLOYEE WHO IS NOT EMPLOYED ON A CONTINUOUS CONTRACT -- FOR EXAMPLE, ONE WHO WORKS FOR LESS THAN SIX HOURS A DAY OR HAS BEEN EMPLOYED BY THE SAME EMPLOYER FOR LESS THAN THREE MONTHS -- IS STILL ENTITLED TO THE HOLIDAYS, BUT HAS NO LEGAL ENTITLEMENT TO BE PAID,+ MR. PRICE SAID.

IF THE EMPLOYER REQUIRES AN EMPLOYEE TO WORK ON A STATUTORY HOLIDAY, HE MUST GIVE HIM AT LEAST 48 HOURS' NOTICE, AND HE MUST GIVE HIS EMPLOYEE AN ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY WITHIN 60 DAYS OF THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY.

IF THE EMPLOYER INTENDS TO GIVE HIS EMPLOYEE AN ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY BEFORE THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY, HE MUST NOTIFY HIS EMPLOYEE 48 HOURS IN ADVANCE OF THAT ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY. AND IF AN ALTERNATIVE HOLIDAY IS TO BE GIVEN AFTER THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY, THE EMPLOYER MUST INFORM HIS EMPLOYEES OF THE ARRANGEMENT AT LEAST 48 HOURS BEFORE THE STATUTORY HOLIDAY.

REGISTERED ELECTORS URGED TO VOTE IN URBCO ELECTION

* * * *

REGISTERED ELECTORS OF THE COMING URBAN COUNCIL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 3 ARE URGED TO TURN UP AT THE 13 POLLING STATIONS TO CAST THEIR VOTES.

THE APPEAL CAME FROM MR. PATRICK LEE, ASSISTANT REGISTRATION OFFICER, URBAN COUNCIL ELECTIONS.

SPEAKING AT A LUNCHEON MEETING OF THE LIONS CLUB TODAY, HE SAID THAT THE LAST URBAN COUNCIL ELECTION HELD IN MARCH 1975 WAS QUITE DISAPPOINTING BECAUSE ONLY ABOUT ONE-THIRD OF THE 34,078 REGISTERED ELECTORS CAST THEIR VOTES.

THEREFORE, HE ADDED, THE PRESENCE OF EVERYONE OF THE 37,174 REGISTERED ELECTORS WOULD BE IMPORTANT TO MAKE THE COMING URBAN COUNCIL ELECTION A MORE EXCITING ONE.

+EVERY VOTE WILL DEFINITELY GIVE SOME FORM OF ENCOURAGEMENT TO THE CANDIDATES,+ MR. LEE EMPHASISED.

AT THE COMING ELECTION, HE POINTED OUT, ONLY THOSE WHOSE NAMES APPEARING IN THE CURRENT REGISTERS MIGHT VOTE.

+THOSE WHO ARE NOT REGISTERED ELECTORS HAVE TO WAIT FOR THE NEXT REGISTRATION CYCLE DUE TO COMMENCE ON FEBRUARY 15, 1978 TO APPLY FOR INCLUSION IN THE PROVISION REGISTERS OF URBAN COUNCIL ELECTORS,+ HE SAID.

MR. LEE DISCLOSED THAT AN INDIVIDUAL POLL CARD WOULD BE POSTED TO EVERY REGISTERED ELECTOR NEXT MONDAY (FEBRUARY 14). THE POLL CARD WOULD FACILITATE AN ELECTOR TO OBTAIN MORE QUICKLY HIS BALLOT PAPER FOR VOTING AT ONE OF THE 13 POLLING STATIONS WHICH HE HAS ALREADY CHOSEN DURING THE LAST REGISTRATION CYCLE.

HE SAID THAT REGISTERED ELECTORS WHO STILL DO NOT RECEIVE THEIR POLL CARDS ON FEBRUARY 17 COULD ENQUIRE BY CONTACTING MR. LI KENG-HEI ON TEL. NO. 5-765912.

HOWEVER, HE SAID THAT A VOTER WITHOUT A POLL CARD WAS STILL ENTITLED TO VOTE, PROVIDED HIS NAME WAS IN THE FINAL REGISTER AND THAT HIS IDENTITY WAS ESTABLISHED.

MR. LEE URGED VOTERS TO GO TO THE POLLING STATIONS EARLY ON THE ELECTION DAY WHEN IT WAS LESS CROWDED.

NOTICES OF INSTRUCTIONS WOULD BE DISPLAYED AT THE POLLING STATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF THE VOTERS, HE ADDED.

SPECIAL TRAIN SERVICES DURING LUNAR NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS

* * * *

FIVE SPECIAL UPTRAINS AND SIX DOWNTRAINS WILL BE OPERATED DURING THE LUNAR NEW YEAR HOLIDAYS (FEBRUARY 18-21) TO COPE WITH THE EXPECTED INCREASE IN COMMUTERS.

THE FIVE UPTRAINS WILL LEAVE KOWLOON (HUNG HOM) STATION AT 7.54 A.M., 12.40 P.M., 2.13 P.M., 3.43 P.M. AND 4.47 P.M.

THESE TRAINS, TOGETHER WITH 13 REGULAR TRAINS DEPARTING AT VARIOUS TIMES BETWEEN 6.30 A.M. AND 3.12 P.M. WILL NOT STOP FOR PASSENGERS AT MONG KOK STATION DURING THESE FOUR DAYS.

ALL PASSENGERS FOR THESE TRAINS ARE REQUESTED TO GO TO KOWLOON RAILWAY STATION. MONTHLY TICKET HOLDERS WILL BE ALLOWED TO BOARD THESE TRAINS WITHOUT EXTRA CHARGES.

THE SIX DOWNTRAINS WILL START THEIR SOUTHBOUND JOURNEY FROM DIFFERENT STATIONS IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

TWO WILL DEPART FROM LO WU AT 1.50 P.M. AND 5.12 P.M., TWO FROM FANLING AT 12.44 P.M. AND 3.51 P.M., ONE FROM TAI PO MARKET AT 1.57 P.M. AND ONE FROM THE UNIVERSITY AT 5.40 P.M.

THE LAST SPECIAL TRAIN, LEAVING LO WU, WILL ARRIVE AT KOWLOON AT 6.50 P.M.

TICKETS FOR TRAINS TO KOWLOON WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR SALE AT MONG KOK RAILWAY STATION.

MR. REGINALD GREGORY, MANAGER OF KOWLOON CANTON RAILWAY, SAID THAT ON THESE FOUR DAYS THE TRAINS FROM KOWLOON TO THE NEW TERRITORIES WOULD PROBABLY BE FULL BETWEEN 6 A.M. AND 3 P.M. WHILE THE DOWNTRAINS WOULD PROBABLY BE SO BETWEEN 3 P.M. AND 9 P.M.

HE SAID, HOWEVER, THAT FURTHER SPECIAL TRAINS WOULD BE RUN IN THE LATE EVENINGS IF THERE WAS PUBLIC DEMAND.

17 COMPLETE INDUSTRIAL SAFETY OFFICERS TRAINING COURSE

* * * * *

AN INDUSTRIAL SAFETY OFFICER REPRESENTS THE MANAGERIAL AND SUPERVISORY STAFF WHICH DIRECTS THE WORK OF THE EMPLOYEES AND HE SHARES THE RESPONSIBILITY OF MANAGEMENT IN THE MAINTAINING OF SAFETY AND PREVENTING OF ACCIDENTS.

THIS WAS HOW THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CENTRAL CONTAINER HANDLING SAFETY COMMITTEE, MR. CLIVE FLEGG DESCRIBED THE FUTURE ROLE OF 17 PARTICIPANTS WHO HAD JUST COMPLETED AN INDUSTRIAL SAFETY OFFICERS TRAINING COURSE AT THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT'S INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING CENTRE.

MR. FLEGG WHO WAS SPEAKING AT THE CLOSING CEREMONY FOR THE SIX-WEEK TRAINING COURSE SAID: +HIS INTIMATE KNOWLEDGE OF HIS PARTICULAR INDUSTRY AND ITS ASSOCIATED STAFF, COMBINED WITH HIS SPECIALIST TRAINING IN ACCIDENT PREVENTION TECHNIQUES AND SAFE WORKING PROCEDURES PROVIDES THE SAFETY OFFICER WITH A UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY TO IMPART THIS KNOWLEDGE TO HIS FELLOW WORKERS, AND EQUALLY IMPORTANTLY -- TO THE MANAGEMENT= AS EVEN THE MOST HIGHLY TRAINED SAFETY OFFICER'S EXPERTISE IS TOTALLY WASTED UNLESS HE HAS THE FULL SUPPORT OF MANAGEMENT.+

MR. FLEGG POINTED OUT THAT THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT HAS A RESPONSIBILITY IN ENSURING THE SAFETY, HEALTH AND WELFARE OF WORKERS IN FACTORIES, AND APART FROM ADMINISTERING VARIOUS SETS OF SAFETY REGULATIONS, THE DEPARTMENT PROMOTES INDUSTRIAL SAFETY BY EMPHASISING THE ASPECTS OF INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING, EDUCATION AND PUBLICITY AS WELL AS STRENGTHENING ITS ADVISORY FUNCTIONS TO THE INDUSTRIAL PUBLIC.

HE APPEALED TO EMPLOYERS TO MAKE USE OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT'S INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING CENTRE BY SENDING EMPLOYEES TO ATTEND COURSES.
