NEW \$14-MILLION CLINIC FOR SHA TIN

RESIDENTS IN THE FAST DEVELOPING NEW TOWN OF SHA TIN WILL BENEFIT FROM IMPROVED MEDICAL AND HEALTH FACILITIES WHEN A NEW \$14-MILLION CLINIC IS OFFICIALLY OPENED LATER THIS WEEK.

STANDING ON A 2 200-SQUARE-METRE SITE, THE LEK YUEN HEALTH CENTRE CONSISTS OF TWO BUILDINGS, A SEVEN-STOREY MAIN BLOCK AND A SINGLE STOREY ANCILLARY BLOCK, PROVIDING A WHOLE RANGE OF GENERAL OUT-PATIENT AND FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE MEDICAL AND HEALTH DEPARTMENT SAID THAT THE CLINIC HAS BEEN BUILT TO MEET THE INCREASED DEMAND FOR FACILITIES IN THIS NEW TOWN OF 140 000 PEOPLE.

THE CENTRE ALSO PROVIDES SUPPORTING SERVICES TO THE PRINCE OF WALES HOSPITAL AND A POLYCLINIC NOW UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

LOCATED WITHIN A SHORT DISTANCE FROM OTHER PUBLIC AND PRIVATE HOUSING ESTATES IN SHA TIN, THE CLINIC ACCOMMODATES A GENERAL OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT, A FAMILY HEALTH CENTRE AND A PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY FURNISHED WITH \$2.7 MILLION WORTH EQUIPMENT TO UNDERTAKE PATHOLOGICAL INVESTIGATIONS.

ON THE SECOND FLOOR OF THE BUILDING IS THE SHA TIN HEALTH EDUCATION CENTRE WHERE SPACE FOR EXHIBITIONS AND SEMINARS IS PROVIDED TO DISSEMINATE HEALTH INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC.

THE NEW TERRITORIES REGIONAL OFFICE OF THE DEPARTMENT, RESPONSIBLE FOR THE HEALTH ADMINISTRATION OF THE REGION, IS LOCATED ON THE THIRD FLOOR OF THE CLINIC COMPLEX.

FURTHER UP IS THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY MEDICINE OF THE CHINESE UNIVERSITY.

SNT WALKS FOR A GOOD CAUSE

SECRETARY FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES, MR DAVID AKERS-JONES, THIS (SUNDAY) MORNING JOINED OTHER SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS IN A +WALK FOR A GOOD CAUSE+ AT THE HONG KONG STADIUM.

THE FUND RAISING EVENT, ORGANISED BY THE HONG KONG GIRL GUIDES ASSOCIATION, WAS FIRST HELD LAST YEAR.

THE TARGET FOR THIS YEAR'S WALK IS \$500 000, MOST OF WHICH WILL GO TOWARDS FUNDING GIRL GUIDE ACTIVITIES TO BE DEVELOPED IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE 24 PARTICIPATING TEAMS, EACH WITH 10 MEMBERS, WERE HEADED BY A TEAM CAPTAIN, WHO DONATED A MINIMUM OF \$10 000. OTHER SPONSORS INCLUDED SPECTATORS AND WALKERS.

THE EVENT TOOK THE FORM OF A RELAY ROUND THE STADIUM'S RUNNING TRACK WITH EACH MEMBER COMPLETING A CIRCUIT EITHER BY WALKING OR JOGGING.

TO ENTERTAIN THE WALKERS AND SPECTATORS, A 15-MINUTE PROGRAMME WAS PROVIDED BY TVB ARTISTES AND 30 GIRL GUIDES WHO PERFORMED A CHINESE DANCE.

THE OTHER SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS TAKING PART INCLUDED THE SECRETARY FOR SECURITY, MR L.M. DAVIES- THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, MR JOHN GRIFFITHS- THE SECRETARY FOR SOCIAL SERVICES, MR E.P. HO- THE CHIEF JUSTICE, SIR DENYS ROBERTS- THE SECRETARY FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE, MR MARTIN ROWLANDS- THE SECRETARY FOR INFORMATION, MR ALAN SCOTT- AND THE SECRETARY FOR EDUCATION, MR KEN TOPLEY.

LAST YEAR, THE EVENT ATTRACTED 1 200 PARTICIPANTS AND RAISED JUST OVER \$520 000.

THE DIRECTOR OF WATER SUPPLIES, MR WILLIAM TUCKER, WILL OFFICIATE AT A SUPPLY +TURNING ON+ CEREMONY TO ANNOUNCE THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT'S 1 000 000TH REGISTERED CONSUMER AT THE YAU OI ESTATE IN TUEN MUN TOMORROW (MONDAY) AT 3.45 PM.

THE CEREMONY WILL BE ATTENDED BY THE ASSISTANT DIRECTOR (KOWLOON) OF THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT, MR LAU KWAN-YUEN.

YOU ARE INVITED TO ATTEND THE CEREMONY.

OFFICIAL TRANSPORT WILL BE PROVIDED. MEDIA REPRESENTATIVES WISHING TO USE THE TRANSPORT FACILITY SHOULD ASSEMBLE AT THE KOWLOON PUBLIC PIER NOT LATER THAN 2.15 PM TOMORROW (MONDAY). INFORMATION OFFICERS FROM THE WATER SUPPLIES DEPARTMENT AND THE HOUSING DEPARTMENT WILL ASSIST THE PRESS.

KEEP THAT KITE LOW

KITE-FLYERS SHOULD KEEP THEIR KITES BELOW A HEIGHT OF SIXTY METRES, SAID MR ALFRED LEUNG, SENIOR OPERATIONS OFFICER OF THE CIVIL AVIATION DEPARTMENT TODAY (SUNDAY).

HE WAS SPEAKING TO 150 KITE-FLYING ENTHUSIASTS GATHERED AT A +SAFE KITE-FLYING DAY+ IN TAI AU MUN.

MR LEUNG EXPLAINED THAT UNDER THE UNITED KINGDOM'S AIR NAVIGATION (OVERSEAS TERRITORIES) ORDER, NO KITE SHOULD BE FLOWN AT OVER SIXTY METRES ABOVE THE GROUND LEVEL IN ANY PART OF THE TERRITORY.

HE CONTINUED BY SAYING THAT IT IS ALSO ILLEGAL TO FLY A KITE WITHIN FIVE KILOMETRES OF AN AIRPORT. +FAILURE TO OBSERVE THIS RULE MAKES THE KITE-FLYER LIABLE TO A FINE OF 400 POUND STERLING (ABOUT HK \$4 000) AND IMPRISONMENT FOR TWO YEARS,+ HE SAID.

THE FORBIDDEN REGIONS IN HONG KONG COVER A FIVE-KILOMETRE RADIUS OF BOTH KAI TAK AND SHEK KONG AIRPORTS, AND INCLUDE THE KOWLOON PENINSULA. THE REGIONS EXTEND TO SUCH PLACES AS TSEND LAN SHUE, CHEUNG SHA WAN, LEI YUE MUN- THE NORTHEAST SECTION OF HONG KONG ISLAND FROM WAN CHAI TO CHAI WAN- AS WELL AS THE SHEK KONG AREA INCLUDING KAM TIN, YUEN LONG SAN HUI AND THE NORTHWESTERN PART OF TAI MO SHAN.

THE +SAFE KITE-FLYING DAY+ WAS JOINTLY ORGANISED BY THE KOWLOON CITY DISTRICT OFFICE, THE CIVIL AVIATION DEPARTMENT AND GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SERVICES AS PART OF THE SAFE KITE-FLYING PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN EFFORTS TO WARN THE PUBLIC AGAINST FLYING KITES NEAR THE AIRPORTS.

THE DAY'S PROGRAMME INCLUDED A PRIZE PRESENTATION TO WINNERS OF A SAFE KITE-FLYING SLOGAN WRITING COMPETITION WHICH TOOK PLACE SEVERAL WEEKS AGO AMONG SCHOOLS AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS IN KOWLOON CITY.

THE FIRST PRIZE WENT TO CHAU WING YU, A STUDENT AT THE JOCKEY CLUB GOVERNMENT SECONDARY SCHOOL. THE SECOND PRIZE WAS WON BY LO WAI LAN, THE THIRD PRIZE BY WONG SIU MAN.

AN EXPERT DEMONSTRATED KITE-FLYING SKILLS AND EXPLAINED THE SAFETY PRECAUTIONS TO BE TAKEN. FOLLOWING THIS EACH KITE-FLYER WAS GIVEN A KITE TO FLY ON HIS OWN.

A 12-MEMBER AMERICAN INTERNATIONAL CONSTRUCTION +TASK FORCE+, NOW VISITING HONG KONG, TODAY (SUNDAY) TOURED THE NEW TERRITORIES TO TAKE A CLOSE LOOK AT THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE NEW TOWNS.

THE DELEGATION, COMPRISING REPRESENTATIVES FROM AMERICAN CONSTRUCTION FIRMS, IS JOINTLY LED BY MR DONALD EARNSHAW, AMERICAN DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY FOR EXPORT DEVELOPMENT AND MR JAMES THOMPSON, DIRECTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONSTRUCTION DIVISION OF THE ASSOCIATED GENERAL CONTRACTORS OF AMERICA.

THE VISITORS ARE HERE TO STUDY MAJOR CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAMMES AND THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR AMERICAN FIRMS TO JOIN IN CONSTRUCTION WORK IN HONG KONG.

THEIR VISIT FOLLOWS ONE TO THE UNITED STATES EARLIER THIS YEAR BY MR DAVID MCDONALD, SECRETARY FOR LANDS AND WORKS.

ACCOMPANYING THEM ON THE TOUR TODAY WAS THE DIRECTOR OF NEW TERRITORIES DEVELOPMENT, MR JOHN DON.

THE DELEGATION VISITED SHA TIN AND TUEN MUN NEW TOWNS WHERE THEY WERE BRIEFED ON THE DEVELOPMENT IN THOSE AREAS BY THE PROJECT MANAGER (SHA TIN), MR K. AUSTIN AND PROJECT MANAGER (TUEN MUN), MR T.S. NG.

THE VISITORS WILL LEAVE ON WEDNESDAY FOR KUALA LUMPUR AND SINGAPORE.

KWUN TONG HOLDS FIRST SPORTS FESTIVAL

THE FIRST KWUN TONG SPORTS FESTIVAL WAS OPENED TODAY (SUNDAY) BY THE DIRECTOR OF HOME AFFAIRS, MR GRAHAM BARNES.

SPEAKING AT THE OPENING CEREMONY HELD AT THE KWUN TONG RECREATION GROUND AT TSUI PING ROAD, MR BARNES SAID THE DISTRICT BOARD HAD BEEN ONE OF THE DRIVING INSPIRATIONS FOR THE WHOLE FESTIVAL.

+YOU NEED THE MONEY AND THE PEOPLE AVAILABLE IF YOU WANT TO ORGANISE THIS KIND OF LARGE EVENT, AND IT IS ONLY RECENTLY THAT BOTH THESE THINGS HAVE BECOME FULLY AVAILABLE FOR DISTRICTS,+ SAID MR BARNES.

UNDER THE NEW DISTRICT ADMINISTRATION SCHEME, THE GOVERNMENT ALLOCATED \$500 000 TO THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE LAST YEAR AND THIS WAS USED FOR THE EARLIER +KWUN TONG TODAY+, HE SAID.

THE NEW KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD WAS SET UP LAST APRIL AND HAS BEEN ALLOCATED \$1 000 000 TO SPEND THIS YEAR, HE ADDED.

THE FESTIVAL INCLUDES A SERIES OF RECREATIONAL AND SPORTS EVENTS TO BE HELD OVER A 15-DAY PERIOD AND IS EXPECTED TO ATTRACT THOUSANDS OF PARTICIPANTS AND SPECTATORS.

IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE OPENING, A SPORTS CARNIVAL FEATURING A VOLLEYBALL MARATHON, A BASKETBALL MARATHON, TAI CHI DISPLAY, TELEMATCH, WAS HELD AND A BAND AND BICYCLE PERFORMANCES WERE STAGED.

THE FESTIVAL, ORGANISED BY THE KWUN TONG DISTRICT BOARD, THE RECREATION AND SPORT SERVICE AND THE KWUN TONG SPORTS PROMOTION ASSOCIATION, WAS SPONSORED BY THE URBAN COUNCIL.

HE IS PROFESSOR I.G. TAYLOR, PROFESSOR OF AUDIOLOGY AND EDUCATION OF THE DEAF AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MANCHESTER.

THE PROFESSOR WILL BE MEETING EDUCATION DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS TO TALK ABOUT SPECIAL EDUCATION, PARTICULARLY PROBLEMS RELATING TO THE ASSESSMENT AND SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL TREATMENT FOR HEARING-IMPAIRED CHILDREN.

HE WILL ALSO BE VISITING SPECIAL EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS AND ASSESSMENT CENTRES FOR CHILDREN AND MEETING PROFESSIONALS IN THE RELATED FIELDS, AND WILL GIVE A PUBLIC LECTURE ON +MODERN TRENDS IN AUDIOLOGY AND EDUCATION OF THE DEAF+ ON TUESDAY (DECEMBER 1) FROM 5.30 PM TO 7.30 PM, AT THE AUDITORIUM ON THE FIRST FLOOR OF DUKE OF WINDSOR SOCIAL SERVICE BUILDING, 15 HENNESSY ROAD, WAN CHAI.

THE 1982 EDITION IS THE LATEST IN A LONG LINE OF EAGERLY-AWAITED BILINGUAL CALENDARS PRODUCED JOINTLY BY THE GOVERNMENT INFORMATION SERVICES AND THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY.

IT IS ON SALE FOR \$26 AT THE GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS CENTRE, GENERAL POST OFFICE BUILDING, CONNAUGHT PLACE, CENTRAL- THE ROYAL OBSERVATORY HEADQUARTERS AT NATHAN ROAD, KOWLOON, AND LEADING BOOKSHOPS.

+THERE HAS ALWAYS BEEN A STRONG DEMAND FOR THIS PARTICULAR PUBLICATION BECAUSE OF ITS INFORMATIVE NATURE AND WE THINK IT WILL HAVE EXTRA APPEAL THIS YEAR IN VIEW OF THE HIGHER QUALITY AND LARGER SIZE,+ A SPOKESMAN FOR THE GIS PUBLISHING SUB-DIVISION SAID TODAY.

ADVICE ON CAR OWNERSHIP TRANSFER

WHEN YOU SELL YOUR MOTOR VEHICLE, MAKE CERTAIN THAT OWNERSHIP IS TRANSFERRED WITHIN 72 HOURS.

THIS ADVICE FROM MR SIMON SIT, SENIOR EXECUTIVE OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT'S LICENSING SECTION, FOLLOWS A NUMBER OF COMPLAINTS FROM MOTORISTS WHO HAVE BEEN SUMMONED FOR TRAFFIC OFFENCES AFTER THEY HAD SOLD THEIR VEHICLES.

MR SIT WARNED THAT SOME UNSCRUPULOUS DEALERS DO NOT REGISTER OWNERSHIP OF CARS THEY PURCHASE.

ONE REASON FOR THIS, MR SIT SAID, WAS BECAUSE TOO MANY RECORDS OF TRANSFER IN THE CAR REGISTRATION BOOK WILL REDUCE THE VALUE OF THE VEHICLE.

+THOSE SELLING THEIR CARS WOULD THEREFORE BE WELL ADVISED TO ACCOMPANY THE DEALER TO THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT WITHIN 72 HOURS TO MAKE SURE THAT THE TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP IS ONLY REGISTERED. OTHERWISE, YOU MAY FACE A NUMBER OF TRAFFIC OFFENCES,+ MR SIT EMPHASISED.

MOST NT BATHING FACILITIES TO CLOSE

WITH THE APPROACH OF WINTER, BATHING FACILITIES AT ALL 29 GAZETTED BEACHES IN THE NEW TERRITORIES AND OUTLYING ISLANDS WILL BE CLOSED FROM TUESDAY (DECEMBER 1).

LIFEGUARD SERVICES ON THE BEACHES WILL BE TEMPORARILY WITHDRAWN BETWEEN DECEMBER AND FEBRUARY NEXT YEAR, SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT.

FROM TUESDAY, BOTH THE KWAI SHING SWIMMING POOL AND SHA TIN JOCKEY CLUB PUBLIC SWIMMING POOL WILL ALSO BE CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC FOR ANNUAL MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS.

THE TWO SWIMMING POOLS WILL BE REOPENED NEXT MARCH, SAID THE SPOKESMAN.

FIRST MARKET COMPLEX FOR TUEN MUN

THE FIRST MODERN MARKET COMPLEX TO CATER FOR THE NEEDS OF THE RAPIDLY-DEVELOPING TUEN MUN NEW TOWN WILL SOON BE OPENED.

FINISHING TOUCHES TO THE KWONG CHOI MARKET ARE NOW IN FULL SWING, SAID A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NEW TERRITORIES SERVICES DEPARTMENT TODAY.

THE MARKET COMPLEX IS LOCATED AT A 1 460-SQUARE-METRE AREA AT CASTLE PEAK ROAD NEAR SAN HUI, WHERE A NUMBER OF RESIDENTIAL BUILDINGS WILL BE BUILT.

COSTING \$4 MILLION, THE TWO-STOREY MARKET IS DESIGNED AND BUILT BY THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND MANAGED BY THE NTSD.

FOR EASY ACCESS, ALL 60 MINI STALLS AND 24 MARKET STALLS SELLING MEAT, FISH, POULTRY, VEGETABLE, FRUIT AND GROCERY ARE ON THE GROUND FLOOR OF THE MARKET BUILDING.

A WORKING AND SERVICE AREA EQUIPPED WITH A TAP AND SINK IS AVAILABLE AT THE BACK OF EACH MARKET STALL FOR THE OPERATOR TO PREPARE HIS COMMODITIES FOR SALE.

A COMMUNAL POULTRY SCALDING ROOM FOR SLAUGHTERING AND DRESSING OF POULTRY, AN INSULATED ICE STALL, A REFUSE-COLLECTION CHAMBER, A LOADING-AND-UNLOADING BAY FOR LORRIES AND A BICYCLE PARKING AREA ARE ALSO PROVIDED.

THERE IS ALSO A ROOF-TOP GARDEN WITH BENCHES, FLOWER BEDS AND WOODEN ARBOURS FOR RESIDENTS AND CHILDREN TO RELAX AND PLAY.

MARKET OFFICE AND STAFF QUARTERS ARE BUILT ON THE FIRST FLOOR.
