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PLANS APPROVED FOR MID-LEVELS APARTMENT BLOCKS
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PLANS FOR TWO MULTI-STOREY APARTMENT BLOCKS IN CONDUIT ROAD IN THE MID-LEVELS WERE AMONG 46 PLANS APPROVED BY THE BUILDINGS ORDINANCE OFFICE IN SEPTEMBER.

THEY WILL BE BUILT AT 6-8, CONDUIT ROAD, AND 2-4, CONDUIT ROAD, AND BE OF 37 AND 31 STOREYS.

ALSO IN THE MID-LEVELS AREA, A 40-STOREY BLOCK WILL BE BUILT AT ALBANY AND ROBINSON ROAD.

A 44-STOREY APARTMENT-COMMERCIAL BLOCK AND A 22-STOREY GOVERNMENT-INSTITUTION-COMMUNITY BUILDING WITH STADIUM AND CAR PARK OVER TWO CAR PARK BASEMENTS WILL BE DEVELOPED ON THE MASS TRANSIT RAILWAY SITE IN WAN CHAI.

AT SHA TAU KOK IN THE NEW TERRITORIES, THE HONG KONG HOUSING SOCIETY WILL DEVELOP TWO SITES AS RURAL PUBLIC HOUSING ESTATES. ONE WILL CONSIST OF FOUR FIVE-STOREY BLOCKS, WHILE THE OTHER WILL HAVE 15 BLOCKS OF FOUR, FIVE AND SIX STOREYS.

AT SHA TIN, A 376-ROOM HOTEL WILL BE BUILT BY MINDANO LIMITED. IT WILL BE OF 16 STOREYS AND A 13-STOREY OFFICE BLOCK WILL ALSO BE DEVELOPED ON THE SITE.

DURING THE MONTH, CONSENT TO START WORK WAS GIVEN IN RESPECT OF 50 PROJECTS COMPRISING 230 BUILDINGS.

THEY INCLUDED A 447-ROOM HOTEL IN MODY ROAD, KOWLOON, A FERRY TERMINAL AT CANTON ROAD, A HOSPITAL IN KWAI CHUNG AND 132 RESIDENCES AT HO CHUNG MARINA IN SAI KUNG.

A TOTAL OF 34 BUILDINGS WERE GIVEN OCCUPATION CERTIFICATES -- 10 ON HONG KONG ISLAND, SEVEN IN KOWLOON AND 17 IN THE NEW TERRITORIES.

THE NUMBER OF CONSENTS TO DEMOLISH DURING THE MONTH WAS 14, AFFECTING 34 BUILDINGS.

THE CONTROL AND ENFORCEMENT DIVISION RECEIVED 482 COMPLAINTS, CARRIED OUT 1 016 INSPECTIONS AND ISSUED 228 ORDERS. FIVE CLOSURE ORDERS WERE OBTAINED.

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PROPER USE OF ELECTRICAL APPARATUS ESSENTIAL

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FACTORY PROPRIETORS AND WORKERS ARE URGED TO TAKE EVERY PRECAUTION WHEN USING ELECTRICAL APPARATUS.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT SAID THAT DURING THE FIRST NINE MONTHS OF THIS YEAR, NINE PERSONS DIED FROM ELECTROCUTION IN FACTORIES AND ON CONSTRUCTION SITES.

THE MAJOR CAUSES WERE DUE TO LEAKAGE OF CURRENT FROM FAULTY EQUIPMENT WITHOUT PROPER EARTHING AND WORKING ON +LIVE+ WITHOUT TAKING THE NECESSARY PRECAUTION.

+AS FAULTY EQUIPMENT CAN LEAD TO FATAL ACCIDENTS, IT IS ESSENTIAL TO HAVE ALL EQUIPMENT PROPERLY MAINTAINED AND EFFECTIVELY EARTHED,+ THE SPOKESMAN SAID.

+IF WORKING ON 'LIVE' IS NECESSARY, WORKERS SHOULD REFRAIN FROM WORKING ALONE AND SUITABLE PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT MUST BE USED.

+FURTHERMORE, WORKERS ENGAGED IN ELECTRICAL WORK SHOULD BE CONVERSANT WITH THE TREATMENT FOR ELECTRIC SHOCK.+

UNDER THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS (ELECTRICITY) REGULATIONS AND THE CONSTRUCTION SITES (SAFETY) REGULATIONS, EMPLOYERS WHO FAIL TO COMPLY WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THESE TWO REGULATIONS ARE LIABLE, ON CONVICTION, TO FINES BETWEEN \$30 000 AND \$50 000.

THE SPOKESMAN ADVISED FACTORY PROPRIETORS AND WORKERS TO ATTEND FREE TRAINING COURSES ON ELECTRICAL SAFETY ORGANISED YEAR ROUND BY THE DEPARTMENT'S INDUSTRIAL SAFETY TRAINING CENTRE.

THE DEPARTMENT HAS ALSO PUBLISHED A GUIDE TO THE FACTORIES AND INDUSTRIAL UNDERTAKINGS (ELECTRICITY) REGULATIONS WHICH IS AVAILABLE FREE TO THE PUBLIC.

ANYONE SEEKING FURTHER ADVICE SHOULD CONTACT THE FACTORY INSPECTORATE OF THE LABOUR DEPARTMENT.

OPENING THE YAU MA TEI CIVIC EDUCATION FESTIVAL AT KOWLOON PARK, MR CHAU SAID THE SUCCESS OF CIVIC EDUCATION SHOULD ALSO INVOLVED THE CARE AND PARTICIPATION OF RESIDENTS, RATHER THAN RELYING SOLELY ON GOVERNMENT PROMOTION.

HE SAID HE WAS GLAD TO SEE THE ACTIVE INVOLVEMENT BY YAU MA TEI RESIDENTS IN TODAY'S EVENTS.

AFTER THE CEREMONY, PARTICIPANTS TOOK PART IN VARIOUS CIVIC GAMES AT GAME STALLS AND WATCHED A VARIETY SHOW STAGED BY VOLUNTARY AGENCIES AND THE +TVB CARES+ TEAM.

EARLIER, A QUIZ FINAL ON CIVIC EDUCATION WAS HELD AND PRIZES WERE PRESENTED TO THE WINNING TEAMS TODAY.

BESIDE THE CARNIVAL, A WIDE RANGE OF ACTIVITIES INCLUDING A FAMILY CAMP, A CIVIC IMPLEMENTATION SCHEME FOR YOUTH AND A SEMINAR WOULD BE HELD DURING THE FESTIVAL WHICH WOULD LAST UNTIL NOVEMBER 23.

THE ENTIRE PROGRAMME COST ABOUT \$110 000, OF WHICH \$70 000 WAS FROM DISTRICT BOARD FUNDS.

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30 PROJECTS SELECTED FOR CIVIC EDUCATION

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THE FIRST TERRITORY-WIDE CIVIC EDUCATION COMMUNITY PROJECTS SCHEME ORGANISED BY THE COMMITTEE ON THE PROMOTION OF CIVIC EDUCATION HAS DRAWN CONSIDERABLE INTEREST FROM THE PUBLIC, THE CONVENOR OF THE PARTICIPATION GROUP, MR MAK HOI-WAH, SAID TODAY.

+A TOTAL SUBSIDY OF \$250 000 HAS BEEN EARMARKED FOR THIS YEAR'S PROJECTS. BUT THE COMMITTEE HAS RECEIVED MORE THAN 120 APPLICATIONS, REQUESTING FOR SUBSIDIES AMOUNTING TO ONE MILLION DOLLARS,+ HE SAID.

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AFTER VETTING BY MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY PARTICIPATION GROUP WHICH COMPRISED UNOFFICIALS AND GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENT REPRESENTATIVES, 30 PROJECTS OF VARIOUS NATURE WERE SELECTED.

+IN DECIDING THE SUBSIDY, EACH APPLICATION WAS ASSESSED ACCORDING TO THE CONTENT OF THE PROJECT, TARGET, THE AMOUNT OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE REQUIRED AND THE COST-EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROGRAMME,+ MR MAK SAID.

THE 30 PROJECTS SELECTED INCLUDE EXHIBITION, VOLUNTEERS TRAINING SCHEME, SEMINAR, SURVEY, PRODUCTION OF AUDIO-VISUAL AIDS AND PUBLICATION OF HANDBOOK ON CIVIC EDUCATION.

OTHER ACTIVITIES ARE VARIETY SHOW, FILM SHOW, DRAMA, QUIZ AND VARIOUS KINDS OF COMPETITION.

ALL PROJECTS SUBSIDISED BY THE SCHEME COULD TAKE PART IN AN OUTSTANDING CIVIC EDUCATION PROJECT AWARD SCHEME TO BE HELD EARLY NEXT YEAR, MR MAK SAID.

LETTERS HAD BEEN SENT TO ALL APPLICANTS INFORMING THEM OF THE RESULTS OF THEIR APPLICATIONS.

+IN VIEW OF THE GOOD RESPONSE, THE COMMITTEE WILL CONSIDER RUNNING THE SCHEME AGAIN NEXT YEAR, AND WE HOPE TO RAISE THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF SUBSIDY TO \$500 000,+ HE ADDED.

THE HEALTH WEEK IS A JOINT PROJECT OF THE TSUEN WAN DISTRICT OFFICE, TSUEN WAN DISTRICT BOARD AND THE YAN CHAI HOSPITAL TO PROMOTE HEALTH CARE.

UNDER THE SCHEME, PEOPLE IN THE DISTRICT CAN GO TO ANY ONE OF THE SPECIFIED VENUES TO HAVE A CHECK-UP BY STAFF OF THE HOSPITAL.

MEDICAL STAFF WILL CONDUCT BLOOD PRESSURE AND URINE TESTS AND GIVE HEALTH ADVICE.

A SPOKESMAN FOR THE SCHEME NOTED THAT EARLY DETECTION OF ANY UNDESIRABLE SYMPTOMS AND THE APPROPRIATE TREATMENT COULD PREVENT DEVELOPMENT OF DISEASES.

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THE VENUES FOR THE FREE MEDICAL CHECK-UPS INCLUDE SCHOOLS AND FACTORY BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT AS WELL AS THE PRINCESS ALEXANDRA COMMUNITY CENTRE IN THE HEART OF THE NEW TOWN.

STUDENTS CAN ENJOY FREE MEDICAL SERVICES AT THE YAN CHAI HOSPITAL LIM POR YEN SECONDARY SCHOOL BETWEEN 9 AM AND NOON TOMORROW AND THE TSUEN WAN GOVERNMENT SECONDARY TECHNICAL SCHOOL AT THE SAME TIME ON TUESDAY.

WORKERS CAN OBTAIN FREE SERVICES AT THE PO YIP INDUSTRIAL BUILDING BETWEEN 2 TO 4.30 PM ON MONDAY AND THE SUN FUNG INDUSTRIAL BUILDING AT THE SAME TIME ON TUESDAY.

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SOUTHERN DISTRICT SPREADS ROAD SAFETY MESSAGE
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THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN ORGANISING COMMITTEE WILL VISIT CENTRES FOR THE ELDERLY AND HOLD GAMES DAYS IN SCHOOLS TO SPREAD THE ROAD SAFETY MESSAGE.

THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT BOARD HAS ALLOCATED \$16 500 FOR THIS YEAR'S CAMPAIGN WHICH PLACES EMPHASIS ON SAFETY FOR THE ELDERLY AND CHILDREN AS STATISTICS SHOWED THAT THEY ARE MOST VULNERABLE TO TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS.

AS PART OF THE CAMPAIGN, A FILM SHOW WAS HELD IN SEPTEMBER FOR 1 200 ELDERLY PEOPLE.
