SIGNIFICANT REDUCTION IN DRUG CASES  
\* \* \* \* \*

THE ACTION COMMITTEE AGAINST NARCOTICS (ACAN) WAS TOLD THAT THERE WAS A SIGNIFICANT REDUCTION IN THE NUMBER OF PERSONS NEWLY REPORTED TO THE CENTRAL REGISTRY OF DRUG ABUSE (CRDA) IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1986 - THE LOWEST QUARTERLY FIGURE FOR THE PAST FIVE YEARS.

AT THE 60TH MEETING OF THE ACAN HELD RECENTLY, MEMBERS WERE INFORMED THAT THERE WAS A DECREASE OF 26.3 PER CENT (FROM 893 TO 658) IN THE NUMBER OF PERSONS OF ALL AGES NEWLY REPORTED TO THE CRDA IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1986 COMPARED WITH THE SAME PERIOD IN 1985.

THE NUMBER OF NEWLY REPORTED YOUNG PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 21 DECREASED BY 19.4 PER CENT, FROM 237 TO 191.

THE COMMISSIONER FOR NARCOTICS, MR GORDON MORTIMER, SAID THE GENERAL TREND SINCE THE BEGINNING OF 1984 HAD BEEN DOWNWARDS, AND THAT THERE MIGHT BE INDICATIONS THAT INROADS WERE BEING MADE INTO THE PROBLEM OF HEROIN ADDICTION.

+HOWEVER, IT IS STILL TOO EARLY TO DRAW ANY FIRM CONCLUSIONS,+ HE SAID.

HE ALSO REPORTED THAT THE NUMBER OF PERSONS PROSECUTED FOR MAJOR AND MINOR DRUG OFFENCES HAD INCREASED BY 8.3 PER CENT, FROM 2 825 TO 3 060, IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1986 COMPARED WITH THE SAME PERIOD IN 1985 BUT PROSECUTIONS OF YOUNG PERSONS UNDER 21 SHOWED A DECREASE OF 3.6 PER CENT, FROM 281 TO 271.

+ADMISSIONS OF DRUG ADDICTS TO TREATMENT PROGRAMMES, ESPECIALLY OF YOUNG PEOPLE, HAVE DECREASED WHILE THE NUMBER OF PERSONS UNDER TREATMENT AND AFTERCARE HAD INCREASED,+ MR MORTIMER SAID.

WITH REGARD TO DRUG SEIZURES, THE MEETING NOTED THAT A TOTAL OF 120 KILOGRAMS OF ILLICIT OPIATES, MAINLY NO. 3 AND NO. 4 HEROIN, AND 53 KILOGRAMS OF CANNABIS AND CANNABIS RESIN WERE SEIZED IN THE FIRST QUARTER OF 1986.

THE CHAIRMAN OF ACAN, PROFESSOR GERALD CHOA, ACKNOWLEDGED THE SUCCESS OF THE ANTI-NARCOTICS VARIETY SHOW HELD AT THE HONG KONG COLISEUM RECENTLY TO LAUNCH THE 1986-87 ANTI-NARCOTICS CAMPAIGN.

THE ANTI-NARCOTICS MESSAGE REACHED MORE THAN 6 000, MAINLY YOUNG PEOPLE, WHO ATTENDED THE SHOW AND AN ESTIMATED THREE MILLION TELEVISION AUDIENCE.

## BOARDS PAY OUT \$4.25 MILLION IN COMPENSATION

\*\*\*\*\*

THE CRIMINAL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES COMPENSATION (CLEIC) BOARDS LAST YEAR PAID OUT \$4.25 MILLION COMPENSATION TO VICTIMS OR THEIR DEPENDENTS, ACCORDING TO THE 1984-85 ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CLEIC BOARDS.

THIS REPRESENTED AN INCREASE OF 30 PER CENT OVER THE COMPENSATION PAYMENTS OF \$3.25 MILLION IN THE PRECEDING YEAR. THE COMPENSATION PAYMENTS WERE PAID IN RESPECT OF 814 CASES INVOLVING CRIMINAL INJURIES AND EIGHT CASES INVOLVING LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES.

THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARDS, MR MARTIN LEE, SAID IN HIS REPORT THAT MORE PEOPLE HAD BECOME AWARE OF THE BENEFITS AVAILABLE UNDER THE CRIMINAL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES COMPENSATION SCHEME. SINCE THE SCHEME'S INCEPTION IN 1973, THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF AWARDS GRANTED HAD REACHED \$22.03 MILLION BY MARCH 1985.

MR LEE SAID THAT 1 195 APPLICATIONS WERE RECEIVED IN 1984-85, REPRESENTING ABOUT 15.7 PER CENT OF THE 7 632 CASES OF CRIMINAL INJURIES REPORTED TO THE POLICE IN THAT YEAR, HE SAID.

IN A PATTERN SIMILAR TO THAT IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR, VICTIMS OF ASSAULT AND WOUNDING AS WELL AS THOSE OF ROBBERY, THEFT AND BURGLARY MADE UP ABOUT 93 PER CENT OF THE PEOPLE APPLYING FOR COMPENSATION, THE REPORT SHOWED.

THERE WERE SIGNIFICANT INCREASES IN APPLICATIONS ARISING FROM CASES INVOLVING FALLING OBJECTS. ALTOGETHER 18 SUCH APPLICATIONS WERE RECEIVED COMPARED WITH EIGHT IN 1983-84.

THERE WERE DECREASES IN APPLICATIONS ARISING FROM CASES OF HOMICIDE, MURDER AND MANSLAUGHTER - DOWN TO 44 FROM 64 IN 1983-84 - AND RAPE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT CASES - DOWN TO 13 FROM 26 IN 1983-84.

DURING THE YEAR, THREE APPLICATIONS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT INJURIES COMPENSATION WERE RECEIVED, THE SAME NUMBER AS IN THE PRECEDING YEAR.

OF ALL THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED DURING THE YEAR, THE MAJORITY WERE REFERRED BY THE POLICE (813), OR SUBMITTED BY THE VICTIMS THEMSELVES OR THEIR FAMILY MEMBERS (351).

THE HIGHEST SINGLE AWARD OF \$42 000 WAS PAID TO SEVEN SURVIVING DEPENDENT FAMILY MEMBERS OF A MURDER VICTIM. THE FAMILY HAD ALSO BEEN REFERRED TO THE SOCIAL SECURITY FIELD UNIT FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE.

MR LEE NOTED THAT THE CLEIC SCHEME WAS REGULARLY REVIEWED TO MEET CHANGING CIRCUMSTANCES. HE SAID THE BOARDS HAD PROPOSED TO EXTEND THE MAXIMUM PERIOD DURING WHICH INJURY GRANTS AND INTERIM ADJUSTMENT GRANTS WERE PAID TO VICTIMS WITH SERIOUS INJURIES. THE EXISTING MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR SUCH GRANTS WAS THREE MONTHS AND THE BOARDS HAD SUGGESTED THAT IT SHOULD BE EXTENDED TO SIX MONTHS, HE ADDED.

THE BOARDS HAD ALSO PROPOSED THAT IN THE CASE OF THE LOSS OF A NON-WAGE EARNER IN A FAMILY, A SPECIAL OR BEREAVEMENT GRANT BE MADE TO RELIEVE THE LOSS OF +COMPANY, EXPECTATION, OR GENERAL ASSISTANCE+ OF THE VICTIM.

IN ADDITION, THE BOARDS HAD ALSO PROPOSED THAT THEY SHOULD BE GIVEN A DISCRETIONARY POWER TO INCREASE THE AWARDS TO RAPE VICTIMS= AND TO INCREASE AWARDS TO VICTIMS WHO HAD DEMONSTRATED EXEMPLARY EFFORTS IN ASSISTING THE POLICE IN THE IDENTIFICATION AND ARREST OF THE CRIMINALS, IN SPITE OF PERSONAL EMBARRASSMENT, INCONVENIENCE OR FEAR.

BLITZ ON BEACHES YIELDS LITTERBUG HARVEST

BEACH LITTERBUGS FELT THE STING OF THE LAW TODAY (SATURDAY) AS ROVING SQUADS OF URBAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT OFFICERS CARRIED OUT A DAY-LONG PROSECUTION SWEEP OF FIVE URBAN BEACHES.

MEN WERE MOBILISED FROM ALL THE URBAN DISTRICTS TO TAKE PART IN THE OPERATION WHICH ALMOST TOOK ON THE ASPECT OF A MILITARY CAMPAIGN.

THE OFFICERS, MANY OF THEM DRESSED LIKE BEACH-GOERS, ISSUED SUMMONSES TO A TOTAL OF 142 INDIVIDUALS SPOTTED LITTERING -- 47 ON REPULSE BAY, 26 ON DEEP WATER BAY, 18 ON STANLEY, 47 ON SHEK O AND FOUR ON BIG WAVE BAY.

A USD SPOKESMAN SAID THAT THE DEPARTMENT WAS DETERMINED TO END LITTERING ON BEACHES ONCE AND FOR ALL.

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT RECENTLY PUBLISHED A PAMPHLET ON THE ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE AND ITS SUBSIDIARY REGULATIONS TO HELP PROFESSIONAL DRIVERS BETTER UNDERSTAND THE LAW.

THE SIX-PAGE PAMPHLET, IN CHINESE AND ENTITLED '+KNOW YOUR ROAD TRAFFIC LEGISLATION - A GUIDE FOR PROFESSIONAL DRIVERS+', CAN BE OBTAINED FREE FROM THE DEPARTMENT'S LICENSING OFFICES OR FROM THE PUBLIC VEHICLE SECTION AT ROOM 906-909 HUTCHISON HOUSE, HONG KONG.

SERVING AS A QUICK GUIDE FOR PROFESSIONAL DRIVERS, THE PAMPHLET COMPRISES SIX SECTIONS EACH ON ONE TYPE OF VEHICLE - GOODS VEHICLES, TAXIS, PUBLIC LIGHT BUSES, SCHOOL PRIVATE LIGHT BUSES, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE BUSES, AND PRIVATE CARS.

EACH SECTION CONTAINS SIMPLE BUT USEFUL EXPLANATION OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS RELEVANT TO THAT PARTICULAR TYPE OF VEHICLE.

THE PAMPHLET ALSO CONSISTS OF A SECTION ON GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ALL TYPES OF VEHICLES. SOME OF THE RULES EXPLAINED IN THIS SECTION ARE ON WINDSCREEN WASHERS, MIXING OF TYRES, CARRIAGE OF PASSENGERS AND GOODS, PARKING AND STOPPING PLACES, MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC SIGNS.

ALSO AVAILABLE FOR COLLECTION AT THE LICENSING OFFICES ARE A NEW SERIES OF BILINGUAL '+HOW TO APPLY+' LEAFLETS ON VEHICLE REGISTRATION AND LICENSING, DRIVING LICENCE AND ANNUAL INSPECTION OF GOODS VEHICLES, TRAILERS AND SPECIAL PURPOSE VEHICLES.
