EXCO APPROVES NEW DEGREE COURSES

* * * * *

APPROVAL HAS BEEN GIVEN BY THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL FOR THE HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC TO INTRODUCE A BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE COURSE IN HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT AND A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE COURSE IN BUILDING SURVEYING/QUANTITY SURVEYING/LAND MANAGEMENT.

THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL HAS ALSO APPROVED THE INTRODUCTION OF BACHELOR OF ARTS (HONOURS) DEGREE COURSES IN CHINESE, ENGLISH, HISTORY, GEOGRAPHY AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES AT THE HONG KONG BAPTIST COLLEGE.

ALL THESE NEW DEGREE COURSES WILL BEGIN EITHER IN SEPTEMBER OR OCTOBER THIS YEAR. MEANWHILE, OTHER NEW DEGREE COURSES ARE STILL BEING CONSIDERED BY THE AUTHORITIES FOR THE 1988-89 ACADEMIC TERM.

THE COURSE IN HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT WILL BE STUDIED IN A FOUR-YEAR FULL-TIME SANDWICH MODE. ANNUAL INTAKE WILL BE ABOUT 40 STUDENTS. THE COURSE WILL PRODUCE GRADUATES TO MEET THE NEEDS OF THE LOCAL TOURISM, HOTEL AND RESTAURANT INDUSTRIES.

THE COURSE IN BUILDING SURVEYING/QUANTITY SURVEYING/LAND MANAGEMENT WILL BE STUDIED IN A THREE-YEAR FULL-TIME MODE. ANNUAL INTAKE WILL BE ABOUT 30 STUDENTS IN EACH STREAM.

THE COURSE AIMS TO TRAIN GRADUATES FOR THE SURVEYING PROFESSION AND FOR OCCUPATIONS RELATING TO LAND USE AND REAL ESTATE.

THE BAPTIST COLLEGE'S EXISTING HONOURS DIPLOMA COURSES IN CHINESE, ENGLISH, HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY WILL BE REPLACED BY THE NEW HONOURS DEGREE COURSE IN THE SAME DISCIPLINES. RELIGIOUS STUDIES WILL BE A NEW COURSE.

THE NEW COURSES WILL BE THREE-YEAR FULL-TIME COURSES.

ABOUT 170 STUDENTS WILL BE ADMITTED EACH YEAR. THEY WILL BE TRAINED FOR CAREERS IN EDUCATION, BUSINESS, PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AND OTHER GENERAL FIELDS.

ALL THE NEW COURSES HAVE BEEN ASSESSED AND ENDORSED BY THE UK COUNCIL FOR NATIONAL ACADEMIC AWARDS AND HAVE BEEN RECOMMENDED BY THE UNIVERSITY AND POLYTECHNIC GRANTS COMMITTEE.

FUNDS FOR CHINESE TEXTBOOKS AWARD SCHEME APPROVED

* * * * *

THE FINANCE COMMITTEE HAS AGREED TO ALLOCATE FUNDS FOR PHASE II OF THE INCENTIVE AWARD SCHEME RECOMMENDED BY THE CHINESE TEXTBOOKS COMMITTEE.

IT WILL ALLOCATE \$3.6 MILLION AS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO PUBLISHERS ON THE PROVISION OF SECONDARY 1 TO 5 CHINESE TEXTBOOKS IN PRACTICAL AND TECHNICAL SUBJECTS.

UNDER THE SCHEME, FINANCIAL AND EDITORIAL ASSISTANCE WILL BE PROVIDED TO THE PARTICIPATING PUBLISHERS.

THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR EACH SET OF CHINESE TEXTBOOKS FOR A SUBJECT WILL BE \$225,000. THERE ARE EIGHT PRACTICAL AND TECHNICAL SUBJECTS.

PUBLISHERS JOINING THE SCHEME WILL BE REQUIRED TO SIGN AN UNDERTAKING AND FOR EACH SET OF CHINESE TEXTBOOKS TO DEPOSIT A LUMP SUM OF \$50,000 WITH THE GOVERNMENT AS GUARANTEE FOR PRODUCING THE TEXTBOOKS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A SCHEDULE SPECIFIED BY THE CHINESE TEXTBOOKS COMMITTEE.

THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL INVITE PUBLISHERS TO PARTICIPATE THROUGH THE THREE EDUCATIONAL PUBLISHERS' ASSOCIATIONS. INDEPENDENT PUBLISHERS ARE ALSO WELCOME.

A MEETING WILL BE ARRANGED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT FOR THE CHAIRMAN OF THE CHINESE TEXTBOOKS COMMITTEE TO MEET PUBLISHERS AND TO INTRODUCE THE DETAILS OF THE SCHEME.

OFFICERS OF THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT WILL ALSO EXPLAIN TO PUBLISHERS THE PROCEDURES OF APPLICATION AND THE DETAILS OF THE EDITORIAL ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

THE MEETING WILL BE HELD AT THE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT HEADQUARTERS' CONFERENCE ROOM, LEE GARDENS, THIRD FLOOR, HYSAN AVENUE, CAUSEWAY BAY ON SEPTEMBER 3, STARTING 9.30 AM. EDUCATIONAL PUBLISHERS ARE WELCOME TO ATTEND.

SUPERVISION OF TSING YI BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT WORKS

* * * * *

THE GOVERNMENT HAS SIGNED A \$1 MILLION AGREEMENT FOR EMPLOYING CONSULTING ENGINEERS TO SUPERVISE CONSTRUCTION WORK ON THE TSING YI BRIDGE IMPROVEMENT.

THE AGREEMENT WAS SIGNED TODAY (THURSDAY) BY THE DIRECTOR OF HIGHWAYS, MR HAROLD BEATON, AND THE DIRECTOR OF MOTT, HAY AND ANDERSON HONG KONG LTD, MR JOHN WHITEFIELD.

A HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT SPOKESMAN SAID THE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, DESIGNED BY MOTT, HAY AND ANDERSON AND MANAGED BY THE HIGHWAYS DEPARTMENT, WOULD COST \$16 MILLION.

THE STRUCTURAL WORKS, WHICH WILL INVOLVE THE INSTALLATION OF ADDITIONAL PRESTRESSING TENDONS TO REDUCE THE PRESENT EXCESSIVE DEFLECTIONS OF THE BRIDGE DECK, WILL BE THE FIRST OF THEIR KIND IN HONG KONG.

THE BRIDGE WILL ALSO BE RESURFACED TO PROVIDE FOR SMOOTHER TRAVELLING AND THE BRIDGE PARAPET WILL BE REALIGNED.

WORK WILL START IN OCTOBER AND BE DUE FOR COMPLETION IN 12 MONTHS.

IN THE COURSE OF WORKS, THE BRIDGE WILL BE CLOSED INTERMITTENTLY. THIS WILL TAKE THE FORM OF SOME NIGHT TIME CLOSURES, ONE LANE CLOSURES AND OCCASIONAL COMPLETE CLOSURES.

DURING THE PERIODS WHEN THE BRIDGE IS CLOSED, TRAFFIC TO AND FROM TSING YI WILL BE DIVERTED TO USE THE TSING TSUEN BRIDGE.

APPROPRIATE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT MEASURES WILL BE TAKEN TO MINIMISE DISRUPTION TO TRAFFIC AND POLICE OFFICERS WILL BE ON HAND AT THESE TIMES TO GUIDE MOTORISTS.

TSUEN WAN - TSING YI FERRY SERVICE TO CEASE

THE HONG KONG AND YAUMATI FERRY COMPANY LIMITED (HYF) WILL CEASE OPERATING THE PASSENGER FERRY SERVICE BETWEEN TSUEN WAN AND TSING YI FROM AUGUST 27.

ALTERNATIVE TRANSPORT TO THE FERRY SERVICE IS PROVIDED BY BUS ROUTE 43B, OPERATING BETWEEN CHEUNG CHING AND THE TSUEN WAN FERRY PIER. THE FREQUENCY OF THE BUS SERVICE WAS INCREASED FROM AUGUST 15.

/A GOVERNMENT

A GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN SAID TODAY (THURSDAY) THAT HYF HAD APPLIED TO THE COMMISSIONER FOR TRANSPORT IN AUGUST LAST YEAR FOR PERMISSION TO CEASE OPERATING THE SERVICE UPON THE OPENING OF THE TSING TSUEN BRIDGE IN DECEMBER LAST YEAR.

THE SERVICE WAS PROVING TO BE UNECONOMICAL AND HYF WAS LOSING MONEY IN CONTINUING TO OPERATE IT.

THIS, THEREFORE, WAS ONE OF THE HYF'S PROPOSALS TO RATIONALISE ITS CROSS HARBOUR FERRY NETWORK SO AS TO ENSURE THE CONTINUED FINANCIAL VIABILITY OF FERRY SERVICES AT REASONABLE FARE LEVELS.

FOLLOWING THE OPENING OF THE BRIDGE, BUS ROUTE NO. 43B WAS INTRODUCED IN FEBRUARY. PATRONAGE ON THE FERRY SERVICE DECREASED SHARPLY TO 700 PASSENGERS PER DAY IN MAY.

TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURES AT NIGHT

THE TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCED THAT THE WINSLOW STREET VEHICULAR UNDERPASS IN HUNG HOM WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC BETWEEN 1 AM AND 5 AM ON SATURDAY (AUGUST 20).

THE CLOSURE WILL FACILITATE CLEANSING OF THE UNDERPASS. VEHICLES ON WINSLOW STREET HEADING FOR TO KWA WAN WILL BE DIVERTED VIA CHATHAM ROAD NORTH, COOKE STREET, GILLIES AVENUE AND WUHU STREET.

IN TSUEN WAN, TO FACILITATE THE ERECTION OF TWO FOOTBRIDGES AS PART OF THE ROUTE 5 CONSTRUCTION PROJECT, SECTIONS OF CHEUNG PEI SHAN ROAD WILL BE CLOSED TO TRAFFIC FOR SIX CONSECUTIVE NIGHTS BETWEEN AUGUST 21 (SUNDAY) AND 26 (FRIDAY).

DAILY BETWEEN 1.30 AM AND 5.30 AM ON AUGUST 21, 22 AND 23, CHEUNG PEI SHAN ROAD BETWEEN LO WAI ROAD AND CHEUNG SHAN ESTATE ROAD EAST WILL BE CLOSED.

DURING THE CLOSURE, CHEUNG SHAN ESTATE ROAD EAST WILL BE TEMPORARILY REROUTED TWO-WAY. MOTORISTS ON TEXACO ROAD HEADING FOR LEI MUK SHU AND SHEK LEI WILL BE DIVERTED TO USE SHING MUN ROAD AND CHEUNG SHAN ESTATE ROAD EAST.

CHEUNG PEI SHAN ROAD BETWEEN SHEK WAI KOK ROAD AND TSUEN KAM INTERCHANGE WILL BE CLOSED DAILY BETWEEN 1.30 AM AND 5.30 AM ON AUGUST 24, 25 AND 26.
